Copy Queries and opinion of Counsel

1. Is Mr Price at present the duly appointed Surveyor of the Bray Commissioners and if so on what terms.

1. In my opinion Mr. Price is at present the duly appointed Surveyor of the Bray Commissioners. Under the conditions of Mr. Price's appointment, I am of opinion that his appointment was for a year and then by one months notice on either side. As Mr. Price's appointment was not put an end to at the end of the first year, it cannot now be terminated before the end of the second year, and then on one months notice terminating at the end of the 2nd year and so on from year to year.

2. Should a resolution be now adopted re-appointing Mr. Price for the current year.

2. I do not think a resolution appointing Mr. Price for the 2nd year is necessary. His appointment not having been terminated by Notice at the end of the first year, he retains the appointment for second year without the necessity for any resolution.

3. In the event of such a resolution not being adopted would Commissioners be safe in signing cheques for the two months salary due.

4. And Counsel will generally advise Commissioners as to any other matter which may occur to him.

3. & 4. As already stated I am of opinion that Mr. Price is validly appointed until the end of the 2nd year and the Commissioners will be safe in signing cheques for his salary during all that period.

With reference to the Declaration prescribed by section 8 of the Towns Improvement Clauses Act 1847 I am of opinion that the omission by Mr. Price to make this Declaration does not invalidate his

appointment. There is no penalty prescribed for omitting to make this declaration. I think however that the Chairman (Mr. Plunkett) before whom Mr. Price made the declaration in October 1897 ought to have accepted it, and may safely do so now.

4973 The minutes of meetings of 16th and 23rd May were read and confirmed.

Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Rossiter and O'Byrne tendered a written protest against the minutes being signed which the Board declined to accept.

4974 The minutes of General Purposes Committee of 27th May 1898 were read.

4975 Letter dated 1st June from W. R. G. Pilkington and copy of letter dated 6th May from W. James S. McCormick addressed to the chairman of the Dublin, Wicklow & Wexford Railway Company drawing attention to the great injustice which the existing scale of Railway charges imposed on the Township read.

W. Langton proposed:-

"That a letter be written to the Dublin, Wicklow and Wexford Railway Company pointing out the injustice imposed on Bray by existing fares"

Sir Henry Cochrane seconded the motion.

There voted for:- the Chairman, Sir H. Cochrane, Mess<sup>rs</sup> McCormick, McFarland, Condren, Langton, O'Reilly & Clifton (8), against:- Mess<sup>rs</sup> Rossiter and O'Byrne (2). The motion was adopted.

4976 Accounts for extra water used for other than domestic purposes for quarter ended 31st March, reports from Engineer, bye-laws, schedule of charges &c in re water question submitted.

The question of charges for water used for other than domestic purposes having been considered at length:-

It was proposed by W. Martin Langton and seconded by W. Clifton:-

"That the schedule of charges as submitted be adopted and enforced with the reservation that in all cases where the supply is by meter and used both for trade and domestic purposes there shall be deducted from the consumption the statutory allowance of water for the family and domestic servants of every such trader and that the excess consumption only be charged for at the rate of 1/- per thousand gallons from 1st January 1898."

W. Plunkett moved and W. O'Reilly seconded as an amendment:-

"That the schedule of charges prepared by this Board as specified be levied, in all cases, on persons using water for other than domestic purposes with the exception of Hotels, Bottlers, Bakers and Coal Merchants who shall be charged by Meter. Allowance to be made for population. The charges to be put into force this year commencing 1st January. Charges per meters to be 6d per 1000 gals if legal. Of compulsory 1/- to be charged."

There voted for the amendment:- Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Plunkett, O'Byrne, Rossiter and O'Reilly (4), against:- Mess<sup>rs</sup> Langton, McCormick, McFarland, Clifton and Condren (5).

The amendment being lost the original resolution was put and carried on same division.  
It was ordered that the schedule of charges should be printed and distributed.

Letter dated 21st May from Local Government Board in reference to the bye-laws proposed to be adopted by the Commissioners concerning water, and naming certain alterations and additions which should be made in the bye-laws.

Read and ordered:-

Bye-laws to be amended as directed

4976 Letters dated 25th May and 3rd June from the Secretary Waterworks Committee Dublin Corporation stating that it had been reported to the Committee that the Commissioners had, at various times, taken water from a hydrant or a pipe the property of Dublin Wicklow and Wexford Railway Company for the purpose of street watering. This he alleged was in contravention of sec. 49 of the Bay Township Act 1866 and the Committee desired that such a practice be discontinued. Read.

4977 A report was read from Mr. George M. Harris, Electrical Engineer recommending the adoption of a sliding scale of charges for consumers of Electric Current.

Mr. Langton proposed and Mr. O'Reilly seconded the scale of 6<sup>d</sup> reducing to 3½<sup>d</sup> per Board of Trade Unit be adopted.

The motion was carried Mr. Rossiter dissenting.  
Mr. Rossiter handed in notice of motion for next meeting in re reducing price of current to 4<sup>d</sup> per unit and 4<sup>d</sup> per quarter for meters.

Reports dated 3rd and 4th June 1898 from Mr. Harris submitting estimates for wiring to Alexandra Ice - £8.8.0, Mr. Whitsitt's house on Esplanade - £7.2.0, and Mr. Fanning's house 11 Eglington Road - £7.13.6, and also submitting requisition for stores required read. Mr. Harris

recommended the adoption of the estimates and ordering of stores.

Of course it is not a "tourist" harbour. I never heard of such an extraordinary idea. The Harbour was built as I know, for the protection of the fishermen on the coast. I never heard of any tourists arriving by the Harbour, such an idea is quite absurd, and I cannot imagine where Mr Balfour can have got his information from as to such a thing. I know it to be used by colliers and fishing boats, and I have never seen such a thing as a tourist steamer go in there at all. It is not fitted for that kind of traffic, but is a great assistance to fishermen like Sherries and other small harbours on the coast.

You can show this letter to Mr Balfour - No one has more opportunity of seeing the Harbour and its contents than I have, living so near Bray and constantly passing it on the Railway to Dublin.

5121a Report dated 30th July from Engineers in  
re proposed preparation of concrete blocks  
for wave breakers to be placed outside  
the Harbour Piers in the event of the  
foundations becoming exposed by scour. At  
present there was no indication of any  
dangerous scour but in the absence of infor-  
mation as to the foundations it was impossible  
to vouch for the permanent stability of  
the work. The suggestion to build concrete  
steps on Southern Pier from Storm Wall to  
Quay he did not recommend, as the steps  
would curtail width of Quay. He suggested  
that a galvanized iron ladder should be fixed

That an offer be made to the D.W & W Railway Company to pump their water (for locomotive purposes) into a tank to be placed over Mr O'Bynes furniture store on the following basis:-

(A) For a fixed payment of £100 per annum to pump a supply of any amount up to 25,000 gallons per day.

(B) Any pumping over and above 25,000 gallons per day to be paid for at the rate of 2d per 1000 gallons pumped.

(C) The Commissioners to have the right to take water as at present from four hydrants on railway main (old or new) or from tank in Church Terrace for watering streets.

(D) The Company to be permitted to lay a new as requested the old main to become the property of the Commissioners.

(E) In the event of the agreement being held at any time to be ultra vires, no action for breach of contract to lie against the Commissioners.
