SPECIFICATION

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

perches of the Road and Footpath,

between

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3-The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8-The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11-Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12-This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year-in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may

be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hellows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be

at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15-The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

qualities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 21 inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the archstones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING 20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extrancous

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22-The contractor is to supply annually cubic yards or more if required, a sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23-In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and

maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 11 inch per yard

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

COUNTY WORKS.

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first helf-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

DALKEY, 9th February, 1889.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your Board that I have audited the Accounts of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following last Summer Assizes, and to transmit the Secretary's account duly declared and certified.

The payments of £5 5s. 0d. to the County Surveyor for inspection and report to the Grand Jury on the Dublin and Blessington Tramway, and £14 14s. 0d. to Mr. Irwin, assistant to the County Surveyor, for service s rendered in connexion with the Tramway, and the mode of charging these expenses appear to me to be questionable.

The payment to the County Surveyor is charged to the County at Large, as is also one-half the amount paid to his assistant, the other half being charged on the Barony of Lower Talbotstown. These payments are represented as having been made pursuant to Clause 4 of the Schedule to the Order in Council of the 5th July, 1884, but the Order and Schedule are silent as to the party—whether the Grand Jury or the Tramway Company—liable for the payment, and in the absence of any direction to the contrary it appears to me that the liability rested on the Company.

Assuming, however, that that is not the case, and that the amount was properly payable by the Grand Jury and chargeable to the cesspayers, why the County at Large is to be charged with nearly two-thirds of the amount, and the interested and guaranteeing Barony—the Barony of Lower Talbotstown (or a portion of it)—with little more than one-third, is not apparent.

An account of Mr. M'Phail's, amounting to £224 2s., for printing in connection with the Parliamentary Voters' Acts, was presented for and paid, without having been duly certified by the proper officer; and although I learnt from the Secretary of the Grand Jury that the Clerk of the Peace stated verbally to the Grand Jury that the account was correct, such verbal representation cannot be deemed sufficient. The Clerk of the Peace should have certified the accuracy of the account in writing at foot thereof, previous to the amount being presented for.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1888 :--

July 2.—A specimen of water from Coollattin was analysed for Mr. F. Brooke, and was favourably reported upon.

7th July.—Four samples of whiskey were received from Sergeant

Hughes, R.I.C., Bray. Two of them were found to be adultered. 9th July .- Four specimens of milk were received from Sergeant

Hughes, Bray. One of them was adulterated, and another was of doubtful composition as regards purity.

July 10th.—The water used in the Police Barracks, Wicklow, was

examined, and, on the whole, rather unfavourably reported.

21st July.—Two specimens of butter were received from Sergeant

John Hughes, Bray, and were found to be pure.

31st July.—On this day I received from Sergeant Hughes a specimen of milk, one of two which he had sent, the other having been spilt in transit. The milk was very poor, but possibly may have been pure.

11th August.—Three specimens of whiskey were received from Sergeant Henry Joyce, Dunlavin. Two of them were adulterated.

6th August.-Two specimens of whiskey were received from Ser-

geant John Hughes, R.I.C., Bray. They were found to be pure.

28th August,—A specimen of water was analysed for Dr Hamilton, Medical Officer of Health, Enniskerry. It was found to be polluted and unfit for use.

September 20th.—Two specimens of whiskey were received from Sergeant Samuel Moore, R.I.C., Baltinglass. One of them was adulterated.

October 1st .- On this day I received two specimens of whiskey from Sergeant Simon Browne, Wicklow. One of them was adulterated.

16th October .- A specimen labelled "butter" was this day received from Sergeant Browne, Wicklow. On analysis it was found to contain a mere trace of butter, being almost wholly composed of fats foreign to butter. I may here remark that the discrimination of butter fats from the fats of lard, suet, &c., is one of the most delicate operations in analytical chemistry, and requires much time and attention.

November 1st.—A specimen of water from the Police Barracks was

found to be exceedingly hard, and in other respects inferior.

November 15th -Two specimens of water were analysed for the Medical Officer of Health of Baltinglass (Dr. F. V. M'Dowell). One was very impure; the other was not so impure.

22nd November.-Two oil cakes were analysed for Mr. Fletcher Moore, J.P., Manor, Kilbride. One of them contained a large quantity

of sand.

December 6th.—A specimen of water was analyed for the Guardians of Baltinglass Union. It was of fairly good composition.

Public Analyst's Report-Continued.

December 11th.—Two specimens of milk were analysed for Sergeant

Browne, Wicklow. One of them was adulterated.

19th December.—A specimen of "weed killer" was analysed for Dr. H. P. Truell, J.P., Ashford, and found to be a solution of arsenic in caustic soda.

20th December.—A specimen of milk analysed for Sergeant A. H. O'Reilly, R.I.C., Arklow, was found to be adulterated.

For Naas Union, which is in part situated in the County of Wick-

low, the following analyses were made:-

7th July.—Four specimens of tea were analysed with the view of determining which was best for use in the Workhouse.

determining which was best for use in the Workhouse.

18th July.—A specimen of water, which was found to be of second-

class quality.

12th November.—Three specimens of milk, two of which were adulterated.

28th December.—A sample of milk, of poor quality.

For Rathdown Union, which is also partly within the County of Wicklow, two specimens of water were analysed. One was from Greystones, but I am not aware where the other came from. The Greystones water was tolerably good; the other water was a very hard one, and, on the whole, inferior water.

The total analyses above described was 45.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW, Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1889.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

It is not necessary on this occasion to trouble you with a long report, as the county matters under my supervision are, generally speaking, in a satisfactory condition.

The following are the only works in the schedule before you to

which it is necessary to draw your particular attention :-

Arklow, No. 7-To build a bridge between the townlands of Ardanairy and Sallymount. This work, although doubtless of use to persons living in that locality, is not situated on any county road; but on a trackway over which the public appears to have a right of way. The original county road is now covered with sand hills. Section 56 of the Grand Jury Act appears to preclude such works being presented for if not on "public roads.'

Arklow, No. 8, and Newcastle, No. 15-To build a culvert at the bounds of these baronies on the road by Deputy's Pass. In my opinion this should not be passed, as it is not required for the county road; but merely to facilitate the drainage of lands above it.

North Ballinacor, No. 10-To widen, improve and protect the road in Rathdrum. This work has been several times before Sessions, and

is necessary.

Newcastle, No. 14-To repair the culvert between Church-street and the wooden bridge in Wicklow is necessary. This culvert is under the

public road and its abutments are badly undermined.

The roads and footpaths of this county being in very many places prejudiced by the obstruction and shade of hedges and trees, steps have been taken in many cases to have them cut; but much work in this direction still remains to be done.

Since last Assizes I am pleased to say that it was necessary in only one case to take proceedings against defaulting contractors. This case was that of Abraham Heatley-No. 7 Newcastle barony-in which a decree was given. I have, however, lately noted a few cases of neglect, which will be dealt with in due course.

During the long continued wet season your roads have been fairly maintained, and with a few exceptions are now in very tolerable order.

Mr. Ramsay, the assistant surveyor for the baronies of Arklow and North Ballinacor, resigned his situation last September in order to accept an appointment on the new Manchester waterworks. I appointed in his place Mr Thomas Little, who has had over four years' experience in a similar position in the County Londonderry, which he resigned in order to accept the vacancy here. I feel sure it is unnecessary to make any especial appeal to you to renew Mr. Little's appointment, as the present number of assistants is essential for carrying out the duties necessary for the proper supervision of your roads and works.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY,

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1889.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

It will be convenient in this report to take up in their order the clauses of the last Grand Jury Committee's report on this matter and inform you how far they have been complied with.

I inspected the line on 9th inst. and found as follows:-

I. Curbing.—The line within the county has been curbed throughout where necessary, with the exception of 35 yards at the Blessington end. The curbing laid since last Assizes is of better description and better laid than that previously put down; but the insecure portions between Blessington and Cross Chapel have not been re-set. Until this is done the water table of the road cannot be properly cleaned up without disturbing the curbstones.

II. Level Crossings.—Five out of the ten level crossings to be lowered are done. The public road level crossing at 11 miles $6\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs is improved, and of the twenty crossings to be timbered fourteen are done.

III. DRAINAGE.—Of the cross drains pointed out by me as necessary ten still remain to be done.

IV. DANGEROUS PLACE.—The place indicated has been much improved in accordance with a permissive presentment passed at Road Sessions (see Schedule, No. 9 Lower Talbotstown).

V. Stone Depots.—Nine stone depots have been constructed; but only eight are available as the Company does not yet appear to be in possession of the land on which the depot at the Slate Quarries road is made. At this depot a foundation has been laid for a wall as if to retake the land, also part of the back wall has been knocked down. The road contractor was prevented by the owner from filling this depot.

The fencing round these depots is of very inferior description and will need frequent repairs. Proper timbered crossings have not yet been made to those depots which are alongside the tramway. There should be two to each.

VI. Side of Road to be Renewed.—Only a very short piece has been done. It is essential that those places I have pointed out should be properly formed and metalled.

VII. MOVING THE LINE.—This has been done to a sufficient extent.

In addition to the above, the following works have been done:—
The line has been extended through Blessington street for 85 yards from its authorized termination. This extension is a considerable public convenience, as it brings the line opposite the Post-office. The company obtained a permissive presentment for this extension at the Road Sessions (see Schedule, No. 10 Lower Talbotstown).

An additional siding has been laid into the station ground at

Blessington and a water tank erected.

The two sets of points in Blessington street should be boarded over, as I consider them dangerous in their present state, and the company should keep the space between the rails through Blessington in better condition, as this part of the road is badly furrowed from the engines blowing off through the cylinder cocks.

A short siding has been put in at the Lamb, and the rails at the sharp curves have been tied together in accordance with General Hutchinson's requirements. The line was opened for traffic on 1st August last.

Two members of your standing committee, Colonels Saunders and

Tighe, went over the line on the 19th November last.

The County Surveyor's report as to the County Works, &c., is satisfactory, and we beg to recommend a renewal of the appointment of Mr.

Thomas Little, as temporary assistant surveyor, for another year.

The report on the Steam Tramway is also satisfactory, as it will be seen that, although the Company have not yet fully completed the works and improvements, as directed by the last Grand Jury and agreed to by the Company, the principal part has been fairly carried out; and we suggest that the attention of the Company should be called to the still unfinished portions, as set forth in the County Surveyor's report, with a view to their being finished with the least possible delay.

The Existing Contracts have been examined, and the total, amount-

ing in all to £4,951 2s. 2d., appears to be correct.

BARONY CONSTABLES.

The schedule of arrears presented to us by the Barony Constables have been duly sworn to and properly completed, but no other books or documents were produced before us, so we are not in a position to make a full statement as to the accounts; and we beg to suggest that the High Constables be directed that for the future they must attend personally before the Grand Jury at each Assizes with their books and other documents. especially the applotment books and the original schedule of arrears, as presented to the Special Sessions, and that any neglect of this order shall entail a disallowance of their fees.

- 1.—That the Sub-sheriff's accounts are correct.
- 2.—That the Coroners' accounts are correct, with the exception of a clerical error in those of Mr. Jones, whereby the total is made £29 5s, whereas it should be £29 2s.
- 3 —The Courthouse-keeper's accounts are correct, but some of them entered in a very inconvenient form for checking, which ought to be amended for the future.

In consequence of the smoky state of the Grand Jury room to-day, the Committee recommend that the Court-keeper be charged to be more careful in the future to see that the flues are in proper working order.

They observe that a large charge—£3 6s. 11d.—has been made for stationery, and again £1 9s. 6d., under the head of "miscellaneous," for the Wicklow Court-house, but they have no means of arriving at what these charges should reasonably be.

Report of the Committee on Mr. F. Browne's Bill of Costs. We find the amount—£15 3s.—correct, and the charges reasonable.

Report of the Committee on Printing Contracts.

Mr. M'Phail's last contract for printing the Register of Voters for County Wicklow is 5s. for each page. Each page to consist of 70 names, irrespective of space, and exclusive of the first and last pages, for each of which he is also to be paid 5s.

The total number of voters on the Register is 10,691 (A).—[See accompanying schedule]; the number of voters on the first and last pages is 1,121 (B and C). Deduct this number from 10,691; there remain 9,570 names on the Register, exclusive of the first and last pages. 9,570 divided by 70, the page by names, gives 137 pages. There are besides 34 first and last pages, the number of polling districts being 17, and each district printed separately.

There are also 19 pages on the Claims List, and 25 on the List of Objections, both reckoned in the same way.

The number of pages, therefore, for which Mr. M'Phail should be paid under his existing contract is—

137 for voters on the Register,

34 ,, first and last pages,

19 ,, pages of Claims List,

25 ,, pages List of Objections; in all 215 pages, at 5s. each=£53 15s. 0d.
