Positive Results in National Satisfaction Survey

Wicklow County Council has emerged with impressive marks in a national Local Authority Satisfaction Survey.

The study, carried out by the National Oversight and Audit Commission (NOAC), found that Wicklow County Council scored higher than average with the public considering the Council is doing a good job.

The NOAC independently oversees the local government sector by reviewing the performance of Local Councils, monitors implementation of national local government policy and identifies opportunities for best practice.

The research carried out in February/March 2019 by IPSOS MRBI, included Wicklow County Council along with other comparative medium sized Local Authorities, comprised off over 3,200 citizens participating in face to face interviews.

Sod-Turned on €3 million Content-Creation Hub

The sod was turned on a new €3 million Content-Creation Enterprise Hub at the Wicklow County Campus in Clermont, Rathnew, on 17th September.

The Hub will provide 10,000sq ft of private and co-working spaces and aims to boost job creation in the sector and spin out services feeding into these industries...It is intended to support content creation and will complement the film industry, with a particular focus on businesses servicing productions happening in Ashford Studios and Ardmore Studios.

The Hub will also offer a collaborative social space, conference centre, podcast studio and screening facility along with access to a range of existing meeting rooms and training facilities on the larger Clermont campus.

Funding of €1.43m was secured under the Government's Regional Enterprise Development Fund. The remainder will be matched by Wicklow County Council.

New Community Monument Fund

Applications are being invited by Wicklow County Council for funds to help the conservation of local monuments.

The Community Monuments Fund will invest €900,000 nationally in our valuable archaeological heritage to help the owners and custodians of archaeological monuments to safeguard them into the future for the benefit of local communities and the visiting public.

Core aims of this new Fund are the conservation, maintenance, protection and promotion of local monuments and archaeological sites. It will have a number of funding streams aimed at enabling conservation works to be carried out on monuments which are deemed to be significant and in need of urgent support, encouraging access to monuments and improve their presentation and also to build resilience in monuments to enable them to withstand the effects of climate change.

COVID 19 UPDATE

The current pandemic has had a major effect on the programme.

Sites were closed for 7 weeks with 3 exceptions, which were allowed to re-open early (Convent Lands Wicklow, Farrenkelly Greystones and Whitehall Baltinglass. All sites are now open.

Progress is being monitored on site to establish any ongoing effects.

Capital Advance Leasing Facility (CALF)

The Approved Housing Bodies are actively pursuing a number of potential CALF projects and are liaising closely with the Council on a regular basis. The members will be kept updated.

- Acquisition by AHB of 38 turnkey units via CALF in Arklow due by Q4 2020.
- Acquisition by AHB of 8 (Part V) units via CALF in Ashford now completed and included in the Part V figures above. The remaining 4 units (2 turnkey and 2 Part V) due in early 2021.
- Construction ongoing on a 40 units (including 4 Part V) via CALF Turnkey in Dunlavin.

Capital Assistance Scheme (CAS) Wicklow County Council is continuing to support acquisitions under the Capital Assistance Scheme with Dublin Simon, Circle Housing, Ark Housing and Peter McVerry Trust.

Expressions of Interest – Social Housing on Council lands - A preferred proposal has been identified.

COVID 19 UPDATE

The Homeless Team continues to provide key support by phone, working from both office and home. B&B proprietors currently retained by the Council are continuing to provide emergency accommodation for homeless clients. All Covid 19 protocols are in place in the facilities.

Self Isolation Units

A number of vacant houses being refurbished for reletting have been kitted out in anticipation of the need for families to self isolate for the required period from emergency accommodation.

Emergency Measures in the Public Interest (Covid-19) Act 2020

With effect from Friday, 27th March 2020, new emergency measures were introduced into law to protect tenants during the Covid-19 emergency period. In summary, a notice of termination cannot be served during the Covid-19 emergency period. All notices of terminations which were served before the emergency period are paused until end of June, and tenants in general cannot be obliged to leave their rented accommodation during this time.

The Mid East Region Homelessness Management Group has completed a brief analysis of the impact of the moratorium on evictions to date, on the extent of homelessness in the region and is recommending that the emergency measures pertaining to notice of terminations be extended, as a homeless preventive measure, with an exemption to be applied to termination notices that relate to rent arrears and/or antisocial behaviour.

Cold Weather Initiative

The Cold Weather Initiative, a partnership arrangement between the Council and the Dublin Simon Community, with the assistance of Five Loaves Homeless Services, opened on 14th November 2019, in Bray to provide emergency night shelter for homeless individuals.

Referral protocol is through Wicklow County Council, Dublin Simon, Five Loaves and the Gardaí.



COVID 19 UPDATE

A new operational model has commenced at the Cold Weather Initiative to endeavour to achieve the necessary health and safety standards around Covid 19 protocols. Opening hours have been extended with a corresponding increase in staffing resources. Sanitary facilities have been increased and extensive temporary modifications have been introduced to ensure separation of beds and provision of secure isolation unit.

Due to the high risk to clients if there should be Covid + cases reported in the CWI, the Council is finalising plans to relocate the residents to another, more suitable facility, where 24 hour accommodation will be provided and adequate self isolation facilities will be available.

Homeless HAP

The Homeless HAP Placefinder provides assistance in:

- seeking out potential properties suitable for households currently identified as homeless or at risk of homelessness;
- > liaising with specific households to establish their specific needs;
- > establishing relationships with local property agents and landlords; and,
- > supporting those homeless households to (a) prevent the necessity to enter emergency accommodation or (b) to exit emergency accommodation and secure a tenancy.

To date, 266 households (209 families & 57 singles) have been assisted under the Homeless HAP Scheme in Wicklow County Council from the inception on 1st October 2018 to 31st August, 2020. 127 homeless cases and 139 prevention cases to date. 89 properties were sourced by WCC.

COVID 19 UPDATE

The Homeless HAP Placefinder and the HAP team continue to progress cases. Key focus at present is on maintaining payments to landlords and reviewing differential rent of those clients who have reduced income during this time.

Sonas Facility, Wicklow - Transition to Family Homeless Hub.

Following the advice that Sonas was withdrawing services from Wicklow, the operation of the facility was tendered out to Approved Housing Bodies to operate and manage the facility as a Family Homeless Hub.

The successful tenderer was Dublin Simon Community, who will be in a position to commence operations and management of the facility pending finaisation of the legal handover.

COVID 19 UPDATE

Refurbishment work is substantially complete on the facility, initially providing self isolation units for vulnerable clients during the current crisis.



Other Temporary Supported Accommodation

Wicklow County Council owned properties in Wicklow, Bray and Arklow, leased to AHBs, provide 22 units of low to medium supported accommodation targeted to the particular support needs of the clients. There has been a significant number of move ons from these properties, signalling the success of this model.

Housing First

With Housing First, the priority is to support a person who has experienced homelessness into permanent housing as quickly as possible, without any preconditions around sobriety or mental health treatment. Then continue working intensively with them on these issues once they are housed. Housing First recognises that a stable home provides the basis for recovery in other areas.

Peter McVerry Trust has been appointed as the Housing First Programme Implementer for the Mid East Region and Wicklow County Council is committed to working with them to achieve the targets identified in the programme. Properties will be provided by both Wicklow County Council and Peter McVerry Trust for the programme.

Wicklow County Council has successfully accommodated 3 clients under Housing First. Other clients proposed for Housing First have been assessed by the team and are availing of key support work pending finalisation of accommodation.



11. Wicklow Community Call

The Community Call continues to respond to requests for help from the public during the COVID-19 crisis. The helpline is now housed in the CC&SD section in Wicklow County Council.

The Community Response Forum, chaired by the Chief Executive Frank Curran, continues to meet fortnightly to oversee the community response, to exchange updates and information and to co-ordinate and enable cooperation. The forum has a number of statutory bodies, community organisations and community groups at the table. In addition the forum has identified and responded to two particular issues that have emerged as result of COVID-19. These are food poverty and digital poverty.

12. Food Poverty Research

Food poverty has always been a feature of overall poverty but this issue was exacerbated by the COVID-19 shutdown and was highlighted as a problem through the Community Call Helpline. A subgroup has been set up under the umbrella of the County Wicklow Food and Beverage Strategy to look at the issue of food poverty and food sustainability. This group is conducting research at present, among responders and those at risk of experiencing food poverty in order to get an accurate picture of the issues involved and the most appropriate responses to them.

13. Digital Poverty

Digital equality is a theme of the County Wicklow Digital Strategy but like food poverty, has been highlighted recently. The Community Response Forum became aware that many crucial services are now being delivered online because of COVID-19 restrictions. However there has been a breakdown in access to these services by some because of a lack of digital equipment or Wi-Fi. Wicklow County Council, through the Community Response Forum, set up a fund aimed at enabling organisations to purchase vital equipment such as laptops and dongles that can be accessed by those in most need of them. The projects funded will achieve an impact in one or more of the following:

- Enabling on-line education, reskilling or training for disadvantaged groups
- Enabling online youth work/mental health interventions
- Support for vulnerable families
- Support for people with disabilities
- Support for those in Direct Provision
- Community outreach to vulnerable groups while social distancing
- Combating isolation for older people

Payments, totalling €44,900, have been made to the successful applicants under the Digital Poverty Grant Scheme.

A further round of applications was made at the end of August and another will be made at the end of September.

15. County Wicklow Library Services

Resumption of Library Services (Update)

In line with national guidance, the reintroduction of library services has been on a phased basis:

- May "Click & Collect" service where the public collected pre-ordered books and items from the library entrance
- June Reopened for browsing in all 13 libraries
- July Reintroduced access to library PCs
- Sept Reintroduction of mobile library service

The final phase was introduced on September 21st, with the reintroduction of study space facilities. Patrons are now able to reserve a 2 hour time slot for study. Spaces have been reduced from what was previously the case, with social distancing ensured. They are further protected by the numerous screens which have been installed at all libraries, especially at study desks.





Quarantining of Stock

Wicklow County Council Library Service has decided that in the interests of ensuring public safety during Covid-19, we will continue to quarantine stock, until a vaccine is widely available. As it has been scientifically proven that the virus can live on plastic surfaces for 72 hours, all libraries quarantine stock, on return, for a 3 day period. Special containers have been purchased for each library, which enable stock to be stored away from the library floor. Quarantining is not mandatory, but this extra precaution is appreciated by the public and provides reassurance to all.

Increase in Usage

When the libraries reopened for browsing, on 22nd June, the public were initially very slow to return. However, our libraries have witnessed an incremental increase in visitor numbers, week on week. They are now at approximately 40% of visitor stats for the same period in 2019. Wicklow library usage stats are ahead of the national average, as all our libraries are open to the public to access, as previously. This is not the case in all local authorities, with some still insisting on the public accessing their libraries by prior appointment. In some libraries, protective screens have not yet been installed to enable the public use IT or study spaces, while approximately 20% of smaller libraries have not yet reopened.

16. Social Inclusion Community Activation Programme (SICAP)

SICAP:

- SICAP mid-year review process has been successfully completed by both Partnerships in Q3.
- Mid-year reports of both Partnerships are now fully approved and Q4 funding payments can now be processed.
- Programme implementers continue to provide targeted supports across the county to disadvantaged communities.



17. County Wicklow Public Partnership Network (PPN):

- Membership currently stands at 340 members.
- Collaborative work is continuing between PPN Disability Awareness Group and WCC Disability & Inclusion Steering Committee.
- The PPN has been involved in the following submissions/consultations: WCC Local Property Tax Adjustment Factor; WCC Part 8 Cedar Court, Bray Apartments Construction
- Upcoming events: Online Meet the Elected Rep meetings.

18. Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership

ASD Camp

Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership partnered up with adventure.ie to run an event day Teen ASD Rock Climbing & Abseiling Event. The programme took place in Dalkey Quarry with 11 teenagers taking part. This was in conjunction with Triple A Alliance & Tusla.

1 Mile Swim Event

Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership is running a 1 Mile Swim Event in conjunction with Swim Ireland Sunday 20th September in Wicklow Harbour.

Bike Week 2020

Bike Week takes place 19th-27th September. Wicklow Sports and Recreation Partnership are running numerous workshops and events though out the week in conjunction with The Sports Room in Wicklow Town and HD Fitness in Blessington. For more information, please contact wicklowlsp@wicklowcoco.ie

20. Pride of Place Competition 2020

The Pride of Place competition 2020 judging was held by way of Zoom calls. The following groups were nominated under these four categories -

- Ashford Community and Heritage Centre Community Tourism Initiative
- Arklow Meals on Wheels Community Wellbeing Initiative
- Carnew Bia Abhaile Creative Place Initiative
- County Wicklow Volunteer Centre Youth Led Initiative

On the 17th to 19th of August, the Zoom calls were hosted by a Co-Operation Ireland representative, who introduced the judges, liaison officer and community/group representatives. The winners will be announced at a virtual event on the 30th of November 2020.

21. County Wicklow Arts Office

National Artist Development Initiative

The Arts Office has received new additional funding for a national artist development initiative which will see 31 artists, one from each local authority area, benefit from €320,000.00 in investment. The project will be managed by Wicklow Arts Office working with the Arts Council and the Association of Local Authority Arts Officers. Each artist will receive €8,000.00 as a bursary to develop their practice in one of four key ways. They will then benefit from additional networking, advisory, production, direction and wellness supports.

Culture Night 2020

Culture Night took place on 18th September in a re-imagined format. A small number of events took place outdoors and within NEPHET revised guidelines with appropriate COVID-19 stewarding. The remaining events took place in our recognised theatre venues with the revised capacity arrangements and online. This year's schedule featured predominantly Wicklow based artists with Joanna Kidney, Erica Devine, Alex Pectu, Fiachra Garvey, Jane Clarke, Olivia Fitzsimons, Phillip St John, Karen Gleeson and many others presenting work throughout the County. The events involved music, poetry, writing, theatre, comedy, performance and visual arts. Illustrator, Aga Grandovitcz, has started work on a new 60 square foot mural at the Park and Ride in Greystones.



Artist Development

Additional investment under the Jobs Stimulus Package was received through Creative Ireland. This is for artist development and investment in heritage practitioners in the county. It will also involve the commissioning of new work and residencies. All of this will be in line with Covid-19 Guidelines.

Artists Connect Panel

The Artists Connect Artist Panel has been convening every three weeks and has now introduced, with support from Wicklow County Council, an artist network Zoom meet up. This will be hosted by a selected artist once a month and it is hoped that during this difficult time it will help artists network, reconnect and re-imagine their work for the immediate future.

Funding Clinics and Artist Salon Events

Funding Clinics and Artist Salon events will be held in October to support artists to access new funding measures coming on stream and to respond to collaborating with Covid-19.

Strategic Project Application

In September, the Strategic Project Application Round will be assessed for projects which will take place in 2021. The Scheme closed to applications in the first week in September and will be announced at the end of September. This will be worth €60,000.00 investment approximately.

Sculpture at Knockroe Bends N81

A sculptural installation will be commissioned under the new scheme for Knockroe Bends on the N81. With the road project almost at completion, site visits have taken place to identify a suitable location. The commission value from the scheme is approximately €50,000.00. It is hoped to add to this figure, given the scale of the site to result in a budget of approximately €75,000.00 overall.



Economic Development, Planning and Infrastructure

 Wicklow Economic Think Tank (CWETT) Action Plan Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) (Economic)

The Economic Development Unit of the Enterprise and Corporate Services Directorate is charged with implementing the economic actions in the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP). Many of the 142 actions listed in the LECP have come from the County Wicklow Economic Think Tank (CWETT) Action Plan. The CWETT which was initiated in 2013 was a collaborative project initiated by Wicklow County Council and involved the business community from across the county and the County Enterprise Board (now LEO Wicklow).

Retail

Bray Town Centre

The Oakmount site was closed for 3 months due to Covid 19 crisis.

Roof weathering works are progressing on the roofs of block 2 & 3. The roof structure for block one has been formed and the slating and weathering works have also commenced.

Lift installation is almost complete and the installation of the travelators and escalators is underway. Mechanical & electrical works are progressing throughout blocks 2 & 3 and both levels of the car park. All M&E works are ready to be installed in the stairwells. ESB and Gas Network Ireland have completed install and connection to the site.

The revised practical completion date is November 2020.

The letting of the units are progressing and there are a number of lettings at heads of agreement stage.

Town Teams

Town Teams in Arklow, Blessington, Bray, Greystones and Wicklow continue to meet on a monthly basis and to progress various projects. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic meetings with a number of community groups and other various stakeholders have been postponed to later dates. This may reflect in the updates below.

Arklow Town Team

Following on from the announcement of LEADER funding being granted to design and develop a new website to promote Arklow town and its environs, contracts have been signed and a sub-committee has been set up to drive this project.



A new destination branding strategy for Arklow is also being designed to coincide with this and will then be used for future marketing communications.

An application has been submitted for funding under the Community Heritage Grant Scheme 2020, to carry out a full survey on the The Goods Store, Arklow Railway Station building at Knockanrahan Lower. The survey will include a measured survey and conservation report, with a view to working with the community and finding alternative uses for the building that will sustain it in the future.

Funding was secured under the Community Enhancement Programme in 2019 for three new bus shelters. Tenders are being prepared at present to install the shelters and they will be located at Ferrybank Northbound, Knockmore Northbound and Rathdrum Southbound.

Arklow Town Team will hold its AGM on Wednesday 23rd September at 6.30pm.

Bray Town Team

The Bray Reopening Committee is a joint initiative with local stakeholders across the community, including members of Bray Chamber of Commerce, the Health Service Executive and An Garda Síochána to plan for a considered, responsible return to civic life which is vital to help to restart the local economy in the town. This is in line with the Government's phased roadmap for reopening the country socially and economically.

The Committee focused on understanding best practices, planning for protections and protocols that businesses and the community will need in place in order to feel confident about resuming activities, once the Covid-19 restrictions are lifted, while emphasising a message that as a society, we all have a collective responsibility to ensure that reopening proceeds smoothly and safely.

The Town Committee is currently liaising with An Garda Síochána to form a Business Watch Group in the Town.

Blessington Town Team

Blessington Town Team held their last meeting on Monday 14th September. At the meeting there was a discussion of the Bank of Ireland Begin Together Awards, Blessington Town Team had submitted an application for the 2020 awards highlighting the Hello Neighbour initiative in the population category 4,001 – 7,000 and were delighted to be shortlisted along with the town of Kinsale, Co. Cork in this category. The judging is to take place on Monday 21st September at 9.30 and the winners will be announced on Ireland AM in October. The Chairperson thanked all that had made the Hello Neighbour initiative a success especially the volunteers who freely gave of their time to support their neighbours and community. It exemplified the level of community spirit in Blessington and the surrounding areas. All members expressed their hope that Blessington Town Team would be successful in the competition. The meeting was updated on the activities of Blessington Tidy Towns who have been doing tremendous work around the town, it was noted that while the pandemic had curtailed their activities, they had focused on achieving a number of projects. There was a short discussion on parking in the town and what was required to improve the situation. Members were also updated on the difficulties facing businesses in the area and it was stressed the need to support local businesses and service providers and the continued



role out of the Wonderful West Wicklow campaign. There was a discussion on the range of supports that are in place for businesses through the Local Enterprise Office and Failte Ireland.

Blessington and District Forum have created a page on their websites for businesses to register and provide information on the services they provide. This will facilitate the development of a business directory for the region in the future. The meeting was informed of the commitment given by the different Deputies to support the building of a swimming pool in West Wicklow. An application is being prepared to look for funding to undertake the detailed design of a swimming pool and multi use gaming area in Blessington. Members were updated on the work that has been undertaken to progress the development of a relief road for the town. The Chairperson outlined the importance of implementing the actions contained in Town Health Check and it was agreed to establish a subgroup to oversee the implementation of the actions.

Greystones 2020

Greystones 2020 have set up a subcommittee to organise a Christmas Festival online coupled with enhancing the streetscape for Christmas this year. As there will be no Christmas Gathering, Santa will arrive virtually and lots of ideas have been brought together to develop a fantastic programme of events. The team are in touch with local artists, video companies, workshop hosts, & actors to develop the idea further.

The #ThinklocalBuylocal campaign was very successful and the business pages have now over 390 businesses's listed on the www.greystones.ie website.

James Hennessy from Paul Hogarth Company will be giving a presentation to the Greystones District Councillors on the Greystones Public Realm Plan at the monthly meeting on the 29th September. This was commissioned by Greystones 2020 in conjunction With Wicklow County Council and LEADER funding. Plan can be viewed on https://greystones.ie/greystones-public-realm-plan-2020

Wicklow Town Team

Wicklow Town Team held their meeting on the 26th August. Funding has been requested for a feasibility study for a golf museum co-located with the Gaol. Sites have been identified for lecterns for the heritage walk. The website is performing very well and was popular with people looking for things to do in the local area during lockdown. The lectern for the Abbey Grounds is complete and the location for erection has been identified.

Town Re-Opening Committees

Following the success of the Bray Re-opening Committee, Wicklow County Council proposed the establishment of re-opening committees in each Municipal District – the purpose of these committees is to



support businesses as they re-open and to encourage members of the community to support local business.

Membership of the Re-Opening Committees consists of the MD Cathaoirleach (Chair), MD Manager, MD Administrator, MD Engineer, Chair of the Town Team, Representative of the Chamber of Commerce and An Garda Síochána.

A Town Team / Tourism recovery meeting was held in on 28th July 2020 with a number of ideas provided including identifying a number of 'visitor hotspots' around the County and setting up kiosks to get people to sign up to the 'Wicklow Passport' which will hopefully encourage people to visit other places in the County.

Tourism

Tourism Strategy and Marketing Plan 2018-2022

The strategy sets out a number of challenging but achievable priorities along with a series of detailed actions to be implemented over the next 5 years

The Key Priorities are:

- 1. Develop New Accommodation
- 2. Develop Key Towns as Visitor Hubs
- 3. Develop a Masterplan for Glendalough
- 4. Grow Thematic Experiences
- 5. Market our County by Developing A Common Narrative

A Tourism Implementation Group has been established to oversee these actions and drive all sectors towards helping Wicklow achieve the target of €200m in tourism revenue by 2023.

Accommodation: Fáilte Ireland has engaged Crowe Consultants to develop a Toolkit to help attract investment in accommodation. It is estimated that Wicklow requires an additional 175 Hotel Rooms over the next five years based on 4% growth, this is assuming that the additional 50 rooms that have extant planning permission are developed. The re-activation of the County Wicklow Accommodation working group is proposed for the end of July.



The County Wicklow Accommodation working group was re-activated at the end of July and met in the Brockagh Centre, Laragh. A number of ideas were raised and it is hoped to have a follow up meeting at the end of September.

A consultant has been appointed to assist the Accommodation Working Group to carry out a dedicated study building on Failte Ireland's Accommodation Toolkit and to contribute in terms of information and advice to the preparation of the related prospectus aimed at attracting the development of tourism accommodation in the County.

Destination Town Funding: An application to Failte Ireland on behalf of Wicklow Town was made in respect of Destination Town Funding and funding has been awarded to develop visitor amenities in Wicklow Town.

Key Towns as Visitor Hubs: Fáilte Ireland has announced an investment of €15.5 million available through local authorities to boost the attractiveness and tourism appeal of towns across the country. Funding of between €250,000 and €500,000 will be available to local authorities to develop towns in their area which have the potential to become a 'destination town' for tourists. The 'destination towns' will need to demonstrate their capacity and appeal to attract more international visitors to stay overnight.

Fáilte Ireland has set aside up to €500,000 in Destination Town Funding for County Wicklow; Wicklow County Council is working on an application for funding under this theme.

A Town Team / Tourism recovery meeting was held in July 2020 with a number of ideas provided including promoting the 'Wicklow Passport' to drive tourism in the County.

Glendalough Masterplan and Wicklow Visitor Orientation Study

Failte Ireland, with its strategic partners OPW, NPWS and with Wicklow County Council is engaging with Consarc Consultants to develop a tourism master-plan for Glendalough and the Wicklow Mountains National Park and a Visitor Orientation Plan for County Wicklow. Consarc lead a multi disciplinary team consisting of tourism, environmental, heritage, public realm, and traffic and parking consultants to develop the suite of plans. Stakeholder engagement is due to commence shortly.

Thematic Experiences

Tracks and Trails - Wicklow County Council have engaged the producers of Tracks and Trails to redevelop some of the existing programmes for use on the Wicklow.ie website and social media and also to develop shorter tracks and trails videos aimed at internet viewers, airlines and traditional media.



The Bray Head to the Great Sugarloaf Trail was launched via Facebook in July. Similarly the Tinahely Looped Walk will be launched in the coming weeks. It had been intended to hold an outdoor event to mark this launch; however recent additional Covid 19 restrictions make it less likely.

Wicklow Passport: A Wicklow Passport aimed at encouraging locals and visitors to explore Wicklow have been introduced by the Wicklow Tourism Alliance. Passport holders can collect various Wicklow Stamps and discover the activities, attractions, and hospitality on offer across the county. Loosely based on the 'Camino Passport' in Spain, the Wicklow Passport is a series of stamps that can only be collected at the respective towns or villages represented on each stamp. For example, you can only get the Shillelagh stamps at stamping locations around Shillelagh.

The Wicklow Passport can be purchased for €2 online at http://visitwicklow.ie/passport. Or can be collected free-of-charge from participating stamping locations, or through the Wicklow Libraries at Bray, Greystones, Arklow and Blessington. The list of stamping locations is available at http://visitwicklow.ie/passport by clicking on each icon.

The Wicklow Passport project was officially launched on the 20th of August. We achieved extensive online, radio and newspaper exposure over the following weeks. We currently count a network of 75 stamping locations through various businesses spread throughout the County. We have distributed more than 4000 Wicklow Passport through the Stamping Locations as well as through the libraries in Wicklow. Passports can be collected for free from any of the locations. The Wicklow Passport can be purchased for €2 from the visitwicklow.ie/passport portal, and over the first three weeks after the launch, more than 180 passports were mailed.

We are currently introducing a new stamp for Newtownmountkennedy which should be soon available from local businesses such as the Parkview Hotel, Wicklow Way Wine, Fisher's or the Druids Glen Resort.

Eco Trail: Unfortunately this year's Eco Trail edition has been cancelled due to Covid 19. It's obviously a huge disappointment but following from latest safety guidelines, it was impossible to safely run the event. There was very strong communication for the event though, with approximately 1550 registered runners, almost 500 more than last year. This shows the amazing interest that the event has generated for its second edition, and proves the viability of the event for the future. Furthermore, Ecotrail has generated an amazing level of interest for the destination and the sport here in Ireland and abroad.



It is intended to continue to use the Ecotrail platform to showcase our county as a fantastic outdoors destination.

Covid 19: Failte Ireland, Wicklow County Council, LEO Wicklow are providing a range of supports and advice for tourism providers and are following all advice and guidelines set out by NPHET and the Government.

Rural and Urban Regeneration Development Fund Grand Applications

There are currently three 2018 URDF projects underway; Arklow Historic Town Core, Wicklow Library and Fitzwilliam Square and the Bray Public Transport Bridge. URDF applications were also submitted in May 2020 for the Regeneration of the Arklow Quays, Bray Harbour Regeneration and the regeneration of Wicklow's Waterfront.

Wicklow County Council was awarded Category 2 funding of €357,750 in respect of Newtownmountkennedy for the design and plans for upgrades to the public realm, street landscaping, traffic management, public spaces and community facilities. The funding will be matched by a 25% contribution from the Council's resources bringing the investment to over €500,000. This funding builds on the €150,000 that Newtownmountkennedy received in 2018 from the Town and Village Enhancement Scheme, which funded streetscape improvements in the town. The closing date for the latest round of RRDF funding is 1st December 2020, when an application in respect of Rathdrum will be submitted.

Climate Action

Climate Action Applications have also been submitted in respect of Wicklow and Arklow Harbours aimed at ensuring both harbours can benefit from development of the offshore wind energy industry.

The Wicklow harbour application was submitted to apply for funding to develop the physical infrastructure in Wicklow harbour in order to accommodate crew transfer vessels servicing the offshore wind sector.

Similarly the application in respect of Arklow is to facilitate servicing of the offshore wind industry and to investigate the possibility of developing enterprise units for small businesses engaged in marine activities. Offshore wind has a cross governmental mandate secured through the delivery of the Climate Action Plan targets of 3.5 GW of offshore wind by 2030.



Maritime

Maritime Strategic Review for County Wicklow

The Strategic Review will identify ways in which the economic base of County Wicklow could be strengthened through its ports and harbours and formulate recommendation for Wicklow County Council.

Key Recommendations:

- To maximise the Offshore Wind Opportunity
- To investigate the feasibility of a new harbour facility at Wicklow
- Aquaculture Support
- Marketing Strategy for County Wicklow as a Coastal Tourist Destination

The Strategic Review is at the core of the applications for Climate Action and URDF funding.

Maritime Business Development Group

An Aquaculture working group has been established to work with industry experts and investigate the proposal to restore natural oyster reefs off the coast of County Wicklow.

The MBDG held their last meeting on 23rd July 2020 at which a presentation was given to the group by a delegation from the Codling Wind Park.

FLAG Funding

Wicklow County Council has supported applications for FLAG funding in respect of the Native Oyster Reef Restoration project and also in respect of a Wreck Fishing proposal.

The Native Oyster Reef Restoration (NORRI) project is a plan to establish self-sustaining native oyster habitats in the Irish Sea, in collaboration where possible, with Wind Energy and Coastal Defence Development. A workshop is planned for the end of March to publicise this project.

The Wreck fishing FLAG is an application supported by the Maritime Business Development Group. It is a proposal aimed at surveying current wreck fishing sites and eventually attracting leisure type fishing in these areas.

Approval has been granted for funding in respect of the Wreck Fishing project and the project is underway.



Food and Beverage Strategy

Wicklow County Council was awarded Leader funding for the implementation of the Food and Beverage Strategy.

- Preparation for Wicklow Feast Food Month
- Organisation of events calendar for the full month
- Preparation of document on Terms of Reference for each subgroup
- Preparation of mapping document outlining each group, leadership, key actions
- Delivery of events during Wicklow Food Month

- Issuing of questionnaires on the need for the Food incubation Centre
- Preparation of publicity material for Wicklow Food Month
- Application for legal status of Wicklow Naturally as a Company Limited by Guarantee

September 2020 Activities

- Schools are currently being recruited for the Student Enterprise Programme for school year 2020/2021. Cognisant of the restrictions and precautions outlined in national Covid 19 guidelines, online resources have been developed to help maximise participation with minimum phyiscal interaction between pupils.

- Extremely high volume of applications for the Trading Online Voucher are being accepted and assessed depending on budgets being available.



3. Planning and Development

Forward Planning

Regional Spatial & Economic Strategy for the Eastern and Midlands Regional Assembly 2019-2031 & Metropolitan Area Strategic Plan

The new Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy (RSES) for the Eastern and Midland Region (EMRA) came into effect on the 28th June 2019. This was subsequently subject to a Ministerial direction which was confirmed in January 2020. The final RSES and accompanying documentation is available at the following link: https://emra.ie/final-rses/

The requirement for a **Metropolitan Area Strategic Plan (MASP)** to be prepared for the Dublin metropolitan area as part of the RSES is set out in Project Ireland 2040 – National Planning Framework (NPF). The MASP provides a 12 to 20 year strategic planning and investment framework for the Dublin metropolitan area.

A MASP implementation group has been formed, with 'terms of reference' and governance structure agreed by the Regional Assembly in May 2020. The Implementation Group, whose function is to oversee progress on the implementation of the Dublin MASP, offers an opportunity for enhanced spatial coordination of land use planning and strategic infrastructure delivery in the Dublin metropolitan area. The Implementation Group will drive strategic housing, employment and regeneration opportunities that are identified in the MASP in tandem with the delivery of key public transport, enabling infrastructure and metropolitan scale amenities, in order to achieve targeted population and employment growth as set out in the accompanying RSES and NPF. The membership of the MASP Implementation group comprises representatives from each of the seven metropolitan local authorities, the Department of Housing Planning and Local Government (DHPLG) and key infrastructure, transport and enterprise agencies.

County Development Plan Review

Notice to review the current County Development Plan 2016 - 2022 and prepare a new County Development Plan 2021 - 2027 was given on the 6th November 2019. Closing date for submissions was Friday 10th January 2020. 156 submissions were received. All of the submissions are available to view on the website. The First Chief Executive's Report was issued to the Elected Members on Friday 12th June 2020. This Report forms part of the statutory procedure for the review of the existing plan and the preparation of the new plan. Its purpose is to report on the outcome of the statutory consultation process and to set out the Chief Executive's opinion on the issues raised in the submissions received. Directions regarding the preparation of the Draft County Development Plan were discussed at the September Council meeting. The Forward Planning team are now in the process of preparing the Draft County Development Plan. When finalised, it will be issued to the Members for their consideration prior to going on public display in 2021.

Heritage

- Together Apart Wicklow Stories 2020 Project: Ongoing for 2020.

Climate Action

An Implementation plan with actions from the Climate Adaptation Strategy and the Climate Charter are being developed by a task group of which M Cahill is a member. The draft Implementation Plan (guidance and templates for all LAs) will be submitted to environment committee of the CCMA for approval and rollout.

Pilot training for Climate Action Officers is being held in October and WCC County Council's Climate Action Officer will attend and will provide feedback to the CARO.

Priority Action items:

- Installation of EV Charging points in Greystones. 4 No. Chargers are proposed for Shoreline Greystones. There is a 6 week lead in time to delivery so installation is likely to happen early November 2020.
- Tree Policy to be drawn up for the County. Initial consultation underway and internal meeting on 9th June to progress this. – Three consultants were initially invited to tender to compile the Policy however none of the parties were interested in tendering – due to this a fourth consultant and UCD have been invited to tender. Awaiting submissions.
- Community Woodlands: All sections are asked to identify public lands which could be suitable for community woodlands. CARO will issue guidance on this project which is being funded by the DAFM.
- A submission has been made for funding of a research project by UCD and Trinity to look at nature based solutions for flood protection in the Upper Avoca Catchment. We await a response to the application for funding.



Environmental Awareness

A project to fund the collection, repair and shipping to Africa of old bikes is being funded under the Anti –Dumping Initiative. The Rotary Club, Bray is a partner in the project. The collection was held over two Saturdays in four locations including the recycling centres of Bray, Wicklow and Arklow and the Greystones Municipal District Office. Hundreds of bikes were donated exceeding the target set by the Rotary club of 200 bikes.

Wicklow County Council worked with Laois, Meath and Westmeath to develop an online version of the Stop Food Waste Challenge which was delivered by video on social media. Catherine Fulvio was the presenter for the four week series of videos which features some of her recipes as well as tips and advice on avoiding food waste. The first two videos were broadcast in July with the first video and the second two in August. 54,688 views of the posts were achieved with 14,433 following through to watching the videos.

The Relove fashion competition piloted successfully in 2019 in partnership with Meath, Westmeath and Dublin City Councils and the Rediscovery Centre in Ballymun was relaunched for 2020. Six more local authorities joined the competition a Wicklow County Council initiative, The focus is on producing wearable clothing design and good use of skill with textiles will be strengthened in the competition to develop circularity skills among students in textiles and fashion. Schools were notified about this year's competition so teachers can incorporate it into their planning for the year

Work has continued with the Wicklow PPN to explore the development of a mapping tool to record projects and actions that deliver on the Sustainable Development Goals. A first draft of the map was developed in house by the IT section. A seminar with the PPN is being planned for community groups in October which will introduce the Goals and the new mapping tool.

A new tree grant has been developed as a climate action to facilitate more planting of tree by local groups in County Wicklow. The grant was launched in August with a closing date for the 9th of October. The grant has attracted high levels of interest.

Funding was secured through the EPA's LAPN programme for a project to develop composting solutions for the management of the high levels of grass production which must be lifted when green space is being managed for pollinators. This project will help to facilitate Wicklow County Council's commitment to designate spaces for pollinators.

The annual Tidy Towns, Estates and Environmental Awards were launched at the beginning of July with a closing date set for the end of July for groups to submit applications. Judging was undertaken of entries.

Recycling Centres

A mattress amnesty was held in Bray Recycling Centre on 25th July 2020. This event allowed members of the public to bring up to 3 mattresses to the Recycling Centre for free on the day. This project was funded under the Anti-Dumping Initiative 2020 by the Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment. A total of 604 mattresses were collected on the day. A further Mattress Amnesty will be held in Arklow in early September.

Lifeguards

The Lifeguard season finished on 31st August for Wicklow Harbour and Arklow. Lifeguards will be on duty at the Blue Flag beaches for the first two weekends of September; on Bray South Promenade, Greystones, Brittas Bay North and Brittas Bay South.

Lifeguards are present on these beaches from 11am to 7pm daily.



Caravan Park Season

Caravan Park owners were written to in March 2020 and informed not to open due the Covid-19. Under the Government's accelerated roadmap to reopening Ireland, caravan parks reopened on June 29th. Applications have been received and all parks are being run in line with government guidelines.

Whitestown Remediation Project

Wicklow County Council have employed Fehily Timoney & Company to advise on the remediation of the site at Whitestown, in accordance with the judgments of Mr. Justice Humphreys.

- Priority Geotechnical Limited completed site Investigation on Friday 13th September and factual report received in January 2020- results of the site investigation will inform the proposed remediation plan which is scheduled for completion in November 2020.
- Website is up and running and regular updates will be made to keep the Public and Members informed of progress.
- Environmental risk assessments as per EPA guidance document and a draft remediation plan are currently being carried out.

Harbours and Ports

Ten cargo vessels berthed in Wicklow Port during August 2020. Nine of the cargo vessels had a single transaction while one was a double transaction. The imports included logs and timber while the exports were scrap metal and pulp.

There were no Marine Notices issued in August.

Pollution Control

- 10 Rivers were monitored at 28 stations involving 60 samples for compliance with environmental quality standards.

Water Framework Directive River Basin Management Plan

Pollution Control met with Local Authorities Water Programme Office Scientific Team to inform the selection of water bodies that require protection and restoration under River Basin Plan 2021-2027.

Executive Scientist to give presentation on progress/status of Wicklow's river water bodies to the forthcoming SPC and Council meetings.

Bathing Water Monitoring Programme

There are 6 designated bathing waters, 4 of which fly Blue Flags*, which will be monitored 10 times through the season until 15th September. Results for August are shown below. Poor results were obtained for Wicklow Harbour and South of Bray Harbour associated with rainfall events. 4 Bathing prohibition notices were issued upon HSE advice due to effect of rainfall events and damaged sewer in Bray in August.

A revised water grant scheme is now in operation effective from date of issue of Departmental Circular. This financial assistance is towards the improvement of water supply which is not wholesome or clean or is not sufficient to meet the domestic needs of a household in the opinion of the Housing Authority.

There are 3 categories of grant are available for houses of 7 year and older, a 100% treatment grant of €1,000, rehabilitation grant for pumps/well protection of 85% cost up to € 3,000 and a new well grant of 85% of cost up to € 5,000. 3 quotations for each grant category of work are required from tax compliant contractors.

The cost of sampling/testing the quality of the well where treatment is required may only be included under the treatment grant. The cost of testing the quantity of a well may be included under the new scheme.

Arklow Flood Relief Scheme

The Office of Public Works (OPW) and Wicklow County Council have commissioned Byrne Looby PH McCarthy (BLP) and Arup to undertake engineering and environmental studies respectively to assess and develop a viable, cost effective and sustainable Flood Relief Scheme for the Avoca River, Arklow.

The process of identifying a preferred scheme to address fluvial and coastal flooding in Arklow includes a detailed assessment of a range of flood risk management measures to determine their technical, economic, social and environmental viability.

Following a detailed scheme options assessment process, the series of measures that will make up the emerging preferred flood relief scheme for the Avoca River, Arklow have now been identified.

A number of changes in design have resulted in the need to update the Public realm drawings which has been carried out and presented to the Arklow District Members.

Following the confirmation of the preferred flood relief scheme an Environmental Impact Assessment Report will be prepared and submitted to An Bord Pleanala.

TII funded projects

N81 Knockroe Bend Realignment

The N81 Knockroe Bend Realignment project is located on the N81 south of Hollywood Cross and consists of the realignment of the N81 over a distance of 0.85km. The construction work commenced in August 2019 and the new alignment was opened to two way traffic on 24th July 2020. The overall construction work is expected to be completed during October 2020.

N11 Kilmacanoge Parallel Service Road

Phase 1 work in the median is currently nearing completion. Phase 1 involves the widening of the N11 into the central median on the southbound carriageway to provide an additional running lane. Progress has been slowed while working in the vicinity of an existing high pressure gas transmission main and other existing services.

Phase 2 will see the works switching to the verge side of the southbound carriageway, with traffic moving on to the new road surface, along with the construction of the Traffic Islands for the delineation of the Service Road. The construction of the concrete bases for the Gantries along the service road will be undertaken also during this phase.

It is anticipated that construction works will be complete by late 2020/early 2021.

N11/M11 Junction 4 to Junction 14 Improvement Scheme

Arup Consulting Engineers were appointed to progress the delivery of the N11/M11 Junction 4 to Junction 14 Improvement Scheme through Phases 1 to 4 of Transport Infrastructure Ireland's (TII) Project Management Guidelines (PMGs). The Outcome of Phase 1 Concept and Feasibility (Scheme Feasibility Report dated 28th November 2019) was that a strong justification for advancement of the project to Phase 2 existed. A number of feasible transportation measures meriting more rigorous assessment were identified, including road improvement options, demand management solutions and public transport alternatives.

Currently Arup are working on Phase 2 Options Selection which when completed should identify the preferred option, the announcement of the Emerging Preferred Corridor is estimated during Q4 2020. This date has been delayed due to the restrictions of access to the study area during March/April and part of May 2020. It is envisaged that an online Public Consultation Process will be conducted for the announcement of the Emerging Preferred Corridor during Q4 2020 and into Q1 2021.

Current active contracts are:

- Murphy Surveys :- Main Topographical Survey along the corridor options
- Roadplan Consulting Ltd:- Road Safety Audits along the corridor options
- GVA Donal O'Buachalla: Land and Property Valuation assessments



- Mc Cann Fitzgerald:- Legal Advice relating to Environmental Planning Law.
- Environmental Assessment including and topographical survey work for Phase 3 is also being progressed in tandem with the above.

Safety Improvement Schemes

Glendalough Junction - Ministerial Consent for Archaeological Assessment & Alignment Drawing complete. The extension of this Ministerial Consent for Construction has been granted. Site clearance works have commenced on site with construction works planned to start week commencing 21st September 2020.

Ballinaclash Junction - Consultant has been appointed and layout agreed. Construction works commenced on Thursday 3rd September 2020 with excavation works to the new alignment progressing well.

- Plans are underway with other Fire Training Centres and the National Directorate for Fire and Emergency Management on the resumption of Fire-fighting Skills (Recruit), Breathing Apparatus Wearers and Officer Courses commencing September. Wicklow County Fire Service will have a major role to play in setting a standard national approach for this training.

Register of Electors

The Franchise staff are continuing to work on database maintenance required to maintain the Register of Electors. Letters are continuing to be issued to electors to establish whether or not they are still resident at the address which they are registered to and the replies are being updated onto the Register or forwarded to other local authorities for registration at new addresses as required.

RFA forms are being issued to new estates and houses that have been sold in Wicklow since February 2020. Contact has also been made with Nursing Homes in the County to update their Disabled Special Voters List.

We have established a highly visible social and print media campaign to raise awareness of the upcoming 2021/2022 Draft Register of Electors and for those who wish to receive a postal vote from home on the grounds of ill health/cocooning due to Covid-19. We have contacted the Year Heads of all the 5th and 6th Year Classes in all the Secondary Schools in Wicklow to register students who will reach 18 on or before 15th February 2021.

Due to the Covid-19 Emergency and restrictions there will be no Fieldworkers carrying out work on the Draft Register of Electors for 2021/2022.

Refurbishment Works

Works are continuing in the County Buildings. New floors have been laid in the Foyer and in the Seminole room. Public toilets have been tiled and are now been fitted out with sanitary ware. The Seminole room has been refurbished. New kitchenette has been fitted opposite the Cathaoirleach's office. Roof above the kitchenette has been cut out for a new skylight.

New steel beams and new joist have been fitted in the Council chamber; area for 5 new skylights has been cut out of the roof. Work is continuing on insulating and repairing the roof area. Moston are beginning to work on the floor area in the Chamber.

Customer Service Innovation Hub

- New security glass has been fitted; new glass walls are now erected. We are at snag list stage and it is scheduled to be complete in the next few weeks.
- Some of the new furniture has been delivered.

Works are almost complete on the new Clinic Rooms (these are located where they old Planning/Environment and Housing counter was).

Completion date for the full project including the Council Chamber is scheduled for December. Holding the first Council meeting there in January (if Covid 19 restrictions are lifted).



Communication

Communication has been a vital tool in our organisation, especially over the challenging last few months. Due to the need for us all to maintain social distancing alternative methods of holding and administrating meetings had to be introduced. Various technologies such as Microsoft Teams, Zoom and Cisco WebEx have been tested and deployed throughout the organisation, depending on the business need.

Our key objective is to ensure that there is clear, consistent and appropriate communication between Wicklow County Council and all Staff. Communication has been delivered through Microsoft Teams and other technologies such as Zoom, as well as our traditional methods, such as e-mail and text alerts.

The *Quality Customer Service Network* invited us to submit an Excellence in Customer Service Case Studies at the beginning of September; this gave us an opportunity to showcase the innovation initiatives we have delivered in Wicklow, over the last few months, carried out by the hard work of our colleagues. The focus was based on service delivery in our community, such as: Improving services for our customers; Making services more accessible and Innovation through digital and people.



Six Month Rates Waiver: A 100% waiver of commercial rates will be applied for a 6-month period from 27 March 2020 to 27 September 2020 to all ratepayers except a small number of categories. The waiver will be applied as a credit in lieu of rates for the 6-month period covered in 2020. The excluded categories are mainly utilities, banks, large supermarkets and corporates.

There is no application process required for this scheme. Wicklow County Council will automatically apply a 100% credit in lieu of commercial rates, for a six-month period, to classes and categories of occupied rateable property where the occupying business is not in an excluded category. In the event that a business qualifies for the six-month credit in lieu of rates and the business has already paid their full rates bill for 2020, a refund or credit will be arranged by the Council.
