299. The following Motion standing in the name of Clr. Dr. B. J. Donnelly was adjourned:—

"That the provision of a voluntary hospital in the township is worthy of the Council's support."

BRAY SPECIAL SPEED LIMIT ORDER.

300. It was proposed by Clr. G. H. G. Stuart, seconded by Clr. J. French, and resolved:—

"That we the members of the Bray Urban District Council view with concern the lack of efficiency on the part of the Minister for Local Government in his failure to overcome the legal difficulties which at present render the enforcement of the Bray Special Speed Limit Regulations, 1950, inoperative. That we now call upon the Minister for Local Government to exercise his powers, immediately, with regard to the fact that over five months have elapsed since a letter was submitted to the Council from the Department of Local Government, stating that active consideration was being given to overcome the legal difficulties in connection with the Speed Limit Order."

305. Submitted letter from Council's Law Agent stating that the Electricity Supply Board had powers enabling it to increase the charge for public lighting.

MR. LONG "WICKLOW PEOPLE."

310. Members of the Council expressed their best wishes to Mr. Long, of the *Wicklow People* who is leaving Bray to take up an appointment elsewhere. A tribute was paid to the impartiality shown by him in reporting Meetings of the Council.

PROVISION OF HOSPITAL IN BRAY.

311. The following Notice of Motion, standing in the name of Clr. Dr. Donnelly was adjourned to the next meeting of the Council, viz:—

"That the provision of a voluntary hospital in the township is worthy of the Council's support."

MUSIC AND DANCING LICENCES.

312. The Council approved of the renewal of the Singing and Dancing Licences, etc., in respect of the Royal Cinema and Braemar Ballroom, subject to compliance with the requirements of the Town Engineer and the County Fire Officer in the matter of sanitation and fire precautions respectively.

REPAIRS TO BRAY HARBOUR.

313. Submitted letter from the Department of Industry and Commerce intimating that the Minister had reconsidered the question of availability of a Grant for the cost of repairs to Bray Harbour but regretted that it would not be possible to have a Grant made available.

It was decided to again ask the Department to reconsider the decision and to point out that unless a Grant is available, an application will have to be made for a Closing Order in respect of the Harbour. If the Harbour is closed the responsibility would be that of the Minister.

LEASING OF SITE AT DUBLIN ROAD.

314. Submitted letter from Mr. J. Quaid asking the Council to reconsider its decision concerning the Rental (£52 per annum) to be paid by him for Lease of a site at Nos. 3 and 4 Dublin Road.

The Council decided to adhere to its previous decision declining to decrease the rent below £52 per annum, over and above Rates and Taxes.

OLD CONNAUGHT HOUSING SCHEME.

315. It was proposed by Cllr. D. Sayers, seconded by Cllr. J. French and resolved:—

"That we hereby make application to the Minister for Local Government for sanction to the raising of a Loan of £8,000 from the Local Loans Fund, repayable over 35 years, for the purpose of defraying the cost of Acquisition of land at Old Connaught, in connection with the proposed Housing Scheme."

"That we hereby make application to the Minister for Local Government for sanction to the raising of a Loan of £72,000 from the Local Loans Fund, repayable over a period of fifty years, for the purpose of defraying the cost of erection of forty-eight houses on lands at Old Connaught."

"That we hereby make application to the Minister for Local Government for sanction to the raising of a Loan of £33,000 from the Local Loans Fund, repayable over a period of thirty-

five years for the purpose of defraying the cost of Development of lands at Old Connaught in connection with the proposed Old Connaught Housing Scheme."

CIVIL DEFENCE.

316. Submitted circular letter from the Department of Defence regarding the organisation of Civil Defence in the Urban Area and intimating, *inter alia*, that comprehensive and intensive organisation would be necessary in the town of Bray. The Department intimated that it was proposed to commence a course of training for those Officers of Local Authorities who had been engaged in connection with the operation of the Civil Defence Organisation.

The Council approved of the proposal of the County Manager to nominate Mr. Robert Byrne, Clerk-Storekeeper, for training in the Civil Defence School.

TOWN AND REGIONAL PLANNING ACTS— DEMPSEY'S FIELD.

317. Submitted letter from Messrs. McNamara and O'Hare, Architects, requesting the Council to approve, in principle, of a proposal to erect bungalows on a number of sites at Dempsey's Field.

Submitted Report of Engineer recommending that permission might be granted for erection of bungalows on sites Nos. 14 to 19; 58 to 63 and 48 to 56. The Engineer would not recommend the erection of bungalows on Sites 65 to 70, which are on the Newcourt Road.

The Council adopted the recommendation of the Engineer in the matter.

TOWN AND REGIONAL PLANNING ACTS— STRUCTURE AT UPPER DARGLE ROAD.

318. The Council granted permission to Mr. James Hanrahan, 9 Upper Dargle Road, for the erection of a structure at his premises.

TOWN AND REGIONAL PLANNING ACTS— HOUSE AT GREENPARK ROAD.

319. The Council granted permission for the erection of a house at Greenpark Road in accordance with Plan submitted, for Mr. Patk. Martin.

TOWN AND REGIONAL PLANNING ACTS— ERECTION OF GATE AT 39 DUBLIN ROAD.

320. The Council granted permission to Mrs. L. Sutton, 38 Dublin Road to erect a gate in the boundary wall adjoining her premises.

SMALL DWELLINGS (ACQ.) ACTS — APPLICATIONS

321. It was decided to appoint a Committee to meet representatives of the Homeland Public Utility Society at 12 noon on the 22nd September, 1951, regarding the making of Loans under the Small Dwellings (Acq.) Acts in respect of houses being erected by the Society. The following members were appointed to constitute the Committee, viz.: Clr. E. Byrne (Chairman), Clrs. J. French, H. J. Byrne, P. Ledwidge and J. Temple.

Submitted report of the Town Engineer recommending that the Type B house to be erected at Dempsey's Field should be valued at £2,000.

The Council approved of the recommendation.

The Council refused to make a loan to Mr. Seamus Doyle Dora-ville, Meath Road, Bray, in respect of a house at the corner of Putland Road and Meath Road.

NAMING OF ROADS.

322. It was agreed to name the road at Dempsey's Field, Camaderry Road. It was agreed to name one of the roads at the Boghall Housing Scheme Cherry Tree Drive.

Consideration of the naming of the second road was adjourned to obtain the views of the members of the Utility Society who are erecting the houses there.

GULLEY—CASTLE STREET/DWYER PARK.

323. Submitted report from the Town Engineer concerning the provision of an additional gulley at Dwyer Park.

It was agreed to ask Messrs. Cooper and Hayes, Castle Street, to contribute towards the cost of the erection of an additional gulley.

WALL BETWEEN BRAY GOLF CLUB AND DWYER PARK.

324. Submitted report of the Town Engineer suggesting that the erection of barbed wire on the top of the wall between Bray Housing Scheme and Bray Golf Club would be unsightly and might be opposed by the occupants. It was suggested that the cost of the erection of the wire would be borne by the Bray Golf Club. It was also agreed to erect a wire fence at the appropriate house in Dwyer Park to prevent trespass. It was also agreed to erect a wire fence at the garden of the bungalow at Castle Street, occupied by Mr. Pyke.

BRAY ROWING CLUB.

325. Submitted letter from Bray Rowing Club thanking the Council for having granted permission to close the Promenade on the 19th August, 1951.

Order:—Noted.

FIRE BRIGADE PERSONNEL.

326. The Town Clerk informed the Council that it was the intention to appoint Mr. John Byrne, driver of the Fire Tender in succession to Mr. L. Flanagan, who tendered his resignation.

Following discussion it was agreed to continue the existing arrangements and to review the matter at a later date.

EMERGENCY AND EMPLOYMENT SCHEMES VOTE.

327. Submitted letter from the Department of Local Government intimating that a Grant of £1,050 will be made available to the Council under the Employment and Emergency Schemes Vote, subject to local contribution of £145.

It was decided to adjourn consideration of the report of the Engineer to enable him to submit details of the cost of the works to be undertaken by means of the Grant. He was asked to examine the possibility of including a sum in respect of footpaths at the People's Park.

HOUSING SUBSIDY.

328. Submitted circular letter from the Department of Local Government intimating that it had been decided to discontinue the issue of Grants from the Transition Development Fund in respect of the erection of houses. In substitution for the Grants it was proposed to pay a contribution towards the loan charges on the first £950 Capital cost, in lieu of previous arrangement whereby contribution was based on the first £350 Capital cost.

The County Manager pointed out that there is no difference in the State Assistance available formerly, and that which will now be available in the case of houses erected and let to families displaced by operations under the Housing Acts, e.g. slum clearance, etc. Where, however, houses are erected for letting to families re-housed from overcrowded dwellings, the effect of the amendment in the method of State Assistance would mean that an additional sum of approximately £7 per house would have to be met from Rates or alternatively, rents of the houses would require to be increased by £7 per annum, the equivalent of 2s. 8d. per week.

It was decided to protest to the Department against the reduction in the amount of State Assistance in respect of houses to be let to families re-housed from overcrowded dwellings.

WM. DOYLE, ASSISTANT WATER INSPECTOR.

329. The Council approved of the recommendation of the County Manager to remunerate Mr. Wm. Doyle, Assistant Water Inspector at the rate of £6 per week as from the 1st January, 1951. The rate of remuneration will include such duties as the laying of new water-mains, etc., in addition to the ordinary duties of the position.

NOTICE OF MOTION—CLR. LEDWIDGE.

330. The Chairman accepted the following Notice of Motion handed in by Clr. P. Ledwidge, viz:—

"Please take notice that I or someone on my behalf will move at the next Statutory Meeting that this Council request the Minister for Justice to introduce legislation that would debar the use of gaming machines, commonly known as slot machines, and further that Local Authorities be given the power of issuing Licences so as to govern Amusement Caterers."

TENANCIES OF COUNCIL'S HOUSES.

331. The Council approved of the following changes of tenancies, viz:—

Submitted report from the Town Engineer concerning No. 4 Pollard's Terrace, and recommending that the house would be suitable for a childless couple or alternatively it be demolished. The Town Clerk stated that the house had been broken into by Mr. Ml. Moorehouse. It was agreed that appropriate action in respect of forcible entry should be taken.

It was decided to ask Mr. Nugent, Ravenswell Row if he would exchange tenancy with Mr. Skelton, 10 Wolfe Tone Sq., Middle.

Regarding alternative accommodation for Mr. Doyle of 9 Maitland Street, and Mr. Macken, 30 Maitland Street, it was agreed to adjourn consideration pending the decision of the Dublin Artisan's Dwelling Company as to whether they would accept nominees of the Council for tenancy of the houses at Maitland Street, which would become vacant if alternative accommodation were provided for Mr. Doyle and Mr. Macken.

The Council refused permission to Mr. N. Doyle to occupy a Council house as a sub-tenant.

SLOT MACHINES AND AMUSEMENTS.

336. The Council agreed to consider, jointly, the Notices of Motion standing in the names of Clrs. P. Ledwidge and J. Temple, concerning the prohibition of the use of Gaming Machines and control of the use of premises for Amusements generally.

Following discussion, and by leave of the Council, the Motion was moved in the following amended form by Clr. Ledwidge. The Motion having been seconded by Clr. J. Temple, was put and carried, viz:—

"That the Urban District Council requests the Minister for Justice to introduce legislation that would debar the use of Gaming Machines, commonly known as Slot Machines, and that the Minister for Local Government and the Minister for Justice be asked to give the Council power to control the use of premises for Amusements, and if necessary, to institute a special Licencing system for this purpose. That copy of this Resolution be forwarded to every Urban District Council and to the Association of the Municipal Authorities of Ireland."

COALING OF ENGINES BY C.I.E. AT REAR OF BRENNAN'S TCE. AND BRENNAN'S PARADE.

341. The Council noted report of Town Clerk upon Conference held with officials of Coras Iompair Eireann regarding the coaling of engines at Brennan's Parade. A deputation consisting of Cllrs. H. J. Byrne, J. Temple and Mrs. McCallion met the representatives of the Company who gave an undertaking that some Diesel engines would be put into operation on the Harcourt Street/Bray line before Christmas.

OPERATION OF A CASINO AT THE ESPLANADE.

342. Submitted letter from Messrs. Amelan & Roth, Manchester, asking whether the Council would approve of the erection of a Casino

at the Esplanade. It was proposed by Cllr. J. Temple, seconded by Cllr. Hipwell.

That consideration of the application be adjourned pending the outcome of Resolutions which were adopted at Meeting requesting the Minister for Justice to debar the use of gaming machines and to give statutory authority to Local Authorities to control amusements generally.

The following amendment was proposed by Cllr. Ledwidge and seconded by Cllr. Stuart:—

"That permission for the operation of a Casino be refused."

The Amendment was put and a division taken when the following voted for, viz., Cllrs. P. Ledwidge, G. Stuart and P. Martin.

There voted against, 9, viz., Cllrs. H. J. Byrne, E. Byrne, J. French, Dr. Donnelly, J. Temple, Mrs. McCallion, D. Sayers, J. Kinsella and H. B. Hipwell.

The amendment was accordingly defeated and the original Motion carried.

OLD CONNAUGHT HOUSING SCHEME.

343. Submitted letter from Mr. A. Cullen, solr., intimating that the Cassell family will be prepared to sell land at Old Connaught for the sum of £600 per acre.

It was agreed to intimate to Mr. Cullen that the price of £440 per acre is the maximum which the Council would be prepared to pay for any land which will be acquired.

VOTES OF SYMPATHY.

357. The Chairman, on behalf of the Council, extended a vote of sympathy to the relatives of the late Miss M. Byrne, 15 Brennan's Parade; Mrs. Archer, Main Street; Mrs. Murnane, Laverna, Meath Road and Mr. Joseph Mooney, Westfield Park, Bray.

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES.

358. The Minutes of the Monthly Meeting held on the 9th October, 1951, which had been circulated, were taken as read by the Chairman.

MANAGER'S ORDERS.

359. The County Manager's Orders Nos. 7195 to 7211 which had been circulated were noted.

CLR. HIPWELL referred to Order No. 7210 terminating the employment of Mr. Michael Fitzpatrick who was employed on the Esplanade and suggested that his services should be availed of for work at the People's Park.

Following discussion it was agreed to adjourn the matter to the next Meeting.

QUESTIONS—CLR. HIPWELL.

360. (1) Question: Why has the Council's Order directing the tenant of No. 46 Wolfe Tone Square North, to replace the palings between Nos. 46 and 47 not been enforced?

Answer: In accordance with the decision of the Council, the tenant of 46 Wolfe Tone Square, North, was directed to replace the division railing between 46 and 47 Wolfe Tone Square, North, on 11th July. He stated that he was willing to replace the railing but as it had not been replaced he was informed on the 31st of that month that the railing should be erected immediately. On the 7th August, and 21st August, he was again instructed to reinstate the railing. In reply he asked that the Engineer would indicate the line of the railing, which the Engineer duly did. As the railing removed, had not been erected early in October, he was informed on the 18th and 31st ultimo that unless the railing were erected immediately, proceedings would be taken against him for the termination of the tenancy of the house. It was found that the railing had not been erected up to the 8th instant, and consequently a final notice was issued on the 10th instant, informing him that unless the railing was erected before Saturday, 17th instant, Notice to Quit would be served on him.

(2) Question: Why was the A.A. road sign at Sunnybank diverting traffic to Wexford via Upper Dargle Road instead of through the town allowed to be erected without first obtaining the views of this Council?

Answer: The A.A. road signs at Sunnybank are erected on the thoroughfare which is in charge of Wicklow County Council and not the Urban District Council. Inquiries have been made from the County Engineer in the matter.

(3) Question: When will the No Cycling notices which the County Manager agreed to have re-erected at Albert Walk be put up?

Answer: An order has been issued for the necessary Notices regarding prohibition of cycling at Albert Walk.

(4) Question: Why has the Council's proposed development scheme of the North end of the Esplanade not been commenced and is it likely to be completed before commencement of next Summer season?

Answer: The Consultant Architect, Mr. D. Fitzgerald, is still engaged upon the preparation of Plans, etc., in connection with the development of the Northern end of the Esplanade. He had consultations recently with representatives of the Bray Swimming Club concerning the possibility of adapting the Municipal Baths in conjunction with the development of the Esplanade. Preparation of Plans required, would ordinarily take considerable time. It is expected that the recommendation of the Architect will be available towards the end of the month. As the Scheme is a comprehensive one it is most unlikely that it will have been completed at the end of next year. Part of the work, will, however, have been completed before next Summer.

(5) Question: Is the delay in the voluntary acquisition of Mr. Gorham's land due to the consent of the Minister for Local Government still not being forthcoming and if so can the County Manager offer any suggestion as to how sanction may be expedited?

Answer: The delay in the acquisition of the land from Mr. Gorham is due to the fact that the recommendations of the Council regarding the Scheme as a whole, were under examination by the Department. In this connection a letter of the 30th ultimo will be considered by the Council at this Meeting.

(6) Question: Why has the erection of palings at 2 houses at Dwyer Park not been put in hand?

Answer: Quotations have already been sought for erection of palings at Dwyer Park. It is expected that the quotations will be available at this Meeting.

CLR. KINSELLA.

(1) Question: Would the Council consider making representations to the Proprietors of the Picture House, Quinsboro' Road, Bray, to have this Cinema re-opened?

Answer: Some two years ago, Plans were submitted for the reconstruction of the Picture House, Quinsboro' Road, into a Repertory Theatre. There had been a fire at the premises some eighteen months before and from that date it remained closed. It is understood there had been delay in obtaining the necessary Building Permit from the Department of Industry and Commerce. The Town Engineer now reports that the Building Licence has been obtained by the Contractors.

Some further difficulty has arisen as to whether the existing roof should be repaired or removed completely and rebuilt.

It is not considered necessary in the circumstances, to make representations to the Proprietor unless the Council consider that representations might have the effect of expediting the progress of reconstruction.

(2) Question: Is there any progress to report on the proposed development of the North end of the Esplanade.

Answer: (See reply to Mr. Hipwell on the same subject).

CLR. J. FRENCH.

(1) Question: Would the Engineer state if he is satisfied with work carried out by the Council's Contractor, especially in relation to attention to orders issued to him from time to time.

Answer: The Engineer has not been satisfied for some time back with the rate at which repairs are being carried out.

The repairs carried out by our Contractor were of a very satisfactory character but for some time past many orders which have been issued in respect of repairs have not been carried out.

This applies particularly, in respect of doors. Some orders in respect of doors have not been carried out although the orders were issued last Spring.

As our Contractor's term of repairs has now expired a new Contractor must now be appointed. The advertisement was published some time ago and tenders must be in by 24th November. All outstanding orders will be handed over to the new Contractor.

ERECTION OF RAILINGS AT DWYER PARK.

361. The Council accepted a quotation from Messrs. Furlong in the sum of £44 16s. 0d. for the purchase and erection of railings at Dwyer Park.

VOLUNTARY HOSPITAL.

362. Proposed by Mr. Dr. Donnelly, seconded by Mr. Sayers and resolved:

"That the provision of a voluntary hospital in the township is worthy of the Council's support."

In moving the motion Mr. Dr. Donnelly referred to the necessity for the provision of a Hospital in Bray, which is possibly the only large town which had not its own hospital. Under present conditions, patients had to be brought to hospitals outside the town, either to Dublin, Loughlinstown, or County Wicklow. He felt that a Hospital with approximately 75 beds should be provided and that the cost

of provision thereof need not necessarily be borne by the Ratepayers. He had in mind the establishment of a voluntary hospital to be erected through public subscriptions. Following a lengthy discussion in which most of the members took part, it was agreed to hold a Special Meeting of the Council to consider the matter further.

DOCK TERRACE.

363. The Council approved of the terms of a Draft Mortgage to Hibernian Bank in respect of Loan of £2,000 which is being raised by the Council to defray the cost of purchase of Dock Terrace.

PURCHASE OF WATERMAINS.

364. Submitted report of the Town Engineer upon Tenders received for the supply of watermains and fittings. The report which recommended the acceptance of the Tender of Messrs McFerran and Guilford in the sum of £3,162 10s. 0d. was adopted by the Council. The Tender is £824 above the lowest but delivery of the pipes could be effected within ten days as against a delivery period of two years in the case of the other Tenders. The recommendation of the Engineer concerning the purchase of the fittings was accepted.

TOWN PLANNING ACTS—RECONSTRUCTION OF 11 MAIN STREET.

365. Plans submitted by Mr. G. S. Horner, Architect, for reconstruction of 11 Main Street, Bray, were adjourned for further information as to the proposed user of the premises when completed.

ALTERATIONS TO No. 1 FLORENCE VILLAS.

366. The Council approved of proposed alterations to the shop front of the premises No. 1 Florence Villas, in accordance with the sketch Plan submitted.

STRUCTURE AT RERE OF 41 AND 42 WOLFE TONE SQUARE, BRAY.

367. The Council granted permission for the erection of a structure at rere of 41 and 42 Wolfe Tone Square, North, providing an undertaking is given that the structure will not be used for human habitation and that the structure is finished in a reasonable manner.

STRUCTURE AT LILA HOUSE, PARNELL ROAD.

368. The Council approved of Plan submitted by Mr. James McKenna for the erection of a structure at the premises Lila House,

Parnell Road, Bray, provided the structure is not used for human habitation and that corrugated asbestos be substituted instead of felt for the roof.

369. The Council approved of Plans submitted by Messrs. Connolly for the erection of structure at Greenpark Road, subject to compliance with the Engineer's requirements as to the site of the gates.

382. Submitted letter from Council's solicitors forwarding an opinion of Senior Counsel upon the claim submitted for overtime on behalf of the Overseer and Esplanade Caretaker.

Briefly the opinion stated that as the Overseer was doing "commercial work" or "Overseeing" within the meaning of the Conditions of the Employment Act, 1936, he would not come within the

scope of that Act which relates to "industrial work." Similarly, the Esplanade Caretaker does not come within the scope of the Act as it is considered that the work carried out by him is agricultural work which is also excluded under the Act.

The Chairman, on behalf of the Council extended Votes of sympathy to the relatives of the late Sergeant Callan and Mr. Charles Elliot.

396. Old Connaught Housing Scheme.

The following letter was read from the Department of Local Government in relation to the Old Connaught Housing Scheme:-

"With reference to your letter of the 3rd ultimo and previous correspondence regarding the proposed housing scheme at Old Connaught, Bray, I am directed by the Minister for Local Government to state that it is noted that final arrangements have not yet been made for the acquisition of the plot adjoining the cemetery which is necessary for the provision of an access road to the Scheme. Pending the making of arrangements for the provision of the access road referred to any suggestions for the erection of houses on the land already acquired would be premature.

In regard to the house plans submitted I am to state that it is considered that plan G.33 is expensive to erect as is evidenced by tenders recently received for houses of that type in other areas. Plan A.3333 is not considered suitable and it is suggested that alternative designs should be prepared providing for the minimum room sizes recommended by this Department, i.e., living-room 160 to 180 sq. ft.; 1st bedroom 135 sq. ft.; 2nd bedroom 110 sq. ft.; and 3rd bedroom 70 sq. ft. Several alternative designs providing the accommodation mentioned should be prepared in view of the magnitude and importance of the proposed scheme.

With regard to the proposed erection of Duplex type houses it is suggested that the part of the site on which it was intended to erect the Duplex houses would be more suitable for bungalow type dwellings.

House plan F. 44 is in order.

In regard to the acquisition of land from Mr. Gorham for the purpose of providing an access road to the scheme from the Upper Dargle Road it is noted that the all-in cost of the land in question as set out in your letter of the 22nd August, 1951, amounts to £5,430, which is considered excessive, particularly in view of the fact that the Council could not erect houses along the access road frontage. It is suggested that it might be possible to make more favourable arrangements with the Cassell family whereby land for the required access road could be acquired. The advantage of such arrangements would be that sites for the erection of houses by the Council would be available along that access road. Such an arrangement would mean that the Council would receive better value for the expenditure incurred.

It is noted that steps are being taken for the acquisition of the land occupied by the Greyhound Racing track.

While the final detailed form of the lay-out for the proposed scheme cannot be determined pending clarification of the position in regard to the land adjoining the parish cemetery which is required for the provision of the access road from the existing scheme at Old Connaught and the other lands referred to above and the submission of suitable house-designs, the general lines of the lay-out plan submitted to this Department are considered suitable. It is considered, however, that the backs of the houses shown on the north side of the access road from the existing scheme are too close to the boundary wall between the scheme and the balance of Mr. Fitzpatrick's land. It is suggested, therefore, that the lay-out should be revised to increase the distance between the backs of those houses and the boundary wall in order to provide larger back gardens to the houses.

I am to request the submission in due course of the Council's final proposals for the provision of the access road from the existing scheme at Old Connaught and the acquisition of the other lands required, together with revised lay-out plan and alternative house designs."

Following a lengthy discussion in which the Members expressed resentment that the Department had not indicated earlier that the House Designs were not considered suitable, the Consultant Architect represented that an error of £70 had been made by the firm of Building Contractors who submitted the Tender for the Type G.3 in another area.

The Town Clerk stated that the Trustees of the Cemetery were quite prepared to dedicate a site for the roadway through the Cemetery Field extension and that in this connection, the Title Deeds were being examined. Quite naturally the Trustees, however, could see no point in having the Deed of dedication executed unless the Scheme as a whole were approved by the Department. It was agreed to request the Minister to receive a Deputation from the Council to expedite the commencement of the erection of the houses and to resolve the present difficulties which were delaying the progress of the Scheme.

The following were appointed to constitute the Deputation: Cllr. E. Byrne (Chairman), Cllrs. Dr. Donnelly, P. Ledwidge, H. B. Hipwell and J. Temple.

The Council recommended that houses to be let at economic rents should be erected on lands which are at present used as a Greyhound Racing Track and which the Council propose to acquire compulsorily.

Borrowing of Capital Monies: The Council approved of the terms of Draft Mortgages in respect of Loans of £8,000, £33,000 and £72,000, which it is proposed to borrow from the Commissioners of Public Works in connection with land acquisition; development work; and the erection of houses on Section 1 of the Scheme.

397. Development of Northern end of Esplanade.

Submitted report from the Consultant Architect, Mr. D. Fitzgerald, outlining his proposals for the development of the northern end of the Esplanade. Briefly, the recommendations are that (1) the area between the Municipal Baths and the proposed terminal cafe/casino be laid out as a lawn, flanked with shrubs on either side, (2) That the Car Park be converted into a Children's Play area with paddling pool, Since the area has already been surfaced, it would entail relatively less expense than if the Paddling Pool etc., were provided elsewhere; (3) That a Shelter with kiosks be provided in the children's play area, and that the existing shelter lying between the Municipal baths and the harbour be moved to one side to open up the vista; (4) That the lawn which was No.2 on the Plan prepared by him and submitted to the Meeting be used for a putting Green.

or for such other lawn sports as may prove popular from time to time; (5) That a cafe casino flanked by fountains be provided at the northern end.

Following discussion the Council adopted the report in principle, subject to the deletion of the recommendation for a cafe casino at the terminal point. As an alternative, the Council suggested the provision of a large shelter.

398. Town Planning Acts - Reconstruction of 11 Main Street, Bray.

Plan submitted by Mr. G.S. Horner, Architect, for reconstruction of 11 Main Street, Bray.
Order: Permission granted.

399. Advertisement Hoarding at 64 and 77 Main Street.

Submitted letter from Messrs D. Allen & Sons, Ltd., asking permission to have advertisement panels erected on the gable walls of 64 and 77 Main Street, Bray.
Order: Permission refused.

400. Structure at rear of Parnell Road.

Plans submitted by Mr. Donnelly, for erection of structure at the rear of her premises at Parnell Road. The Town Engineer reported that the structure was considered unsightly and would not recommend that permission should be granted.

It was agreed to defer the matter to enable the Town Engineer to discuss it further with Mrs. Donnelly.

(401) Bray Cove Swimming Club.

Submitted letter from the Secretary, Bray Cove Swimming Club, asking the Council to permit the Club to defer payment of an Account amounting to £36 12s 3d until next year as the Club suffered financial loss as a result of the fire at the Club House, and had also to pay an Account of approximately £70 which was due to a Contractor. It was agreed to permit the Club to defer payment of the Account until next year.

(402) Public Library.

Submitted letter from the Librarian stating that the Library Advisory Committee were anxious that the Juvenile Library should be provided at the Library and suggesting that the Newsroom be used for a Juvenile Library and that the Boardroom in the Town Hall be made available as a Newsroom.

Following discussion it was decided to advise the Library Advisory Committee that the Boardroom could not be used as a Newsroom, due to the fact that it is required for official and other purposes. The Council also decided not to discontinue the use of the room in the Library as a Newsroom. The question of the provision of separate accommodation for a Juvenile Library was referred to the Committee for their views.

(403) Alliance & Dublin Consumers' Gas Co. Charge for supply of gas in Bray Area.

Submitted letter from the Alliance and Dublin Consumers' Gas Co. stating that the Company were investigating the matters raised by the Resolution adopted by the Council, protesting against the price for the use of gas in the Bray Area.

(404) Vocational Education Committee.

Mr. Thomas Byrne, Glenburg, Dargle Road, Bray, was appointed a Member of the Vocational Education Committee, in succession to the late Mr. George Doyle.

(405) Esplanade Putting Green.

Submitted letter from Mr. P. Mooney asking the Council to extend for a further three years the Licence which he held up to the 31st October, 1951, to use the Putting Green. It was agreed not to renew the Licence and to invite Tenders by public advertisement.

(406) Valuation Increases.

The Council adopted a Resolution from the Tralee Urban District Council asking that the Valuations of premises which had been improved, in accordance with the requirements of the Health Act, 1947, should be increased in respect of improvements or additions.

(407) 29 Houses Scheme - Bonus Payments.

The Council declined to grant permission to the tenant of 13 St. Patrick's Square to use a Circular Saw at the premises, and to remove the front railings. It was agreed to make a plot of ground, at the rear of St. Laurence's Terrace, available for use by Mr. Cahill, 13 St. Patrick's Square.

(411) Repairs to Council Houses.

"That the Seal of the Urban District Council be affixed to the Deed of Charge in respect of a Loan of £2,000 which is being obtained from the Treasurer in connection with the acquisition of Dock Terrace."

(413) Laneway at the rear of Quinsboro' Road.

Submitted Memorial from a number of Ratepayers on the Quinsboro' Road, concerning the condition of a laneway at the rear of Quinsboro' Road.

The Town Clerk pointed out that the laneway was a private one and could not be maintained or cleaned by the Council. He had asked the memorialists to indicate whether they would be prepared to recoup to the Council the cost of surfacing the laneway should it be decided to do so. As a reply to the letter had not been received it was agreed to adjourn the matter until the views of the memorialists in the matter were known.

(417) Bray Greyhound Racing Association.

Submitted letter from Council's Solicitors stating that the Bray Greyhound Racing Association Limited had not paid the Costs of the Certiorari proceedings or of the High Court Action, or the Costs as measured in the District Court, amounting to a total of £434 4s 4d. It was pointed out that the Attorney General had decided not to proceed further in respect of the Fine of £470 which was imposed in the District Court. The Council decided that the Attorney General be asked to take the necessary steps to collect the Fine and have it made payable to the Council to offset the expenditure of £434 4s 4d, which did not seem possible now to recover from the Company.

(418) Town Planning Applications.

(a) Plan submitted by Mr. P. Murray, Engineer, for proposed new fencing on wall at 10, Greenpark Road. It was agreed to advise the tenant that favourable consideration would be given to the erection of a more "open" fence which would not cut off vision at the corner.

The Council refused permission for the erection of a structure at 13 St. Brigid's Terrace, in accordance with the Plan submitted by Mr. E. Ryan.

(c) Additions to 110/111 Strand Road.

The Council refused permission for additions to Nos. 110 and 111 Strand Road in accordance with amended Plan submitted by Messrs. McNamara and O'Hare, architects.

(d) Structure at 28 Wolfe Tone Square, North.

The Council approved of the Plan submitted by Mr. P. McEvoy for a structure at 28 Wolfe Tone Square, North, provided that the structure is kept a suitable distance from the house and is kept in a satisfactory manner.

(e) Structure at rear of St. Anthony's, Parnell Road.

(c) The amount of money in the £, if any, placed on Rates due to financial loss by existing management between Council and Club.

ANSWER:—It is not considered that there has been any financial loss sustained by the existing arrangement with Bray Cove Swimming Club. It will be noted that the greater part of the expenditure in 1949 and 1950 was in respect of Loan Charges which would have to be paid even if the Pools were allowed to become derelict. Excluding Loan Charges the net expenditure by the Council in operating the Pools through the Club was as follows:—

Year ended 31/3/1951—£7 12s 0d (£17 12s 0d—£10).

Year ended 31/3/49—£108 2s 5d (£128 1s 10d—£19 19s 5d) which included a special contribution of £100 made by the Council that year.

During the year ended 31/3/50 there was actually a profit of £15 6s. 0d. (i.e. £16 16s. 0d. revenue—£1 10s. expenditure).

Members of the Council will recollect that, prior to the arrangement with the Club it has been the practice to let the pools to an individual who paid a nominal rent, but the Council was required to clean the Pool.

The amount in the therefore, expended was as follows:—½d in 1949. Nothing at all in 1950, since there was a profit, and one twentyfourth part of a penny in 1951 (£7 12s. 0d. expenditure—1d. produces £190).

(2) Is there a permanent Law Agent on the Council's Staff. If so, why does he not attend Council Meetings?

ANSWER:—Council's Solicitor is engaged on a Taxed Bill of Costs basis. He would be available to attend Council Meetings whenever it is considered that his attendance is necessary. He would, of course, be entitled to a Fee, possibly £2 2s. 0d. or £3 3s. 0d. for each attendance.

(3) Is membership of a particular Union essential for employment on Direct Labour Scheme.

ANSWER:—No. The only requirement is that every employee must be a member of a Trade Union.

(4) Has the Town Clerk any more information re the Building of houses at Old Connaught? Will the work be in hand for Christmas?

ANSWER:—The Council is aware that the whole position of proposed Old Connaught Housing Scheme was discussed at a Meeting on the 27th ultimo, which was attended by the Consultant Architect. The erection of the houses will commence without delay when the site for the Access Road through the Cemetery Field has been dedicated for public use, providing the house designs are approved by the Dept.

(5) Due to unsatisfactory lighting of the Bray Urban Area, has the Engineer inspected the lighting arrangements lately, with a special reference to Parnell Road and Meath Road?

ANSWER:—The former Engineer made a survey of the Urban Area in February, last in connection with improved public lighting. Provision was made for additional lighting at the Estimates Meeting held in March, and orders were subsequently issued to the Electricity Supply Board for lighting of additional lamps. It is understood that difficulty in obtaining the necessary equipment has prevented the Board from complying with the requirements of the Council in this connection.

(6) When is it proposed to commence work on the resurfacing of Main Street and Quinsboro' Road?

ANSWER:—The Quinsboro' Road which is in charge of the Co. Council was resurfaced some five years ago. No provision is made in the County Council's Road Programme for resurfacing of this road for the current year.

The Department of Local Government insisted that the Main Street should be resurfaced in tar macadam and suggested that, if the machinery were not available, that the resurfacing of the road should be performed by contract. The County Council had recently purchased the necessary machinery and it was hoped to commence work as soon as the machinery had been transferred to Bray.

(7) Has the Town Clerk received intimation as to when this Council will receive copies of Standing Orders?

ANSWER:—The Draft Standing Orders approved by the Council were submitted to the Department for approval some 18 months ago, but to date the consent of the Department to the adoption of Standing Orders has not been received.

CLR. JAMES FRENCH.

(1) Will the Manager indicate what steps he proposes to take against Messrs. Boni and Cassoni, Strand Road, since they proceeded building after a Prohibition Notice was served upon them in relation to such building.

ANSWER—Mr. Boni:—As the Council will recollect, a Prohibition Order was made on 3rd July, 1951, in respect of a structure which

was being erected at 110 and 111 Strand Road without Plans having been submitted under the Town and Regional Planning Acts. A Prohibition Order was served declaring the further proceeding with the work unlawful. Subsequently, Plans were submitted, but permission was refused as it was considered that the area was already densely built-up, and that the structure would detract from the amenities of the neighbourhood. Amended Plans were submitted and considered by the Council at its Meeting on the 4th instant. The Council refused permission for the erection of the structure. On Monday, 10th December, 1951, the Town Engineer stated that a roof had been erected on the structure. Since the Prohibition Order had been contravened, Council's solicitors have been instructed to institute proceedings under the Town and Regional Planning Acts in respect of contravention of the Prohibition Order.

Mr. Cassoni:—On the 20th November, 1950, the then Town Engineer stated that he had found a structure was being erected by Mr. V. Cassoni, at Strand Road, Bray, for which Plans had not been submitted under the Town Planning Acts. A Prohibition Order was made on the 21st idem declaring the further proceeding with the work to be prohibited. In February, 1951, Plans were submitted for the structure, but permission was refused as the structure was shown projecting in front of the building line. The Architect who submitted the Plans subsequently appealed to the Minister for Local Government and asked that the structure should be approved as a "Temporary Building" for a specific period under Section 27 of the Public Health Act, 1907, and that the building would be removed when so required by the Council. The Council declined to agree to the acceptance of an Agreement to this effect.

On the 26th April, 1951, it was reported that work had again commenced on the structure and consequently the Council's Solicitors were requested to institute proceedings for contravention of the Prohibition Notice. Subsequently, correspondence took place between the Council and the Department of Local Government upon an appeal which Mr. Cassoni made to that Department. The Department requested the submission of various reports, Manager's Orders, etc. which were duly forwarded on 3rd August, 1951, and on 4th October, 1951; the Department intimated that, as no further communication had been received from Mr. Cassoni, or his Architect, it was assumed that the Appeal against refusal had been withdrawn. The matter is still in the hands of Council's Solicitors.

(2) During the Summer holidays children under 14 were refused admission to cinemas on Sunday after 7 p.m. As the Christmas school holidays are approaching will the cinemas be written to pointing out the conditions of their Licence?
