I am directed by the Local Government Board for Ireland to state that they have had before them the report of their Adjusting Auditor, Mr J. H. Perry, on the Inquiry

held by him on 21st January last into the financial relations between the County of Wicklow and the Urban District of Bray. With reference thereto I am to state that after careful consideration of the question the Board propose to give instructions for the preparation of a Provisional Order reversing the said relations to the following extent:-

(1) The Urban District of Bray to be exempt as from 1st April, 1899, from contributing to the following expenses, viz:-

The salaries, pensions, and expenses of:-

County Surveyor

Assistant Surveyors

Clerks and Officers in the County Surveyors Office whether permanent or temporary.

Clerks and Officers in the Offices of the Secretary of the County Council, other than the Secretary, whether permanent or temporary.

Expenditure incurred in respect of:-

The printing of books and forms, other than printing provided for by Section 6 (2) and (3) of the Local Government (Ireland) Act 1898.

4. That the cost of the preparation of the County Jurors lists in Urban Districts should be made a County-at-Large charge, corresponding work for the Rural Districts being such a charge.

5. That the expression "Directly Concerning the Urban Districts" in reference to publication of notices and law books should read "Directly and beneficially affecting the Urban Districts".
