- The following resolution was passed in silence, the Council standing:-
"That we, the Bray Urban District Council, have learned with deep regret of the death of Mr. John Byrne, for over 20 years the local Manager, Alliance Gas Company, and we tender to his widow and children our heartfelt sympathy and condolence with them in their bereavement".
- 2481 Councillor Sexton proposed and Councillor E. Byrne seconded the adoption of the General Purposes Committee of 19/3/1940. Passed unanimously.
- 2482 Councillor Duffy proposed and Councillor Sexton seconded the adoption of the Public Health Committee of 19/3/1940. Passed unanimously.
- 2483 Councillor G. Byrne proposed and Councillor Ed. Byrne seconded the adoption of the Report of H. & E. Committee of 19/3/1940. Passed unanimously.
- 2484 Councillor E. Byrne proposed and Clr. Dunne seconded the adoption of Report of Finance Committee of 26th March, 1940. Councillor Kinsella proposed and Clr. Dunne seconded:-

- 2511 Letter dated 8/4/1940 (A.9650/40) from the Min.Loc.Govt. enclosing a copy of the Auditor's Report on his Audit of the Accounts of the Bray Vocational Education Committee for the year ended 31st March, 1939, together with attested Abstracts of the Accounts. Left on table.
- 2512 Letter dated 20/3/1940 (G.8855/40) from Min.Loc.Govt. enclosing form of queries for completion and return in connection with the superannuation of Mr. John Kenny, Poor Rate Collector, and stating consideration of the question of superannuation will depend in the first instance on, (1) whether Mr. Kenny was a whole-time officer and (2) the submission of a certificate that all matters connected with Mr. Kenny's collection have been disposed of satisfactorily. - 2513 Letter dated 16/4/40 (G.8855/2/40) from Min.Loc.Govt. regarding the appointment of a Poor Rate Collector, drawing Council's attention to the provision made in the terms of the appointment of the Town Rate Collector to the effect that he may be required in the event of a vacancy in the position of Poor Rate Collector to carry out the duties of that post and stating that he sees no reason to appoint two rate collectors to carry out separate collections on the same ratings. An economy can be effected by assigning the duties of collecting the Poor Rate to the existing Town Rate Collector and the fixing of a moderate addition to his salary and commission.
