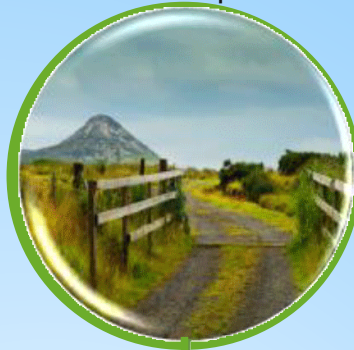

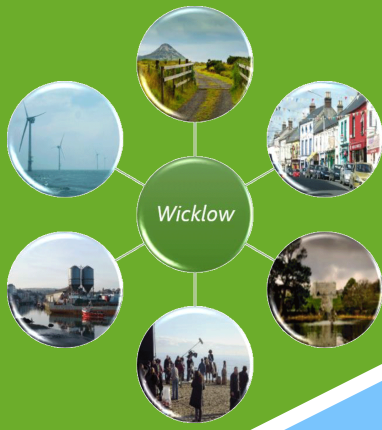

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Launch of County Wicklow Economic Think Tank Action Plan

The County Wicklow Economic Think Tank (CWETT) action plan was launched in January 2015.

The CWETT, which is comprised of business people from County Wicklow, was formed in late 2013 following widespread consultation with the business community in the county. The aim of the CWETT was to develop a practical Action Plan that would be used to drive and maintain economic activity and lead to increased employment in County Wicklow.

The action plan has recommended the establishment of a new business brand for the county and a major communications plan which will turn wicklow.ie into a portal that will provide a 'one stop shop' for businesses in the county.

The Action Plan has two key elements. "The Big Idea" intended to capture the imagination and enthusiasm of the businesses and the community, and six strategic objectives each of which addresses specific areas of economic opportunity for the County. The underlying concept of "The Big Idea" is to build a strong brand for County Wicklow. This brand is to encapsulate what County Wicklow has to offer across multiple dimensions including business potential, investment potential, tourism, lifestyle and commerce.

There are numerous detailed actions underlying each of the objectives. The next step will be to prioritise the proposed actions and identify the resources required and available. This will be followed by a timeline for implementation and a method for measuring progress. It is expected that a number of key actions will be completed in 2015.

ENJOY THE HILLS AND THE GREAT OUTDOORS A Guide for Responsible Dog Owners

Farm Animals / Livestock

Keep your dog away from areas where there are livestock even if on a lead.

Sheep and Lambs

Sheep and lambs are very vulnerable to dog activity and they will view even the friendliest pet dog as a predator and be very nervous of it. Being chased by a dog causes a very high level of stress among sheep and lambs and can easily result in their death. Each week hundreds of ewes and lambs are killed all over Ireland by marauding dogs. Even those ewes that are not killed are hugely stressed and lose lambs if they are pregnant.

For Other People

Some people, especially young children, can be very frightened by dogs - even the friendliest tail-wagging pet! Horse riders, cyclists and runners can be easily startled by a dog and vice versa. You can help by keeping your dog on a lead.

For Other Dogs

It is best to keep your dog on a lead in the vicinity of other dogs unless their owners clearly are happy that your dog approaches them. Dogs do not always act predictably in the presence of other dogs.

Fouling by Dog Mess!

Many people are aware of the importance of cleaning up dog mess in urban settings so that no-one steps in it but think it's fine to leave it in the outdoors. However, it is equally important to clear up your dog's mess in the countryside as this can cause infections in people or wildlife and can cause serious illness and death in livestock. All dogs should be wormed regularly and all mess removed.

Update From The Wicklow Heritage Office

Wicklow County Council is about to embark on the preparation of a new Heritage Plan for County Wicklow. The Heritage Plan is a five year strategy and action plan, setting out a vision for enhancing the protection of our natural and cultural heritage and encouraging greater participation.

The elected members at their meeting on 2nd March agreed to the establishment of a new Wicklow Heritage Forum, which will include elected representatives, along with representatives from statutory and non statutory bodies and the community and voluntary sector.

Key actions carried out through the Heritage Plan process to date with support from the Heritage Council, have included the compiling of information on a diverse range of topics, including wetlands, geology and traditional buildings; producing publications on archaeology, wildlife and architecture and the development of heritage trails and signage in towns and villages and along the coast. The development of an online community heritage archive for County Wicklow at www.countywicklowheritage.org was also spearheaded through the Heritage Plan process and remains the first county based archive in the Irish Community of Archive Networks. More to follow on this subject in the coming months as the process gets underway and the input of interested individuals and groups is sought.

Showcase of Local Supports for SMEs a Huge Success: LEO Wicklow 'Grow Your Business' Open Day

The 'Grow Your Business' Open Day, organised by the Local Enterprise Office Wicklow saw a hive of activity on the attractive grounds of Wicklow County Campus in Rathnew, on Wednesday 11th March. Close to 180 owner-managers of County Wicklow based SMEs (small and medium enterprises) visited throughout the day to get support and advice on growing their businesses. From 10am till 4pm the Exhibition Area hosted 25 exhibition stands, giving advice to attendees on topics such as patents, procurement, training, tax, funding, incentives and incubation space.

The focus of the day was to support local businesses to grow. Noel Davidson, online sales expert and guest speaker at the first of two free seminars on the day delivered an energetic and practical presentation on

'Successful Online Trading', and encouraged Wicklow based SMEs to view the world as their oyster when it comes to selling online. The second seminar covered the tried and tested core principles of 'How to Generate and Close Sales', delivered by sales guru Terry Harner, who urged the audience to 'sell benefits not features', and to make face-to-face sales a personal interaction.

There was huge demand for appointments at the Mentor Rooms, where visitors could meet one-to-one with a business mentor. The team of mentors worked diligently throughout the day, giving tailored advice to over 40 local business owners.

At the event Sheelagh Daly, Head of Enterprise at the Local Enterprise Office (LEO) Wicklow, expressed her sincere thanks to the 70 staff from the local and national Enterprise Support Agencies that exhibited on the day, including: the relevant departments of Wicklow County Council, such as Planning, Procurement, Economic Development and Environment, the Revenue Commissioners, Enterprise Ireland, Microfinance Ireland, the Chambers of Commerce, the Enterprise Centres, the Patents Office, local banks, INTREO, Wicklow County Tourism and many others. The exhibition provided a great opportunity for busy, growing businesses to save time, by gathering information from all the various stands in one afternoon, and business owners got a chance to speak directly with staff from the various agencies and organisations.

National Spring Clean 2015

Just like in your own home, the countryside needs a bit of a spring clean after the winter! Before the new growth in spring and summer, it's an ideal time to get the roadsides and open spaces looking clean and tidy. And we'd all like an excuse to get out and about as soon as the weather gets a bit warmer and brighter.

National Spring Clean is Ireland's most popular, well recognised and successful anti-litter initiative. Now in its 17th year, the campaign encourages every sector of society to actively participate and take responsibility for litter, by actually conducting clean-ups in their own local environment during the month of April.

Last year, over half a million people countrywide at 5,112 clean-up events collected an estimated 500 tonnes of litter, of which 35% was recycled. In the current era of climate change the more we recycle, the more we reduce our carbon emissions, so by taking part in National Spring Clean we are making a difference!

Taking part in the National Spring Clean is very straight forward. If your group, school, club, gang of friends/neighbours or an individual wants to do a clean up event in the local area, to take place any time during April, register your event online, by phone, fax or post with National Spring Clean. (Details below) Once you have registered you will receive a FREE clean-up kit from An Taisce.

The clean up kit contains valuable tips on how to hold a successful clean-up event, posters to advertise your event, ideas on how to make your event different and lots more useful information. The pack also includes plastic bags in which to collect your litter and recyclable material, tabards to keep your clothes clean and gloves to keep your hands safe and clean. Because National Spring Clean encourages recycling, a number of colour-coded bags are provided for collection of litter that can be recycled. Recycling helps reduce the production of greenhouse gases and therefore climate change.

When you register you become a member of National Spring Clean. This will allow you to post details of your event on www.nationalspringclean.org events section. Members who also post a report of their event when it has been completed will receive an NSC Certificate from An Taisce.

Once you have a firm date for your event you should contact Wicklow County Council's Environmental Awareness Office, who will provide you with more support and details for rubbish disposal after your clean-up. Simply ring LoCall 1890 22 22 76 or email eao@wicklowcoco.ie with the details and a contact name and phone number.

You can share the details of your event on the National Spring Clean Facebook page. You will be able to see what other groups and individuals are doing and let people know what you are planning as well. National Spring Clean is a powerful community event. It gives everybody a good excuse to get out there and clean up the footpaths, hedges, roadsides, riverbanks and other beautiful areas before the summer. Let's get rid of more than the cobwebs this Spring!

River Dargle Flood Defence Scheme

www.bray.ie

- This project is one of the key capital investment projects by Wicklow County Council and the Office of Public Works (OPW) with an investment of €40 million and the next two years will see the completion of this vital Flood Defence Scheme.
- The Flood Defence Scheme involves the widening and deepening of the river channel and the construction of walls and embankments along a 3.3km stretch from Silverbridge at the N11 to the Harbour Bridge at Bray Harbour.
- The scheme is required to protect both property, but more importantly, potential loss of lives in Little Bray.
- Works on site have been ongoing since 2012. The main contractor was SIAC construction Ltd. They were on site for two years before the company went into examinership.
- The contract was terminated by agreement resulting in the construction of the works being suspended since November 2013.
- Works that have been completed already will have a significant beneficial affect in alleviating flood risk in the interim period.
- Wicklow County Council is now continuing the construction with Tom Foley Management Ltd taking on the role of Construction Management Service Provider and works recommenced on the River Dargle Flood Defence Scheme in July 2014.
- The River Dargle Flood Defence Scheme is scheduled for completion in late 2016. This is subject to weather and ground conditions and in accordance with environmental restrictions such as those set by the Wildlife Acts.

Latest News

Throughout February and March 2015 the following works took place:

- Construction of Coburg reinforced concrete wall which included mini piling, reinforced concrete wall and 700m² of stone cladding. The work is planned to be completed by the end of July
- Commenced construction of the next phase of flood defence wall in Ravenswell Road including the new entrance to the golf club
- Commenced construction of the flood defence works in Seapoint Court in March
- Carried out condition surveys of properties in Seapoint Court and the Maltings area in February

What will you see when the scheme is completed?

When the scheme is fully completed in late 2016 there will be a number of significant changes to the river and it's landscape. The 'before' image is the view presently from the bridge looking towards the harbour. The 'after' image is an artist's impression of the same view after works have been finished. Environmental Update

- Ongoing meetings with an Ecological Consultant to review all environmental issues.
- Liaison and consultation with the National Parks and Wildlife Service & Inland Fisheries Ireland
- Procurement of licensing requirements such as exemptions under the Wildlife Act (1976, amended 2000) to allow clearance of vegetation during the breeding and nesting season (1st March to 31st August)

New County Wicklow Civil Defence Training Centre & Headquarters



A new state-of-the-art training centre and headquarters for County Wicklow Civil Defence was officially opened in Greystones on 6th March. This is the first such fully-equipped, dedicated training and Headquarters facility for Civil Defence in County Wicklow and will provide significant support for the various volunteer services provided by Civil Defence throughout the county.



The new Civil Defence centre is housed in a purpose-built building on Mill Road in Greystones and provides facilities for:

Vehicle garage for ambulances, all purpose vehicles, boats etc, Communications centre, Training hall, Reception centre, Stores, Changing and shower facilities, Kitchen and Administration. It was built and equipped by Wicklow County Council with the support of the Department of Defence.

The Civil Defence is a volunteer-based organisation whose members serve as a high quality back-up service in support of the primary emergency services and the local community and can be called out to assist in severe weather conditions, missing persons searches and for other events etc.

Activities undertaken by Wicklow Civil Defence include:

- First Aid and Ambulance Services
- Stewarding Services
- Providing assistance in emergency situations i.e. flooding, accidents, evacuation and other emergencies
- Search and rescue

About 130 members are registered with County Wicklow Civil Defence with around 70 of those engaged in regular training. Each volunteer undergoes accredited training in a number of core disciplines such as first aid, rescue skills, fire-fighting, radio communications and welfare skills.

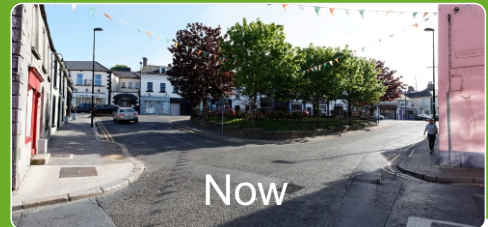

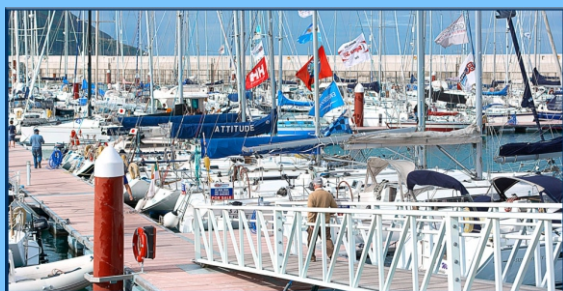
