SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for years of perches of the Road and Footpath,
between
and

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, *and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.*

2—No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road to be in good order and repair at *any time* he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4—The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the *repair, constant maintenance in good order*, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6—In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods, and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove *before seed time* all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10—Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13—All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16—The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18—Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gulleys and the arch-stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19—The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING.

20—One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually cubic yards or more if required, a sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24—The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows:—

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be re-sodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch per yard towards the road.

25—All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair.

All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

COUNTY WORKS.

26—Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

Resolved—That in future, if any subject of complaint should exist, or if any charge is preferred against the County Surveyor, or other County Officer, such complaint or charge shall be made specially in writing on the first day of the Assizes, evidence of the facts shall be afforded in the con-

sideration of the same, and that Notice of the intention to prefer such complaint shall be previously given to the party complained of.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to report to your board that I have audited the account of the Secretary of the Grand Jury of the County Wicklow, following last Spring Assizes, and to transmit the accompanying account duly declared and certified.

The amount (£25 15s 6d) disallowed at previous audits, being interest charged by the Treasurer on overdrafts, has not been as yet brought to the credit of the account. This should be done without further delay, as a charge in the account for interest against the county, unless under exceptional circumstances which do not exist in this case, is illegal.

The special attention of the Grand Jury is called to the large amount (£799 1s 9d) of arrears of County Cess due by the baronies.

The Secretary states that he has drawn the attention of the Grand Jury to this question of arrears at three assizes, but without avail. No steps were taken in the matter.

It would be very desirable that the Grand Jury should appoint a committee of their body to scrutinize the lists of arrears, and to give the necessary directions respecting them.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to state that I have made the following analyses during the first half of the present year:—

A specimen of water was analysed for the guardians of Rathdown Union. It was one of the most highly polluted which has ever come under my observation, and resembled sewage more than it did potable water.

Three specimens of whiskey were from time to time analysed for the guardians of Baltinglass Union; they were very weak and not of first-class quality, but they were not adulterated.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated within the County of Wicklow, three samples of milk were analysed, and proved to be poor in quality.

I regret that there is such a falling off in the amount of work now reported upon, but I trust that during the present half-year my services will be more fully availed of.

COUNTY OF WICKLOW.
COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

TO THE
GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,
Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1886.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The Schedule of Applications for new presentments now before you is, perhaps, the shortest ever laid before a Grand Jury of this county; the total number of applications for road renewals and special works being but 67.

The number of applications for special works is about the average; but for road renewals it is small owing to the fact that nearly all your roads are now under contract for five years, so that the contracts for very few will expire before Spring Assizes, 1888.

The number of road contracts is now 463, and they are in the hands of 320 contractors.

I do not deem it necessary to call your special attention to any of these applications.

There is one important application which, however, has now merely to be certified (see page 9 of Schedule). It is for the reconstruction of Ballymaghroe bridge, barony of South Ballinacor. This is the last but one of the timber road bridges remaining in this county. The other being in the same barony on the townland of Tomanierin, on the Coolbawn road, and will have to be dealt with before long.

I have to bring under your notice the condition of Aughrim bridge, examined by me on 17th inst. This bridge consists of three 20-foot span arches and small arch for mill-race. The whole of the pavement has been carried away by floods from the centre arch, and portions from each side arch. The piers are also undermined in places. I consider it would be dangerous to leave the bridge in this state for the winter, and am therefore of opinion that you should now present the sum necessary for its repair—namely, £50, under the provisions of the 38th section of the Grand Jury Act. A moiety of this sum can be placed on the County at Large, as the bridge is on a mail car road.

It would be well, I think, if some definite understanding were come to concerning Wicklow stone-bridge. An application for a new bridge on the site of the present timber foot-bridge, and for removing the present stone-bridge, was put forward at the last road sessions for Newcastle barony, but was not discussed on its merits owing to some informality in the notices.

The case appears to stand thus: Some 27 years ago a project was considered for a new bridge on the site, I believe, of the present timber foot-bridge; but this project was abandoned in favour of one for widening the old bridge, which was carried out in the year 1862 at a cost of £1,000. Thus when the old bridge was widened it was, I presume, considered in a tolerably sound condition and worth preserving, otherwise a new bridge would have been built.

Within the last two years a considerable sum has been expended on the repairs and strengthening of this bridge, and were it not for the increased scour of the ebb and flow caused by deepening the river channel below bridge, in connection with the new harbour works, I am decidedly of opinion that nothing further would have been required to be done to the bridge for a number of years.

This work is still good, with the exception of some damage to one of the cut-waters; but I fear cannot stand for long unless the bed of the river under the arches and for some distance above and below bridge be protected from further scour.

I have prepared a plan and estimate for this work which I will lay before you—but to carry it out will be difficult and expensive; besides which, being in connection with such a very old structure, no guarantee can be given that it will permanently secure the bridge.

Bearing in mind the above facts, I think the Grand Jury should carefully consider whether any further expenditure on the bridge in this direction should not be borne by the Harbour Board rather than by the County.

It would be desirable for the Grand Jury to reconsider the most convenient dates on which to hold the Winter Road Sessions. Last winter they were changed from December (the month in which they had hitherto been held) to January, a change which resulted in considerable inconvenience. I have prepared a separate report on this question which I can submit to your committee, which will probably be appointed to consider this report.

In accordance with a resolution of the last Grand Jury, the lighting and ventilation of the landing outside your room have been improved, and the recommendations of the committee of the last Grand Jury as to alterations of jury box and passage to same in Crown Court, and the providing of a jurors' waiting room have been carried out.

Small contracts have been entered into for some necessary repairs, painting, &c., at Arklow and Baltinglass Court-houses.

At Tinahely Court-house it would be desirable to erect an iron railing on front boundary wall. The cost would be about £16, which can, if sanctioned by you, be paid for out of funds in hand for repairs of Court-houses.

Since last Assizes proceedings were commenced against two of your contractors and their sureties in Upper Talbotstown for allowing their roads to get into bad order; but as the defects were to a large extent remedied before the hearing of the cases, the proceedings were withdrawn on the defaulters paying costs.

Mr Allen, assistant surveyor for Upper and Lower Talbotstown, having resigned his situation, I have appointed in his place Mr Francis Irwin. Mr Irwin has been highly recommended to me, and has had five years' experience in a similar situation in the County Londonderry, which he only resigned at the recent assizes in that county, in order to accept the vacancy here.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

On the County Surveyor's Report.—Summer Assizes, 1886.

Certain points in this report have already been dealt with by the Grand Jury, there remain the following for the consideration of the committee:—

1. **AUGHHRIM BRIDGE.**—The bridge appears to be in a dangerous state in view of the approaching winter. After careful consideration and consultation with the County Surveyor, as an exceptional urgent case, in order to avoid risk, the Committee recommend the Grand Jury to present the sum of £50 for the present repair of the bridge. But for the risk involved, the proper course would have been to bring the work before Presenting Sessions; and the Committee wish to impress upon the County Surveyor that this course should be invariably pursued, unless under exceptional and pressing circumstances.—*Approved.*

2. **WICKLOW BRIDGE.**—This is a case of very great importance both with regard to expenditure and utility, and, as it appears to the committee, many different interests are involved, they consider that the question should be allowed to further develop itself, before the Grand Jury take any steps in the matter. The Committee are of opinion that the damage already done to the bridge, which is of a serious nature, has been entirely due to the action of the Harbour Commissioners, and they therefore think that the Grand Jury should hold the Commissioners responsible for the consequences resulting therefrom.—£20 granted to County Surveyor.

3. **RAILING IN FRONT OF TINAHELY COURT-HOUSE.**—There does not appear to be any pressing necessity for this, as hitherto the Court-house has done without it; if, however, there is now need for such change, it should be brought before Presenting Sessions.—*Approved.*

4. **PROCEEDING AGAINST DEFAULTING CONTRACTORS IN UPPER TALBOTSTOWN.**—The course pursued by the County Surveyor the committee consider has been satisfactory.—*Approved.*

5. **THE APPOINTMENT OF MR. IRWIN.**—This appointment being in place of the regular assistant to the County Surveyor for Upper and Lower Talbotstown, calls for no remark.—*Approved.*

6. **ALTERATIONS IN THE COUNTY COURT-HOUSE.**—The Committee have inspected the alterations made in lighting, ventilation, and accommodation for jurors, and consider them quite satisfactory.—*Approved.*

7. **THE DATES FOR WINTER ROAD SESSIONS.**—The Committee recommend that the Special Sessions previous to Spring Assizes should commence as formerly—the first week in December—on such a day that the Adjourned Sessions shall not overlap Quarter Sessions—due intervals between the days of sessions being observed.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE

ON

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL AND REFORMATORY ACCOUNTS.

We, the Committee appointed at Spring Assizes, 1886, to enter into agreements with the Manager of Industrial Schools, and with the Directors and Manager of Reformatories, and to check the committals and report on the accounts, beg to report that we have checked the accounts, comprising the items Nos. 53 to 72, both inclusive, in the Schedule of Applications for Presentments on the County at Large, and same are correct and should be paid.

We have been unable to check the committals at the dates of committal, and periods of sentence do not appear in the returns from the schools, and we recommend that a list shall in future be kept by the Secretary to the Grand Jury of the committals to Reformatories and to Industrial Schools, giving the place and date of committal, name and age of child, name of school and date of expiration of each sentence; and that the list appended to this report shall be respectively sent to the magistrates at the petty sessions district-named in each list, with a request that they will furnish the particulars above named, and that in future returns of committals these particulars may be given.

And we recommend that the Managers of Reformatories and of Industrial Schools be requested to furnish the Grand Jury with the date at which each child committed from the County of Wicklow shall cease to be under the charge of such manager, and the reason for such child leaving.

All the Reformatories and Industrial Schools have agreed to accepting the sum of 2s per head per week, save Cork-street, but no formal agreements have been signed between your committee on behalf of the Grand Jury and the managers, and your committee recommend that a form of such shall be prepared for that purpose and printed.

Your committee regret to observe that no contribution seems to be made by the parents of any of the children committed from this county, nor does any attempt seem to have been made to compel such contribution, and suggest that the Secretary of the Grand Jury should be directed to call the attention of the magistrates to this circumstance, and also to the number of members of the same family who seem to have been committed from some of the petty sessions courts in this county.

EXISTING CONTRACTS.—We find that the amounts in the accounts of existing contracts, as initialed in the several baronies, are correct.

SUB-SHERIFF'S ACCOUNT.—With regard to the account of Mr. Davidson, late sub-sheriff, we find that he has charged seven items in con-

nection with summoning the Grand Jury, &c., which we consider he is not legally entitled to, amounting to £3 19s, the auditor already having refused to allow similar charges, and would therefore suggest that this sum be struck out of his account.

We also recommend that the sum of £6, that the auditor called attention to at last assizes, and which the committee then appointed to inquire into the sheriff's account recommended to be deducted from any sum due to the late sub-sheriff, should be deducted from his present account.
