An adjourned meeting of Bray Township Commissioners was held in the Town Hall Bray at 10 am on Monday 22 August 1898.

5133 The minutes of meeting of 8th August were read and confirmed.

5134 The minutes and report of Electric Light Committee were read and adopted.

5135 The minutes and report of General Purposes Committee were read and adopted.

5136 Circular dated 18th August from Sir David Harvel enclosing copy of order in Council dated 16th August re Transitory Provisions Local Government (Ireland) Act. Referred to Town Clerk.

5137 Pursuant to notice of motion Mr Rossiter moved and Mr O'Byrne seconded "That consumers of electric current are in future to have meters at the reduced charge of 1/- quarterly or 4/- yearly (minimum charge to be 4/- payable in first quarter)"

Passed unanimously

5138 Letter dated 12th August from Mr N. J. Harmon in re accident to Mr John Ryan's horse and stating that as Messrs O'Byrne and

Bondrin (deputation appointed to settle matter) could not agree, his client had no other option left him except to proceed with his action.

Read

A report was received from Messrs O'Byrne and Bondrin recommending that a sum of £11·5·0 be paid to Mr John Ryan in full settlement of his claim and costs for injury to horse.

Ordered:- £11·5·0 to be offered in full settlement of claim and costs without prejudice.

5139 Letter dated 13th August from Mr Maurice Knight in re water supply for cottage on Boghall Road & asking if Lord Meth consented to bear half the expense would the Commissioners lay a water main to the immediate neighbourhood of the cottage.

Referred to engineer for report.

5140 Letter dated 1st August from Mr James Whiston applying for a Hackney Carriage Licence.

Granted

5141 Letter dated 16th August from Messrs W MacFarlane and Co asking an immediate settlement of their account for urinal &c £50·12·0.

Your Clerk to write to Messrs MacFarlane asking if they would exchange urinal for two smaller ones.

5144 Letter dated 20th Aug from Messrs David Drumie and Son in re insurance of workmen &c. Consideration postponed.

5145 Letters dated 22nd August from Messrs A. McDonnell and Sons asking the Commissioners to extend the main at Dock Terrace.

Messrs Baird's tender for supplying and laying 380 yards 3" main, one bend 3" main, one sluice valve 3", 3 hydrants and covers 3" at Harbour for £84·7·6 was submitted

Ordered:- accepted for main across Bridge to North Pier.

5146 A tender was received from Messrs Baird for supplying and laying 249 yards 3" water main with necessary valves &c. on Church Road and also 50 yards 2" water main with one 3" + 2" branch, one 2" + 2" branch one 3" hydrant &c for £67·2·6. Referred to Engineer.

5147 William Lee Water Inspector and Frank Murphy were called before the Board in re waste of water near Fair Green.

After hearing the explanation of Lee and Murphy.

The Chairman moved that Frank Murphy be suspended for one week for neglect of duty. The motion was not seconded and the matter dropped.

It was ordered that the engineer should in future see that all lead supply pipes were properly covered.

5148 The Town Clerk was directed to write to Local Government Board and ascertain if any annual elections should be held in October in re seats now vacant on Board
