#### SPECIFICATION

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

vears of

Road

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

The Contractor will observe that the County Surveyor will give no notice of inspection, but will expect to find the road in perfect and thorough repair at any time he or his

assistant may happen to visit it. The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory

The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant. All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and work-manlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this

Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor. In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry

into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

2-The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present working way; but in no case less than 18 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns and villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, foothpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

3-The sides to be formed of sods or clay, at least two feet wide, and kept to the height of 5 inches over the watertables. These sides are to be kept neatly, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, the width to be increased with stones, sods,

WEEDS, HEDGES, TREES, ETC.

4-The spaces between the margins of the working way and the boundaries to be kept clear of weeds, loose stones, brambles, and all rubbish whatsoever.

The Contractor shall also cause injurious or obstructive hedges and trees to be cut

or plashed.

5-Watertables, outlets, side, back, and catch drains to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones formed where necessary.

Gullets to be cleaned out and repaired when required. This drainage and the edging above described to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, beginning of April, and October, and at all other times as may be required.

6—The roadway and watertables shall be scraped and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

The surface of the working way is to have a rounding from the centre to the sides of one inch per yard. Where the road has not at present this form it is to be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface. The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities. All stones appearing over the surface of more than 2½ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes carefully filled with fine metalling.

Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be repaired with a sheet of metal. These

Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be repaired with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust. They are to be spread alternately at short intervals on each side of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 2 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may units with the old.

Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the archstones of bridges well metalled over,

In no case will drills or small patches be allowed. All loose and rolling stones to be picked off.

Nine-tenths of the quantity of stones as given below to be spread during the late Autumn and Winter, and the whole before 1st April in each year.

#### QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

7—The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within two miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

#### QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

8—There are to be supplied annually for the use of the road cubic yards of broken stone, or more if required, for its proper maintenance. This quantity to be laid down in in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, before 1st October in each year. The heaps to be outside the working way.

Notice in writing of the delivery of the material to be served on the assistant for

the district before 25th September in each year.

N.B.—When the contract is entered on at Spring Assizes sufficient material to be at once provided for the proper repair of the road, which quantity must be entirely independent of the regular annual supply.

#### WASTE STUFF.

9—All road scrapings, trimmings, etc., to be used for levelling the sides, repairing fences, etc., and the surplus carted off the road; but on no account are they to be left on the working way, or thrown on the sides.

#### COUNTY WORKS.

10-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass.

#### FOOTHPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

11—The foothpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained. Gravel paths to be repaired as follows:—

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled to be re-sodded, and the whole neatly trimmed to a fair line on inner and outer edges. Grass on sides to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair the outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over \(^3\_4\)-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 11 inch per yard towards the road. All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in

All gratings where broken, disturbed, sunk or removed, to be renewed and re-set with new grates of the original form.

RESOLVED—That the Court Keepers, Official Managers of Reformatories, and all others whose claims for payment have to be brought before the Grand Jury at Assizes, be requested to furnish their several accounts to the Secretary to the Grand Jury, on or before the 15th of February and the 15th of June, in each year, in order that they may be entered in the printed Schedule, and that no account or claim be submitted to the Grand Jury unless this direction has been complied with.

RESOLVED—That in future the Schedule do only contain the new works, and such matters as should, in due course, come before the Grand Jury at each Assizes, and that the "existing contracts" be omitted from the Schedule, but that all county works be printed in the Abstract, which should be made as complete as possible.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT.

26,637—'85—Grand Jury.

DALKEY, 17th July, 1885.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your board that I have audited the accounts of the Secretary of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following the last Spring Assizes, and to transmit the accompanying account duly declared and certified.

The presentment for £21 3s (No. 86 County at Large), to the Sub-Sheriff, for his "trouble and expenses in connexion with the Jurors Act," should not, I think, have exceeded £14 5s, there being £6 8s charged in relation to the "Grand Jury Panel." The Grand Jury would do well to consider the propriety and legality of allowing such items in future, as the Jurors Act has no relation to the summoning of Grand Juries.

I disallowed and struck out of the account a sum of £13 19s interest, charged by the National Bank as Treasurer of the County, on over-drafts. It was represented to me that these advances, or over-drafts, were necessitated by the payment of salaries to present and superannuation to late officers of the County; but it is expressly stated in the Schedule of Presentments that the items referred to were to be paid "now out of any surplus or balance to the credit of the County." If there were no surplus or balance the payments should not, strictly speaking, have been made; or, if made, the Cesspayers of the County ought not to be charged with interest on the advance.

One of the Barony Constables, Mr. Buckley, lodged on the day of the Assizes, 20th March, £266 8s. 11d,, his previous lodgement amounting to £98 16s 10d, was made on the 14th March. He failed to attend the audit (as did all the other collectors), and also to lodge his block receipts with the Secretary of the Grand Jury, although required to do so by the Order in Council; so that I was unable to ascertain from the information, which the blocks should supply, whether any portion of the above sum of £266 8s 11d was received by him previously to the 14th of March, in which case the amount should have been lodged on that date.

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1885.

Mr. Foreman, and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The number of applications for renewals of maintenance contracts and for special works at last Road Sessions was unusually large, amounting in all to 224. The number approved of was 187, which may be classified as follows:—

146 for renewals of maintenance contracts for roads.

- 5 ,, repairing roads.
- 8 ,, protecting fences.
- 11 ,, repairs of bridges.
- 2 ,, footpaths.
- 8 ,, building and repairing culverts and drains.
- 1 ,, new road.
- 2 , removing rocks from roads.
- 1 ,, cutting hills and filling hollows.
- 3 ,, permissive presentments.

Total, 187

The competition for maintenance contracts was, I regret to say, in many cases very reckless; consequently many Contractors have undertaken what they can only perform at considerable loss to themselves.

With regard to the application for a new road in Rathdown Barony (see page 8 of Schedule), it appears that the presentment is illegal, as, according to the 55th section of the Grand Jury Act, a new road cannot be presented under 16 feet wide in the clear.

The application for the repair of Knockeen bridge, at the bounds of this County and Carlow, Barony of Shillelagh (see page 8 of Schedule), is an important one.

A presentment for this work was approved at the Road Sessions for the Barony of Rathvilly, County of Carlow, for £300, half to be levied off the County Wicklow.

I have prepared a drawing of this bridge and approaches, from which it will be seen that on the Carlow side is a long walled approach. Besides repairs to the three arches over the river, extensive repairs are proposed to be done to this approach on the Carlow side, and it is important that it should be decided, if, under Section 57 of the Grand Jury Act, the County Wicklow is liable for half the cost of the repair of the Carlow approach.

The Justices and Cesspayers at Shillelagh were of opinion that Wicklow is liable only for a moiety of the cost of the repair of the bridge proper, or that portion over the river only.

No. 15, North Ballinacor, is another important application. It is for cutting hills and filling hollows on the road from Rathdrum to Greenan. The places proposed to be improved are steep and rocky. The work would, I think, be useful, if carried out in accordance with the sections I have prepared.

The object of application No. 13 Newcastle is to provide a shorter route to the new Railway Passenger Station, Wicklow; but to carry it out would require a much larger sum than was allowed at Sessions.

Since last Assizes it became necessary to take proceedings at Quarter Sessions against Timothy Darcy and his sureties for breach of contract on the Ballineddan road, Barony of Upper Talbotstown. In this case a decree was granted for the full amount of the bond, £19 17s. 4d., and costs.

It will be necessary now to cancel the following contracts, as new ones have been entered upon, owing to the contractors having been decreed for breach of contract:—

The Great Southern and Western Railway Company having constructed the new road at the Grange, Barony of Upper Talbotstown, in an unsatisfactory manner, I proposed certain alterations in the gradients, etc, to them. I have recently again inspected this road and found that its reconstruction was in progress.

Since last Assizes the exterior of Bray Court-house has been coloured, repaired, and painted, and the interior partially renovated.

At the County Court-house some useful repairs and improvements have been carried out, including the fitting up of a small lavatory for the use of the Grand Jury which I trust will meet with your approval.

The Court-house at Arklow will next require attention in the way of repairs, painting, etc.

I think it would be very desirable if you would be good enough to authorize me, should occasion require, to consult your solicitor on important matters, involving legal points, in the interest of your County. I have several times, in the intervals between Assizes, felt the great loss of having to do without legal advice on such matters.

The period for which you appointed an additional assistant expires now. Mr. Browne, having been offered a more lucrative appointment, received my permission to resign. I have appointed Mr. John Pansing in his place. Mr. Pansing has had eight years' experience in a similar capacity in the County Louth, and is, I believe, known to some members of your body. Since his appointment, three months ago, he has discharged his duties to my satisfaction. I have now to request you to sanction the further employment of an additional assistant on the following grounds:—

1st—The mileage of roads in this County is about 1,200 miles. I am of opinion that a greater amount of work than the supervision of

300 miles of roads cannot be efficiently discharged by one man at the small salary given. This opinion is borne out, if the whole of Ireland be taken into consideration, as, from a return of the number of assistants and the mileage of roads in Ireland, it appears that each assistant has on the average less than 300 miles of roads in charge.

2nd—Forty years ago it was considered necessary to employ three assistants in this County; but, since then, the mileage of the roads permanently under contract has nearly doubled, and is still continually increasing. Thus, formerly each assistant had but little over 200 miles in charge,

and if you now grant the fourth assistant each will have 300.

3rd—The contracts for a large proportion of the roads now specify a certain quantity of road metal to be supplied and spread each year. This is absolutely necessary to insure the proper maintenance of the roads. This measurement involves a large amount of entirely extra work, as formerly the materials were not systematically measured.

4th—The necessity for increased supervision is now more needed than ever, bearing in mind, as I have reported above, that so many of your

roads have been taken at improvident prices.

5th—Should you think fit to refuse this necessary assistance, I most respectfully beg to say that it will be out of my power to continue the improvement in the condition of your roads, which is now in fair progress, and it will be necessary for me to take the entire charge of a large district of the County into my own hands, and thus deprive the rest of that fair share of my general supervision to which it is justly entitled; besides which the absence of sufficient supervision may easily cost the County many times the salary of an assistant.

6th—I feel confident you will give the matter fair consideration, and beg to say, in conclusion, that my request is not a personal one, but solely in the interest of your County, as the granting of it will not relieve

me of any of my present duties.

We the undersigned Committee, appointed to consider the Report of the County Surveyor now submitted to the Grand Jury, and to examine as to the necessity for the proposed presentment of £60 for repairs of certain County Court-houses as mentioned in the Schedule, and also the amounts in same for existing contracts.

With regard to that part which speaks of the recklessness of the competition for maintenance contracts, we consider that so long as the contractor is efficient, and sureties solvent, there ought to be no difficulty

about the work being properly performed.

The application for the repair of Knockeen Bridge, having been refused by County Carlow Grand Jury, the matter calls for no remark from

us at present.

With reference to request of County Surveyor to be authorised, if necessary, to obtain legal advice from your solicitor during the interval between assizes, we consider that though it might be desirable for the officers of the Grand Jury to be able to get such assistance, we believe that the Grand Jury have no power to authorise the same.

With respect to the application, No 86 in Schedule for £60 for repairs of the County Court-houses, we have examined into the matter and

recommend that the presentment be passed.

It would appear that some inconvenience is still experienced in settling contractor's application for payment from the final certificates not being given until too late. We think that the County Surveyor should not grant such certificates later than 14 days before the assizes, but that he should carry out fully the arrangement made at last assizes on this head.

With regard to the appointment of an additional assistant to the County Surveyer, which is really the question before us, we feel that the time has come when a final decision should be arrived at. Being a question of great importance, we think it ought to be dealt with by the Grand Jury at large; it is, however, our opinion that three efficient assistants, who were in a position to give sufficient time to their business, would be able to compass the work without necessitating the County Surveyor having to take into his own hands the immediate supervision of any district.

We have checked the amounts charged for existing contracts.

# REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY APPOINTED TO CONSIDER THE AUDITOR'S REPORT, AND SUBSHERIFF'S AND CONSTABULARY ACCOUNTS.

We draw the attention of the Grand Jury to the remarks of the Auditor as to charges of Sub-sheriff, and it will be for the Grand Jury to consider if they should not inform the Sub-Sheriff that there will not in future be allowed any sum for expenses in connection with summoning Grand Juries.

With reference to disallowance of £13 19s of interest on overdraft, we recommend that no payment shall in future be made by the Treasurer,

which would occasion an overdraft, if same would cause expense to the

We observe that some of the Barony Constables have not complied with the orders in Council which directs them to attend the audit, and also to lodge their receipt blocks with the Secretary of Grand Jury, and we suggest that they be specially ordered to do so, and that Mr Buckley be reprimanded for the neglect of which the Auditor complains.

A county cheque for £21 3s has been brought to our notice in which an alteration as to the wording has been made after issue, and which we therefore consider should not have been paid by the County Treasurer, and we desire to bring this irregularity to the notice of the Grand Jury. This

cheque is appended to our report.

We would draw attention to the Sub-sheriff's account for printing and stationery, amount £21 3s, which we think excessive, and we would suggest that such work should in the future be competed for with the other county printing.

With reference to the Auditor's report of the 28th February, 1885, we are of opinion that the six receipts signed "John Bassiere" should be amended by omitting all charges for clerk's time, and including only the

amount justly chargeable for postage and stationery.

With regard to the Constabulary accounts, we find that the sum of £38 10s 10d is payable in respect of expenses connected with weights and measures, and that £50 will be a sufficient sum to estimate for the ensning year on that account.

The balance due under the head of "Expenses for the conveyance of prisoners" amounts to £14 4s 6d. We consider that the charge of £3 Os 6d for "Extra Constabulary" should not be made against the County of Wicklow, as our force is within 5 of its full quota, and should therefore, have been sufficient to perform all duties required.
