SPECIFICATION

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for years of between

and

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

I—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stegnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and alterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3-The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the *repair*, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8.—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four incheshigh over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept and edged with spade and line (a plough on no account to be used) and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road. Contractor to remove any waste margins that may be pointed out.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones; sods; and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, turf, manure, &c.

The Contractor is to cat down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAÍNAGE.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grüss, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11-Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12-This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year-before 1st February, 1st April, and 1st October, and at all other times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

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property of the contractor, and he removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14. The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor. APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the archstones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19.-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st. December ; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year. QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually at least cubic yards a sufficient quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for mensurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTFATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows :--

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from elay, dirt, and stones over $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter. Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 12 inch per yard towards the road.

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first helf-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIALS.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

29f—The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal ound deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented to the credit of the Barony.

COUNTY ANALYST.

Conditions under which the County Analyst performs Analyses.

1.—All articles sent to him by the Grand Jury, Boards of Guardians, Towns Commissioners, County Infirmary, County Coroner, and Magistrates sitting at Petty Sessions, to be analysed without any fee.

2.—Persons residing within the county to pay 10s. 6d. for the analysis of any article which it is suspected to be adulterated, the fee to be paid to the County Treasurer.

3.—Persons residing within the county to be entitled to have analysis made at the following reduced scale—about one-fourth of the usual fees—payable to County Analyst :—Analysis of water, oil cakes, and artificial manures, 10s.; analysis of the viscera of sheep, cows, and horses, for the detection of poison, 30s.; dogs' do., £1; analysis of soils, limestones, and ores, from 10s. to £3, according to nature of investigation.

Quantities required for analysis: -8 oz. of bread, flour, butter, whiskey, wine, beer, porter; 4 oz. of buttermilk, confections, cocoa, pepper; 2 oz. of new milk, tea, coffee, pepper, mustard; $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon of water, in clean and, if possible, stopper bottles; $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of oil cakes and manures. In case of soil and ores analysis, quantities to be sent depend on nature of the investigation and may be ascertained on reference to the Analyst. The bodies of animals suspected to have been poisoned should not be sent; only their viscera.

Resolved—That the County Printer shall be required to have the "Schedule of Applications," previous to each Assizes, printed and ready for distribution, within fourteen days from the day on which the copy of same is given to him by the Secretary; and that he shall have the "Abstract of Presentments," after each Assizes, printed within twenty-one days after he receives the materials for same from the County Treasurer.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to inform you that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1891 :---

Two specimens of whiskey were analysed for Sergeant S. Moore, R.I.C., Baltinglass. Both proved to be pure.

Two specimens of milk were analysed for Sergeant T. Callan, R.I.C., Wicklow. One like cream; the other was of poor quality.

Four specimens of water were analysed for Rathdrum Union. They were all more or less polluted, and not one of them was suitable for potable purposes.

Four waters were analysed for Colonel Carpendale, Glenberrie, Bray. All proved to be of good quality.

A specimen of water was analysed for the Rev. Mr. Hallowes, Arklow. It was largely polluted and unfit for use.

A sample of water examined for Mr. A. J. Reid, Newtown-Mount-Kennedy, was favourably reported on.

A specimen of milk analysed for Mr. J. C. Macraith, Greystones, proved to be below the average quality of pure milk.

For Naas Union, which is in part situated in the County of Wicklow, twelve specimens of water were analysed. None were decidedly bad; some were pure, and a few were second-class waters.

COUNTY WICKLOW. COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW, Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1892.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications approved of at last December Baronial Sessions, as set forth in the schedule before you, consist of-

25 renewals of road maintenance contracts.

6 bridge repairs.

2 new footpaths.

10 gullets.

3 repairing old roads.

6 walls and protection fences.

2 permissive presentments. 11 miscellaneous works.

Total 65

The road renewals represent in the aggregate a length of 432 miles.

A comparison of the new with the expiring contracts shows that-

In Arklow barony the average price of $6\frac{1}{4}$ miles of roads is reduced from 1s. $11\frac{1}{2}d$. to 1s. $2\frac{3}{4}d$ per perch per annum, representing a decrease of £73 2s. per annum on six contracts.

In North Ballinacor the price of the only road contract renewed remains the same—viz., $3\frac{1}{2}d$, per perch per annum.

In South Ballinacor the price of one mile of road is reduced from 4d. to 3d., representing a decrease of £1 5s. 6d. per annum on one contract.

In Newcastle the price of $6\frac{3}{8}$ miles of road is increased from $6\frac{1}{4}d$. to $6\frac{3}{4}d$, representing an increase of £5 4s. 10d. per annum on two contracts.

In Rathdown the price of 3 miles of road is increased from $7\frac{1}{2}d$. to 11d., representing an increase of £14 11s. 4d. per annum on two contracts.

In Shillelagh the price of $1\frac{1}{8}$ miles of road is reduced from 7d. to $2\frac{1}{2}$ d., representing a decrease of £6 15s. per annum on one contract.

In Upper Talbotstown the price of 11 miles of road is increased from 1s. $8\frac{3}{4}$ d. to 1s. $11\frac{3}{4}$ d., representing an increase of £43 3s. 6d. per annum on six contracts.

In Lower Talbotstown the average price of $12\frac{3}{8}$ miles of road in six contracts remains the same—viz., $4\frac{1}{2}d$. per perch per annum.

The following are the only applications to which your attention need be called in this report :---

County at Large, No. 103.—To repair the court-houses, £100. I propose to expend this sum in repairs to Arklow Court-house and, if you approve, in cementing the front elevation of the County Court-house, which has a bad appearance from the present broken condition of the old plaster.

Arklow, Nos. 9 and 10 .- To enlarge an existing and build a new

gullet on the road from Woodenbridge to Killahurler, together amounting to $\pounds 45$. These are necessary works, as they are required to increase the water way of two gullets which carry the stream flowing along the side of this road. In the months of October and November last the water broke out at these gullets and greatly damaged the road.

I wish to call your attention to another matter connected with this road. Some years ago, in order to deposit a large spoil bank of *debris* from a slate quarry close to the road, two culverts were built parallel to it for 82 yards to carry the stream above mentioned, and the spoil bank was tipped over them. The water way through these gullets has not been maintained. They are now broken down and carry but a small portion of the stream after heavy rains. The water broke out here several times last autumn and winter, damaging the road to a most serious extent for nearly $\frac{3}{4}$ mile. In addition to this the *debris* from the spoil bank has filled up the bed of the stream below these culverts so that part of the water flows along the road instead of in its own channel. The spoil bank should be partially removed, a proper channel made to carry the stream, the bed cleared up below, and retaining walls built. If this work be not done it seems of little use to continue the county contract for maintaining this road.

The matter was fully gone into at road sessions when an application that the county should carry out this work at the cost of ± 300 was disallowed.

Arklow, No. 11.—To cut a hill and fill a hollow at Coolahullen, \pounds 17. This is a necessary work, as the place proposed to be improved is dangerous.

North Ballinacor, No. 3.—To repair the road between 3 roads on Toghermore and 3 roads on Sraghmore, £78 15s. This road is of some use. It was repaired by the county in 1882.

North Ballinacor, No. 5.—To build a new gullet at Sleamaine, at the northern end of the road No. 2 above referred to, ± 80 . This is to replace an old gullet carried away by the floods in October last. It was not contracted for at adjourned sessions.

North Ballinacor, No. 7.—To build a wall at Mr. Guinness's back gate, on the road from the railway station to the town of Rathdrum, $\pounds 45$. This is to rebuild at the side of the public road an existing wall which is in a dilapidated state.

South Ballinacor, No. 5.—To repair Aughrim bridge, £100. The entire pavement of one arch of this bridge was carried away, one pier almost cut through and other damage done by the floods last autumn. For some time the whole bridge was in a critical state; but it has been secured in a temporary manner by magistrates' order. This bridge had originally four arches to carry the river—three of 20 feet span and one of 15 feet span. The latter has been appropriated to carry the head race of Mr. Fogarty's mill, and I attribute in a great measure to this the damage that has occurred to the bridge.

South Ballinacor, No. 6.—To rebuild a gullet, £30. This is to replace a gullet carried away by floods in October last.

South Ballinacor, No. 8 — To fill and pave grips, £39 12s 6d. This is a useful work. It is in extension of a work previously presented for.

All the special works in Rathdown barony, with one exception, are

necessitated by the recent heavy rainfalls which did considerable damage in this barony.

Shillelagh, No. 3.—To repair an old road, 449 perches long, £100 1s. 8d. Part of this—namely, 269 perches, seems of little use; the remaining 180 perches would be useful.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 10.—Wall at Baltinglass, £100. This is to complete the work for which £100 was presented at last assizes.

Considerable damage was done to some of the county roads, bridges, walls and other works by the heavy rains of last autumn and winter. In ten of the most urgent cases orders were signed by the county magistrates for repairs, and the amount now to be presented under this head is $\pounds 234$ 15s.

At the latter end of February, after the sudden thaw, a dangerous breach occurred in the road at Slievereagh bridge, on the road from Rathdangan to Knockanarrigan, barony of Upper Talbotstown. I am of opinion that you should now present the sum of £25 necessary for its repair under the 38th section of the Grand Jury Act.

Since last assizes it became necessary to take proceedings for breach of contract in the following four cases — The sureties of the late Bartholomew Fitzsimon, Nos. 3, 19 and 20, Rathdown barony, and Richard Buckley and his sureties, No. 28 same barony. Decrees were granted in each case.

The work of constructing the Bray and Enniskerry Railway, referred to in previous reports, was commenced in April, 1891, and discontinued in December, 1891. Since the latter date considerable inconvenience has occurred. The public have now put up with a narrow, inconvenient and badly-kept temporary road diversion at one place, and at other places along the line the soft clay is continually slipping on to the road, and at times has rendered it almost impassable, while banks of clay, pressing against the wall bounding the county road, have broken and destroyed it in several places. I apprehend grave public inconvenience on general holidays.

As the matter is a serious one, I would suggest that you should appoint a small standing committee of your body to take charge of the matter and obtain legal advice if necessary, as there seems no present prospect of the works being resumed.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT—EXISTING CONTRACTS —DISCHARGED AND UNDISCHARGED QUERIES—AND WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

Committee-Colonel Kemmis, David Mahony, Esq., and Major Tottenham.

1. With regard to the County Surveyor's Report, the Committee consider-

As to the repair of the Court-houses of Wicklow and Arklow, that the work should be carried out at an expenditure of about $\pounds 30$ on the former and about $\pounds 70$ on the latter.

They think in future that the County Surveyor should submit to the Grand Jury an account showing the expenditure to "persons employed" previously on the County Court-houses, and that he should also submit to Road Sessions, and subsequently to the Grand Jury, a statement giving as nearly as possible an estimate of the probable cost of works of this character.

With respect to the gullet on the road from Woodenbridge to Killahurler, the road is in a very bad state, due to the obstruction caused by the stream beside it, the gullet having broken down and *debris* from a spoil bank having slipped down. It would appear that a question has arisen as to whether it is the duty of the County authorities or of the Earl of Carysfort, on whose land the gullet and spoil bank lie, to make the necessary repairs, in order to secure the road. The Committee think that the Solicitor of the Grand Jury should be instructed to take such steps as he thinks right to settle the question legally, and as the matter is urgent, it should be dealt with as early as possible.

As regards Shillelagh, No. 3, the Committee recommend that this presentment should be thrown out, as it would appear that the greater part of the road is little used by the public.

As regards the breach in the road at Slievereagh bridge, the Committee recommend that the sum of £25 should now be presented for its repair.

With respect to the discontinuance of work on the Bray and Enniskerry Railway and the consequent obstruction to the public traffic, the Committee recommend that the Hon. Captain Monck and Mr. J. Otway Johnson be appointed to act as a committee in the matter and to confer with the County Surveyor, as occasion may arise, and if necessary to call in the assistance of the Solicitor to the Grand Jury.

2. Existing Contracts-These appear correct, as amended.

3. Discharged and Undischarged Queries-These appear correct.

4. Weights and Measures—The Committee recommend that the Weights and Measures at Baltinglass be kept in the Court-house there, as there seems to be no suitable accommodation for them in the Police Barrack. The County Surveyor should be directed to make the necessary arrangements for their storage. WILLIAM KEMMIS, Colonel.

The Grand Jury having received an offer from Lord Carysfort's agent to refer the question of the Killahurler road to the decision of some eminent member of the Bar, to be selected by the parties concerned, recommend the Solicitor to consider if this proposition can be adopted in the interest of the public, and if so, to act upon it.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON THE COUNTY INFIRMARY AND FEVER HOSPITALS' ACCOUNTS. AND THE COUNTY PRINTING AND PARLIAMENTARY REGISTER.

Committee-Capt. Pennefather, Julius Casement; Esq. ; A. Tailyour, Esq. ; and J. Otway Johnson, Esq.

County Infirmary-We have examined the accounts, as submitted to us by the Treasurer, Mr. E. Wynne, and find that they have been audited and certified as correct by Dr. Truell.

We find that the maintenance of the patients averages 2s. 11d. per diem, and the total cost brings up the expenses to 3s. 8d. per diem, not including the doctor's salary ; and including the doctor's salary, 4s. 71d. per diem. Number of patients, 204 ; average number of days in hospital, 71.

This shows an increase of 1s. 2³/₄d. per patient per diem over this time last year, or deducting a charge of fittings and repairs, which the Treasurer states to be exceptional, shows an increase of 1s. 01d. per patient per diem.

We consider the increase in expenditure unduly large.

A printed report, such as goes to the public, has been laid before us, which does not coincide with the accounts as laid before the Presentment Sessions, and shows a cost per diem per head of 1s. 41d.

We recommend that the annual report for the public and the accounts for Presentment Sessions be closed to the same date.

The information supplied by the Barony Constables relative to arrears of County Cess is very defective, and they should be directed for the future to verify each such case themselves so as to be able to give the Grand Jury full explanation with regard to them.

They should also be directed to cause the attention of the Revising Valuator to be called to any premises which are in such a condition from dilapidation or otherwise as to require revision. There are some cases in which, premises although occupied, the cess is returned irrecoverable, with the remark-no effects. In such cases we suggest that the parties liable should be proceeded against, or the warrant placed for execution in the hands of the constabulary.
