A Rate of Six Pence in the £ to be called the Gray Township Sinking Fund Special Rate for the purpose of providing charges in re money borrowed and interest thereon.

Reven A Gray Township Harbour Rate of Sixpence in the £ for the purpose of paying interest on money raised under the Provisions of the Gray Township Act 1890 to 1895 for the construction of Gray Harbour and purposes connected therewith. That the said Rates and arrears of Rates be payable in two moieties the first moiety and arrears forthwith and the second moiety on 1st October 1910 and that Rate Book as now submitted be sealed and signed.
