The Overseer reported Coolgreaney Road cleaned up and macadam spread. Abbey Street is being cleaned and macadam about to be spread. Direct Labour Staff satisfactory during month.

The Secretary, Irish Tourist Association, Dublin, forwarded circular letter asking for particulars of roads in locality requiring attention from Tourist Development Point of view.

The letter was referred to the local Tourist Development Committee for their attention.

The following Roads business was transacted at the Monthly Meeting of the Arklow Urban District Council held on the above date.

Arising out of the Finance Committee's report, the Council went into Committee on a letter dated 27th ult. received from MR. D.H.O'Leary, Solicitor, regarding an alleged complaint from Dr. Maloney, Ferrybank, stating that damage had been caused to hid land by the Council through the opening of a gullet or culvert, and also that water from adjoining streets through gratings not being kept cleared, had been allowed to flow on to the land. His (Mr.O'Leary's) instructions were to take proceedings if the matter complained of were not remedied.

The Clerk stated on receipt of above letter he sent a copy of same to the Town Surveyor for his investigations.

In connection with this matter the Direct Labour

Staff Overseer reported that one of the Councillors drew his
attention to a sewer in Seaview Avenue which had become silted
up and houses in the neighbourhood flooded in consequence.

On his (Overseer's) instructions Carter Snell cleared it.

The Town Surveyor in a report dated 31st ult. stated he had made a careful examination of the place and could find no damage done to property, and recommended the matter be referred to the Council's Solicitor.

A discussion taking place the Council's Solicitor advised that as no damage had been caused he could not see how damages could be awarded.

The Solicitor was directed to reply to the allegations put forward by the Complainant's Solicitor.

As regards the above matter and arising out of same the Surveyor stated the building erected by Dr. Maloney was not a house within the meaning of the Bye-laws, and submitted a copy of Notice which he intended serving therein. "Approved."

Mrs. Alice Myler, 36 Fair Green, applied for permission to erect a railing in front of her house. The Surveyor stated he had given permission subject to the sanction of the Council. "Approved."

A memorial was received from the occupiers of

Meadows Place pointing out that shore in front of houses in
a very insanitary condition and asking same might be improved
by putting down a covered shore.

The Memorialists also pointed out that the improvement would be in the interests of Tourist Development and many Visitors stayed there in the Summer and the present Shore was an eye-sore.

The work was referred to the Surveyor to prepare specification, also for side drain on South side of Tinahask Street, reported December Meeting, which was unsightly and insanitary; and tenders to be obtained.

As tegards the Council's Horse-Brush which was not being used the Town Surveyor pointed out that owing to the spreading of stones on the streets in the Winter period the Brush could not be utilised, and in the Summer period the Brush was not necessary.

It was suggested that the Brush be sold, but it was decided to retain same for the present and estimate for repairs to be obtained.
