- 1360 The minutes of meeting of 15th May and special meeting of 29th May were read and confirmed.
- 1361 The reports of Subsanitary Officer and Water Inspector were read and usual orders made.
- 1362 Messrs John D'Arcy & Son Anchor Brewery Dublin wrote stating that they should not be asked to pay any portion of expenses for laying water main to their premises at Church Terrace but as they should have water they were willing to contribute £2. It was decided that order of the Board already made in the matter should be adhered to.

It was reported that Messrs D'Arcy were proceeding with erection of buildings the plans of which had not been approved of, and it

was ordered that the owners and contractor should be warned that they incurred considerable risk in so doing.

1363 A circular was received from the Under Secretary enclosing form of certificate to be given to Inspectors appointed under the Shop Hours Act 1892.
Read.

1364 The Engineer reported that sheds erected at Kennys Lane were an encroachment and objectionable from a sanitary point of view.
It was ordered that notices for their removal should be served immediately.

1365 Messrs John D Carnegie & Co wrote enclosing necessary deed transferring £200 of the Bray Township 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ % Redeemable Stock from Messrs Wm A. Mahony and Patk J Kiwan to Robert Denham Robson Esq. 4 Munster St. Phibsboro Dublin. The transfer was duly executed and the necessary certificate sealed and issued accordingly.

1366 Consideration of communications &c in reference to Irish Education Act 1892 was further postponed.

1367 Mr Robert Martin wrote asking to have space opposite Post Office Main St concreted and stating that he was willing to contribute half the expense.

1368 A letter from Mr Craig Solr with reference to instructions he had received from Engineer in re removal of dilapidated house at Chapel Lane Little Bray and Town Clerks

reply thereto having been read it was ordered that Town Clerk should see that Mr Comber carried out the orders of the Board in the matter.

1369 The Secretary Local Government Board wrote asking for returns in reference to Local Taxation Statistics. Supplied.

1370 The following resolution was proposed by Mr M. McCormick seconded by Mr Langton:-
"That the proceeds of Harbour Rate be credited to Harbour Account and transferred to required to Loan Fund Account for payment of dividends or other purposes."
Passed unanimously.

1371 The Postmistress (Bray) wrote acknowledging receipt of complaints in reference to wheeling of postal barrow on footpaths and stating that the matter would receive attention.
Read.

1372 Pursuant to advertisements the following tenders were received for construction of new road without sewerage works to Novara Avenue via Doyle's cottage viz: -

Messrs Brady & Sons tender dated 9th May of £225 for construction of new road with sewerage works which was considered at last meeting was also submitted.

It was proposed by Mr McCormick and seconded by Mr O'Byrne: -

"That Brady's tender dated 9th May 1893 for construction of new road and sewer at Novara be accepted at £225 for complete work, subject to a bond being executed for the due performance of the contract, secured by sureties to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk. No extra work to be executed without the authority of the Board. The work not to be commenced without written orders from the Town Clerk.

Passed.

The Town Clerk was instructed not to give orders for construction of road until the necessary deed of conveyance of land was executed.

1373

A letter was read from Mr Devaynes Smith drawing attention to the action of parties depositing rubbish on foreshore opposite Bray Head Hotel. Read.

1374

The Registrar Petty Sessions Clerks wrote stating that he had lodged £18-1-3 to credit of Comms being proportion of surplus of Dog License Duty for current year due Bray Township.

1375

Letters were read from Mrs Morgan; Messrs Mordaunt, Solicitors &c objecting to erection of Esplanade Shelters opposite Prosvravn.

A report from Special Comms appointed in the matter was also read.

The reports was adopted and the Commissioners unanimously declined to alter sites.

1377

Mr A. E. Porte wrote informing Commissioners

he had inspected Electric Light arrangements &c in Bray and had a report thereon ready for Mr Keogh. Read

1381

A report was read from Messrs Strype & Lomber, Harbour Engineers setting forth the work which had been done since last meeting and enclosing a certificate in favour of Contractor for £975.

The following resolution was proposed by Mr Langton seconded by Mr McCormick:

"That a cheque be drawn in favour of W. J. Doherty Esq for £975 as certified by Engineers on account of Bray Harbour Contract."

Passed unanimously.

Messrs Strype & Lomber wrote offering to accept the reduced sum of £37-10-0 for extra work done in preparing Harbour plans for Board of Trade, attending before arbitrator and other matters in connection with new works. It was ordered that the account should be paid.

1384

Correspondence between Solicitor & Town Clerk in reference to taxation of Mr Slattery's costs having been read it was ordered that the matter should be left in the hands of Mr Keogh.

1385

Mr Lomber sent in special report in reference to Sea Wall, Ladies' Baths &c. Read

1386

It was proposed by Mr Langton seconded by Mr Plunkett:—

"That man be employed for keeping the Esplanade in order, seats clean,

"and trespassers off. No basket-women or boys selling fruit &c to be allowed to remain on walk or grounds."

Passed unanimously.

1388 The Town Clerk was directed to advertise for a temporary Overseer for Township by next meeting.

1389 A memorial was received signed by a great number of residents and ratepayers drawing attention to the hardship imposed on owners of luggage carts in being prevented from standing at back gate of Railway Station.

It was decided that the Chairman should endeavour to induce the Railway Company to allow them to stand in Railway Yard.

1390 The Town Clerk was directed to write to the Engineer stating that Commissioners were surprised at not receiving reports in reference to Sherman's house and bridge at Harbour as promised.

1391 Attention having been drawn to the fact that the grooves in blocks of Harbour Pier did not meet each other in some cases:

It was ordered that the Town Clerk should ask the Engineers for an explanation in the matter.

1392 Messrs Guinness, Mahon & Co wrote asking for a certificate of their holding of Bray Township 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent stock. Certificate sealed and issued accordingly.

1393 The Town Clerk submitted block plans of

John Brien wrote drawing the attention of the Commissioners to the fact that he had not as yet received any allowance for acting as Overseer during the illness of the late James Connell.

On the motion of Mr Plunkett seconded by Mr O'Byrne it was decided to allow John Brien £2 for acting as Overseer and John Doyle £1 for keeping workmen's time, making out paysheets and Overseers accounts.

1464

The Town Clerk submitted copies of notices received from Mr Keogh and Messrs Casey & Clay in re Traverse of the Arbitrator's award by Messrs Cuthbert.

It was ordered that Mr Keogh

should take all necessary steps to defend the Commissioners' interests in the matter at ensuing assizes.

1465 Consideration of Mr Gow's motion in re printing of minutes and Committee reports was postponed in order to enable Town Clerk to obtain an estimate of the cost.

1466 Letter received from Messrs Casey & Clay in reference to Mr Keogh's costs was submitted and marked "Read".

1467 Mr Wm Slattery wrote asking for payment of cost of writ issued in re Bray & Ey. Railway Account. Ordered: - Town Clerk to remind Mr Slattery of the circumstances under which the expense was incurred and to state that the Commrs consider that he therefore should not ask for the cost of the writ.

1468 The Commissioners granted permission to Mr Copeland to produce his entertainment on Esplanade on condition that he would withdraw on receiving twenty-four hours notice.

1469 Mr C. A. Dufresne wrote complaining of the nuisance and annoyance caused by erection of Switchback Railway on Bray & Enniskerry Railway property near International Hotel. It was ordered that Town Clerk should serve notices on Mr Frederick McCreagh and Mr Alfred Hillingley, Directors of the Bray & Enniskerry Railway requesting them to cause the removal of the concerns within twenty-four hours

and warning them that in default proceedings would be taken against them to protect the interests of the ratepayers and the public.

1470 A report was read signed by Mr Jackson and Mr Breslin on behalf of deputation which waited on Water Works Committee in reference to consumption of water in the township. The report was adopted and it was ordered that a copy should be sent to Water Works Committee.

It was also decided that an Assistant Water Inspector should be appointed for three weeks.

1471 The Misses Adelaide & Annie Nolan wrote asking for certificate of their holding in Bray Township Redeemable Debenture Stock. Certificate sealed and issued.

1472 Mr Devaynes Smyth wrote drawing the attention of the Commissioners to the erection of canvas tent on waste plot of ground south of Fontenoy Terrace.

It was decided to cause removal of tent if it became a nuisance.

A letter having been read from Messrs Molloy & Molloy in reference to obtaining for the Commissioners of a site for new road to Novara other than that for which presentment was passed at Spring Assizes of current year: -

Dr Toomey proposed and Mr Gow seconded: -

"That the presentment be carried out and that the workmen of

" the Commissioners be instructed to take down the wall."

Mr Plunkett proposed and Mr O'Byrne seconded as an amendment: -

" That all matters connected with road to Novara stand over till next meeting and that due notice be given to each member of the Board."

There voted "for" the amendment: - Messrs Plunkett, Condren, & O'Byrne, (3); "against" - Messrs Breslin, Toomey, Gow, & Capt. Patrickson (4).

The Chairman declared the amendment lost. Mr Plunkett then proposed and Mr O'Byrne seconded as a further amendment: -

" That this Board will decide on running road straight to Novara via Arno House if Mr Molloy Solicitor will have all matters arranged satisfactorily on behalf of owners by next meeting of the Board."

There voted "for": - Messrs Plunkett, Condren, & O'Byrne, (3); "against", - Messrs Breslin, Gow, Toomey, & Capt. Patrickson, (4).

The amendment was accordingly lost and the original motion carried, there voting "for": - Messrs Breslin, Gow, Toomey, Patrickson (4) "against" - Messrs Plunkett, Condren, & O'Byrne (3).

The Chairman who did not vote in any of the divisions declared the motion carried.

1474 Town Clerk informed the Board that it was necessary to have Rate Book revised for ensuing elections. Consideration of the matter was postponed until next meeting.

1475 Capt. Patrickson handed in notice of motion to create £1000 Bray Township Redeemable

Stock, (Harbour Loan) for next meeting.

1476 Town Clerk applied for and was granted three days leave of absence.

1477 Mr Keogh wrote enclosing what purported to be a Dr. and Cr. Account in re Parliamentary Costs (1881 Act).

The Commissioners decided that a complete Dr & Cr. Account to date should be furnished, and that the matter should be left in the hands of Mr. Lloy.

1478 A communication having been received from Mr Comber in the matter it was ordered that shed in Henry's Lane should be removed.

1479 Mr Comber wrote stating that Mr Plunkett had promised to have men at work at houses corner of Chapel Lane, Little Bray, on Monday 17th Inst. Read.

1480 It was ordered that the Southern Band Stand should be lighted by electricity.

1481 The Caretaker of Esplanade wrote stating that Miss Townsend and other parties were in habit of holding religious services on Esplanade and Sea Wall.

It was ordered that religious services of all kinds should be prohibited on Sea Wall and Esplanade; Miss Townsend to be advised accordingly.

1482 The Overseer reported having examined man-hole in Sidminton Avenue when he found sewer in Henry's Lane working

satisfactorily.

1483

The Rev^d Robert Seymour wrote drawing attention of Commissioners to a nuisance caused by deposit of refuse on site of Bray & Enniskerry Railway at back of his houses on Seapoint Road. Referred to Sanitary Sub Officer.

The caretaker of Peoples Park attended and handed in a list of parties who played football in Peoples Park on previous day in contravention of Commissioners' orders in the matter. It was ordered that Mr Keogh should institute legal proceedings against the offenders.

Mr O' Byrne proposed and Mr Breslin seconded:—

There voted "for" the motion: - Ald. Sir Hy Cochrane Messrs Breslin, Hennessy, Mr Cormick, Mr Farland Low and Capt. Patrickson & Chairman (8).

The Chairman declared the motion carried.

It was also decided to issue a special circular to all householders in the matter.
