To the Chairman and Commissioners

Bray Township.

Gentlemen

I beg to submit for your information
copies of Public Health Acts Amendment Act
and the Open Spaces Act of last session which
have been forwarded through the Local Government
Board.

The first mentioned is a very important act
the adoption of which would confer some useful
powers on Bray Urban Authority.

There are five parts in the act all or
any of which may be adopted should the Com-
missioners deem it advisable

The following is a synopsis of its provisions—

Part I This portion of act is general and refers principally
to mode of procedure for adoption and carrying
out of act

Part II Gives power to the Local Authority to make bye-laws
and regulations for prevention of danger in
reference to use of posts and wires for
telegraphs lighting telephones signaling &c and
authorizes the inspection of apparatus used for
such purposes

Part III Under this part of act many useful powers
are conferred upon the Local Authority viz—

A Power to prevent any person from allowing any

injurious matter to pass into any sewer
or drain leading thereto such as chemical
refuse waste steam condensing or heated
water &c.

B To erect sanitary conveniences levy a charge
for use of same or rent them for a period
not exceeding three years.

C To make bye-laws prescribing the hours at
which any offensive matter should pass
through streets

D To provide proper boardings at buildings
and erection by builder of a temporary
footpath properly railed and lighted.

E To control places of public resort and enforce
the making of proper exits from such
places

F To control the management of shooting
galleries whirligigs erection of public
platforms &c

G To provide shelters for cat and cartmen

H To plant trees along roads &c

I To close parks or pleasure grounds for 14
days in each year and to hire same
from time to time.

J To license boatmen and make bye-laws &c

Part IV This part of act gives power to Magistrates in
reference to licensed premises used for music
and dancing but does not give any add-
itional power to the Local Authority in the
matter.

Part V Gives power for consolidation of debts and
creation of stock. The Commissioners have
similar powers under their own act of last
session but there could not be any objection
to the adoption of this additional power.

A month's notice should be given of intention
to move any resolution adopting act and
I am of opinion that it would be advisable

to adopt all parts of the act except part 4
which does not appear to give any power
to the Local Authority.

The "Open Spaces Act" has very little if
any application to Draf so far as I
can see at present.

The other papers referred to by me refer to
the Infectious Diseases Acts and application
for provisional orders. The Commissioners
have not shown any inclination to adopt
the forms and I do not think that the new
regulations in reference to provisional orders
can effect anything before this Board
at present unless it is decided to take
lands or premises by compulsion for Public
Baths.
