SPECIFICATION

OF

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

MANAGER TO MANAGE OF THE STATE OF

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1—Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5—All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and work-manlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to

carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8.—The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE

9—All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may

be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be

at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

qualities.

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 24 inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the arch-

stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19.-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING. 20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December : two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22-The contractor is to supply annually cubic yards or more if required, a sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23-In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and

maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 13 inch per yard

towards the road.

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed.

COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first half-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

RESOLVED-That, on reading that portion of the Auditor's Report, calling upon the Grand Jury to enforce the Order in Council as well as the Resolution at Spring Assizes, 1879, requiring Barony Constables to lodge, with the Treasurer, all moneys collected at not longer intervals than one fortnight, or whenever such Collections shall amount to £100, this Grand Jury hereby direct the especial attention of the Barony Constables to the observance of such conditions, as well as to the necessity of furnishing the blocks of their books duly filled, in failure of which duty their re-appointment at ensuing Assizes is not likely to take place.

It is further ordered that a copy of the foregoing Resolution be sent

to each Barony Constable within the county.

Resolved—That the provisions of the Grand Jury Act, 6 & 7 Wm. IV., cap 116, be strictly adhered to in respect to the applications for payment to be made by contractors to and at the respective Presentment Sessions. All such applications, with the certificates of the County Surveyor, to be, as provided in said Act, laid before the respective Presentment Sessions for approval or rejection by those courts, subject to the power of the Grand Jury to disallow any presentment founded thereupon, where the road or work shall not have been properly maintained in the interval between the Sessions and the Assizes. And further the greatest care is desirable in examining tenders at Adjourned Sessions, so as to reject such as may appear tainted with fraud, and to regard with distrust and, where possible, refuse, future tenders made by parties who may have connived at unfair tendering.

On Presentment No. 76, in the Barony of Arklow, the opinion of Mr Justice Harrison having been asked as to whether it was legal, on the non-appearance of a surety named in a tender, to substitute another with the consent of the sessions and the other parties to the tender, the judge declared that this could be done; that the non-appearance did not vitiate the tender, and that a contract founded thereupon was perfectly legal.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

30,534—'88—Grand Jury.

GENTLEMEN,

DALKEY, 21st July, 1888.

I have the honour to report to your Board that I have audited the Accounts of the Grand Jury of the County of Wicklow, following last Summer Assizes, and to transmit the account duly declared and certified.

My attention was called to certain matters in connection with the printing of the Lists of Parliamentary Voters, whereby apparently the charge on the county has been very considerably and, it appeared to me, unduly increased.

A tender, dated 11th June, 1885, was received from Mr M'Phail for the printing and binding, &e, of those Lists at the rate of 9s. per printed sheet. This tender was duly accepted, and on the 23rd June a formal contract was entered into by Mr M'Phail and his sureties. The specimen printed sheet, as exhibited to me, on which the contract was based, and for which the sum of 9s. was to be paid, contained about 72 names.

The amount paid for this work at Summer, 1887, was £243 18s., being considerably more than double the amount in the preceding year, owing to the fact that, although the contract price (9s. per sheet) only was charged and the size of the sheet was unaltered, the space left between the names was so great that only about 34 names were printed on each sheet

Mr M'Phail stated to me that he was required by the late and also by the present Clerk of the Crown and Peace to make this change in the printing of the Lists, and that he dared not disobey their orders, and he contended that he was justified in charging 9s. for each sheet, irrespective of the number of names thereon, even though the number should not exceed half-a-dozen.

Moreover, Mr M'Phail charged at the rate of 10s. per sheet for the portion of the work which was done in July, 1885, and 9s. per sheet for the work subsequently done in that year, on the ground, as he alleged, that his contract for the work entered into in June, 1885, did not come into operation until after the month of July, when the great bulk of the work was done. He failed to furnish me with any authority for this reading of his contract. The advertisement inviting tenders could not be found.

The Grand Jury will, no doubt, take these matters into consideration previous to making the next payment to Mr M'Phail for printing the Parliamentary Voters' Lists.

I regret to have to complain that great inconvenience arises from the unsatisfactory manner in which the Grand Jury accounts of the County Wicklow are furnished, and from the non-attendance on more than one occasion of the Secretary at the audits. The Order in Council requires the Secretary to transmit to the Local Government Board the accounts, with the necessary vouchers, within one month from the termination of every Assizes.

This rule has been systematically disregarded by the Secretary for a considerable time past, and matters are getting worse in this respect. For instance, last Assizes were held in the last week of March, but the accounts were not forwarded to the Local Government Board until the 18th of June,

and consequently could not be legally audited sooner than the present week; and although, on the application of the Secretary, I changed the date as originally fixed by me for the audit from the 17th to the 20th Inst., he failed to attend as he had previously failed to attend the audit held last Summer.

I must say in conclusion that I cannot undertake in future to

I must say in conclusion that I cannot undertake in future to audit accounts in the absence of the accounting officer, from whom information and explanation on various points are so frequently required.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report, for your information, that I have performed the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1888:—

February 17th—A specimen of water was received on this date from Dr Henry P. Truell, J.P., Clonmannon, Ashford. It was an exceedingly hard water, and was impure and unfit for use.

March 3rd—Two specimens of milk were received from the Guardians of Baltinglass Union. They were poor in quality, but not sufficiently so to warrant me in certifying that they were adulterated.

On the 17th March another sample of poor milk was received from this Board.

On the 14th April a specimen of water was received from the Convent of Mercy, Rathdrum. It was found to be of tolerably good composition.

On the 27th April a specimen of water sent by Dr Truell was

received. It was an impure water.

May 21st—A sample of water was received on this date, and another on the 6th June, from Mr W. G. Strype, C.E., Wicklow, and were both from the Wicklow Water Supply. Their analyses gave satisfactory results.

A specimen of whiskey was sent on June 19th by Sergeant Moore,

R.I.C., Baltinglass. It was found to be pure.

For Naas Union, which is in part situated with the County of Wicklow, there was analysed a specimen of water and one of milk. The former was highly polluted with sewage; the latter was of poor quality.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW, Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1888.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

With but few exceptions the applications for presentments in the Schedule are for the ordinary renewals of maintenance contracts and the usual works of improvement and repair.

Arklow, No. 21. This road has not been repaired by the county for ten years. It accommodates a considerable district and it would be

desirable to have it presented for again.

Newcastle, No. 5. To renew the wooden foot bridge in Wicklow. At Newcastle Sessions it was proposed that half the cost to the county should be paid by Arklow barony. In considering this application you will please bear in mind that no presentment was passed at the road sessions for the barony of Arklow for this work; but a resolution in its favour was passed. No part of this bridge is situate in the barony of Arklow. According to section 56 of the Grand Jury Act, the authority for this presentment, the money must be raised off the county or off the barony in which the work is situate.

Newcastle, No. 7. This work, now to be tendered for, is to improve a narrow and dangerous place on the road between Newcastle village and railway station. It is a very desirable work.

Rathdown, No. 5. This wall is intended to protect the road from

Ballyreagh to Loughbray in two narrow and dangerous places.

At last Summer Assizes I referred to the great inconvenience of not having the Abstract following Spring Assizes issued until after the Summer Sessions have commenced. This causes great unnecessary trouble and liability of errors in dealing with contractors' applications for payment. On that occasion the Committee on my report considered "it very desirable that the Abstract should be issued as early as possible." The 142nd Section of the Grand Jury Act fixes the time within which it should be issued.

I notice that my report to the last Grand Jury on the proposed extension of the Dublin and Blessington Tramway to Poulaphuca has been omitted from the present Abstract. As a presentment was then passed for that tramway and printed in the Abstract it would appear desirable that this report, which describes the tramway and sets forth what the Company undertook to do in return for that presentment should also have been recorded in the same Abstract. At Summer Assizes, 1883, the Grand Jury resolved "that all county works be printed in the Abstract which should be made as complete as possible." If, however, there be no objection this report could be printed in the next Abstract.

Since last Assizes it became necessary to take proceedings against one of your contractors—viz., William Byrne, 54, Newcastle barony, and his sureties for neglect of this road. A decree was given in the case for amount of bond and costs, so that the existing contract should be cancelled.

I have been obliged to refuse certificates in several cases where unauthorized sod cutting on the roads was observed. This sod cutting is in direct violation of one of the provisions of the specification which directs the contractors to proceed summarily against offenders under the provisions

of 19 and 20 Vic., cap. 63, sect. 18, which deals specially with this offence. I feel sure the Grand Jury will support me in trying to stop this unlawful interference with the roads; but regret to learn that a case of the kind was recently dismissed at Petty Sessions.

The work at Wicklow bridge, ordered by the Grand Jury at Spring

Assizes, 1887, is now practically completed.

In accordance with the instructions of the last Grand Jury I have provided a suitable place beneath the Crown Court for the adjustment and storage of weights and measures.

I have also prepared a map as directed on which are shown the county roads and railways with the distances between numerous places in

the county and the coroners' residences.

I beg to submit a separate report on the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway now approaching completion,

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW, Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1888.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

In compliance with the 35th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, I beg to submit the following report upon this undertaking as far as this county is concerned, my inspection for this purpose having been made on 14th inst.

The rails and sleepers of the tramway are now laid throughout and their fastenings completed from the county bounds at Brittas to its present termination in Blessington street, at which point the proposed extension to Poulaphuca will

commence

At the entrance to Blessington the rails are laid upon a raised siding and for the terminal 16 chains through the street are laid flush with the road surface. This raised siding at the entrance to the town curtails the width of the carriage way to 18 feet which is now about the narrowest part between Britas and Blessington. To obviate this and to enable the tramway to be laid flush at this place I suggested to the Company the cutting of a hill and filling the adjoining hollow which would have improved the gradients of the tramway considerably and given a good entrance to the town. A permanent siding laid across the road at same place into a gravel pit and which is now inconvenient would also have been improved by the cutting and filling proposed. This suggestion was not adopted although the expense incurred compared with the advantages gained would have been trifling.

The laying down of another siding from the tramway into ground taken for a depot in Blessington is in progress, as also the ballasting of the line which

is not yet complete.

About 14 miles of the tramway siding are curbed at the Blessington end and a short piece at the county Dublin bounds. Most of this curbing is of a very inferior description, of insufficient dimensions and badly laid. It is not sunk nearly enough into the road so that it can be readily displaced.

Unless numerous cross drains are laid under the tramway to carry the surface water from the water table of the road to the side ditches the water, which now lodges along the tramway in considerable quantity after rain, will injuriously affect both road and tramway. Up to the present only ten such drains have been laid. They consist of old gas pipes 6 inches diameter. These pipes are suitable for the purpose; but as only one 9 feet length has been laid for each drain the rest of the length consists of simply a hole through the ground and fence. The mouth next road has been packed round with sods. These pipes should be lengthened to the outside of the road fence and the curbing at their upper ends should be cut to fit round them.

Seven or eight of the level crossings to lands and buildings referred to in my last report have been improved but about ten still remain to be lowered. Timber guard rails have been placed at six only of these crossings leaving still

about twenty to be done.

At Hempstown there is what I consider a dangerous place where a sudden fall from the road occurs at the junction of a lane on opposite side to tramway.

It could easily be improved and made safe.

When the rails were being laid I considered that the allowance for expansion was insufficient. At my recent inspection this was confirmed as many of the rails were in close contact owing to the increased temperature. This should be attended to as accidents have occurred from the buckling of rails during warm weather.

I have to inform you that the breaches by the Company of their Order in Council referred to in my last report have not yet been made good and that the state of the road and works as far as the county requirements are concerned remains practically the same as reported at last Assizes.

I will here briefly recapitulate the violations of the most important

provisions.

Ten stone depots were laid out in November, 1887. Since then only one has been partly built—a direct breach of the 30th clause of the Order in Council.

The wanton destruction of the side of the road opposite the tramway for a length of 3 miles in October, 1887, not since restored—a direct breach of clauses 14 and 15.

The level crossings not constructed to the satisfaction of the County

Surveyor-a breach of the 19th clause.

The line in places not laid as the County Surveyor directed—a breach of

ie 11th clause

I requested the last Grand Jury to authorize me, should occasion require, to seek the aid of your solicitor. The Grand Jury did not authorize me to do so; but appointed a standing Committee to whom I might refer in case I required legal assistance. On June 9th I informed this Committee of the state of affairs. On June 18th I received notice from the Solicitors of the Company that they "had called upon the Board of Works to appoint a referee with a view of deciding the questions in dispute between the Company and myself."

The Committee having been informed of this notice declined to authorize

proceedings being taken.

I have since heard nothing of the appointment of this referee and can find no such powers vested in the Board of Works in the Company's Order of 1887. Some such power is given in the 35th clause of the Order in Council of 1880; but the construction of the line under that Order was abandoned by an Order in Council of 1887.

If a referee were appointed I do not know what matters could well be referred to him as I do not think his powers could extend to setting aside the provisions of an Order in Council and further I have had no disputes whatever with the Company as everything I have called on them to do they either are expressly bound to do by their Order in Council or have themselves undertaken to perform when they obtained their guarantee in 1884.

At the hearing of an application to the Court of Queen's Bench on behalf of the County Dublin Grand Jury for a "mandamus" to compel the Company forthwith to carry out the provisions of the Order in Council, Mr Justice O'Brien is reported to have asked "how it was that an application was not made

County Surveyor's Report-continued.

long before, as the Company were violating the provisions of the Order in Council."

At the invitation of General Hutchinson, R.E., Inspecting Officer of the Board of Trade, I accompanied him on his inspection of the line on 5th inst. I then pointed out all the above matters to him; but understand they do not properly come within the jurisdiction of the Board of Trade, as the Grand Jury have full powers with regard to county requirements. General Hutchinson finding the line in an unfinished state will again inspect it before the opening for public traffic.

Having now discharged my duty to the best of my judgment I respectfully leave the matter in your hands, pointing out that everything left undone now must eventually be done at the expense of the ratepayers.

Four engines, same as described in my last report, seven passenger cars and ten open goods wagons have been delivered on the line. The cars have end platforms and are supported on two four-wheeled bogies. They are fitted with movable tops with canopies for outside passengers during summer. Length of car 30 feet, width 6ft. 10 inches and height to top of canopy 14ft. Sins. They weigh about 6½ tons. Five of these cars are composite to seat twelve 1st class and eighteen 3rd class passengers inside and 38 outside. The other two cars are all 3rd class of same dimensions to seat sixty-eight passengers. These cars are very comfortable, the inside seats and backs being cushioned and the outside to which access is gained by stairs from each platform being fitted with slatted reversible seats. The only fault seems to be that the inside ventilation is not sufficiently provided for,

The goods wagons are 9ft. Sins, long, 6 feet wide and two feet deep inside

measurements and weigh about 13 tons.

The travelling on the line is very smooth and free from annoyance from smoke or steam.

The trains are completely under control by means of the powerful brakes employed and can be stopped within a very short distance. The return journey from Blessington to Terenure on 5th inst. was accomplished in 1 hour and 26 minutes including stops, or at an average speed of nearly 11 miles an hour.

The tramway will in my opinion prove the greatest possible advantage to

the district served.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY. POULAPHUCA EXTENSION LINES.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW,
Assembled at Spring Assizes, 1888.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

As required by the 5th section of the Tramways (Ireland) Act, 1860, I beg to submit the following report upon the above projects, as set forth in the plans and other documents lodged for inspection. It is proposed to make and maintain the following lines for steam traffic:—

Tramway No. 1.—This is merely a siding in connection with the authorized line from Dublin to Blessington, to be made off the Dublin United Tramways Company's line at Terenure, county Dublin, with which you have no concern.

Tramway No. 2.—This tramway lies wholly in the county Kildare; but owing to its position and other circumstances you have some concern with it.

At Hempstown, between Brittas and Blessington, the boundary between this county and Kildare is the centre line of the road for a distance of about 5 furlongs, Kildare lying on the west and Wicklow on the east side.

The Tramway Company at first intended to place their present authorized line on the east side of the road, and therefore wholly in Wicklow; but in accordance with the 11th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, I directed that the tramway should be laid on the west side of the road, as far as the road lies wholly in this county, which has been done; but the Company, having no presentment from Kildare, and not wishing to have two crossings from one side of the road to the other within such a short distance, have applied in Kildare for the necessary presentment to make this length of 5 furlongs in that county. In fact this alteration simply amounts to an abandoment of 5 furlongs of line in this county on the east side of the road and the substitution of the same length for it in the county Kildare on the west side of the road. Its cost was included in the estimate for the present authorized tramway.

The progress of the work, I may remark, has not been delayed on account of this change, as in point of fact the rails and sleepers are already laid on that part of the road in Kildare which constitutes Tramway No. 2.

Tramway No. 3 consists of an extension of the present authorized tramway from its termination in the street of Blessington along the public road to Poulaphuca bridge.

The total length of this tramway is 4 miles 4 furlongs and 4 chains, of which 3 miles and 8 chains lie in this county and 1 mile 3 furlongs and 6 chains in the county Kildare. This tramway was included in that for which the Grand Jury passed a presentment at Summer Assizes, 1884; but the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, sanctions the line as far as Blessington only.

Very little information, except that the gauge is to be 5 feet 3 inches, is given in the deposited documents as to the details of construction but I have been able to obtain the following particulars at the inquiry, which I attended, held at Blessington on the 21st February last, on behalf of the Board of Works, on the merits of the undertaking from an engineering point of view.

It is proposed to lay the tramway, or rather road railway, generally upon a siding on the east side of the road or that opposite the footpath, such siding to be formed, ballasted and curbed with stone somewhat like a footpath and about 11 feet wide, having a channel or watertable at the side, with suitable outlets for carrying off the surface water from the carriage way across the tramway to the side chains. Upon this siding the permanent way will be laid having rails, sleepers and fastenings similar to those on an ordinary railway, but of less dimensions, weight and cost.

The rails are to be of steel of the Vignoles' or flat-footed type, weighing 50lbs per lineal yard. The joints to be fished with flanged fish plates. The rails to be secured to cross sleepers in the usual manner with fang bolts and dog spikes. The joint sleepers are to be spaced 2 feet 3 inches apart, centre to centre, and the intermediate sleepers 2 feet 9½ inches apart, centre to centre. Where the tramway passes through towns and villages, and at road junctions, entrances to farms, &c., it is proposed to lay the ordinary rail flush with the road surface.

At the Board of Works inquiry the representatives of the promoters proposed not to curb the tramway throughout; but on an expression of opinion from me that such curbing was essential, in which opinion the County Surveyor of Kildare concurred, they undertook to curb it throughout.

The above method of constructing this road railway is in accordance with approved modern practice; but I think that where the rails are laid flush with the road surface, a guard rail of heavy section should be placed beside the ordinary rail and the space between the rails and for 18 inches on each side of them should be paved on a bed of concrete, for which purpose, in order to obtain sufficient depth for the paving over the sleepers, the rails should rest on chairs.

In this county the tramway will be entirely within the road fences. I have taken measurements of the road between Blessington and the county bounds at Russborough and find that the average width of the carriage way is 21 feet, and as the tramway will be laid upon the present waste strip or grass margin on the side of the road it will not unduly encroach upon it.

The traffic on this road, since the opening of the railway to Baltinglass and Tullow, has considerably decreased and the Company are bound by the 7th Section of the Tramways (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1881, to give a minimum width of 18 feet clear roadway.

In general the tramway will follow the present levels of the road, but in order to avoid short dips and rises, cuttings and fillings of small amount will be made.

The curves and gradients obtainable are generally good and capable of being easily worked over. The worst point, as marked on the deposited plans, is at 1½ miles beyond Blessington where a gradient of 1 in 30 upon a 5 chains curve occurs; but this gradient is only for a length of 16 chains.

The waste strip on which it is proposed to lay the tramway is at present used for the storage of road materials, so that it will be necessary for the Company to provide depots for broken stones and gravel in place of this storage room with convenient access across the tramway. Not less than three depots per mile will be required.

The line will be worked with the rolling stock of the authorized line to Blessington.

The promoters are wise, I think, in seeking powers to extend their line to Poulaphuca as without this extension the line to Blessington only would lose a considerable source of income, namely, that from summer excursion traffic to the Waterfall.

The engineer to the promoters estimates the cost at £16,000, or at the rate of say £3,550 per mile. I consider this very high and am of opinion that the cost of the line for way works and stations including an

increase in the rolling stock of the present line, which may become necessary on account of the increased mileage, should not exceed £2,900 per mile, considering it to be merely an extension of an existing line.

In considering any proposed guarantee for this extension it should be borne in mind that the portion of the barony of Lower Talbotstown consisting of the parishes of Blessington, Boystown, Burgage and Kilbride has already incurred the liability to pay £600 per annum in the extreme case of the line, now in course of construction to Blessington, paying only its working expenses. This sum on the valuation of these four parishes, namely £14,786, is equivalent to an annual rate of 9¾d in the pound.

Report of the Committee appointed by the Grand Jury to consider the County Surveyor's Report upon the County Works, &c.—his Report upon the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway, and upon Existing Contracts.

1.—THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT UPON THE COUNTY WORKS, &C.

(a) The Committe endorse the recommendation of the County Surveyor that his report on the proposed extension of the Dublin and Blessington Tramway, which ought to have been printed in the present Abstract, be printed in the next.

(b) The Committee consider that the action of the County Surveyor against contractors who do not take steps to secure their roads from damage

by sod cutting is to be approved.

2.—EXISTING CONTRACTS.

These have been examined, and the totals appear correct.

3.—County Surveyor's Report upon the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway.

The Committee have made a separate report upon this.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON CORONERS'—SUB-SHERIFF'S—FEVER HOSPITAL AND COUNTY INFIRMARY ACCOUNTS

Committee—Frank Brooke, Marcus Beresford, Gordon E. Tombe, and H. P. Truell.

CORONERS' ACCOUNT.

We beg to report that we have examined the accounts of Mr Newton and Mr Jones, and find them correct.

SUB-SHERIFF'S ACCOUNTS.

The above we find correct, with the exception of the sum of £3 10s., which has been charged for notices summoning special jury panels for cases sent from other counties for trial at Wicklow under the Criminal Law Procedure Act. This amount should, in our opinion, be paid by the Treasury. We therefore recommend that the sum of £3 10s, be disallowed, as on a former occasion this charge was paid by the Treasury.

WICKLOW FEVER HOSPITAL.

The Committee appointed at last Assizes to examine these accounts reported that in consequence of a "clerical error" they could not recommend the "presentment to be re-instated this Assizes, but would allow it to be brought up again at the next Presentment Sessions, and that if passed the presentment to be marked 'To be paid now."—See page 26, Abstract.

In consequence of this report we have examined the above accounts from April, 1885, to April, 1888. The "clerical error" was omitting to carry forward to the next account the sum of £112 8s. 8d. This amount has not been accounted for, and we find the balance now in hands—£48 17s. 5d.—to be correct; and we recommend that the presentment of £102 9s. 0d. be passed, and that the sum of £80 be paid now.

WICKLOW COUNTY INFIRMARY.

As the last application for the support of the Infirmary was, through a misunderstanding, cut down £100, we recommend that the presentment for £270 (which includes the ordinary presentment for £170 and the abovementioned £100) be now passed; and we further suggest that one-half of the above sum of £270 be now paid, so that the Institution can be carried on until next Assizes.

We have also had before us a communication from the Rev. Canon Dillon, relative to continuing the services of an assistant nurse, and we beg to report that owing to the present financial state of the Institution we connot recommend the retention of this nurse's services.

We find that the Wicklow County Infirmary has, for the past year, been most economically managed, and is in satisfactory working order at the present time.

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS AND REFORMATORIES

The Committe on Reformatories and Industrial Schools have checked

the accounts and committals.

Some of these accounts have been forwarded to the Secretary to the Grand Jury too late for entry on the printed Abstract, and we are of opinion that the attention of the Managers and also of the Inspector shall be called to this default.

The Petty Sessions Clerks at Bray, Ovoca and Arklow have not given any return of the persons committed to Reformatories and Industrial Schools, with their ages at time of committal, and the dates of committal and term of sentence; and we suggest that the Chief Secretary should be asked to direct that this information shall be sent to our Secretary immediately after each committal.

We also think that a return should be sent to our Secretary before each Assizes from the Inspector of Reformatories and Industrial Schools of the names of all children who have ceased to be inmates and the cause of

their discharge.

SOLICITOR'S CHARGES.

Our Solicitor's bill of costs has been taxed by the Clerk of the Peace, and amounts to £21 0s. 1d., which we recommend shall be paid.

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REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT ON DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

Committee-Robert Pratt Saunders, J. S. Tighe, and William Kemmis.

We, the Committee, having examined the above, and finding that it relates almost entirely to differences that have arisen between the Tramway Company and the County Surveyor as to the proper construction of their line, so far as concerns the safety and future maintenance of the county road, considered it necessary to confer with the authorized officers of the Tramway Company, as well as the County Surveyor, and having heard all the evidence obtainable on the subject, beg to make the following suggestions as to all the matters in dispute, and which we have reason to believe will be accepted by the Tramway Company, and which, if properly carried out, will be a fair arrangement between them and the county and all that is necessary to ensure the safety and future maintenance of the road.

I. KERBING .- Any portion of the kerbing already laid which may be ascertained to be insecure, to be re-set. The rest of the line within the county to be kerbed throughout, except in places where the top of the rails are flush with the adjoining road surface. Kerbing to be of sound stone, roughly hammered square on top surface and also on face and joints for a depth of not less than 6 inches. No stone to be of less dimensions than 18 inches long by 13 inches deep, the uniform width at the top being, at least, equal to that lately delivered but not yet set, and are all to be firmly bedded a depth of at least 5 inches beneath adjoining road surface.

II. LEVEL CROSSINGS .- The ten level crossings to lands and dwellings, as pointed out by the County Surveyor, to be improved by sinking the line where practicable, with due regard to its safety, and by levelling out the gradients thereto, so as to interfere as little as possible with the proper drainage or form of the road. The public road level crossing at 11 miles 61 furlongs to be improved in a similar manner so far as is practicable. In addition to the six crossings already done twenty more, as pointed out by the County Surveyor, to have timber guard rails fixed to sleepers in a similar manner.

III. DRAINAGE. - Cross drains to be made under the tramway in such places as shall be pointed out by the County Surveyor, such drains, whether pipes or open channels, to be constructed so as to ensure the water being carried without hindrance to the outside of the road fence. If of pipes, to have the kerbing at upper ends cut to fit closely round them. If open channels, the bottoms to be concreted 4 inches thick,

IV. DANGEROUS PLACE.—The side of the road opposite tramway at junction of lane with public road near Hempstown at 12 miles 61 furlongs, to be filled up and made safe to the satisfaction of the County Surveyor, who is to apply for a permissive presentment to enable same to be done.

V. STONE DEPOTS.—Nine stone depots to be constructed between the county bounds and Blessington in the positions already pointed out by the County Surveyor, or as near thereto as may be practicable, each of such to have an area equivalent to 60 feet by 11 feet, with a good and

sufficient fence round same, at least 5 feet over the level of floor, this fence to be made to the satisfaction of the County Surveyor. Any such depot constructed on tramway side of the road to have a convenient level crossing made to same.

VI. SIDE OF ROAD TO BE RENEWED.—The east side of the road for the length and width from which the grass margin has been removed to be neatly formed and covered with a coat of the usual road metal, so as to bring the surface to the proper level, as pointed out by the County Surveyor.

VII. MOVING THE LINE.—The line from the Points to its present termination in Blessington street to be moved towards the footpath, so that a greater space than 4 feet shall not intervene between the western rail and the kerb of footpath.

The whole of the above works and alterations to be thoroughly completed on or before the 15th September, 1888.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON HIGH CONSTABLES', BRAY TOWNSHIP AND COURT-KEEPERS' ACCOUNTS, AND EXPENSES OF PARLIAMENTARY REGISTRATION.

Committee-Fletcher Moore, Walter R. Bulwer, and Captain Pennefather.

BARONY CONSTABLES.

The schedules of arrears, as presented to us by the Barony Constables, were not in proper order. Some of them not dated nor sworn to; some of them incorrectly totted.

The Committee consequently could not examine them in a satisfactory manner, and recommend that they should be carefully checked and each sheet properly headed, dated and sworn to by the respective Barony Constables, and then laid before a Committee to be appointed at the next Assizes.

We have received the accompanying schedule, duly vouched by your Secretary, and we recommend such arrears to be struck off their respective Baronies.

BRAY TOWNSHIP ARREAR OF RATES.

Your Committee find that the Bray Township has raised a legal question, and as it may possibly hereafter require an authoritative legal decision we think it unadvisable at present to make any report thereon.

EXPENSES OF PARLIAMENTARY REGISTRATION.

There are 206 complete Registers of Voters to be prepared and posted for 17 polling districts in the County of Wicklow.

The same number of Supplemental Lists in Form 11, the same number in Form 12, the same number of Notices to Claimants and of Notices to the Public, as to where the Registers are to be seen.

There are now 11,463 voters on the Register of this county, who are liable to revision and to objections. The number of alterations from these two causes together amount to about 25 per cent. of the whole number, say to 3,000. This procedure has to be separated in the case of Lists of Claimants, of which 206 copies have to be sent out. Each of these Lists consists of two or three pages.

206 Lists of Objections have afterwards to be prepared and posted within four days, between the 20th and 24th August.

All these Lists have then to be bound and prepared for revision

before the Revising Barrister, and Notices posted of the dates and places for the Revision Court sittings.

The Clerk of the Peace has to attend the seven Revision Courts, averaging, on the whole, nine days' sittings, exclusive of travelling time, and he has to pay his own expenses.

When the Register is finally revised four Separate Lists, viz :-

The existing Register, Supplemental List, Form 11, ,, ,, 12,

List of Claimants.

Have to be amalgamated in alphabetical order and sent to the printer. This complete list, when printed and signed by the Clerk of the Peace, becomes the Register of Voters for the ensuing year.

The present scale of remuneration is £10 for the first 400 names and 4d, for each name afterwards on the five Lists, of which total sum the Clerk of the Peace receives three-fourths and the Government one-fourth.

The old remuneration was about £90, the number of voters being then under 6,000. The number of voters has since doubled, but not the work in proportion.

We find that the sum required to cover the actual expenses of preparing the Register, posting Notices, and attending the Revision Courts, with travelling expenses, has been about 2½d. per name, counting the names on the existing Register, on the two Supplemental Lists, and on the Lists of Claimants and Objections; and we estimate the expenses thus—
