SPECIFICATION

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

years of

perches of Road and Footpath,

between

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3-The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to

carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8-The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept and edged with spade and line (a plough on no account to be used) and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road. Contractor to remove any waste margins that may be pointed out.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, turf, manure, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the

roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10—Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11-Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12-This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year-before 1st February, 1st April, and 1st October, and at all other

times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15-The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

qualities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than 2! inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the archstones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19.-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

cubic yards a sufficient 22-The contractor is to supply annually at least quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the

contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23-In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 11 inch per yard towards the road.

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27-All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIALS.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the

road shall become the property of the county.

29-The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal found descient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should be fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented tothe credit of the Barony.

have applied to us to become security to the said Board for the said loan; and whereas it has been proposed that in the first place the school buildings and premises, and in the second place two solvent securities in addition to the said Earl of Meath, to be approved of by the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow at the Summer Assizes, 1890, should become liable for the repayment of said loan in priority to any security which may be given by the Grand Jury. Now we, upon the terms above-mentioned, are willing to give security in such manner as may be agreed upon.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1889:—

The following articles were received from Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Food Inspectors:—Sergeant Joyce, Dunlavin, two specimens of whiskey; Sergeant Moore, Baltinglass, four specimens of whiskey; Sergeant Dobbyn, Newtown-Mount-Kennedy, two specimens of whiskey; Sergeant Hughes, Bray, a specimen of milk.

None of the above specimens were adulterated, whilst in the first half of the year one-third of the samples sent were adulterated. In the corresponding period of 1888 the Constabulary first began to collect articles of food for analysis, and out of the twenty-four specimens so collected eleven were adulterated, or nearly 50 per cent. It is evident then that the collection of samples of food for analysis has greatly lessened adulteration in the county.

Three specimens of water were analysed for the Town Commissioners of Wicklow; one of them was fairly good; one was not up to a tolerably fair quality; and the third was highly polluted and unfit for use.

The water from the pump at the Police Barracks, Wicklow, was examined, with satisfactory result.

A specimen of water analysed for the Medical Officer of Health, Baltinglass, was favourably reported.

The waters in use in St. Kyran's Industrial School and the School of the Convent of Mercy, Rathdrum, were found to be pure.

A specimen of water was analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union; the result was satisfactory.

Another collection of three waters were analysed for the Town Commissioners of Wicklow; two of them were unfavourably reported upon.

Six specimens of milk were analysed for the Guardians of Baltinglass Union; two of them were adulterated with the enormous proportion of 80 per cent. of water, or nearly their own volume of water.

For Dr. Raverty, Medical Officer of Health, Bray, a sample of milk was analysed and found to be pure.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1890.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The number of road maintenance contracts which happen to expire at these Assizes and which therefore appear for renewal in the schedule of applications for presentments before you is not large, and the only special works to which I need direct your particular attention are the following:—

Arklow, No. 3—This road has not been repaired by the county for nearly six years. As it is of considerable importance it is desirable to have it put into repair with a view to a regular maintenance contract afterwards.

Arklow, No. 5, and Newcastle, No. 7—This work was disallowed by the Grand Jury a year ago on the grounds that it was not required for the county road. The circumstances remain the same except that the sum passed at Sessions is now £30 instead of £50 as before.

South Ballinacor, No. 9—This is a work which has for a long time been considered necessary. It is to cut down, widen and fence a part of the road from each side of which the adjoining turf bog has been cut away, leaving the road narrow, unfenced and dangerous.

Newcastle, No 5, and County at Large, No 114—To renew the wooden foot-bridge in Wicklow. As this matter has been several times under discussion at Road Sessions and Assizes it is not necessary for me further to refer to it here; but any required information can be given when the applications come to be considered.

Newcastle, No 6—As the weir referred to in this application is private property and as the lessees object to its being interfered with, I think the application should be disallowed.

Rathdown, No 10—This is an application to curb part of the principal road in Greystones. I understand it is intended as a first instalment of the desirable work of curbing and improving the principal footpaths in Greystones.

Shillelagh, No 9—This is an application to curb and channel the footpath for whole length of Carnew street on south side, a most desirable work.

In Upper Talbotstown the only application of importance is to build a bridge on the road from Rathdangan to Rathgorragh over the stream which crosses the road near the bounds of Cranareen and Rathgorragh Lower. The wisdom of expending so much money on an unimportant road like this appears questionable; but as the matter will be reconsidered at next Sessions you need not go into the merits of the application now.

The decisions of the last Road Sessions for the barony of North Ballinacor with regard to applications for the repairs of county bridges were not satisfactory. For instance, a sum of £30 was applied for to repair Coolalingo bridge on the Military road from Drumgoff to Laragh. Although

a less sum would be insufficient to do the work only £10 was granted with the result that the work was not contracted for; again, I made application for the necessary funds to reconstruct Beresford bridge on the main road from Bray to Roundwood which shows serious signs of failure; but the application was thrown out.

Since last Assizes three of your contractors and their sureties were proceeded against for breach of contract. The cases are those of Peter Murphy and Sylvester Byrne, contractors for Nos. 10 and 46 barony of Arklow, and James Cashen, contractor for building a fence at Rathbran, barony of Upper Talbotstown. Decrees were given in each case.

Within the last year many useful works have been carried out. I may mention the following:—

Thirteen of the county bridges have been substantially repaired.

Nine retaining walls and protection fences have been built and others repaired.

The flagging of the footpath in Arklow, so long delayed, is at length nearly completed.

Footpaths have also been made or curbed at Dunlavin, Rathdrum, Shillelagh, on the road from the Willow Grove to Barry's Bridge, in the barony of Newcastle, and elsewhere.

Several other minor road improvements, culverts, &c, have also been carried out in various localities.

I have pleasure in stating that with but few exceptions your county roads and works are in a satisfactory condition. Your roads have been fairly maintained during the past winter and are now in good order.

As the period for which you sanctioned the appointment of Mr. Little expires now, I have to request that you will be good enough to sanction his further appointment either permanently or, if you object to this, for at all events another year.

As the present satisfactory condition of your roads is entirely due to the strict system of supervision now in force for 6 years, I feel confident you will not hesitate to maintain the present number of assistants, as to now reduce it would deprive me of the means of maintaining this system of supervision which has produced the best results.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON REFORMATORIES AND INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

Committee-William F. Littledale, Col. J. S. Tighe, and Charles W. Barton.

We have examined the several accounts and certify that the amounts in the application schedule are correct.

We refer to our report presented at last assizes, and have now to repeat that the absence of information in all of the applications, save that from Artane Industrial School, as to the dates of committal, ages of the children, and terms for which committed, and whether discharged or remaining, prevents us from reporting as fully as we think should be done, and we again recommend that a circular shall be sent to the different institutions and to the Inspectors of Reformatories and Industrial Schools requiring that this information shall appear on each account sent in.

No. 60, Glencree—Michael Waters is charged for as from 29th September last. He was committed from Wicklow, but no return thereof has been made by the Clerk of Petty Sessions to the Secretary of the Grand Jury.

No. 63 St. Michael's, Wexford—Sarah Flood is not charged for, and

no explanation is given why she has ceased to be chargeable.

Nos. 72 and 74—Five children of the name of Clery were committed in October and November last from Bray Petty Sessions, and no return was made by the Clerk of Petty Sessions to our Secretary. This whole family, if sent to the workhouse, would have been chargeable on the Bray Electoral Division, but by being committed to industrial schools entail a cost of 10s per week on the cesspayers of the entire county. We suggest that the attention of the Bray magistrates be called to this fact, and that they be asked to ascertain if there is any person liable to contribute to the support of these children. We consider that in the interests of the ratepayers, a special inquiry should be made into the circumstances of the case.

Report of Committee-Continued.

No 83—Christopher Quinn and James Kelly were transferred, it seems, in May, 1889, by order of the Chief Secretary, from Rathdrum Industrial School to Letterfrack, Co. Galway, and the only other child committed to Rathdrum School seems also to have been removed.

We suggest that careful enquiry should be made into the causes of these removals. It seems to us that all the children committed in this county should be sent to the industrial schools and reformatories in the county, and not to remote parts of Ireland where neither their own relatives nor any person on behalf of the ratepayers can inspect them, and see that they are taken proper care of, and that the Chief Secretary shall be asked to have the inquiry instituted for our satisfaction.
