tion and maintenance of Urban roads, water supply, sewerage, etc.) is 17s. 2d.; in the years immediately prior to 1939 the average was 14s. 0d. It is evident consequently, that the rate for Municipal Services has only increased by 22% per cent. in the past seventeen years, which scarcely can be regarded immoderate, seeing that in the intervening period the general price level has advanced about threefold.

Again it is felt that some reference should be made to the improvements effected by the Council in recent years, as public memory is usually rather short. Most of the roads in the town have ben reconstructed. It should here be mentioned that the County Council is reconstructing, in concrete, this year that part of the Strand which they maintain as a Main Road; last year they laid new footpaths along it. A nost 350 houses have been built by the Council since 1947: Public Lighting has been very much improved; there is a Cleansing Service which can be more than favourably compared with any elsewhere; the Public Library, judging by its popularity is providing a very useful service; and an adequate Water Supply seems to be available in all parts of the town as a result of the programme of main laying carried out in recent times. It would be regrettable if program in the improvement of these Municipal Services were eventually to be affected by the rising costs of the Social Services which the County Council has to administer.

To the Chairman and Members of the Council I desire once again to express my sincere appreciation for the guidance and assistance they have given so freely in the past year. The Council Staff, both indoor and outdoor, have continued to give a most satisfactory service. The preparation of these Estimates and review of your Services have been facilitated by the manner in which the necessary records have been kept, and every assistance sought has been given by the Town Clerk, Town Engineer, and the Council's Staff Officer.

The Council granted permission to Bray Amusements Committee to hold a tricycle Race at the Esplanade on the 17th July from 7 to 7.30 p.m. on condition that a Public Liability Policy holding the

Council indemnified was produced by the Committee. The Council indicated, that the Garda Authorities being satisfied, they would have no objection to the holding of a 25 mile Cycle Race by the Bray Amusements Committee on the 19th July.

LEANTO AT NORTH END OF WALLACE'S YARD.

575. Messrs. D. Coughlan Ltd. were given permission to erect a temporary leanto at the north end of Wallace's Yard on condition that it was removed immediately, on notice from the Council.

MEETING WITH VOCATIONAL SCHOOL COMMITTEE. 576. It was decided to fix a date for this Meeting in September.

CINEMA LICENCES—ADMISSION OF CHILDREN.

577. Having been informed that none of the School Managers in the town had any objections, it was recommended that the Licences granted to local Cinemas be amended by the deletion of the restriction of the admission of children after 6 p.m., between 15h June and 15th September each year.

Clr. Dr. Donnelly dissented.

SALE OF FLAGS ON ESPLANADE. 578. Permission was granted to the Order of Malta to hold a Flag Day on the Esplanade on the 22nd July, 1956. Permission was also granted to the Cerebral Palsy Association to hold a Flag Day on the Esplanade on Wednesday, 25th July, 56 Permission was also granted to Fr. Healy Nursing Association to hold a Flag Day on the Esplanade on either of the following two dates, 14th or 15th July, 1956.

LOTTERY APPLICATIONS.

579. A letter from the Council's Solicitors conveying a query by District Justice Price, asking if the Council were in agreement with the number of Licences granted in the Urban Area under the Gaming and Lotterles Act, 1956, was noted. The Council were of opinion that each case should be treated on its merits.

580. On the proposition of Councillor D. Sayers, seconded by Clr. C. Doyle, the Council approved of the following Loan Mortgages from the Hibernian Bank:—

- 1. £3,500 for ten years for resurfacing of the Seymour Road,
- 2. £2,500 for fifteen years for laying of Watermains in the Killarney Road-Vevay Road areas.

PALERMO TENANTS ASSOCIATION.

581. It was decided that the Sub-Committee of the Council previously appointed, meet the Palermo Tenants Association in the Town Hall, Bray, on Tuesday, 17th July, 1956 at 7.30 p.m.

TRAFFIC BYE LAWS-THE STRAND ROAD.

582. A letter from the Garda Superintendent intimating that in almost all cases a warning was given to motorists offending against the One Way Traffic Regulations at the Strand Road, before a prosecution was instituted, was noted.

During the discussion on this matter, Councillor Hipwell suggested the erection of a suspended sign at the entrance to the Strand Road.

ERECTION OF BARRIER AT THE ESPLANADE.

583. On the proposition of Clr. Sayers, Seconded by Clr. Hipwell, excess expenditure not to exceed £54 was voted for the provision and erection of barriers at the Esplanade.

NOTICE OF MOTION—MRS. LEDWIDGE.

The following Notice of Motion was accepted by the Chairman from Clr. Mrs. Ledwidge.

ROAD WORKS-HERBERT ROAD.

585. STREET TRADING BYE LAWS.

23 WOLFE TONE SQUARE, EAST—TRANSFER OF TENANCY.

The Council recommended that the tenancy of 23 Wolfe Tone Square, East be granted to Mrs. Annie Kelly, widow of the previous tenant.

VACANCY-27 DARGAN ST.

589. A suggestion that the tenant of 15 O'Byrne Road be transferred to 27 Dargan Street, did not met with the approval of the Council. It was agreed to investigate the matter further.

SEA WALL REPAIRS.

590. A report from the Town Engineer recommended that the work at present in progress on the Sea Wall be extended to take in the breadth of the steps, north and south of the section under repair.

On the proposition of Clr. H. Hipwell, seconded by Clr. T. Byrne the Council agreed to the extension recommended in the Report.

MOCK AUCTIONS.

591. A letter from a lady visitor to Bray complaining of the activities of a group of men who were holding what was termed mock auctions in the Albert Walk was read. After a long discussion on the matter, during which several of the Members stated that they had received similar complaints, it was decided to ask Deputy Mark Deering and Deputy P. Brennan to raise this matter in Dail Eireann.

SACKING USED AT SOUTH BANDSTAND.

592. The Town Clerk was directed to write to Mr. Bierney to whom the Council had rented the South Bandstand for concerts, and ask him to make some improvements in the type of covering erected thereon as it was considered that the present sacking was most ugly.

S. D. ACTS—TRANSFER APPLICATION.

The Council considered the application from Mrs. Martha Dempsey, 3 Sutton Villas, Bray, to transfer existing loan on St. Michael's, Newcourt Road, from Mr. Dermot Mooney.

It was pointed out to the Council that it had been ascertained that the present employment of the applicant was temporary and that her present engagement was until a period ending 31st July, 1957, when her continuance in the employment of the E.S.B. would be reviewed. It was felt, therefore, that her ability to meet commitments of loan repayments was questionable.
