RESOLUTIONS

OF THE
GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW.

Resolved—That all certificates for repairing sudden damages be henceforth lodged in the Secretary's Office, at least three clear days before the Assizes, great confusion having arisen from the contrary practice being pursued.

Resolved—That no Presentment will, in future, be made in aid of any Infirmary or Fever Hospital, unless the same shall be accompanied by the account and accurate list of subscribers' names, and the amount severally subscribed by them.

Resolved—That in future there shall be printed in detail, at the beginning of the Schedule, a list of duties to be gone through by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That the space within the Bar in the Grand Jury Room be strictly reserved for the use of the Grand Jury and the Officers of the County connected with the duties of the Grand Jury, and that all others be kept beyond the Bar, unless specially introduced.

Resolved—That in future, if any subject of complaint should exist, or if any charge is preferred against the County Surveyor, or other County Officer, such complaint or charge shall be made specially in writing on the first day of the Assizes, evidence of the facts shall be afforded in the consideration of the same, and that Notice of the intention to prefer such complaint shall be previously given to the party complained of.

Resolved—That we recommend the Coroners to employ the Dispensary Physicians, whenever it may be necessary to call in a medical man, and to pay them a fee of £1 1s. for each attendance.

W. W. F. HUME, M.P., Foreman.

Resolved—That in future, all tenders postponed to the assizes, if not lodged with the Secretary the day before the commencement of the Fiscal Business, will not be entertained by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That in future the several High-Constables shall be required to furnish the amounts of their respective insolvencies every two years, pursuant to 6 & 7 Wm. iv., cap. 116, sec. 149.

Summer, 1863.

W. W. F. HUME, Foreman.

Resolved—That the County Printer shall be required to have the "Schedule of Applications," previous to each Assizes, printed and ready for distribution, within fourteen days from the day on which the copy of same is given to him by the Secretary; and that he shall have the "Abstract of Presentments," after each Assizes, printed within twenty-one days after he receives the materials for same from the County Treasurer.

Resolved—That with the view of supplying better information for the future to the Justices and associated Cesspayers, as to the matters that are to come before them at Presenting Sessions in each Barony, the Secretary is instructed to have printed and circulated to such, a notice of all Presentments which are to be discussed at such Sessions, so far as it is practicable to do so.

Resolved—That in future any party who, having duly entered into a Contract, shall sell, transfer, or dispose of it to another, such contract shall upon proof thereof be declared "null and void" by the Grand Jury, and the money levied for it shall be re-presented to the credit of the County or Barony, where the fraud has been committed.

Spring, 1870.

GEORGE HODSON, Bart., Foreman.

RESOLVED,—That, it having been represented by the County Surveyor that considerable damage has recently been caused to some of the County Roads by Traction Engines, it be referred to the solicitor of the Grand Jury to examine the Acts relating to the use of such Engines, and, in conjunction with the County Surveyor, to take such steps as may be necessary for the protection of the public roads.

Summer, 1881.

RESOLVED—That, if from any cause the sums payable on any contract remain undischarged for two successive half-years, such sums be re-presented to the credit of the county or barony, as the case may be, without delay, unless special reason for not doing so be shown to the satisfaction of the Grand Jury.

RESOLVED—That, in future no new contract for any works or roads shall be entered into or entertained, unless all money levied for the previous contract has been previously discharged, or is approved of, or ordered to be re-presented.

RESOLVED—That with the view to avoiding the expense of unnecessary Printing, all obsolete or revoked resolutions be omitted from the Abstract.

Spring, 1883.

GEORGE HODSON, Bart., Foreman.

RESOLVED—That the Court Keepers, Official Managers of Reformatories, and all others whose claims for payment have to be brought before the Grand Jury at Assizes, be requested to furnish their several accounts to the Secretary to the Grand Jury, on or before the 15th of February and the 15th of June, in each year, in order that they may be entered in the printed Schedule, and that no account or claim be submitted to the Grand Jury unless this direction has been complied with.

RESOLVED—That in future the Schedule do only contain the new works, and such matters as should, in due course, come before the Grand Jury at each Assizes, and that the "existing contracts" be omitted from the Schedule, but that all county works be printed in the Abstract, which should be made as complete as possible.

RESOLVED—That, in order to entitle the Solicitor to the Grand Jury to payment for the High Constables' Bonds, he shall have them registered and returned to the Secretary, within one calendar month from date of receiving same from him for that purpose.

RESOLVED—That the attention of Magistrates and Cesspayers at Adjourned Sessions should be again called to the great importance of enquiring most particularly into the solvency of sureties, and also to ascertain that their property be such that the amount of their bonds can be recovered without difficulty, in the event of the contractor failing to fulfil his obligations. And it is also most desirable that the contractors should reside within a reasonable distance of their contracts.

Further, that in cases where former contractors, who have proved themselves notoriously inefficient, put in tenders for new works, it will be desirable to take into serious consideration whether such tender be accepted, and if accepted, such cases to be specially brought to the notice of the Grand Jury by the County Surveyor.

GEORGE HODSON Bart, Foreman.

Resolved—That the provisions of the Grand Jury Act, 6 & 7 Wm. IV., cap 116, be strictly adhered to in respect to the applications for payment to be made by contractors to and at the respective Presentment Sessions. All such applications, with the certificates of the County Surveyor, to be, as provided in said Act, laid before the respective Presentment Sessions for approval or rejection by those courts, subject to

the power of the Grand Jury to disallow any presentment founded thereupon, where the road or work shall not have been properly maintained in the interval between the Sessions and the Assizes. And further the greatest care is desirable in examining tenders at Adjourned Sessions, so as to reject such as may appear tainted with fraud, and to regard with distrust and, where possible, refuse, future tenders made by parties who may have connived at unfair tendering.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

Resolved—That the coroners' accounts be now received and sent to the sub-committee, but that the coroners shall now take notice that if their accounts are not in future sent to the Secretary ten clear days before the Assizes, he is not to receive them.

Summer, 1885.

Resolved—That the attention of the Barony Cess Collectors be called to the necessity of giving in to the Treasurer's Office, at least two days before the first day of every Assizes, the amount of the assessments collected by them, as required by their warrants, and by 4 Geo. IV., cap. 33, sec. 7, as their fees will not in future be allowed till this be complied with.

Resolved—That the Court-keeper be instructed in future to see that the Grand Jury are properly supplied with blotting and writing paper for their use on each day they sit, whether for fiscal or criminal business.

Resolved—That it be a direction of this Grand Jury to their Secretary that he shall in future keep a record of all resolutions passed in a minute book, and that the Foreman sign such minutes.

Resolved—That the County Presentment Sessions should require that the accounts of the County Infirmary and the several Fever Hospitals be audited by a competent person.

Spring, 1888.

C. G. TOTTENHAM, Foreman.

Resolved—That a committee of the Grand Jury, consisting of Colonel R. Pratt Saunders, Lieut.-Colonel Tighe, and W. R. Bulwer be appointed, who, in case of any difference between County Surveyor and Tramway Company, shall decide as to what may be reasonable requirements in accordance with the report of the committee adopted by the Grand Jury at this Assizes. The Tramway Company undertake to carry out what this committee may direct, and failing their so doing the committee are here by empowered to direct such legal proceedings to be taken as they may think desirable.

Resolved—That the Harbour Commissioners elected at Presentment Sessions be asked by the Secretary to the Grand Jury to draw up a report of the accounts of the Harbour Board for the information of the Grand Jury at Summer Assizes; that a Committee be appointed to examine it; and their report be printed in the Abstract, so that the Cesspayers of the guaranteeing Baronies may know something of the income and expenditure.

Resolved—That the Governors of the Richmond District Lunatic Asylum be requested to furnish to the Secretary of this Grand Jury before each

Spring Assizes the names of the lunatics charged to this county, with the Petty Sessions District from which they have respectively been committed, and the date of each committal, and the total number of patients in the asylum during the period for which the yearly charge is calculated.

Resolved—That the accounts of the Blessington Steam Tramway guarantee tax be kept by the Secretary and Barony High Constable as distinct from the ordinary county cess, and that a book showing such account, with all its credits and debits, be laid upon the Grand Jury table on the first day of the Grand Jury meeting in each half-year.

Resolved—That a copy of the resolution as to Lower Talbotstown be sent to the High Constable, and he be ordered to make a separate return from time to time, when and as required by the Secretary, of the amounts collected for the guarantee, and informed that if he neglect to do so his fees will be stopped by the Grand Jury.

Resolved—That in the case of a vacancy occurring amongst the assistant surveyors during Mr Campbell Boyd's tenure of office, we authorize that a temporary assistant be appointed by the County Surveyor until the Assizes following Mr Boyd's retirement, when the matter can again be gone into.

The Grand Jury having refused to present for Coroner Byrnes expenses for inquests held since the previous assizes, he not having lodged his abstract and account with the Secretary to the Grand Jury as required by 9 & 10 Vic., cap. 37, sec. 24, "ten clear days at least before the assembling of the Grand Jury," although lodged ten clear days before their second assembling for Crown business. The Coroner appeared by counsel and traversed the non-presentment. O'Brien, C. J., after consultation with Pallas, C. B., confirmed the finding of the Grand Jury, ruling that the words of the section quoted were mandatory, and a condition precedent to obtaining a presentment.

Resolved—That the following be the premises set to Col. Dennis—20th July, 1895:—The whole house on the south side of the bridewell backyard in Baltinglass, the joint use of said yard and of the pump in the inner yard; the several rooms in the house to be put into a fair tenantable order by Colonel Dennis, whose claim to be allowed for same will be fairly considered—windows to be repaired, locks and keys supplied where necessary. The proper proportion of poor rate, &c., to which Colonel Dennis will be liable, to be ascertained, as at present all the Grand Jury property in Baltinglass is included in one assessment.

Resolutions passed at Spring Assizes, 1898.

Resolved—That the following gentlemen be requested and authorized to attend the proposed conference of Irish Grand Jurors and Peers relative to the provisions of the Irish Local Government Bill, as representatives of the Grand Jury of the County Wicklow—Colonel Tottenham, Fletcher Moore, Esq; D. Mahony, Esq.

Resolved—That we, the Grand Jury of the County Wicklow, having read the Local Government Bill, consider that there are many important points on which it should be amended in committee; but, having appointed three of our number to act as a deputation from this Grand Jury and to represent us on the conference asked for by Lord Castletown, we prefer to submit our views to them rather than *commit* ourselves to opinions which must at present be based, as regards a great part of the Bill, on insufficient information.

Resolved—That we are entirely in accord with the opinion expressed by so many public bodies, and generally supported by the Press of the country, that the Local Government Board should be strongly reinforced by persons having a practical experience of the working of the Grand Jury system, and we desire to express our opinion that some grand juror of great experience should be appointed to one of the posts about to become vacant on that board.

Resolved—That, referring to clause 50 of the proposed Local Government (Ireland) Bill, by which powers are given to a county council to utilize a superfluous workhouse as an auxiliary asylum for harmless lunatics, this Grand Jury are of opinion that the State should provide for the care and maintenance of dangerous lunatics (as is the case with criminal lunatics), and that a county council should be only responsible for the care and maintenance of its harmless lunatics.

Resolved—That the committee already appointed to consider the most desirable course to adopt in regard to that part of the Baltinglass Bridewell, not required for use of Baltinglass Courthouse, having reported that they consider that the part referred to be sold, are hereby directed to arrange, with the aid of the Solicitor to the Grand Jury, to prepare title, conditions of sale, and any necessary preliminaries for such sale, and report same to next Grand Jury for its opinion and further direction.

Resolved—That, having had Colonel Morley S Dennis' letter of the 16th March, 1898, and cheque for £6 4s 3d, laid before us, we hereby direct our secretary to accept and lodge said cheque as payment on account

of rent due for the portion of the bridewell in Baltinglass, in the occupation of Colonel Dennis, and leave what allowance shall be made and the final checking of the account between the Grand Jury and Colonel Dennis to the committee appointed to sell the bridewell.

Resolved—That a committee of this Grand Jury, consisting of Mr D. Smythe, Mr Otway Johnson, and Col Saunders, be appointed to consider a report prepared by Mr Dillon, solicitor to the Board of Governors, Richmond Asylum, by order of that Board, relative to the question of an issue of Richmond Asylum Stock in lieu of the present system of raising funds required for that institution by Government loans, and to confer with any other similar committee appointed for the same purpose by the other contributory districts, and report decision arrived at to next Grand Jury at Summer Assizes.

Resolved—That, understanding that the Irish Government will appoint someone to the Local Government Board, who is acquainted with the working of the Grand Juries' Acts, in the view of the Local Government Bill becoming law, we beg to recommend our County Surveyor, Mr Carter Draper, who is a candidate for the post, as a gentleman in every way suitable for the position.

Resolved—If any sum is awarded by the Judge in respect to presentment No 60, South Ballinacor, that the area of charge be the townland of Aughrim Lower.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the period which elapsed between the 1st day of June and the 31st day of December, 1897:—

For the sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed:—

September 2nd—For Sergeant J. Sullivan, Tinahely, a specimen of whiskey was analysed; it was free from adulteration.

November 9th—Two specimens of milk, analysed for Acting-sergt. D. Connor, Bray, were of the average quality of pure milk.

November 12th—For Sergeant O'Leary, Wicklow, 4 specimens of milk, 1 of buttermilk, and 1 of whiskey, were analysed; they were all free from adulteration.

November 13th—On this date, for the same sergeant, 2 specimens of milk and 2 of butter were analysed. The milks were of rich quality. One of the specimens of butter was adulterated with excess of water, of which it contained 18·18 per cent.—16 per cent. being the maximum which should be permitted.

November 24th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant S. Browne, Ovoca, was pure.

November 25th—Two specimens of whiskey, analysed for Acting-sergeant P. Carroll, Dunlavin, were of good quality.

November 26th—For Sergeant T. Hannify, Rathdrum, 2 specimens of whiskey were analysed. One was adulterated with 7·33 per cent. of added water, being 30·5 degrees under proof.

November 23rd—Two specimens of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant T. Hannify, Rathdrum, were pure.

June 8th—A specimen of water, analysed for Dr Brady, Coolattin Dispensary, had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 4·200; including—Albuminoid ammonia, 0·003; saline ammonia, 0·003; nitric acid, trace; chlorine 1·190; equal to sodium chloride, 1·960; sulphuric acid, none; equal to calcium sulphate, none. A good water.

June 25th—A specimen of water analysed for the guardians of Rathdrum Union, had the following composition: One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 18·300; including albuminoid ammonia, 0·004; saline ammonia, 0·0055; nitric acid, trace; chlorine, 1·190; equal to sodium chloride, 1·960; sulphuric acid, trace; equal to calcium sulphate, trace. COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT
TO THE
GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,
Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1898.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for public works approved of at last December Presentment Sessions and which will now be submitted for your consideration are for the usual works connected with the maintenance and improvement of the roads, bridges, &c., in the county. They may be classified as follows:—

48 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
8 new roads.
10 repairs of bridges.
9 new gulleys and repairs of old ones.
10 new footpaths and recurbing old ones.
13 miscellaneous works.

Total, 93

I shall here only refer to the following works; but can give any necessary information with regard to the others as they come before you:—

Arklow, No. 72.—To pin, point, repair and pave Arklow bridge, £300. Having made a careful examination of the bridge I find that this expenditure is immediately necessary to secure the foundations, &c.

North Ballinacor, No. 43.—To repair Ballinastoe bridge, £45. Half off the barony of Newcastle. This is a necessary work.

North Ballinacor, No. 45.—To recurb a footpath in the Lower street of Rathdrum, £64 7s. This is a desirable work of improvement.

Rathdown, No. 45.—To repair and curb a footpath in Enniskerry, £69. This is a very useful work.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 69.—To make a new footpath between Rathdangan village and Killamoat chapel, £42. A very useful work.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 74.—To repair Redmond's bridge, £47 10s. This sum will only suffice for the repairs that are at present urgent. Further expenditure will be necessary on this bridge.

Lower Talbotstown, No. 75.—To build a 3-ope gullet over the ford at Garryknock, £46 17s 6d. This is a necessary work, its object being to bridge over the present rough and dangerous ford.

Since last assizes it became necessary to take proceedings against five of the county contractors and their sureties for breach of contract, viz.—Denis O'Brien, for not proceeding with his contract for paving in Arklow, No. 75, Spring, 1897. Patrick Whelan, for abandoning his three maintenance contracts in the barony of South Ballinacor, Nos. 19, 47 and 48, Summer 1897. James Roche, for abandoning his maintenance contract, No. 55, Summer, 1897, barony of Upper Talbotstown. John Dwyer, No. 71, Summer, 1896, barony of Upper Talbotstown, for not proceeding with his contract to build a retaining wall, &c.; and Joseph Sutton, No. 46, Spring, 1896, barony of Rathdown, for not completing his contract to make footpaths. Decrees were granted in each of the above seven cases.

The "Estimate of Advances" shows an estimated deficiency amounting to £478 8s 4d. This is accounted for by the fact that a number of roads placed in the hands of the County Surveyor may have to be provided for in advance of the collection of cess. In view of impending changes, it would be desirable that at next assizes the Grand Jury should make ample provision for such contingencies.

The accounts continue to be kept in a most satisfactory manner.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the period which elapsed between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of May, 1898 :—

For the sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed :—

January 11th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergt. S. Moore, Baltinglass, was pure.

February 4th—For Sergeant J O'Leary, Wicklow, 3 specimens of whiskey were analysed. One was 27 degrees under proof, and was therefore adulterated with 2.67 per cent. of added water.

February 5th—Two specimens of milk, analysed for Acting-sergeant D. Connor, Bray, were above the average quality of pure milk.

February 9th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant Hannify, Rathdrum, was pure.

February 15th—For Sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin, two specimens of whiskey were analysed. One was adulterated with 7.33 per cent. of added water, being 30.5 degrees under proof.

February 22nd—For Sergeant S. Browne, Ovoca, three specimens of milk were analysed. Two were under the average quality of pure milk.

February 23rd—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for the same sergeant, was of good quality.

March 11th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant Conroy, Newtown-Mount-Kennedy, was pure.

March 16th—For Sergeant Hannify, Rathdrum, a specimen of butter was analysed. It was not adulterated.

March 24th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant Moore, Baltinglass, was of good quality.

March 31st—For Sergeant J. O'Leary, Wicklow, 4 specimens of milk, 2 of butter, and 1 of whiskey, were analysed. They were all free from adulteration.

May 24th—Two specimens of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant S. Browne, Ovoca, were pure.

May 27th—For Sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin, two specimens of whiskey were analysed. They were not adulterated.

March 29th—For No. 2 Dispensary, Bray, two drugs were analysed. Vinegar of oil of squills—specific gravity, 1.0315; extract 6.81 per cent; acetic acid, 5.82 per cent. The residue on evaporation possessed the characteristics of the true extract from squills. Soap liniment—It contained 53.8 per cent of rectified spirit, and corresponded in gravity and other respects with the pure liniment.

January 18th—For the Town Commissioners of Bray, 6 specimens of milk were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

February 1st—The viscera of a dog, and a cabbage leaf, were received from W G Merrey, Esq., Blessington. Strychnine was discovered in the cabbage leaf.

April 29th—For Dr Raverty, Bray, a specimen of milk and a specimen of water were analysed. The milk was of rich quality. The water had the following composition :—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 35.700; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.007; saline ammonia, 0.005; nitric acid, trace; chlorine, 5.566; sulphuric acid, none; equal to calcium sulphate, none. This was a fairly good water.

January 8th—For F. Brooke, Esq., J.P., Shillelagh, some materials supposed to contain a poisonous matter; but nothing of that nature was present.

May 17th—On this date a specimen of cake was received from Dr Raverty, Bray. It was portion of a cake which had been eaten by some children, who afterwards had become unwell. No ordinary poison was detected in it; but this seems to have been another instance of noxious principle (*ptomaines*) being developed food, as a result of incipient decomposition.

For Rathdown Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, 2 drugs and a specimen of water were analysed. The drugs were tincture of cinchona and tincture of rhubarb. Tincture of cinchona specific gravity, 9436 (should be about 9370); absolute alcohol, 42 per cent, equal to proof spirit 86.75 per cent; extract, 4.68 per cent. In this tincture there is a rather large deficiency of spirit. Tincture of rhubarb specific gravity 9427 (should be about 9550). Absolute alcohol 43.3 per cent, equal to proof spirit 98.39 per cent.; extract 4.88 per cent. The extract and spirit were both somewhat deficient.

The specimen of water had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 53.900; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.0055; saline ammonia, 0.004; nitric acid, 1.200; chlorine, 1.192; sulphuric acid, none; equal to calcium sulphate, none. This water was a very hard one, but otherwise of good quality.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, 5 specimens of water and 3 drugs were analysed. The specimens of water had the following compositions :—One imperial gallon contained in grains—

No 2 was a very inferior water; No 4 slightly below the standard of best waters; No 1 was a good water; 3 and 5 were fairly good. The drugs were salicylate of soda, one specimen of compound spirit of sulphuric ether, and a specimen of compound tincture of benzoin. The salicylate of soda was pure. Compound spirit of sulphuric ether specific gravity 0.8147 (this is about correct). Its characters agree with the pure article. Compound tincture of benzoin extract per cent 15.25 (correct); specific gravity .892 (should be .889); absolute alcohol 60.9 per cent, equal to rectified spirit 72.5 per cent (correct).

I have only given an outline of the composition of the waters above referred to, but in the original reports full details, chemical, microscopical and bacteriological, were given.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications for public works approved of at last May Presentment Sessions and which will now be submitted for your consideration are for the usual works connected with the maintenance and improvement of the roads, bridges, &c., in the county. They may be classified as follows:—

- 65 renewals of road maintenance contracts.
- 3 repairs of bridges.
- 5 new gulleys and repairs of old gulleys.
- 4 recurring footpaths.
- 2 new footpaths.
- 9 miscellaneous works.

Total, 88

I shall here only refer to the following works; but can give any necessary information regarding the others as they come in order before you:—

County at Large, No. 100.—To repair the court houses, £200
This amount, passed at sessions for this purpose, is larger than usual as th.

cost of new drainage and sanitary appliances in the County Court House is included in it, a work which I consider most necessary.

County at Large, No. 125.—To repair Clash bridge, £49 12s. 6d. This is the County at Large moiety of the cost of the work, the other moiety being equally divided between the baronies of North and South Ballinacor as the bridge is situated at the bounds of these baronies. This is a necessary work.

North Ballinacor, No. 43.—To recurb a footpath in the Lower Street of Rathdrum, £60 15s. This work was disallowed by the last Grand Jury. I consider it a desirable work of improvement.

Rathdown, No. 45.—To rebuild the bridge at Annacrivey school-house, £48. A very useful work; but not tendered for at Adjourned Sessions.

Rathdown, No. 46.—To recurb a footpath on the Church hill, Enniskerry, £63. A useful work; but not tendered for at Adjourned Sessions.

Rathdown, No. 47.—To recurb a footpath on the Kilbride road near Bray, £150. A very useful work; but not tendered for.

Rathdown, No. 48.—To rebuild a gullet at Kilmurry, £55. This is a most necessary work as the present gullet is in a ruinous and dangerous condition.

Shillelagh, No. 51.—To build a protection wall at Park, £40. A useful work; but not tendered for.

Shillelagh, No. 52.—To raise the road at Pierce's bridge, near Shillelagh, on the road from Shillelagh to Carnew, £45. The object of this work is to prevent the water rising above the road and flowing over it after heavy rains, and part of the work is to sink and improve the water-course below the bridge, and remove some trees which interfere with it. This would appear to be the duty of the owner of the stream and trees. Some time ago this stream was cleared by the owner, but it again requires cleaning.

Upper Talbotstown, No. 67.—To make two pipe drains across the road at Baltinglass West, £12—one-third to be contributed. The object of this work is to renew two existing drains, under the county road, which are out of order, and which constitute the supply and overflow for a watering place beside the road. I do not consider it is the duty of the county to contribute to the cost of this work.

Since last assizes it became necessary to proceed against Patrick Byrne and his sureties for breach of contract in the non-completion of a protection fence at Knockanrea, near Baltinglass, No. 66, Spring, 1897, barony of Upper Talbotstown. A decree was granted, and the work is now completed.

Sudden damages having occurred to Greenan and Strand bridges, at the bounds of the baronies of North and South Ballinacor; to Cranareen bridge in the barony of Upper Talbotstown, and to the paved ford at Knocknadroose, in the barony of Lower Talbotstown, orders were signed for their repair by the justices at petty sessions.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1898.

Mr Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

I have made the usual annual inspection of that part of the line situated in the County Wicklow, also of the buildings, engines, rolling stock and plant.

With regard to the permanent way, it is on the whole in better order than usual; but mostly very weedy. The fastenings of the rails have been improved, and the sharp curves strengthened.

The rolling stock, which has been increased by two wagons during the last year, is in good order, and the fact that out of 35 vehicles only 2 are undergoing repairs, speaks well for the quality of the carriages and wagons. This cannot, however, be stated of the engines, of which there are eight; but of these only two are at all suitable for the line—namely, those last purchased. Of the remaining 6, two are nearly always in the repairing shop undergoing extensive repairs and renewals. I should say that 5 or 6 good engines would be quite sufficient to work the present traffic, if it be decided to continue the use of steam as the motive power for the future.

The telephone has been laid from Terenure to Tallaght, a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles. I am of opinion that it should be extended to Blessington, as in the case of a single line with passing places at intervals, such as this line is, it would prove of great use in working the traffic in case of accidents and delays.

I am informed that an engine is constantly kept with steam up at the depot at Templeoge, chiefly in order to be ready for any emergency, and it will be seen that the use of this engine is greatly lessened if a long time elapses before any mishap on the line can be communicated to the depot. The loss and inconvenience which occur at present when any breakdown or delay occurs would, to a large extent, be obviated if a line of telephone were established. I find from the half-yearly reports that the expenditure on the present line of telephone from Terenure to Tallaght, a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, was £89 15s. At this rate it would cost about £307 to complete the additional 12 miles to Blessington; but probably, if carefully considered, it would cost considerably under this sum. It would have to be arranged for on the hire system, with a view to purchase.

1—County Surveyor's Report—With regard to the Baltinglass Court-house, which matter, though not mentioned in the report, has been laid before the committee, they recommend that the draft presentment drawn up by the Grand Jury's solicitor, Mr Brown, for effecting the sale of that part of the court-house not required by the county, be approved (save that the premises be sold free of rent) by the Grand Jury, and submitted to the judge for sanction, and they recommend as commissioners to carry out the sale—Colonel Tottenham, G C C Crampton, Fletcher Moore, Esq; Sir Henry Cochrane, Dr Truell, David Mahony, Esq.—with power to sell in one lot or in two (defined in the plans) as may be advisable. The County Surveyor to make necessary alterations to make the two parts complete in themselves—expense to be defrayed out of the funds in hands of County Surveyor for repairs of court-houses. In the County Surveyor's report itself there appears to be nothing requiring particular mention, with the exception of No 67 Upper Talbotstown, which, being required for the convenience of the occupier of the land on one side of the road, they consider 1s. 0d. presentment sufficient.

GENTLEMEN,

I have audited the Accounts of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following the last Summer Assizes, and I beg leave to forward herewith an Abstract thereof declared and certified in the prescribed form.

I ascertained that the total amount received by the Grand Jury since the previous audit was regularly accounted for, and the expenditure properly authorised and vouched.

There is a sum of £691 3s 8d on the face of the accounts as a liability against the Bray township to which I wish to direct special attention in order that steps may be taken for requiring its speedy payment, a course which becomes the more necessary in view of the coming changes affecting grand jury finances.

I inspected the bonds of the several High Constables, and found them in proper form and duly executed.

The accounts of the Grand Jury were submitted for audit in a satisfactory manner.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that I have made the following analyses during the period which elapsed between the 1st day of June and the 31st day of December, 1898:—

For the sergeants of the Royal Irish Constabulary, acting as Inspectors of Food, the following articles were analysed:—

July 6th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergt. T. Hanniffy, Rathdrum, was pure.

September 7th—A specimen of buttermilk, analysed for Sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin, was of very poor and doubtful quality.

September 20th—For Sergeant J. O'Leary, Wicklow, 2 specimens of whiskey, 1 of butter, 1 of buttermilk, and 1 of tea, were analysed. One specimen of whiskey was 84 degrees under proof, and was therefore adulterated with 12 per cent. of added water.

September 23rd—For Sergeant T. Hanniffy, Rathdrum, 2 specimens of milk, 1 of tea, and 1 of pepper were analysed. They were all free from adulteration.

September 26th.—On this date a specimen of buttermilk, analysed for the same sergeant, was of very poor and doubtful quality.

September 28th—Two specimens of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant J. Conroy, Newtown-Mount-Kennedy, were adulterated with 10.67 and 18 per cent. of added water, being 33 and 38.5 degrees under proof respectively.

September 29th—For Sergeant T. Hanniffy, Rathdrum, 2 specimens of whiskey were analysed. One was 36 degrees under proof, and was therefore adulterated with 14.67 per cent. of added water.

October 24th—On this date a specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant Conroy, Newtown-Mount-Kennedy, was adulterated with 14.67 per cent. of added water, being 36 degrees under proof.

November 12th—A specimen of milk, analysed for Sergeant D. Connor, Bray, was of rich quality.

November 15th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant T. Hanniffy, Rathdrum, was 46 degrees under proof, and was therefore adulterated with 28 per cent. of added water.

November 16th—A specimen of rum, analysed for Sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin, was of good quality.

On same date, for Sergeant Reilly, Shillelagh, a specimen of milk and a specimen of buttermilk were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

November 17th—A specimen of buttermilk, analysed for Sergeant D. Connor, Bray, was adulterated with 38 per cent. of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes.

November 21st—For Sergeant P. Reilly, Shillelagh, a specimen of milk and a specimen of buttermilk were analysed. They were free from adulteration.

November 28th—Three specimens of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant J. O'Leary, Wicklow, were pure.

December 7th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant T. Hanniffy, Rathdrum, was of good quality.

December 15th—For Sergeant J. O'Leary, Rathnew and Wicklow, 4 specimens of butter, 2 of milk and 2 of buttermilk were analysed. One of the buttermilks was adulterated with 14 per cent. of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes.

December 17th—A specimen of whiskey, analysed for Sergeant Carroll, Dunlavin, was pure.

On same date, for Sergeant J. O'Leary, Coolbeg and Wicklow, 3 specimens of buttermilk and 1 of whiskey were analysed. One specimen of buttermilk was adulterated with 12 per cent. of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes.

December 24th—For Sergeant J. Lane, Arklow, 2 specimens of buttermilk were analysed. One was adulterated with 30 per cent. of added water, exclusive of 25 per cent. allowed for churning purposes.

June 21st—A specimen of linseed meal, analysed for Dr. R. Brew, Enniskerry Dispensary, was pure.

December 8th—No poison was discovered in the stomach and liver of a woman, sent by Dr. J. Bolster, Tinahely.

July 11th—A specimen of milk, analysed for Mrs. Hallelwell, Dargle Cottage, Enniskerry, was deprived of at least 18 per cent. of its fats.

October 20th—No poison was discovered in the viscera of a fox, examined for D. Mahony, Esq., D.L., Grange Con.

December 29th—A specimen of water, analysed for Colonel R. J. P. Saunders, D.L., Saunder's Grove, Baltinglass, had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 16.800; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.008; saline ammonia, 0.0025; nitric acid, trace; chlorine, 0.795; sulphuric acid, trace; equal to calcium sulphate, trace. A good water.

For Rathdown Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, 2 drags and 4 specimens of water were analysed. The drags were antimonial wine and compound tincture of rhubarb. They were both pure. The specimens of water had the following compositions:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—

For Naas Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, 2 specimens of milk, and 1 of water were analysed. The milks were free from adulteration. The water had the following composition:—One imperial gallon contained in grains—Total solid matters, 3.500; including albuminoid ammonia, 0.004; saline ammonia, 0.005; nitric acid, trace; chlorine, 0.695; sulphuric acid, none; equal to calcium sulphate, none. A good water.

I have only given the principal details of the waters sent to me for analysis, but in the original reports full particulars, chemical, microscopic and bacteriological, were given.

Total number of analysis made in the half-year, 59. Of the foods sent, 11 were adulterated, a very large proportion.

The applications for renewals of road maintenance contracts are on this occasion more numerous than usual, as provision has to be made not only for the continuance of those contracts which expire now, but also for those which will expire at next Summer Assizes.

At the December Presentment Sessions provisions were made for carrying on all the above contracts until the 30th September next, including the supplies of road metal required for next winter's repairs.

No new works were approved of at sessions, and the only special works allowed were a few for necessary repairs to bridges and culverts.

In accordance with instructions received from the Local Government Board, all presentments of previous assizes appearing in the abstract following last assizes must be disposed of by either paying or representing them in whole or in part.

Having given these instructions, which are serious and important, careful attention, I have certified in every case, where the presentments are for roads and works, as far as I considered the contracts were complied

with, and have prepared a list of sums not certified for, which, in accordance with these instructions, are to be represented by you.

There are two cases which I wish to mention. One is that of Arklow bridge, for the paving and repairs of which you presented at last assizes. Out of the sum presented £27 remains unexpended. I would suggest that as this sum must be represented, and as the £27 should be expended as soon as possible on the bridge, you should make a new presentment for £27 on account of this work.

Another case is that of the repair of Clash bridge, a most necessary work; but to which the contractor has done nothing. In like manner I suggest that you should represent the sums presented at last assizes, and make presentments to parties employed for the same amounts.

Out of the presentment for repairs to court-houses made at last assizes, I have had the entire drainage and sanitary appliances of this court-house renewed and rearranged in accordance with the best modern practice, and have had all exterior wood and iron work painted, also portions of the interior—namely, the grand jury room and some of the offices; but it would be desirable to renovate the rest of the interior at an early date.

In only the following two cases were proceedings taken against county contractors since last assizes:—

William Plant, contractor for part of the road leading to the Rifle Ranges at Kilbride, in the barony of Lower Talbotstown, over which heavy traffic for this class of road was passing to the ranges allowed it to get into such a bad state as to cause considerable public inconvenience. The contractor and his sureties were summoned to petty sessions, and an order was made that the road should be put into proper order within a specified time. The contractor was also directed to pay costs.

In the same barony the contractor for the repair of Morris's bridge at Ballinahown having died, his sureties were called on to do the work; but neglected to do so. Proceedings were taken at quarter sessions and a decree granted.

The Committee examined the Discharged and Undischarged Queries, and also the Existing Contracts, and believe them to be correct.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CORONERS' & PRINTING ACCOUNTS.

Committee—Colonel Stoney, J. Otway Johnson, and Fletcher Moore, Esq.

Coroners' Accounts.—We regret to find that Coroner Jones died on the 8th day of November last. We recommend that there be paid the proportion of his salary to that date, £32 17s 8d.

We have a report of two inquests held by Mr Germaine on the 11th August and 28th December, respectively, with medical fees, mileage, &c., amounting to £2 4s, which we recommend to be paid.

We desire to call the attention of the Grand Jury to the fact that Coroner Germaine has for a long time been living out of the country, and not attending to his duties. Under the Act of Parliament, as Coroner Germaine has failed to reside within his district, we consider he has forfeited all right and claim to his salary.

We have investigated the number of coroners' inquests held in the West Wicklow district during the past five years, by virtue of which his future salary should be fixed, and we find that they give an average of 9.6 per annum, which, at £2 2s for each inquest, would leave his future salary at £10 1s 8d for each half-year, assuming that he complies with the requirements of the Act of Parliament.

We have also investigated the number of inquests held in this county by Coroner Jones, under which the future Coroner's salary should be fixed, and we find that the average number of inquests have been 27 per annum for the past five years, which, at £2 2s per inquest, would make £28 7s for each half-year.

With reference to an application made by Dr Brady for fees of £2 2s, we find that the Grand Jury have already paid these to Coroner Byrne upon the production of receipts purporting to be signed by Dr Brady.

No. 79—Contract work, £110 for half-year to Summer Assizes, 1899, inclusive, we recommend to be passed.

No. 80—Printing of supplemental lists, claims, registers, &c., extra work under Local Government Act.

Your committee have gone carefully into these questions, but not being experts in printing, have had great difficulty in arriving at any definite conclusion; but from the samples of the forms which have come before us—for instance, 86 front pages of Parliamentary and County Council units, charged at £18; binding 60 copies of each unit into County Councils and Rural Districts, £20—with other items charged at similar rates—we have come to the conclusion that the charges made are too high; but, on the other hand, taking into consideration that the printing work had to be performed in a great hurry, and the printer had a great amount of trouble in arranging the names in alphabetical order for each elective district, we recommend that a sum of £450 be offered to him in full discharge, and that failing his acceptance of such offer, an expert in the printing trade be employed to examine into the various items of the account, and to report thereon to the incoming County Councils.
