SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one mouth, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and work-manlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to

carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may

be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be

at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15-The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

qualities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 21 inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the arch-

stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19.—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size. TIME FOR SPREADING.

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

cubic yards or more if required, a 22-The contractor io te supply annually sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23-In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and

maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 13 inch per yard

towards the road.

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed. COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27-All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

1,634-'87-Grand Jury.

DALKEY, 10th January, 1887.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your Board that I have audited the Account of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following the last Summer Assizes, and to transmit the account duly declared and certified.

The Solicitor to the Grand Jury applied to the Presentment Sessions prior to Summer Assizes for payment of £14, costs of preparing and registering two sets of bonds for the Barony Collectors.

The Presentment Sessions disallowed the claim, but an application having been subsequently made to the Grand Jury by the Solicitor at the following Assizes, the Grand Jury made presentments for the amounts.

It would appear from the Act 6 & 7 Wm. 4, cap. 116, sections 38 and 117, that the Grand Jury were precluded from making a presentment, in this case the application not having been "approved at sessions." Moreover the cost of preparing the bonds should have been borne by the collectors, in accordance with a resolution adopted by the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes, 1854, whilst the cost of registering (10s. each) was payable by the County. The claim against the County ought, therefore, not to have exceeded £8, being 10s. in each case.

This matter will, I presume, be adjusted when some future bill of costs of the Solicitor is being settled.

Mr. Buckley, Collector for the Barony of Rathdown, does not send his block receipt books to the Secretary of the Grand Jury, as he is bound to do by the Order in Council.

Only two Collectors, Messrs. Storey and Appleby, attended the audit.

The Manager of the National Bank, at Wicklow, gave me an undertaking that he would, without further delay, carry over to the credit of the Grand Jury the amount charged as interest on advances and disallowed at previous audits.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to leave report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended the 31st December, 1886:—

For the guardians of Baltinglass Union, eight specimens of whiskey were from time to time examined, and their strength and quality reported upon.

A specimen of water analysed for this Union was found to be of good composition and fit for all domestic purposes.

Two specimens of milk were sent to me for analyses by the guardians of Rathdrum Union. One was spilt in transit, the other was found to be of fairly good quality.

A water analysed for Dr M Dowell, Medical Officer of Health, Baltinglass, was found to be pure.

Three waters were analysed for the guardians of Shillelagh Union, and, although somewhat peaty in character, were found to be free from sewage and similar pollution.

A water sent by Mr A. Taylor, from Arklow, was found to be largely polluted and to be unfit for use.

The viscera of a dog, sent by Mr W. Owen, J.P., Blessington, were found to contain poison.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated within the County of Wicklow, three specimens of milk were analysed; they were all poor in quality.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW, Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1887.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The number of applications for maintenance contracts and special works at the last Road Sessions of your county was 100, of which 81 were for special works and 19 for road maintenance. This number was, on investigation, reduced to 68 for miscellaneous works and 17 for road contracts. Most of these were contracted for at Adjourned Sessions; but a few remain over for your disposal.

With some few exceptions, these miscellaneous works are all of the ordinary character and may be passed over in this report, as all necessary information concerning them can be given as the schedule is gone over.

No. 7, South Ballinacor, now to be tendered for, has been referred to in previous reports. It is to reconstruct Ballymaghroe bridge, and is a most necessary work.

No. 11, in same barony, now, however, merely to be certified, is to reconstruct the timber bridge on the Coolbawn road. When this work has been done the last of the timber road bridges in this county will have disappeared.

No. 19, Newcastle, also to be certified, is for a very useful work. It has been applied for several times at previous Road Sessions; but was rejected.

Since last Assizes the unsafe condition of Wicklow bridge has engaged my anxious attention.

An application was made at the last Road Sessions for Newcastle barony for a sum of £600 to pile and pave under and below the bridge; but having examined it on the morning of the sessions' day, I came to the conclusion that the proposed work would entail a considerable expenditure with an uncertain result, and reported accordingly to the sessions, whereupon the application was disallowed. I then, under the provisions of the 15th section of the Grand Jury Act, made an application for a new bridge, which, having been carefully considered, was passed, and appears at No. 20 Newcastle. The site proposed by me was that of the present foot-bridge, which appears to present several decided advantages. Since then, however, a proposition has been made at a public meeting of those interested to build the bridge close above the present stone-bridge and to provide it with an opening span. This so materially alters the application approved of, and which now lies before you to be certified by the foreman, that I am of opinion, if the change be approved of, the whole proceedings must be commenced afresh at the next Presentment Sessions by the lodgment of a new application. Meanwhile the Grand Jury might deem it advisable to appoint a committee to go into the whole matter and report to the next Road Sessions and the next Grand Jury.

A breach occurred last month in one of the piers of a most serious nature; but the repairs were taken in hands at once and done as well as circumstances admitted. Since last Assizes a sum of £52 has been expended on the bridge,

Many roads were badly damaged by the heavy rain falls of last autumn, but were all with one exception (see 17 Lower Talbotstown) repaired without having recourse to sudden damage orders, which as a rule should not, in my opinion, be granted for surface damages to roads, as in nine cases out of ten such surface damage would be inconsiderable if the provisions of the specification, especially with regard to drainage, were carried out, and in case of such damage occurring, the supply of road metal, if provided in time in accordance with the contract, would in most cases be amply sufficient to make good the damage.

It is a matter for congratulation that so little damage was done to the county bridges and culverts; but this may be accounted for in a great measure by so many of them having been repaired during the last few

The principal damages done were to Davidstown foot-bridge, barony of Upper Talbotstown, and Mullenramond bridge, barony of Rathdown, both of which have been since repaired.

Since last Assizes it became necessary in the seven following cases to proceed against the contractors and their sureties for breach of contract:—

Edward Byrne
Michael J. Byrne
John Donohoe
Michael Fitzpatrick

Cornelius Reilly
James Reilly

Decrees were obtained in each case for amounts of bonds and costs.

Proceedings were also commenced against two other contractors;
but as the defects were to a large extent remedied before the cases were heard, the proceedings were withdrawn on the defaulters paying costs.

All the above nine cases were from the Barony of Lower Talbotstown, a large district of which has not shown that improvement in the condition of the roads which the rest of the county has. It is, however, satisfactory to be able to report that since the above proceedings were taken a considerable improvement is apparent in many of the roads of that district.

A request has been made to me that I should bring under your notice the desirability of having arrangements made for heating the Crown Court. I have obtained estimates for this work on several systems which I can submit to any committee you may appoint to consider the subject.

The period for which you renewed the temporary assistant's appointment expires at this Assizes, and I feel confident you will be good enough to extend it for such further period as you may think fit. I have gone so fully into the necessity of this appointment at several previous Assizes that I think there is no occasion for me to do so again in this report.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE

On the County Surveyor's Report-Spring Assizes, 1887.

The Committee of the Grand Jury appointed to consider the County Surveyor's Report met on Friday, 25th of March, consisting of George Booth, Esq., E. Dennis, Esq., Capt. Drought, Capt. Pennefather, and Dr. Truell, beg to recommend-

1—That tenders for No. 7 South Ballinacor be now accepted.

2—That No. 11 in same barony be now certified for.

3-That No 19 Newcastle, be left for treatment in the ordinary course, without expressing any opinion.

4-Having attentively considered the arguments brought forward by the deputation of the Town Commissioners (Messrs. Nolan, Strype, M'Carroll, Delahunt, and Kennedy), against the site of the proposed new bridge selected at sessions, we recommend the presentment No. 20, Newcastle, should not be further proceeded with, and that we postpone the building of any new bridge till the exigencies of increased traffic of the new harbour require it.

In mean time we unanimously agree to ask the Grand Jury, if they have the power, to grant a sum not exceeding £600, to be immediately laid out by the Co. Surveyor, in piling across the river, about 20 feet south of the stone bridge, with balk timber, seven inches square, and say on an average 20 feet long, to be securely driven into the marl below the bed of the river, and that the interval between the row of piles and bridge, as also under same to northern end of its abutments be filled with large stones, as a sort of rough paving. We suggest the money required for the bridge be raised half on the Barony of Newcastle, half on Arklow Barony.

We believe it is absolutely necessary to execute some such work immediately, to protect the foundations of the bridge being further undermined and ultimately carried away by the scour produced by the Harbour Board having blasted the rock and dredged the river bed so close up to the bridge.

We are of opinion the above repairs will, in all probability, enable the existing bridge to last for very many years (as the superstructure is in perfect order), without any further outlay, and that we are not justified in laying out the money of the cesspayers in building a new bridge, more especially that as yet the traffic of the port does not warrant us in removing the bridge to the site originally proposed at the commencement of the harbour work.

We recommend the above work to be commenced as soon as possible, under the supervision of the County Surveyor, and that the payment of the various instalments be previously sanctioned by the following committee, consisting of Capt. Drought, Mr. Casement, Dr. Truell, Mr. Ellis, Mr. Wade, and Mr. Shepard, any four of whom to form a quorum, Dr. Truell to be convenor.

If the Grand Jury see their way to grant this application, it will entail very much less cost than the only other way of granting a number of sudden damage warrants.

5-We wish to refer the Grand Jury to the report of a former committee, and to previous resolutions and reports, and to suggest that our solicitor be instructed to apply to the Harbour Board for the amount of the outlay which has been made imperative in consequence of their deepeningthe bed of the river.

6-We recommend that application be made for a sum not exceeding £60 to next Presentment Sessions, for the means of heating the Crown Court .- Approved as amended.

7-We recommend that the temporary assistant, Mr. Pansing, be re-appointed for one year.

8-We examined the Sub-Sheriff's account, and reduced the amount by ten shillings.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

ON

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS AND REFORMATORIES.

Committee-C. W. Barton, Colonel Saunders, W. F. Littledale.

1—We, the Committee appointed at Spring Assizes, 1887, to report on above, beg to recommend that the items from No. 57 to No. 74, both inclusive, be passed.

2—We find that your Secretary has been prevented fully complying with the order of previous Grand Jury, directing him to keep a list showing all particulars relative to the committal of children to Reformatories or Industrial Schools, owing to the neglect in some instances of the Magistrates making such committals, and of the Managers of those establishments to which the committals are made sending him the information required to enable him to do so, and we recommend that the necessity of supplying such information be strongly pressed on the notice of the Magistrates and Managers by directing your Secretary to forward to them copies of the above-named order.

3—We find that Artane Industrial School, as well as Cork Street, has not agreed to the 2s rate, and we recommend that no committals be made to any Industrial School or Reformatory, save those which have agreed to such rate, unless the further sum required be guaranteed from some private source, and thus save unnecessary expense being entailed by the County.

4—We beg to call the attention of the Grand Jury to paragraph No. 5 of last report on this subject, and would suggest that the recommendation set forth be again strongly urged on the attention of the Magistrates; and, further, that the greatest care should be given to the investigation of all such cases, so that no committal be made unless the absolute necessity of such a step being taken is proved beyond all doubt.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO INVESTI-GATE THE COURT-HOUSE KEEPERS, CORONERS, THE FEVER HOSPITALS AND INFIRMARY ACCOUNTS.

Committee-Colonel Kemmis, W. R. Bulwer, Major Tottenham, Meade C. Dennis.

That the Court-house Accounts are correct. That the Coroners' Accounts are complete and correct, with the exception of a fee of one guinea (£1 1s), due to Dr H. Stoker for medical evidence at an inquest on the body of James Atkinson (an infant) held at Newtown-Mt.-Kennedy, before two J.P.'s—Messrs Meade and Segrave—in the absence of the Coroner, Mr. Jones, which fee they recommended should be presented for, but which has not yet been entered on the schedule.

The Committee also recommend that a sum of eighty pounds, sixteen shillings (£80 16s), be presented for the Newtown-Mt.-Kennedy Fever Hospital, under 58 Geo. III., cap. 47, sec. 7.

A question has arisen with regard to the representation of the Grand Jury on the Board of the Wicklow Infirmary, which was recommended by a resolution passed at the Spring Assizes of 1885. The Board of the Infirmary object to the Secretary of the Grand Jury sitting on the Board, inasmuch as his subscription was paid for him by the Grand Jury, and not by himself.

If the Grand Jury are of opinion that they should be represented on the Board, the Committee suggest, as they think the Grand Jury is entitled to some control over the expenditure of their grant, that instead of presenting £170 for the Infirmary, they present a sum of £168 to that institution.

Presentment made ... £159 10 0

We recommend that the presentment No. 33 in the schedule, for seventy pounds for one year's salary to the Surgeon of the Wicklow County Infirmary, be reduced to forty-seven pounds, inasmuch as the Grand Jury has no power to present a sum exceeding £47 under 6 & 7 Wm. IV., c. 116, sec. 86, at any one assize, and that at the two next ensuing assizes two sums of £47 and £46, respectively, be presented, in order to recoup a loss which was the result of an oversight on the part of the Surgeon when he was first appointed.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED BY THE GRAND JURY TO CONSIDER THE REMUNERATION TO BE ALLOWED IN THE FUTURE TO THEIR SOLICITOR.

COMMITTEE-G. E. Tombe, F. Moore, W. F. Littledale, A. Taylor.

Having considered the various duties the Solicitor to the Graud Jury may be called on to perform, we, the undersigned members of the Committee, suggest the following regulations for the consideration of and adoption by the Grand Jury:—

1st. Their Solicitor to be in attendance on any day upon which the Grand Jury may sit for fiscal business, and to be entitled therefor to a fee of £3 3s for each of such days, which fee is to include all business to be personally performed for the Grand Jury upon those days.

2nd. He is to be further entitled to receive, as hitherto. a sum of money, at the rate of 17s. 6d. for each bond, at each assize, to cover all the expenses of perfecting the bonds of the High Constables and their Sureties, and of duly registering the warrants thereof.

3rd. All other business done by direction of the Grand Jury outside of their days of sitting for fiscal business, including all costs out of pocket, fees to counsel and scrivenery, to be taxed as between solicitor and client.

4th. Any bill of costs incurred on their behalf to be submitted to the Grand Jury upon their first day of sitting at each assize, for their inspection, and to be afterwards taxed by the Clerk of the Crown and Peace, or by such other officer as the Grand Jury may direct.

5th. All directions to employ counsel, or to incur other expenditure, to be given in writing to the Solicitor, and in case a necessity for any such expenditure should arise during the assize, but after the Grand Jury had been discharged, the directions to incur such expenditure may be given by the Secretary of the Grand Jury upon the sanction and approval of the Foreman, and at least one other member of the late Grand Jury.
