Mr Robert Hammond Consulting Electrical Engineer and Mr Drew Electrical Engineer were present.

The Council proceeded to consider matters in re appointment of Electrical Engineer.

It was decided that the following conditions should apply to the appointment:-

1) The person appointed shall devote his whole time to the business of the Council.

2) He shall reside in Gray, and a month's notice on either side shall terminate the appointment.

3) He shall be responsible to the Council for all matters connected with the working of the Electricity Department both inside and outside the works, and keep such books and make such returns as may be from time to time required by the Council or Electric Light Com<sup>tee</sup>.

4. He shall discharge such engineering or other duties as the Council may from time to time prescribe.

5. He shall report regularly to the Council or Electric Light Com<sup>tee</sup> in reference to all matters requiring

attention, and in urgent cases to the Clerk of the Council, through whose office, orders of the Council + Committee and all correspondence with the public Contractors or others shall pass.

6. He shall inspect once a week at least, all plant, fittings and works in his charge, and see that all Telephones + Electric Bells connecting the works with Railway Offices, Water Tanks and Town Hall, and connecting Town Hall with Police Office, are in working order, paying particular attention to fire alarm or extension bells; and shall, if required by the Council, assume charge of the Fire Department, and see that all Hose, Engine Escape and fittings are constantly in good order and repair.

7. He shall see that all sub-stations, Transformers, Mains + Connections are properly recorded on Map of Township, and make such amendments as may be from time to time necessary.

8. He shall certify as to the chargeability of all accounts in reference to the Departments in his charge, making necessary distinctions between Capital + Revenue, endorsing on the assessment books the particular undertaking of the Council to which any account or pay sheet is chargeable, and make necessary sub-division thereof.

9. He shall see that all stores are properly entered in Store Book on arrival, and charged out to proper use on issue, and he will be held responsible for seeing that all contracts are duly executed, and materials supplied in all cases equal to sample.

10. He shall see that the men under him fully and efficiently discharge their duties, and shall at once report any dereliction of duty.

11. The Engineer or his recognised Assistant shall attend at the Generating Station during all hours of running up to 10:00 a.m., and in order to be available in the event of accident each Engineer should report when going off duty, where he would be found should a breakdown occur, and either Engineer when leaving Bray, should report where a message would reach him, if urgently required.
12. The Chief Engineer shall furnish the Clerk of the Council with all information from day to day required, in reference to estimates for House wiring, Accounts and matters pertaining to the Commercial Management of the works, and shall see that sufficient stores for the efficient working of the works are always on hand.

The Clerk to the Council read the requisition and notice convening the meeting and submitted deposited plans notices book of reference Surveyors Report Memorial against scheme lodged by D.W. & W. Coy &c

Mr. Din objected to the matter being considered on following grounds:-

- (1) The date of meeting was given in the Dublin Gazette as 21st April and in the Day Recorder as 28th April
- (2) The date was not as near as might be to the Quarterly meeting of County Council.
- (3) The Advertisement was not published two months before date of meeting.

Mr. Esq. said that the reprint in a newspaper should not be held fatal as it had been held that substantial compliance with enactments was sufficient. He held that the meeting was quite in order and he was satisfied to abide by it. He contended that the notices were quite in

order as the <sup>first</sup> advertisements were published on 21st February 1902 and the meeting was held on 21st April 1902.

The Chairman took the sense of the Council as to whether the Standing Orders and Statutory obligations had been complied with and there voted:-

Ayes - Councillors Sir A. Cochrane, N. Langton, J. Sutton, J. Mc Dermott, Edward Lee + J. W. Reigh (6)

No's - Councillors M. O'Dwyne + Isaac Jones. (2)

The Chairman declared that all Statutory obligations had been sufficiently complied with and the Council would now consider the scheme on its merits.

Mr. A. Lane Esq. exhibited (1) Copies of Dublin Gazette and of the Day Recorder of 21st Feb, 1st March + 28th March 1902 containing copies of the Statutory Notices (2) Affidavit of Mr. A. J. Maginn of having made the necessary Statutory deposits of plans &c (3) Affidavit of Mr. J. W. Reigh as to service of notices by Post (4) Post Office receipt for notices &c.

Mr. Din asked if report from Board of Works had been received.

Mr. Esq. said that the Enquiry had been held and report could be produced at an adjourned meeting if required.

Mr. Lane Esq. addressed the Council in favour of the scheme explained its provisions and asked for consent.

Mr. Din said that the Company would not object if the line to Old Connaught, which, while not being beneficial to the people, might become the junction with a system from Dublin which would be a competing scheme, was

left out of Scheme.

Mr Shannon in reply to Mr Sim said that the line was laid to the end of Gwendover Road next Railway Station where it was very congested.

The arguments for and against the undertaking having been heard Councillor J. Sutton proposed and Councillor R. Langton seconded:-

"That we, the Dray Urban District Council, specially summoned as required by the Tramways (England) Act 1866 to 1900 to consider the proposed Dray Electric Tramways as set forth and referred to in the published advertisement, maps, plans, sections, book of reference, Memorial, Draft Order in Council, Estimates and Lists deposited with the Clerk of the Council, and now produced, having fully considered the proposed scheme and Memorial against, and having heard all parties interested in supporting or opposing the undertaking hereby decide that all standing Orders and contracts have been sufficiently complied with, and we approve of the said Electric Tramways in so far as we have power so to do, and they affect the Urban District of Dray and come within our jurisdiction. Provided always that the Undertakers shall in every way observe and perform conditions hereby mutually agreed to or shall give clauses to such effect in the Order in Council and shall legally complete such documents as may be considered necessary by the legal advisers of the Council in reference hereto:

#### Conditions.

1. The expression "Council" in the Conditions following shall mean the Dray Urban District Council and the expression "Undertakers" shall mean the General Electric Company of England Limited, the Promoters of the said

2. That the Undertakers within six months from date hereof (2nd April, 1902) or such earlier date as will leave the Council sufficient time to enter opposition to the Scheme before the Council, shall in the name of the Chairman of the Council and of one Trustee for the Undertakers deposit the sum of £500.0.0 in the Libernian Bank, Dray, said sum to be held in trust for the Council and the Undertakers, and to be applied towards defraying all legal and other expenses of the Council in connection with the scheme; repairing any damage occasioned during the construction of the works, indemnifying the Council in any action or actions which may be brought against them by any person or persons or body corporate whatsoever, arising out of their granting this concession, or as the case may be forfeited in the event of the Undertakers not proceeding to obtain their Order in Council within six months from this date or such extended time as the Council may permit, or not proceeding with the construction of the authorized tramways in the Urban District of Dray within one year from the date of their obtaining such Order in Council. The said sum or such balance thereof as may remain unexpended to be refunded to the Undertakers within six months of the completion of the works to the satisfaction of the Council. In the event of the Undertakers failing to carry their Order, the deposit to be refunded less costs and expenses of the Urban District Council in the matter. An agreement embodying the conditions of the trust to be executed as between the parties.
3. The Undertakers shall pay a way leave of £10 per mile per annum until they pay their debentures

or other shareholders the equivalent of 5 per cent per annum on original capital. £5 per mile per annum when they pay over 5 per cent per annum; and £20 per mile per annum when they pay over 7.10 per cent per annum, for every line constructed within the Urban District, or which may hereafter be constructed or brought within the Urban District by extension of boundaries or otherwise.

4. The Undertakers shall pave and maintain to the satisfaction of the Council the paved portions of any and every roadway now or hereafter within the Urban District along which any of their Tramways are laid, between all rails and to the extent of eighteen inches outside the outer rail on each side.

5. The Undertakers shall provide a skilled foreman who shall be present at the making of and shall be responsible for all joints made and the Council may appoint an Inspector at the expense of the Undertakers who may make tests for the purpose of satisfying himself that perfect electrical continuity has been established and no joint or bond shall be covered up unless approved of by such Inspector and if any injurious electrolytic action be detected on the Electric Light Cables, telephones, water mains or other mains or services in the Urban District of May the Undertakers shall immediately and at their own expense take such steps as the Council may direct to prevent same and the Undertakers shall pay to the Council the cost in full of making good any damage caused by or due to such electrolytic action.

6. The Company shall between the hours of 6 a.m. and 11.30 p.m. from 1st day of April to 30th day of

September inclusive in each year run a car in each direction along all the Tramways in the Urban District of May at intervals of not more than fifteen minutes each, and shall between the hours of 8 a.m. and 10.30 p.m. from 1st day of October to 31st day of March inclusive in each year run a car in each direction along all the said Tramways in the said Urban District at intervals of not more than 30 minutes each unless the Council shall consent to a modification of such summer and winter services.

7. The Undertakers shall pave the portions of the streets or roads, along which any of the said Tramways shall be laid, with stone setts between the rails and to the extent of 18 inches on each side of the rails. The setts to be approved of by the Council. The said setts shall be laid on a bed of concrete 6 inches deep composed of one part cement and seven parts sand & gravel.

8. The gauge of the Tramways shall be the standard gauge of the Dublin Electric Tramways, the rails to weigh at least 80 lbs per yard and to be jointed with fish plates having six bolts each, the streets being paved with approved setts.

9. Passing places shall be provided where line is single at distances of not less than 1/2 furlongs. Location subject to approval of Council.

10. The line to be single or interlaced from Western Corner of Quinsboro Road to Presbyterian Church, and along all other roads double or single, at the option of the Undertakers subject to the approval of the Council.
