The minutes of meeting & special meeting of 15<sup>th</sup> June; adjourned special meeting of 22<sup>nd</sup> June and special meeting of 26<sup>th</sup> June were read & confirmed.

It was ordered that interest & wages cheques should be signed & some small account which had been referred to Finance Committee paid.

Letters &c of Public Health Committee (who had not met) were read & orders made in committee book.

The deputation which had been appointed in the matter informed the Boards that satisfactory arrangements had been made for settlement of Gas Comp's accounts.

The Town Clerk advised that deductions to the amount of £129-13-4 might be made from account as originally turned on one item of the deductions (Electric Cable) the Company might still claim £12-19-2. These deductions would bring the account down to £1344-14-7.

It was proposed by Mr Coffey seconded by Mr O'Brien & adopted:-

"That a Cheque be drawn in favour of the Allianee Gas Co for £1344-14-7 to pay all accounts furnished up to date."

Mr Cullinan (Chief Secretary's Office) wrote enclosing draft for £44-16-11 being balance of amount payable to the Commissioners as Road Authority in respect of the Probate Duty paid for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March last. Draft rejected by Commissioners & passed for lodgment.

The Solicitor to the Commissioners (Casey & Clay) in re taxation of Parliamentary Costs (act of 1890) wrote stating that

Plans &c submitted by Mr Thomas Dayle re alterations at No 2 onam St and letter from Mr J. Dixon re removal of material from bed of river were referred to Engineer for report.

It was ordered that Mr Glancy should be instructed to advise the commissioners immediately on Arbitration notwithstanding award in re Bray & Enniskerry Railway & Dray bridge.

Mr R. Smyth wrote asking the commrs to extend sewer in Novara so as to drain the new houses he was building there. Ordered request to be complied with.

The Solicitor of the Commissioners was directed to write to the Lub-Sheriff asking him to obtain immediate possession of yards of messrs Cuthberts required for Harbour Works.

A letter received from Mr G. Dodd in re erecting a small enclosure opposite his house on Bray Common was referred to Superintendent.

A letter having been read from Mr. Robert Smittle re state of portion of footpath in West Ward:-

It was proposed by Mr. McFarland seconded by Mr. McCormick and adopted:-

"That the footpath between Miss O'Rileys and Mr. R. Smittle's Main St be kept and a width not exceeding 14 feet flagged or concreted work to be carried out by superintendent"

A letter from Mr. Dodd re enclosure at his house on Bray Commons and Superintendent's report in the matter were referred to the Chairman and Mr. Dunn for observations.

A report having been read from the Engineer in reference to supervision of Haston Works stating that they understood that they were to be allowed a commission of 5% on outlay, 3% being paid at commencement and remainder during progress of works. A Clerk of works was to be required - It was proposed by Mr. McCormick seconded by Mr. Jackson and adopted:-

"That the Town Clerk advertise for the carriage of suitable persons to act as Clerk of Works at the Haston Works under the supervision of the Engineer. Salary two guineas per week."

Conditions of employment and duties to be settled by the Engineer in conjunction with Town Clerk"

Estimated for purchase of old engine and various accounts received were referred to Finance Committee and Treasurers Division & Bankers account to Engineer.

It was proposed by Mr. McFarland and seconded by Mr. Coffey:-

"That the warrant for collection of Rates for 1891 be sealed and signed and issued to Mr. Benjamin Keay for collection at the rate of six pence in the pound"

Messrs. Casey & Co. collectors to Commissioners re iteration of Parliament's Cocks' works enclosing a letter received from Messrs. George Keay for suggesting a meeting of Council to discuss items in Bill of Costs. Ordered Messrs. Casey & Co. to carry out their instructions.

The attention of Superintendent was drawn to gates opposite No 14 Main St and to state of adobe Daff Road, Church Road, & Bridge St

\* he was ordered to see that the carts were put in shed when not in use.

A report from Mr. Comber in Mr. Dixon's proposal to remove material from the bed of river was received & marked read. Town Clerk to write to Mr. Dixon

Plans and specification submitted on behalf of Mr. Butler for alterations at 1102 Main St were approved of on the recommendation of Mr. Comber - an outlet ventilator to be provided for sewer in yard. The plans to be referred to superintendent.

Superintendent's report re sewer from Royal Marine Hotel was read & referred to Public Health Comm.

Mr Coffey gave notice that he would move for the appointment of a Harbour Comm at next meeting.
