That the Secretary of the Grand Jury be directed to forward copies of this resolution to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, the Prime Minister, and the Marquis of Salisbury.

SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for _____ years of _____ perches of the Road and Footpath,

and _____

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, *and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.*

2—No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road to be in good order and repair at *any time* he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4—The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the *repair, constant maintenance in good order,* and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6—In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods, and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove *before seed time* all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10—Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13—All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16—The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18—Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleets and the arch-stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING.

20—One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually cubic yards or more if required, a sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GEATINGS, ETC.

24—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows:—

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be re-sodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ¾-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 1½ inch per yard towards the road.

25—All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

COUNTY WORKS.

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

Resolved—That no Presentment will, in future, be made in aid of any Infirmary or Fever Hospital, unless the same shall be accompanied by the account and accurate list of subscribers' names, and the amount severally subscribed by them.

Resolved—That in future there shall be printed in detail, at the beginning of the Schedule, a list of duties to be gone through by the Grand Jury.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

8,627—'86—Grand Jury.

DALKEY, 24th February, 1886.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your board that I have audited the accounts of the Secretary of the Grand Jury of the County Wicklow, following last Summer Assizes, and to transmit the accompanying account duly certified.

I have disallowed and struck out of the account a sum of £11 16s 6d, charged by the Treasurer (The National Bank) as interest on over-drafts under similar circumstances to those referred to in my report of the 17th July last when reporting the disallowance of £13 19s 0d in the account following the last Spring Assizes.

These two sums, making together £25 15s 6d, should now be placed by the Treasurer to the credit of the County, and it may be desirable that the Grand Jury should make an order to that effect.

I beg to refer to my former reports of July, 1884, and February and July, 1885, for observations relating to the charges made by the Sub-sheriff for expenses in connection with the Fines Act.

A Committee of the Grand Jury appointed to consider the Sub-sheriff's claims reported last Summer Assizes:—"It will be for the Grand Jury to consider if they should not inform the Sub-sheriff that there will not in future be allowed any sum for expenses in connection with summoning grand juries."

"We would draw attention to the Sub-sheriff's account for printing and stationery amounting to £20 3s, which we think excessive, and we would suggest that such work should in future be completed for with the other county printing."

"We are of opinion that the six receipts signed "John Bassiere," should be amended by omitting all charges for clerk's time, and including only the amount justly chargeable for postage and stationery."

Since the date of my last report the sum of £36 2s 6d was paid to the Sub-sheriff, pursuant to presentment for printing in connection with the Juries Act.

The bill, as originally made out, amounted to £37 15s, from which £1 11s 6d, the amount charged in respect to grand juries at Assizes, was deducted, but charges relating to the Quarter Sessions grand juries, amounting to £6, remain in the account, and form a portion of the sum paid to the Sub-sheriff.

The Sub-sheriff has informed me that the latter charges are correct, inasmuch as Quarter Sessions grand juries come under the designation of special juries, but I have been unable to adopt this view, as I could not find any authority for it.

The Grand Jury will, I presume, in considering further claim from the Sub-sheriff for expenses in relation to the Jurors Act, bear in mind pre-

vious over-payments and also a previous resolution of the Grand Jury on the subject, and will inquire what are the additional duties and expenses imposed on sub-sheriffs by the Jurors Acts, as it is only those expenses he is entitled to be recouped.

For the duties imposed on the Sub-sheriff and the expenses incurred by him in discharging such duties prior to the passing of the Jurors Act in the year 1871, the salary paid to him by the county was, I believe, understood to compensate.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have made the following analyses in my capacity as your analyst during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1885:—

For the guardians of Rathdrum Union, two specimens of milk were analysed, one of them was adulterated with 12 per cent. of water; the other was of very poor quality, and was probably either "fore" milk or slightly skimmed.

A specimen of milk sent from the Court-house, Wicklow, was found to be of poor quality.

A specimen of water analysed for the guardians of the Rathdown Union was found to be so highly polluted as more to resemble slightly diluted sewage than potable water. It was, of course, utterly unfit for use.

Four analyses of various articles were made for private persons residing within the county.

For Naas Union, which is partly within the County of Wicklow, three specimens of milk were analysed, of which one was found to be adulterated with 12 per cent. of added water.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1886.

Mr. Foreman, and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

It is not necessary on this occasion to call particular attention to any of the applications for presentments in the Schedule, as any necessary information can be given as they come before you.

The past season has been very severe for road maintenance; but it is satisfactory to be able to report that the majority of the roads have had fair work done on them, and that the improvement in their condition steadily continues.

Some contractors have, however, been negligent, and have in consequence been refused certificates.

Since last Assizes it became necessary in the four following cases to proceed against the contractors and their sureties for breach of contract:—

Laurence Conroy	...	Lower Talbotstown.
James Kean	...	Newcastle.
Henry Appleby	...	North Ballinacor.
George Byrne	...	Shillelagh.

Decrees were granted in each case.

It would have been very desirable to have taken the same course in some other cases, but it was impossible to do so, as, owing to the Road Sessions having been held a month later than usual, the dates clashed with those of the Quarter Sessions.

Plans have been deposited for a narrow gauge railway from Bray to Enniskerry. It is proposed to cross the county road from Bray to Enniskerry in two places as follows:—First, at Kilbride, about 3 chains east of Troy's public-house. Here the road is to be raised 6 feet by gradients of 1 in 30 each way and the railway passed beneath. Second, at the Dargle Big Tree, where a level crossing is proposed. I have made a special report on this level crossing to the Board of Trade.

Referring to the new pier at Greystones, now in course of construction, I beg to inform you that I applied to the Board of Works for copies of the contract plans and specification, but they were refused. I should not have applied for them did I not understand that this pier will on completion be handed over to the county for maintenance.

I have to inform you that a serious injury suddenly occurred to one of the piers of Wicklow stone-bridge. I attribute the immediate cause of the damage to the fact that a barge was allowed to drift across all the arches between the western abutment and the damaged pier, thus directing the full force of the current against it.

The scour in the river has, however, greatly increased since the channel below bridge was deepened, and I fear there will be further trouble

in consequence of the undermining action of the current below the bridge, as the bed of the river is certainly being scoured away.

As the period for which you sanctioned the appointment of a fourth assistant expires now, I regret having to trouble you again with the consideration of his further appointment which I consider absolutely necessary for the reasons given in my report to the last Grand Jury, which appears at page 16 of the abstract on the table before you.

As there is a probability of changes in the administration of county matters some members of your body may, possibly, object under the circumstances to the permanent appointment of a fourth assistant. Should this be so, I would respectfully suggest that you sanction his re-appointment for a further period of twelve months. In this way you are committed to but a very small matter in a pecuniary sense, but one of great importance to your county, and the matter can be again considered in twelve months' time. I would here remark that the extra assistant has now been sanctioned for one year and eight months with the best possible results.

THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED BY THE GRAND JURY TO REPORT ON THE INFIRMARY, SUB-SHERIFF'S, AUDITOR'S, CORONER'S, COURT-KEEPER'S AND INDUSTRIAL ACCOUNTS, BEG TO REPORT AS FOLLOWS:—

Infirmary.—That, with regard to the Infirmary, we consider that the Grand Jury cannot present for the law expenses *re L'Estrange*, as they have not been taxed. Payments, £15 12s 10d.—*Approved*.

No accounts relating to the Infirmary were laid before us.—£170.

Approved.

Sub-Sheriffs.—We recommend that a sum of £15, claimed for printing in connection with the Jurors' Acts, by the late Sub-sheriff, be disallowed, as it is not entered in the Schedule, therefore could not have been lodged in time with the Secretary, as required by resolution of the Grand Jury, nor can we find any authority for the payment thereof, it not having been vouched.—*Approved*.

The amount of £6 to which the Auditor calls attention in his report, we recommend to be deducted from any sum now due to the late sub-sheriff for his expenses in connection with the last two quarter sessions, these being the only claims that he can now have on this Grand Jury.

—*Approved*.

Auditor's Report.—With regard to the two sums charged by the National Bank for interest on overdraft amounting to £25 15s 6d, which the auditor disallowed, we recommend that the Manager of the Bank be ordered to place the same to the credit of the county, and that in future no draft be honoured unless there are county funds to meet the same in the bank, and so prevent a recurrence of such charges. To be communicated to the Manager of the National Bank.

Coroners' Account.—No. 99.—With regard to the Coroners' accounts, we are of opinion that £14 11s should be disallowed in Mr Jones's account for 5 inquests and mileage, held in Mr Newton's district during the absence of that gentlemen on private business.

No. 100.—We also consider that the sum of £2 2s should be disallowed in Mr Newton's account for doctors' fees for 2 inquests, No. 12 and 13, held upon inmates of the workhouses of Shillelagh and Baltinaglass, the doctors in each case being the medical officer of the workhouse in which the inquest was held. See 9 & 10 Vic., ch. 37, sec. 32

Court-keepers.—We recommend that the sum of ten shillings for firewood be disallowed, for which there is no voucher in the account of the Wicklow Court-house keeper.

Industrial Schools.—We recommend that the following Standing Committee of the Grand Jury be appointed pursuant to 31 & 32 Vic., ch. 25, sec. 9, and 31 & 32 Vic., ch. 59, sec. 10, to enter into an agreement with the managers of any industrial school duly certified for the respective maintenance and keeping in such school of such children as shall be ordered to be sent there from this county, and with the Directors and Managers of any reformatory duly certified for the reception and keeping in such school from time to time of offenders from this county sentenced to be detained in any Reformatory School, and to check the respective committals, and report on the accounts to each assizes.

Colonel Tottenham, Thomas Acton, D.L.; Colonel Tighe, Lieut.-Colonel Pratt Saunders, C. W. Barton, Esq.; David Mahony, Esq.; W. F. Littledale, Esq.; A. Taylor, Esq.; W. R. Bulwer, Esq.; and Dr. Truell; or any three or more of them.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO EXAMINE
THE HIGH CONSTABLES' ACCOUNTS.

We have examined the lists of arrears of County Cess, but in the absence of information as to items which may be barred by the statute of limitation, we are unable to report that any portion thereof is irrecoverable.

We have had under our consideration a receipt for County Cess, which is not on a printed form, and does not state the Barony, nor give the name of the Barony Collector, and we recommend that the High Constables be directed to give printed forms of receipt in all cases.

We also recommend that the High Constables be directed to distinguish the repayments for the instalments for Harbour Works which come under the provisions of 43 Vic., c. 4, sec. 14, and to place the amounts separately on the back of the receipts for cess.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE

On the County Surveyor's Report and Application regarding Drainage Work, Mr. Strype, C.E.

1—As to the clashing of dates, Road Sessions and Quarter Sessions causing inconvenience, we consider it will be necessary to reconsider the fixing of dates of Presentment Sessions at next Assizes.—To be brought before next Grand Jury.

2—With reference to the County Surveyor's remarks on the Stone Bridge at Wicklow, and Mr Strype's application for consideration of a drainage scheme for the Murrrough of Wicklow, we consider that the Grand Jury has no call to contribute to a drainage scheme of the kind contemplated, which appears outside their duties.

The present bridge is, no doubt, unsafe, and will require considerable repair. Certainly not less than £400 will be required to make it safe.

If a new bridge on the site of the present foot-bridge was constructed with a swing pass for navigation, we understand the Chemical Works Company are prepared to contribute a yearly instalment in repayment of capital equal to £1,000, the cost of a new bridge may be estimated at about £2,000; there would be a saving, it appears, of about £400, which would leave the cost on the county of new bridge of about £600 extra, and we consider the improvements to the town by the change and new bridge full value for this, and will let the matter be brought before Presentment Sessions, but without any expression of opinion as from the Grand Jury.

3—We recommend that the fourth assistant be continued for the present, as recommended by the County Surveyor, but distinctly as a temporary arrangement.
