8713 Letter dated 29th December from Secretary Local Government Board enclosing copy of Public Bodies Order 1904 made pursuant to Local Government (Ireland) Acts 1898 to 1902.

A report was submitted from Town Clerk drawing attention to the increased and unnecessary duties imposed on Council and Officers by the Order; and stating that in its present form the Order served no useful purpose and the most advisable thing that could happen would be the withdrawal of the Order.

The Town Clerk Blommel wrote enclosing copy of resolution from Corporation of Blommel protesting against the Order in question.

It was proposed by Councillor O'Carroll and seconded by Councillor McCreagh:—

"That we respectfully protest against the action of the Local Government Board for Ireland in issuing the Public Bodies Order, for the following amongst other reasons:—

1. That many provisions of the Order are in excess of the powers conferred by Statute upon the Local Government Board, and therefore ultra vires.
2. That the attempt of the Local Government Board to acquire the right to receive and review proceedings of Urban Councils in matters of a purely municipal nature, apart from Sanitary or Financial matters, is contrary to the spirit and intention of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, and has no legal or equitable justification.
3. That the proposed changes are in many instances the reverse of improvement, and calculated to lead to unnecessary complications and expense, without any corresponding advantage.
4. That the Order, whilst containing some useful provisions, tends to interfere to too great an extent with the independence of elected Councils, and unless revised in accordance with the views of those who are best qualified to speak and act for Local Boards, it should be withdrawn.
5. That as the existing system of this Council has already received the sanction of Local Government Board, and is

far better than the new proposals, we request that it shall be allowed to continue.

6. That pending the revision, or withdrawal of the Order, the following modifications be applied for.

- (a) Copies of the reports of the Public Health and Finance Committees of this Council, as circulated to the members, to be accepted in lieu of prescribed Financial minutes.
- (b) The Rate Books, Receipts and Abstracts, as at present framed, and all other matters in connection with the making and collecting of Urban District and Poor Rate, and Artisan's Dwellings Accounts, to continue.
- (c) Existing system in reference to Subsidary *etc*, which is in accordance with previous recommendation of the Local Government Board, to continue instead of prescribed system.
- (d) Paying Orders and Treasurer's advice notes to be one set, with space for naming account chargeable, instead of having different coloured Paying Orders and advice notes for every account, which would lead to an unnecessary multiplication of forms.

That copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Lord Lieutenant; the Chief Secretary for Ireland; the Under Secretary, Mr John E Redmond M.P., Sir Thomas Grattan Esmonde M.P., Mr J. M. Healy M.P., Mr D. G. Coogan M.P., and the Local Government Board for Ireland."
