You will notice that the expenditure has been exceeded on General Purposes (Page 8) by £1603:6:10, on Sanitary and Public Health (Page 5) by £1961:18:11, on Electricity Works (Page 7) by £312, on Harbour Account by £31:0:5, and my estimate was reduced last year by £1900 or the equivalent of 1/3d in the pound. In the present Estimate I have only estimated barely on the basis of last year's expenditure without allowing for any new Works and should any be included the Estimate will have to be proportionately increased.

If the Council do not wish to have great balances due at the end of each financial year it will be necessary to strike a rate sufficient to clear the proposed expenditure without incurring any excess as has been done in the last two years or three years, and keep within the Estimate each year.

"A Rate of sixpence in the pound is for the purpose of defraying expenses in connection with the water supply of the district to be called the bai Cualang Urban Water Rate, and of which threepence is for domestic and threepence is for public purposes.

"A Rate of twopence in the pound to be called the bai Cualang Urban Sinking Fund Special Rate for the purpose of providing charges in re money borrowed and for the interest thereon.

"A bai Cualang Harbour Rate of twopence in the pound for the purpose of paying interest etc on money raised under the provisions of the bai Cualang Township Acts 1890 to 1895 for the construction of bai Cualang Harbour and purposes connected therewith.
