SPECIFICATION

OF WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for years of perches of Road and Footpath, if any, between and

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2—No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4—The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6—In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept and edged with spade and line (a plough on no account to be used) and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road. Contractor to remove any waste margins that may be pointed out.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods, and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, turf, manure, mud heaps, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10—Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—before 1st February, 1st April, and 1st October, and at all other times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13—All scrapings, trimmings, and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall

become the property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass, dirt, manure, litter, rubbish, and nuisance of all kinds.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16—The surface is to be made even by cross-picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary with fine gravel. Before spreading materials the surface is to be thoroughly cleaned, and when required is to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18—Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleys and the arch-stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose and rolling stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING.

20—One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before 1st March in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually at least cubic yards a sufficient quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way, so as not to interfere with the traffic, and honestly made up.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows:—

If curbed with stone, any misplaced stones to be re-set, and all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be re-sodded. Grass on side of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be entirely cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the

surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ½-inch diameter. Surface of path to be kept clean at all times and free from grass, manure, dirt, rubbish, litter, and nuisance of all kinds.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 1½ inch per yard towards the road.

25—All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed

COUNTY WORKS.

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment, trespass, nuisance, or obstruction. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIALS.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

29—The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal found deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented to the credit of the Barony.

COUNTY ANALYST.

Conditions under which the County Analyst performs Analyses.

1.—All articles sent to him by the Grand Jury, Boards of Guardians, Towns Commissioners, County Infirmary, County Coroner, and Magistrates sitting at Petty Sessions, to be analysed without any fee.

2.—Persons residing within the county to pay 10s. 6d. for the analysis of any article which it is suspected to be adulterated, the fee to be paid to the County Treasurer.

3.—Persons residing within the county to be entitled to have analysis made at the following reduced scale—about one-fourth of the usual fees—payable to County Analyst:—Analysis of water, oil cakes, and artificial manures, 10s.; analysis of the viscera of sheep, cows, and horses, for the detection of poison, 30s.; dogs' do., £1; analysis of soils, limestones, and ores, from 10s. to £3, according to nature of investigation.

Quantities required for analysis:—8 oz. of bread, flour, butter, whiskey, wine, beer, porter; 4 oz. of buttermilk, confections, cocoa, pepper; 2 oz. of new milk, tea, coffee, pepper, mustard; ½ gallon of water, in clean and, if possible, stopper bottles; ½ lb. of oil cakes and manures. In case of soil and ores analysis, quantities to be sent depend on nature of the investigation and may be ascertained on reference to the Analyst. The bodies of animals suspected to have been poisoned should not be sent; only their viscera.

## PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 31st December, 1894:—

A specimen of milk analysed for Sergeant O'Leary, Wicklow, was very poor, but not so poor that I could certify that it was adulterated.

Four specimens of water were analysed for the Guardians of Baltinglass Union. They were soft, and, on the whole, fairly good waters.

Five specimens of waters were analysed for the Guardians of Baltinglass Union. They were all deep yellow, highly peaty waters of second class quality.

A specimen of water was analysed for Mr W G Morris, Windgate House, Bray. It proved to be of good composition.

A specimen of butter, examined for Surgeon F Jones, Bray, was, so far as could be judged—the quantity available for analyses being very small—pure.

The viscera of a bullock were analysed for poison, at the request of Captain Pennefather, Rathallagh. The result was negative.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, four specimens of water were analysed. They contained very large quantities of solids in solution—namely, 107.9 and 106.4 grains per gallon; they were otherwise defective. The other two waters were a moderately hard and a very soft one. They were second rate waters.

Excluding 2 samples of milk analysed for Mr P Barrington, Ballyman, Bray, erroneously returned in my last report, instead of being reported to County Dublin Grand Jury, the total number of analyses made in 1894 amounted to 43. Of the articles of food and drugs analysed, 8 were adulterated.

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

## GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1895.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for roads and special works, approved of at last December Baronial Sessions, may be classified as follows—

29 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
2 repairs of bridges.
1 new road.
5 new bridges.
7 new gulleys and repairs to existing gulleys.
9 fences and walls.
6 new footpaths.
5 miscellaneous works.

Total 64

I shall here only refer to the following :—

Arklow, No 75—New footbridge in connection with the present stone bridge between Arklow and Ferrybank, £630. For this work, which is now open for tenders, I have prepared alternative designs—namely, for a concrete and a timber footpath.

Arklow, No 77—New flagging and curbing in Lower Main-street, Arklow, £96, of which a moiety is to be contributed by the Town's Commissioners. This is an useful work.

North Ballinacor, No 41—To rebuild Boleyhorrigan bridge on the road from Roundwood to Sallygap, £350. Half to be levied off the County at Large. This bridge, which has been referred to in previous reports, is in a dilapidated and falling condition.

North Ballinacor, No 42—New footpath, £36. Half to be levied off the County at Large. There is a tolerably good stone curbed path in this place at present; but it is rather narrow in places.

South Ballinacor, No 56—To rebuild Ballinagappoge bridge, £50. £80 was applied for at sessions; but only £50 was allowed. A large portion of the bridge has fallen and the rest is in a dilapidated state. There was no tender at adjourned sessions.

Rathdown, No 44—To widen and improve Church Lane, Greystones, £150. This road has not hitherto been on the county. It forms a continuation of a short piece of county road past Greystones Church, and connects the Church road, Greystones, with the Kilcoole and Bray road, at Lower Kindlestown. There is an existing county road running approximately parallel to it at a distance of about 60 perches from it. This work was certified at last assizes and is now to be tendered for.

Shillelagh, No 48—To build a protecting wall and widen the road in front of Kilquiggin new chapel, £45. The object of the application is to provide standing room for vehicles in front of the chapel, so that the general traffic of the road may not be interfered with.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 66—To build a bridge between the town-

lands of Randalstown and Winetavern, £15. This work is not required for county purposes; but for the drainage of the lands above it.

Upper Talbotstown, No 67—To build a gullet in Baltinglass, £40. This work should be carried out at the expense of the sanitary authority, and not at that of the county.

There will also be laid before you, to be certified, an application for £200 for a bridge on the road from Rathdangan to Ballingule, at the bounds of the baronies of South Ballinacor and Upper Talbotstown (£100 on each barony), where there are at present a paved ford and a footbridge. This work has been several times before sessions; but was disallowed.

Since last assizes it became necessary to take proceedings against two of your contractors and their sureties for breach of contract—viz., Jeremiah Byrne, No 45 South Ballinacor, and Anthony Allen, No 51 Lower Lower Talbotstown. Decrees were granted in each case.

A Bill has been deposited in Parliament for the purpose of obtaining powers to supply the townships of Blackrock, Bray, Dalkey and Kingstown, with water from Lough Bray, in the barony of Rathdown. This scheme is, as far as this county is concerned, the same as that for which a Provisional Order was sought last year; but which application was rejected by the Local Government Board. As mentioned in my report to the Grand Jury at Spring Assizes, 1894, under this scheme, it is proposed to lay lines of pipes, in all about 7½ miles in length, under the county roads. I consider that these pipes should be laid through the fields and not along the county roads, as when so laid they seriously interfere with them and the numerous bridges, culverts, &c., in connection with them.

Notices were published in November last, that the Dublin Corporation intended to apply for a Provisional Order to enable them to take lands for the purpose of constructing a reservoir and waterworks supplemental to their existing reservoir at Roundwood, the Lough Dan scheme, referred to in my report a year ago, having been withdrawn. An inquiry was held by the Local Government Board on 21st February and 8th March last. I have examined the plans referring to this scheme, and find that the lands proposed to be taken for the new reservoir would be in area about 509 acres, of which I am informed about 300 acres would be under water. These lands consist of parts of the townlands of Ballinastoe, Knockraheen, Mullinaveige, Sraghmore, and Tithower, all in the parish of Calary and baronies of North Ballinacor and Newcastle. These lands stretch northwards on both banks of the Vartry river from the north end of the present reservoir for about 2¼ miles or to about 3 furlongs below Ballinastoe or Vartry bridge. Two county roads will be affected by the works. 1st, the main road from Bray to Roundwood is proposed to be raised at a point about 1¼ miles north of Roundwood by an embankment along the margin of the reservoir, 212 yards long and 6½ feet high at the highest point. The other road affected is that rather unimportant one from Sally's bridge to Knockraheen three roads. This road will cross the new reservoir, and it is proposed to raise it by an embankment with a bridge over the present ford. This embankment will be 471 yards long and 18 feet high at the new bridge or highest point. I consider the proposed works, as affecting these county roads, will improve them.

With regard to the bridge approaches at Troy's public-house, on the road from Bray to Enniskerry, nothing has been done since the date of my last report towards completing the road and fences in accordance with the umpire's award and the order of the Master of the Rolls.

The construction of the extension of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway from Blessington to Poulaphuca Waterfall, described in my report at Spring Assizes, 1888, was commenced on 6th August last and was being carried on with energy; but was stopped on 11th January last by the heavy snow falls. Since which date the work has been almost entirely suspended owing to the heavy snow. It will, however, I am informed, be resumed on the 11th inst., and speedily completed and opened for traffic.

The county, as you are all aware, was visited by very heavy snow storms during last January, and as a result serious inconvenience took place from interruption of traffic. In most cases your contractors made commendable efforts to cope with the emergency; but a considerable time must elapse before the roads are restored to their normal condition.

Mr Little, assistant for the baronies of Arklow and North Ballinacor, having resigned his situation soon after last assizes, I appointed in his place Mr W J Keating, who is fully qualified, and since his appointment has discharged his duties in a satisfactory manner.

As to No 41 North Ballinacor—the rebuilding of Boleyhorrigan bridge—the Committee consider that the bridge being in a bad and falling condition on one of the only two outlets from that side of the county, and having been passed at road sessions, should be considered by full Grand Jury.

No 39 South Ballinacor and No 111 County at Large—Jeremiah Byrne, contractor—his contract having been broken and a fresh contract having been entered into, the sums of £4 10s 5d and 12s 11d should be struck out, and the old contract cancelled.

With reference to the scheme for supply of water from Lough Bray, in the barony of Rathdown, to Blackrock, &c, the Grand Jury at Spring Assizes, 1894, directed that at the Local Government Board enquiry, with respect to that scheme, the County Surveyor and their solicitor should attend and represent that the water pipes should not be laid under the county roads, but across the fields; it appears that the County Surveyor and Mr Browne did so, with the result that the promoters of the scheme consented that the pipes should not be laid under the roads. Now the promoters are bringing a Bill for their scheme before Parliament, in which, as it would appear, they will not be tied to lay the pipes as the Grand Jury desire. The Committee think, therefore, that instructions should be given to their solicitor to take the necessary steps for ensuring a clause in the Bill to restrain the promoters from laying the pipes under the roads.

With regard to the bridge approaches at Troy's public-house, on the road from Bray to Enniskerry, we recommend that the Grand Jury direct their solicitor to apply to the Master of the Rolls to have his order carried out.

All the other points in the County Surveyor's report have already been considered by the Grand Jury,

**Mr. Coroner Jones' Account.**—We have examined and found his account correct, except in one particular—viz., the charge for mileage, which should be twelve pounds, fifteen shillings and sevenpence, instead of fourteen pounds, fourteen shillings, as stated by Mr Jones. We also have allowed him the sum of two pounds for holding an inquest in Coroner Byrne's district. The whole sum to be presented to Mr Coroner Jones is thirty-two pounds, twelve shillings and seven pence.

**Mr. Coroner Byrne's Account.**—As regards Mr Coroner Byrne, the Grand Jury will recollect that at the last assizes it was proposed to disallow his salary and fees because he had failed to comply with the Act of Parliament by not living within his district, and the presentment was then made on his absolute pledge, given personally to the Grand Jury, that he would, within one fortnight, take up his abode and continue permanently to reside in the district to which he had been appointed. As he has not carried out this undertaking, we recommend that no presentment be made to him for any salary, fees, or emoluments to the present date, in accordance with 9 & 10 Vic., cap. 37, sec. 21.

There have been placed before us a number of applications from medical men who have given evidence, and from witnesses who have been examined at inquests held by Mr Byrne, and from a carman for his fare on one occasion, none of whom have been paid by the coroner. Having gone

through these applications, we recommend that the sum of nine pounds be presented to the Secretary of the Grand Jury, with a request that he pay the sums to the various parties entitled.

We find that two inquests were held by Justices of the Peace of the county, and that six pounds and sixpence is due for expenses of witnesses medical fees. We recommend that this sum be also presented to the Secretary of the Grand Jury with the view to these claims being discharged by him.

We recommend that in future the Coroners be required to give in their returns the name of the townland and parish in which each inquest was held, so as to enable the Secretary and Committee of the Grand Jury to check the charge for mileage.

We find that the maintenance of patients, including medicines, averages 2s per diem, and the total cost, including the staff and doctor's salary, brings up the expenses to 3s 2½d per diem. Number of patients in hospital, 120; average number of days in hospital, 19.

We recommend that the presentment for £100 for the half-year be passed.

**Fever Hospitals—Wicklow**—We have examined the accounts of the Wicklow Fever Hospital, as submitted to us by Mr E. Harding, the Treasurer, and audited and certified as correct by the Rev Canon Rooke, and find they show a balance in hand on 1st Nov., '94, of £29 10s 5d. Amount of subscriptions, £36 12s 6d.

We recommend that the presentment for £73 5s be passed.

**Arklow**—We have examined the accounts of the Arklow Fever Hospital, as submitted by Mr Barlow, the Treasurer, and audited and certified as correct by R Philpot, J.P., and recommend a presentment of £30 be passed. Amount of subscriptions, £31 8s 6d.

**Newtown-Mt. Kennedy**—We have examined the accounts submitted to us by the Treasurer, Rev J. A. Stamper, and find that they have been audited and certified as correct by Major Gun Cuninghame, and show a balance of £45 14s 2½d in hands up to 1st Nov., '94.

The total number of patients in the year was 10, and average number of days in hospital, 23.

We recommend that a presentment of £60 for the year be passed. The sum subscribed to 1st Nov., '94, amounts to £43 4s.

Presentment No 56—The amount estimated for is £1,121 13s 9d, about 1-5th of the whole estimate.

On the 11th March, 1895, there were 1,502 patients in the asylum, of which 128 only came from this county, or a proportion of about 1-12th of the total number.

With regard to this presentment, we are of opinion that, as the number of patients from this county is only 1-12th of the whole number, we should merely pay a like proportion, or a sum of £482 17s 11d.

We find that the charge against the County Wicklow is increasing every year; while, from the information before us, it would appear that the number of patients is always under what the county is entitled to.

We have examined the remaining presentments in connection with the asylum, which came before us, Nos 76 to 86, amounting to £211 6s 8d, being instalments and interest on various sums expended for new works and temporary accommodation, which, we presume, must be paid.

SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for years of perches of Road and Footpath, if any, between and

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

- 1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.
2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.
3-The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.
4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.
5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.
6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7-The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8-The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept and edged with spade and line (a plough on no account to be used) and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road. Contractor to remove any waste margins that may be pointed out.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods, and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, turf, manure, mud heaps, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11-Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12-This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year-before 1st February, 1st April, and 1st October, and at all other times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings, trimmings, and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall

become the property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

**MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.**

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass, dirt, manure, litter, rubbish, and nuisance of all kinds.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16—The surface is to be made even by cross-picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor.

**APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.**

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary with fine gravel. Before spreading materials the surface is to be thoroughly cleaned, and when required is to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18—Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleys and the arch-stones of bridges well covered with metal.

**LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.**

19—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose and rolling stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

**TIME FOR SPREADING**

20—One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before 1st March in each year.

**QUALITY OF MATERIALS.**

21—The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

**QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.**

22—The contractor is to supply annually at least cubic yards a sufficient quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way, so as not to interfere with the traffic, and honestly made up.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

**EXTRA MATERIALS.**

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

**FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.**

24—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows:—

If curbed with stone, any misplaced stones to be re-set, and all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be re-sodded. Grass on side of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be entirely cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the

surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ¾-inch diameter. Surface of path to be kept clean at all times and free from grass, manure, dirt, rubbish, litter, and nuisance of all kinds.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 1½ inch per yard towards the road.

25—All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

**COUNTY WORKS.**

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

**INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.**

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment, trespass, nuisance, or obstruction. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

**SURPLUS MATERIALS.**

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

29—The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal found deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented to the credit of the Barony.

**COUNTY ANALYST.**

**Conditions under which the County Analyst performs Analyses.**

1.—All articles sent to him by the Grand Jury, Boards of Guardians, Towns Commissioners, County Infirmary, County Coroner, and Magistrates sitting at Petty Sessions, to be analysed without any fee.

2.—Persons residing within the county to pay 10s. 6d. for the analysis of any article which it is suspected to be adulterated, the fee to be paid to the County Treasurer.

3.—Persons residing within the county to be entitled to have analysis made at the following reduced scale—about one-fourth of the usual fees—payable to County Analyst:—Analysis of water, oil cakes, and artificial manures, 10s.; analysis of the viscera of sheep, cows, and horses, for the detection of poison, 30s.; dogs' do., £1; analysis of soils, limestones, and ores, from 10s. to £3, according to nature of investigation.

Quantities required for analysis:—8 oz. of bread, flour, butter, whiskey, wine, beer, porter; 4 oz. of buttermilk, confections, cocoa, pepper; 2 oz. of new milk, tea, coffee, pepper, mustard; ½ gallon of water, in clean and, if possible, stopper bottles; ½ lb. of oil cakes and manures. In case of soil and ores analysis, quantities to be sent depend on nature of the investigation and may be ascertained on reference to the Analyst. The bodies of animals suspected to have been poisoned should not be sent; only their viscera.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

The Tramway Company undertake to carry out what this committee may direct, and failing their so doing the committee are here by empowered to direct such legal proceedings to be taken as they may think desirable.

Resolved—That the Harbour Commissioners elected at Presentment Sessions be asked by the Secretary to the Grand Jury to draw up a report

of the accounts of the Harbour Board for the information of the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes; that a Committee be appointed to examine it; and their report be printed in the Abstract, so that the Cesspayers of the guaranteeing Baronies may know something of the income and expenditure.

## TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1895:—

For the sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as inspectors of food, the following articles were analysed:—

For Sergeant Sullivan, Arklow, 4 specimens of whiskey, 3 of buttermilk, and one of milk. Of the buttermilk specimens, two were adulterated with 12 and 55 per cent. of added water respectively, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes. The specimens of whiskey were pure. The milk was not up to the average quality of pure milks.

For Sergeant Moore, Baltinglass, 4 specimens of whiskey were analysed; they were all of pure quality.

The viscera of a terrier dog were examined for poison for Dr Lawrenson, Medical Officer of Health, Dunlavin; strychnine was found.

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

## GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1895.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for roads and special works, approved of at last May Baronial Sessions, may be classified as follows—

113 renewals of road maintenance contracts.

2 repairs of bridges.

1 new road.

3 new bridges.

4 new gulleys.

2 new footpaths.

4 miscellaneous works.

Total 129

I shall here only refer to the following:—

Arklow, No. 74—This work should be under the heading "New Road." The money granted is small, viz. :—£10; but as the road is not a thoroughfare and ends at a gate, to pass the presentment would establish a precedent for putting numerous similar lanes on the county.

There is another work in the Barony of Arklow which should be referred to; but on this occasion it has only to be read and certified. It is

to build a gullet on the road from Connary cross-roads to 3 roads at Knock-anree Lower, over the ford at the southern end of this road.

In North Ballinacor an application of mine for £400 for re-building Boleyhorrigan bridge, so often referred to, was reduced to £350, to be borrowed from the Board of Works and repaid in instalments. This work has now, however, merely to be certified.

In South Ballinacor £90 was allowed for re-building Ballinacappoge bridge, on the road from Aughavannagh to Ballinacash. This bridge is in a ruinous condition. This application has also to be certified.

In Newcastle, the only application of importance for a special work is to build a gullet over the ford on the road from Rathnew to Newcastle, near Dr. Truell's gate at Clonmannon, for which £49 10s was allowed.

In Rathdown barony £117 18s was allowed to recurb and reform the footpaths in Enniskerry. This application has also to be certified.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 66.—To build a bridge between the townlands of Rañdalstown and Winetavern, £35; £5 of which is to be contributed by the owner of the lands above the bridge. As mentioned in my last report, this work is not required for county purposes; but for the drainage of the lands above it.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 67.—To curb a footpath in Baltinglass, £42. Half on County at Large. This is a useful work.

Lower Talbotstown, No. 71.—In this case, as the road commences at a gate across it, ends in a bog, and has no house along it, it would not appear to be a proper case for maintenance by the county.

Lower Talbotstown, No. 74.—To build a gullet near the railway bridge on the townland of Milltown, near Dunlavin—£40. This is on an unimportant road, which was but recently put under county presentment.

The matter of the bridge approaches at Troy's public-house, on the road from Bray to Enniskerry, so often brought before you, came before Mr. Justice Holmes, sitting for the Master of the Rolls, on 14th May last, when an order was made that the fences and walls should be completed in accordance with the umpire's award. This order was appealed against, but was confirmed by the Court of Appeal on 12th June last. The road surface is still very bad; but this point was decided in favour of the defendants, who, however, have to pay the costs of both trials.

The County Inspector has requested additional space and other improvements for the storing of weights and measures in this Court-house, which I will explain to the Committee.

The extension of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway from Blessington to Poulaphuca bridge, referred to in my last report, was inspected by Major Marindin, on behalf of the Board of Trade, on 19th April, and was opened for public traffic on 1st May last. I accompanied Major Marindin on his inspection and pointed out to him some of the works remaining to be done, which are:

1st. The completion of the curbing, as out of a total length of 3 miles and 8 chains in this county, about 1 mile 2, furlongs and 4 chains have not yet been curbed.

2nd. Most of the curbing already laid should be taken up and reset as it has been very badly done.

3rd. The sides of the line in Blessington to be filled and properly formed, and the drainage of the street provided for.

4th. Drainage outlets across the line to be provided in several places.

The first three of the above requirements were ordered by the Board of Trade to be done within a month of the date of the opening of the line.

There are several other matters to which I have called the contractor's attention and which he has promised to carry out.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT  
TO THE  
GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,  
Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1895.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

I have made the usual annual inspection of that part of the line situated in the County Wicklow, also of most of the engines, rolling stock and plant. Very little cleaning has been done to the line and practically no fresh ballast spread during the last year, with the exception of that part of the line through Blessington, which has been lifted and ballasted. The whole line should be thoroughly cleaned and the ballast loosed and renewed in many places. The crossing timbers at the several stone depots, referred to in my last report, have not been renewed. If the line were kept ballasted up at the crossings the inconvenience of the absence of timber would be obviated to some extent.

I again found numbers of the fish plate bolts loose and several bolts broken or missing.

The roof of the engine shed in Blessington, referred to in my last report, has been re-roofed with open or half slating.

The water difficulty, which I reported a year ago, has been overcome. Tanks have been erected at Crooksling, in the county Dublin, and at Poulaphuca, and supplies of water laid on to each. Water can also be obtained at Blessington as heretofore.

One of the engines is now being rebuilt and provided with new fire box. This will be the third engine rebuilt since the line was opened.

Four additional wagons and one third class carriage has been hired with a view to ultimate purchase, and when added to stock the Company will own seven engines, seven composite carriages (1st and 3rd class), four third class carriages, eighteen wagons and one van. There were two vans; but one was broken up by an accident at Poulaphuca when on hire to the contractor for that extension. I also observed that one wagon was being rebuilt. This will be the fourth wagon rebuilt since the opening of the line.

1—County Surveyor's Report.—Arklow, No 74—This road has not been upon the barony before; it is, therefore, misleading to place it under the heading "Existing contracts"; it should have been under that of "New road." The presentment should be thrown out, as the road is not one used by the "public," properly speaking, and passing it would establish an undesirable precedent, as the County Surveyor states.

The requirements of the Board of Trade and of the County Surveyor, in the extension of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway, should be carried out, and if not carried out within reasonable time steps should be taken to compel the company to do so.

The attention of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway should be called to the defects found in the line by the County Surveyor at his annual inspection, and they should be requested to remedy them—a copy of the County Surveyor's report should be forwarded to them.

2—Discharged and Undischarged Queries—These appear to be correct, with the exception of No. 37 Lower Talbotstown, which should be struck out, a new contract having been entered into.

3—Existing Contracts—Appear correct.

West Wicklow—The coronership having become vacant at last assizes, it appeared then that certain fees and payments were due to medical witnesses and to others, and a presentment was then passed for the amount of £15 5s 6d, payable to the Secretary to the Grand Jury for the purpose of paying such sums.

Your Secretary has now produced to us vouchers for these payments to the amount of fifteen pounds, one shilling, and for postages and expenses, of two shillings, making a total of £15 3s, leaving a balance in his hands of 2s 6d to be represented to the county.

Wicklow County Infirmary—We have examined the accounts of the Wicklow County Infirmary, and believe them to be correct, but have no detailed items, which have been already audited. The number of patients treated since 16th November, 1894, being 112, and the total expenditure, £134 3s 5d, leaving a balance to credit of £28 11s 10d, on 21st May, 1895.

We recommend that the sum of £100 be presented for.

Court-keepers' Accounts.—We have examined the various accounts and find them correct. Only one of the Court-keepers (Wicklow) attended; the court-keepers for Bray, Arklow and Baltinglass having returned home. We think that in future the court-keepers should attend the Committee.

And it is also most desirable that the contractors should reside within a reasonable distance of their contracts.

Further, that in cases where former contractors, who have proved themselves notoriously inefficient, put in tenders for new works, it will be desirable to take into serious consideration whether such tender be accepted, and if accepted, such cases to be specially brought to the notice of the Grand Jury by the County Surveyor.

Resolved—That the following committee of the Grand Jury be appointed pursuant to 31 & 32 Vic, cap 59, sec 10, and be empowered to enter into an agreement with the Directors and Managers of the Reformatory and Industrial Schools, and to check the committals, and report on the accounts to each assizes:—Thomas Acton, David Mahony, Lieut.-Col. Tighe, D.L.

Resolved—That the provisions of the Grand Jury Act, 6 & 7 Wm. IV., cap 116, be strictly adhered to in respect to the applications for payment to be made by contractors to and at the respective Presentment Sessions. All such applications, with the certificates of the County Surveyor, to be, as provided in said Act, laid before the respective Presentment Sessions for approval or rejection by those courts, subject to the power of the Grand Jury to disallow any presentment founded thereupon, where the road or work shall not have been properly maintained in the interval between the Sessions and the Assizes. And further the greatest care is desirable in examining tenders at Adjourned Sessions, so as to reject such as may appear tainted with fraud, and to regard with distrust and, where possible, refuse, future tenders made by parties who may have connived at unfair tendering.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

Resolved—That the coroners' accounts be now received and sent to the sub-committee, but that the coroners shall now take notice that if their accounts are not in future sent to the Secretary ten clear days before the Assizes, he is not to receive them.

Resolved—That the attention of the Barony Cess Collectors be called to the necessity of giving in to the Treasurer's Office, at least two days before the first day of every Assizes, the amount of the assessments collected by them, as required by their warrants, and by 4 Geo. Resolved—That the Court-keeper be instructed in future to see that the Grand Jury are properly supplied with blotting and writing paper for their use on each day they sit, whether for fiscal or criminal business.

Resolved—That it be a direction of this Grand Jury to their Secretary that he shall in future keep a record of all resolutions passed in a minute book, and that the Foreman sign such minutes.

Bulwer be appointed, who, in case of any difference between County Surveyor and Tramway Company, shall decide as to what may be reasonable requirements in accordance with the report of the committee adopted by the Grand Jury at this Assizes. The Tramway Company undertake to carry out what this committee may direct, and failing their so doing the committee are here by empowered to direct such legal proceedings to be taken as they may think desirable.

Resolved—That the Harbour Commissioners elected at Presentment Sessions be asked by the Secretary to the Grand Jury to draw up a report



of the accounts of the Harbour Board for the information of the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes; that a Committee be appointed to examine it; and their report be printed in the Abstract, so that the Cesspayers of the guaranteeing Baronies may know something of the income and expenditure.

Resolved—That the Governors of the Richmond District Lunatic Asylum be requested to furnish to the Secretary of this Grand Jury before each Spring Assizes the names of the lunatics charged to this county, with the Petty Sessions District from which they have respectively been committed, and the date of each committal, and the total number of patients in the asylum during the period for which the yearly charge is calculated.

Resolved—That a copy of the resolution as to Lower Talbotstown be sent to the High Constable, and he be ordered to make a separate return from time to time, when and as required by the Secretary, of the amounts collected for the guarantee, and informed that if he neglect to do so his fees will be stopped by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That in the case of a vacancy occurring amongst the assistant surveyors during Mr Campbell Boyd's tenure of office, we authorize that a temporary assistant be appointed by the County Surveyor until the Assizes following Mr Boyd's retirement, when the matter can again be gone into.

The Grand Jury having refused to present for Coroner Byrne's expenses for inquests held since the previous assizes, he not having lodged his abstract and account with the Secretary to the Grand Jury as required by 9 & 10 Vic., cap. 37, sec. 24, "ten clear days at least before the assembling of the Grand Jury," although lodged ten clear days before their second assembling for Crown business. The Coroner appeared by counsel and traversed the non-presentment. O'Brien, C. J., after consultation with Pallas, C. B., confirmed the finding of the Grand Jury, ruling that the words of the section quoted were mandatory, and a condition precedent to obtaining a presentment.

Resolved—That the following gentlemen be appointed a committee to confer with the Commissioners of Public Works on the subject of the repairs required for the breakwater of Wicklow Harbour and other works, but without any power to agree to any further contribution from the several Baronies at present under taxation for the harbour loan:—Captain Segrave, Mr Knight, Mr Frank Brooke, Mr Tailyour, Colonel Kemmis.

Resolved—That the following be the premises set to Col. Dennis—20th July, 1895:—The whole house on the south side of the bridewell backyard in Baltinglass, the joint use of said yard and of the pump in the inner yard; the several rooms in the house to be put into a fair tenantable order by Colonel Dennis, whose claim to be allowed for same will be fairly considered—windows to be repaired, locks and keys supplied where necessary. The proper proportion of poor rate, &c., to which Colonel Dennis will be liable, to be ascertained, as at present all the Grand Jury property in Baltinglass is included in one assessment.

Resolved—That we approve of the principle of the Bill now before the House of Commons, relative to the Payment of Jurors, Ireland, but consider it should apply to Winter Assizes only, and that the funds required for the carrying out of its provisions be found by Parliament.

Resolved—That we approve of the Bill about to be introduced into Parliament by Mr Edward Carson, Q.C., M.P., with the object of enabling Grand Juries in Ireland to grant Superannuation Allowances to their Secretaries on the basis of the Superannuation Act, 1859.

Resolved—That Col. Dennis is to hold that part of the court-house in Baltinglass, at present occupied by him, as a weekly tenant at the rate of 2s per week, free of all taxes.

Resolved—That the Auditor, at his audit, be requested to ascertain the balance, if any, arising out of surplus income of Wicklow Harbour, which is due to the Baronies guaranteeing the loan for it, and whether the same has been paid to such Baronies.

Resolved—That the Grand Jury consider that the Bill to amend the law relating to Coroners in Ireland contains many objectionable provisions, and that in any case it is quite unnecessary.

Resolved—That we, on behalf of the County Wicklow, protest against the continuously increasing expenditure in connection with the Richmond District Lunatic Asylum, which is not required for this county. The number of lunatics returned from the County of Wicklow being less than the proportion to which the county is entitled; and therefore the enlargement of the buildings is not required for this county.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT.

#### TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW.

The Willows, Terenure, 14th February, 1896.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report that I have audited the Accounts of the Secretary to the Grand Jury of the County Wicklow, following last Summer Assizes, and I forward herewith the usual certified and declared Abstract.

The surety bonds of the High Constables were submitted for my inspection, and appeared to have been duly executed.

The accounts were prepared and submitted for audit in the usual most satisfactory manner.

It would be desirable that the attention of the Grand Jury should be

directed to the necessity of requiring the Bray Township Commissioners to discharge their obligations in respect of county cess within the periods allowed by statute. The abstract shows at foot a sum due by the Township, at the time of making up the accounts, of £265 16s 9d. This assessment was made at Spring Assizes, 1895, and should have been paid at latest, as regards the first moiety, on 3rd June, and the balance on 3rd December last. On inquiry I find the amount was not lodged until 21st January in the present year. In the meantime the first moiety of the summer levy, £221 12s, became due on 5th October, and no payment has yet been made in respect of it. Delay of this kind is a distinct loss to the county revenue, inasmuch as the Grand Jury is entitled to receive from the Treasurer interest on the credit balances appearing on the Secretary's public account.

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1896.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for renewals of road contracts and for special works may be classified as follows—

34 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
1 new road.
2 repairs of bridges.
5 new bridges.
9 new gulleets.
6 new footpaths.
6 new walls.
6 miscellaneous works.

Total 69

I shall here only refer to the following works, but can give any

necessary information with regard to the others as they come in order before you:—

Arklow, No. 75.—To build a gullet on the road from Connary cross-roads to 3 roads at Knockanree Lower, £54. This work will bridge over a ford at the South end of the road, which is not an important one; but such works are notwithstanding very useful.

Arklow, No. 76.—New flagging and curbing in the town of Arklow, £100; of which a moiety is to be contributed by the Town Commissioners. This work will complete the flagging of footpath on West side of Lower Main-street, as far as at present intended, and commence the flagging of footpath on North side of Main-street, opposite the Bank.

North Ballinacor, No. 41.—To rebuild Boleyhorrigan bridge on the road from Roundwood to Sallygap, £350. To be borrowed from the Board of Works. This bridge, the condition of which has been referred to in previous reports, is in a dilapidated state, and a large portion of the masonry has fallen.

South Ballinacor, No. 56.—To rebuild Ballinagappoge bridge, on the road from Aughavannagh to Ballinacash, £76. A large portion of the present bridge has fallen and the rest is in a dilapidated state.

Rathdown, No. 46.—To recurb footpaths in Enniskerry, £82 19s 4d. This is an useful work.

Shillelagh, No. 47.—To repair Knockeen bridge, on the road from Tullow to Clonmore, at the bounds of this county and county Carlow, £200, of which a moiety is to be defrayed by the county Carlow. The sum of £150 (£75 on each county), presented at Summer Assizes, 1894, is now being expended on repairs to this bridge, and this further presentment is required to carry out necessary repairs and strengthening of the bridge, including a long walled approach on the county Carlow side.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 65, and County at Large, No. 122.—£25 on each, for the flagging of the footpath on each side of the gate to chapel in Baltinglass.

Lower Talbotstown, No. 72.—To build a double gullet near the railway bridge on the townland of Milltown, near Dunlavin, £40. This is not on an important road; but its object is to bridge over the present ford.

Besides the above there are five other applications for new bridges and other works; but as they have now merely to be certified, they need not be particularly referred to. They are set forth on page 10 of the Schedule before you.

In accordance with the recommendations of the last Presentment Sessions, held in Baltinglass, concerning the disposal of the premises attached to the Court-house there, I have prepared the plan and estimate referred to.

The General Prisons' Board having damaged part of the boundary wall of the yard of this Court-house while excavating for new drains, I laid the matter before the County-at-Large Sessions, and was instructed to offer to amicably settle the matter by accepting from the Prisons' Board half the cost of rebuilding this wall. I will submit to you the acceptance of the Prisons' Board of this offer.

I have applied for a larger sum than usual for repairs of the Court-houses, as I consider it necessary to re-cement the whole of the external walls of Bray Court-house and surrounding boundary walls, and to paint the exterior wood and iron work. The interior also requires renovation, which should be done after next Assizes. New water-closets are also badly

needed at Tinahely Court-house; also the external painting of the building. I have made a recent inspection of the new line of Steam Tramway from Blessington to Poulaphuca bridge, of which 3 miles and 8 chains are situated in this county. The matters referred to in my report to the last Grand Jury as being necessary for the completion of the work, as far as county requirements are concerned, are not yet completed.

A length of 528 yards of the line is not yet curbed, as the directors of the company do not consider it necessary. I am of opinion that the curbing of this part of the line is as necessary as that of any other part, and essential for the safety of the public using the road, and for the proper demarcation between the tramway and carriage way. At the original Board of Works' Inquiry, held at Blessington on 21st February, 1888, it was undertaken by the promoters to curb the line throughout, and I accordingly so reported to the Grand Jury, and it was on this understanding, I presume, that the presentment was allowed. The directors, it is only fair to say, are supported by the Board of Trade in refusing to complete the curbing, as the Board of Trade first said the curbing was to be completed and afterwards said it need not be, and so the matter stands.

Most of the curbing is very badly laid, but as the cost of its maintenance will fall on the Company, I do not think the Grand Jury, at present, need take any steps about it; but the Road Contractors cannot properly clean the water-tables without disturbing the curbing.

The proper filling and forming of the side of the line in the street of Blessington, and the drainage of the same, are not yet properly done. I have pointed out all the defects to the contractor.

The line crosses a stone bridge at Russborough, which I consider unsafe for tramway traffic, as on the tramway side there are bad cracks, holes, and broken places in the wing walls of the bridge. I have, however, reported the matter to the Board of Trade, and hope the Tramway Company will repair and strengthen the bridge, and thus avoid the risk of a serious accident.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT, EXISTING CONTRACTS, DISCHARGED & UNDISCHARGED QUERIES.

Committee—Lieut-Colonel Morley S. Dennis, Colonel William Kemmis,  
Wm. G. Morris, Esq.

1—It is proposed to charge the expense of the Arklow bridge upon the County at Large; if this is done, the rebuilding of Boleyhorrigan bridge should in like manner be charged to the County at Large, and has a much stronger claim to be so treated, for it is a bridge used by tourists and by a large extent of the county, whereas the Arklow bridge is of local use mainly. Boleyhorrigan is one of the great outlets between East and West Wicklow.

The Committee recommend that the plan and estimate of the County Surveyor, with regard to Baltinglass court-house, be adopted—that is to build a new wall as shown in the north yard, to repair the portion originally occupied by the governor as shown in the plan, including both storeys, which portion would be let at a remunerative rent to the court-keeper or other person; the remaining portion of the property should be sold.

The offer of the Prisons Board, with regard to Wicklow court-house, should be accepted.

The Committee consider that the portion of curbing on the Steam Tramway, Blessington to Poolaphuca, left undone, should be completed, there being no reason why this part of the line should be treated any different to other portions.

The Committee think that the special attention of the Board of Trade should be drawn to the state of Russborough bridge, as mentioned in the concluding paragraph of the County Surveyor's report; there should no risk of a serious accident be allowed by neglect of proper precautions.

We have examined Mr Germaine's accounts, and have disallowed 3s for mileage, 9s 1½d for postage and telegrams. We have allowed Mr Germaine, for mileages and medical fees in holding inquests, £18 8s.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report that I have audited the Accounts of the Secretary to the Grand Jury of the County Wicklow, following last Spring Assizes, which I found had been prepared as usual in a most satisfactory manner. I forward herewith a certified and declared Abstract thereof.

The surety bonds of the High Constables were submitted for my inspection, and appeared to have been regularly executed. It is satisfactory to note that no arrears of county cess appear on the account as due.

In compliance with the request of the Grand Jury at last Assizes, I made an investigation into the financial position of the Wicklow Harbour Commissioners, so as to ascertain if there exists any surplus revenue from the harbour, which should be applied in repayment of loan, and so relieve the guaranteeing baronies.

I examined the Secretary to the Harbour Commissioners on this subject, and embodied his statements in a memorandum which I handed to the Secretary of the Grand Jury to be submitted at next assizes. It does not appear that the Harbour Commissioners are, or have recently been, in a position to pay any monies in reduction of loan.

## PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

### TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1896:—

For the Sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as inspectors of food, the following articles were analysed:—

February 7th—For Sergeant O'Leary, Wicklow, 2 specimens of butter and a specimen of milk were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

May 14th—3 specimens of whiskey, analysed for Acting-sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin, were of good quality.

May 22nd—For Sergeant Reilly, Shillelagh, a specimen of whiskey was analysed. It was not adulterated.

June 24th—For Sergeant Moore, Baltinglass, 2 specimens of whiskey were analysed. They were of good quality.

On the same date—3 specimens of linseed meal were analysed for Acting-sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin. They were all debased, containing only 7.13, 8.13 and 8.4 per cent of oil, respectively, instead of about 30 per cent, which pure linseed contains.

June 25th—For Sergeant Reilly, Shillelagh, a specimen of milk was analysed. It was adulterated with 14 per cent of added water.

June 26th—3 specimens of whiskey analysed for Sergeant Conroy, Newtown-Mt.-Kennedy, were of good quality.

On the same date—A specimen of buttermilk analysed for Sergeant Reilly, Shillelagh, was adulterated with 25 per cent of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent allowed for churning purposes.

June 27th—For Sergeant O'Leary, Wicklow, 4 specimens of whiskey were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

February 10th—A specimen of water analysed for the Guardians of Shillelagh Union had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 5.600; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.012; saline ammonia, 0.005; nitrogen in nitrites and nitrates, equal to nitric acid, traces; chlorine, 0.994; equal to sodium chloride, 1.638; hardness, 1.8°. This was a tolerably good water.

March 31st—A specimen of water analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union, had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 4.200; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.007; saline ammonia, 0.001; nitrogen in nitrites and nitrates, equal to nitric acid, traces; chlorine, 0.994; equal to sodium chloride, 1.638; hardness, 1.8°. A soft and fairly good water.

April 28th—A specimen of water was analysed for the Guardians of Baltinglass Union, with the following results:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 53.200; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.072; saline ammonia, 0.018; nitrogen in nitrites and nitrates, equal to nitric acid, traces; chlorine, 2.783; equal to sodium chloride, 4.586; hardness, 27.3°. This water, so called, resembled sewage as much as potable water. It was enormously polluted.

January 29th—A specimen of water analysed for Dr Leeper, Rathdrum, had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 83.300; including albuminoid ammonia,

0.014; saline ammonia, 0.001; nitrogen in nitrites and nitrates, 2.940; equal to nitric acid, 13.230; chlorine, 16.997; equal to sodium chloride, 28.009; hardness, 23.8°. This was a very hard water, and on the whole an inferior one.

March 2nd—A specimen of dried blood was analysed for the Dublin and Wicklow Manure Company.

March 11th—A specimen of water was analysed for Marcus F Beresford, Esq, J.P, Shelton Abbey, Arklow, with the following results—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 5.600; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.006; saline ammonia, 0.002; nitrogen in nitrites and nitrates, equal to nitric acid, traces; chlorine, 1.292; equal to sodium chloride, 2.129; hardness, 2.1°. A good water and very soft.

March 23rd—A specimen of beef-tea from Thomas Tuck, Esq., 1 Westbourne Terrace, Bray, was analysed for poison with negative result.

April 8th—A specimen of water analysed for Dr Brady, M O Health, Carnew, had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 14.700; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.0086; saline ammonia, 0.0105; nitrogen in nitrites and nitrates, equal to nitric acid, traces; chlorine, 2.186; equal to sodium chloride 3.603; hardness, 5.6°. A rather middling kind of water—not very good and not decidedly bad.

April 24th—A specimen of coffee was analysed for Dr Leeper, Rathdrum. No poisonous matter, but it was adulterated with chicory—at least 40 per cent.

May 26th—Strychnine was found in crystals in specimen of meat analysed for Dr Leeper, Medical Officer of Health, Rathdrum.

For the Enniskerry District of Rathdown Union, 6 specimens of water were analysed with the following results. One imperial gallon contained in grains—

All soft or moderately hard waters, mostly of the peaty class, but free from sewage.

In the above statements in reference to the waters analysed, only an outline of their analysis is given, but in the original reports full details were given, including their bacteriological examination and results.

Summary of work done in half-year—34 official analyses for county authorities; 3 private analyses—total, 37; six articles were adulterated.

## COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1896.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for renewals of road maintenance contracts and for special works, approved of at last May Baronial Sessions, may be classified as follows—41 renewals of road maintenance contracts; 5 repairs of bridges; 2 new bridges; 7 new gulleys; 4 new footpaths; 4 walls and fences; 8 miscellaneous works—Total, 71.

I shall here only refer to the following works; but am prepared to afford any necessary information that may be desired with regard to the others.

County at Large, No. 87.—To repair the Court-houses, &c., £180. It is proposed to expend a large portion of this sum in the restoration of the late Governor's apartments adjoining Baltinglass Court-house as recommended by the last Grand Jury.

In Arklow barony the chief application is for widening Arklow bridge by an overhanging footpath £850. As this application has now merely to be certified, I suppose the matter is not properly open for discussion; but I think it would be well now to decide if the cost of this work can be divided between the barony in which it is situated and the County at Large or whether it should not be charged wholly on the barony or wholly on the County at Large.

North Ballinacor, No. 41.—To repair Clara bridge £50. This is a necessary work.

North Ballinacor, No. 43.—To rebuild Boleyhorrigan bridge on the road from Roundwood to Sallygap, £400. The condition of this bridge has been referred to in previous reports. The same question here arises as in the application above referred to for widening Arklow bridge.

In my application for this work I proposed that the cost should be defrayed either by the barony or by the County at Large as this Grand Jury should determine; but at Road Sessions there was added to the application "Half to be levied off the County at Large."

Rathdown, No. 43.—To form and curb the footpath along Trafalgar-road, Greystones £79 19s. Half on the County at Large. This is an useful work.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 67.—To sink and re-build a gullet at Winetavern, £33. This work is not required for county purposes; but for the drainage of the lands above it.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 69.—To repair Gibstown bridge, £49. This is a necessary work.

Lower Talbotstown, No. 72.—To make a new footpath in Dunlavin, £95. This is a very useful work.

Lower Talbotstown, No. 75.—To repair the bridge over the Doll's brook at Intack on the road from Hollywood to Donard, £60. No tender was received at adjourned Sessions for this work.

Since last Assizes it became necessary to take proceedings against one of your contractors and his sureties for breach of contract, viz—Daniel McDonnell, No. 73 Spring, 1894, and No. 14 Spring, 1896, Barony of Lower Talbotstown. Decrees were granted in each case.

With regard to the portion of my last report referring to the Blessington and Poulaphuca Steam Tramway, I beg to say that having reported the state of the stone bridge at Russborough to the Board of Trade, an inspection of it was made on 9th April last by Major Marinden, the result of which was that the bridge was soon after repaired and strengthened. The line in the street of Blessington has also been improved; but the curbing of the line still remains uncompleted to the same extent as last reported,

#### DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

#### COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW, Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1896.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,  
I have made the usual annual inspection of that part of the line situated in the County Wicklow, also of the engines, rolling stock and plant.

During the last year a considerable quantity of ballast has been spread; but more is required. The line to a great extent is in a very weedy condition. Many of the fish plate bolts are loose; but not so many as at former inspections.

The ballast should be kept clear of all fastenings so that it can be at once seen if they are in proper order. To a considerable extent they are covered up by the ballast at present.

The rails on the sharp curves should be curved to the proper radius which will be of advantage to the rolling stock.

Last May the rolling stock was increased by the delivery to the Company, on the three year's system, of a new locomotive weighing when loaded about 18 tons, to be paid for in six half-yearly instalments of £216 13s 4d each, in all £1,300.

A new composite carriage has also been hired with a view to ultimate purchase.

The van referred to in my last report as having been broken up at Poulaphuca has been rebuilt.

The rolling stock is well looked after and improvements continue to be effected in the engines—No. 3 engine is at present being improved and practically rebuilt and six of the carriages have been repainted.

When the above new engine and carriage are paid for and added to stock the Company will own—Eight engines, Eight composite carriages (1st and 3rd class) Four third class carriages, Eighteen wagons and Two vans.

Referring to a circular letter from the Board of Works dated 13th February last and handed to me at last Assizes I beg to say that I have furnished to that department a copy of every report made by me to you in accordance with the 35th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887.

As to No 43 Rathdown, the committee are of opinion that, though on a mail coach road, the charge should not be partially placed upon the County at Large; the work does not seem to be absolutely necessary, and is entirely for the benefit of the barony.
