A Gray Township Rate of Four Shillings Sixpence and Five Pence in the Pound, whereof Two Shillings and Sixpence is for the General and Sanitary Expenses of the District, under and pursuant to the Gray Township Act 1866 to 1895; Two Shillings and Five Pence is for Sanitary Expenses under and pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 and for Charges in respect of Lanes under the Public Health (Ireland) Act; the Housing of the Working Classes Act; the Electric Lighting Act &c. and the other Acts amending the same; One Penny in the Pound is for Technical and Agricultural Instruction, pursuant to the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act 1899, and the Technical

Act 1889 to 1891.

A Rate of Fivepence in the Pound for the purpose of defraying the expenses in connection with the Water Supply of the District, to be called the Bray Township Water Rate, and of which Fivepence is for Domestic Purposes and Two pence is for Public Purposes.

A Rate of One pence in the Pound to be called the Bray Township Sinking Fund Special Rate for the purpose of providing charges in respect of money borrowed and interest thereon.

A Bray Township Harbour Rate of One pence in the Pound for the purpose of paying interest on money raised under the provisions of the Bray Township Act 1890 and 1895 for the construction of Bray Harbour and purposes connected therewith.

That the said Rate and arrears of Rates be payable in equal moieties, the first moiety and arrears forthwith and the second moiety on the 1st October 1905.
Passed unanimously

Councillor R.C. Donogh moved and Councillor O. Carroll seconded.

"That the Warrant as now submitted for collection of Bray Urban District Council Town Rates for Year ending 31st March 1906 be sealed, signed and delivered to Mr. Benjamin Keagle for Collection."
