SPECIFICATION

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE

for years of perches of the Road and Footpath,

between

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons.

2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at any time he or his assistant may visit it.

3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when

required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to

carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY.

7—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8-The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept, edged with spade and line, and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods,

and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions' to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10-Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11-Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the channels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear.

12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—in February, April, and October, and at all other times as may

be required.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14-The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be

at all times free from mud and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and ine-

All stones appearing over the surface of more than 2; inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17-Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of

the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the arch-

stones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES. 19-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year.

QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21-The stones to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and to be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

cubic yards or more if required, a 22-The contractor is to supply annually sufficient quantity of broken stones, for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before 1st October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23-In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and

maintained as follows :-

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year-in February and October-and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over 3-inch diameter.

Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of 11 inch per yard

25-All flagged or paved paths and changels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, ore; moved, to be repaired, re-set or renewed. COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the firstOhalf-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27-All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall require the owners to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily against all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic, cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIAL.

28-Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

M I beg leave to report that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1889 :-

January 10th.—On this day I received three specimens of milk from Sergeant Hughes, Bray. It proved to be pure.

23rd January-A specimen of whiskey from Sergeant M. Fallon,

Rathdrum, was found to be pure. March 15th.—Two specimens of whiskey were received from Sergt.

John Prendergast, Shillelagh. One of them was pure; the other was adulterated.

8th April-A specimen of water received from Dr H. P. Truell, J.P., Ashford, was found to be of remarkably good quality.

8th April-Three specimens of milk were analysed for the guardians of Baltinglass Union; one of them was adulterated with 20 per cent, of water; one with 26 per cent; and the third with 29 per cent.

17th April-Sergeant Conroy, Roundwood, sent a sample of whiskey; no adulterant was found in it.

May 21st-A specimen of water of good quality was analysed for Messrs Comerford & Sons, Rathdrum.

May 29th-Two specimens of water were received from the Sanitary Authority, Arklow. Both were found to be highly polluted and unfit for use.

June 3rd-A specimen of water from Rathdown Union was unfavourably reported on.

15th June—Three specimens of water were received from the Town Commissioners, Wicklow, but the quantities sent were insufficient for a proper examination.

June 28th-Sergeant Browne, of Wicklow, sent a specimen of whiskey, and a sample of milk, and a specimen of buttermilk. The whiskey was pure; the new milk was adulterated with at least 8 per cent. of water, and the buttermilk was adulterated with 150 per cent. of water, exclusive of

20 per cent. which have been properly added for churning purposes. Total analyses made, 19; for last half-year 45 analyses were made. I am informed that the contractors who supplied the grossly adulterated milk to the Baltinglass Union were not prosecuted; but they were "severely cautioned." Catherine Hall, of Wicklow, was fined £2 on the 4th February, for selling adulterated milk to Sergeant Simon Browne, of Wicklow. I referred to the milk in my last report.

Thomas Thorpe, of Coolkenno, was fined £1 and 4s 4d costs for selling adulterated whiskey to Sergeant John Prendergast of Shillelagh.

The milk adulteration cases of Sergeant Browne are pending. The prosecutions have fallen off in number since last half year, in which they numbered 10; the fines amounting to £14 18s.

I trust the operations of the Sale of Food and Drugs Act in the county have lessened the amount of adulteration.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW,

Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1889.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The business at the recent baronial sessions consisted chiefly in considering the necessary presentments for the renewals of road maintenance contracts, as no special works of any magnitude were passed. Any information required about the works in the Schedule before you can be given as they are read over.

The competition among road contractors at the adjourned sessions was on the whole reasonable; but a few improvident contracts have been entered into.

Since last assizes two of your contractors and their sureties were proceeded against for breach of contract. The cases are those of John Neill, junr, and Laurence Brien, Nos 18 and 36 Lower Talbotstown, in which decrees were given.

I beg to call your attention to presentment no. 41, North Ballinacor, Abstract Spring, 1889, which is to be levied in three instalments, the last of which will not be levied until after next assizes. The contractor is bound to complete the works before 1st October next, and I have to request that you will be good enough to authorize your Secretary to advance payments to the extent of three-fourths of the contract sum on my certificates as the work proceeds out of any balance to the credit of the county without waiting for the levying of the instalments. This will obviate considerable hardship to the contractor.

I think it desirable to bring under your notice the present condition of Greystones Fishery Harbour. The new works are—

- 1—A pier 200 feet long, which, starting from the outer side of the county pier, runs in a north-north-west direction for 150 feet, and then in a west-north-west direction for 50 feet at an angle of 135 degrees with its former direction. This work is practically completed.
- 2—A boat slip reaching from the level of the county road opposite the post-office to below low water level at a point about 55 feet south-west from outer quoin to county pier. This work appears complete.
- 3—A small inner basin in course of excavation out of the rock on the site of the former approach of the county pier. The entrance to this basin will be at the inner angle of the county pier, the new approach to the new pier being brought round the eastern side of the basin.

The pier protects the harbour from gales varying from north-east to south-east. Before its construction any shingle that travelled from the north was caused to travel back again by gales from the south-east; but now the pier shelters the beach from these winds so that it has been raised by successive deposits of shingle and the accumulation over a large portion of the bed of the harbour is now enormous. The whole appearance of the place has changed. Within the harbour just west of the boat slip the high and low water lines are about 200 feet seaward of their former positions; this portion of the harbour being converted into permanent dry beach.

County Surveyor's Report-Continued.

The shingle has encroached to such an extent into the harbour that the lower end of the new boat slip is covered by it for a length of about 70 feet, there being a depth of about 8 feet of shingle over its lower end. On the occasion of a recent visit to the place I found that the high water line was 14 feet and the low water line 120 feet seaward from the present toe of the slip, thus leaving a bank of shingle between the toe of the slip and the sea, over which boats must be drawn. Within the last eight months an accumulation of 5ft 6in in depth has taken place at the inner quoin of the county pier. In fact this point is now dry at low water where vessels drawing 10 feet could formerly come alongside about two hours after low water.

The general opinion expressed in Greystones by those who have given the matter careful attention is that if the above state of things is to be remedied a north groin will be required extending from a point in the vicinity of the life-boat house in a north-easterly direction into deep water. Such a work would intercept the shingle travelling from the north.

The Treasury, in response to a memorial of the inhabitants of Greystones calling attention to the serious state of the harbour as above described, has sanctioned the expenditure of £600 upon the construction of some low timber groins to the north of the harbour. I am of opinion that these will be of but little use except in connection with a deep water groin as above mentioned. The Treasury makes no mention of any provision for the removal of the shingle already accumulated, which, within a distance of 450 feet, measured northwards along the beach from the county pier, probably amounts to upwards of 35,000 tons.

DUBLIN AND BLESSINGTON STEAM TRAMWAY.

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW, Assembled at Summer Assizes, 1889.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

I inspected the line on 15th instant, and found as follows :-

The Grand Jury requirements have now been complied with with the following exceptions:—

I. The badly-laid curbing between Blessington and Cross Chapel, so often referred to, remains in practically the same state as last reported.

II. Four of the cross drains laid in concrete are partly broken up from not being properly laid.

III. The walls round the stone depots have received but little

County Surveyor's Report-Continued.

attention. They should be well pointed in good mortar especially at the back.

IV. A little more side metalling is required.

The permanent way is in good order; but some fresh ballast is required and the sleepers require raising and packing up at several points.

The rolling stock now consists of six engines, five composite carriages (1st and 3rd class), four third class carriages, one first class carriage, four open wagons, four cattle wagons, two covered wagons and two break vans.

The engines have been fitted with governors and speed indicators in accordance with the Board of Trade requirements. The governors (which cannot be tampered with by the driver) are so arranged that when the speed exceeds 14 miles an hour steam is shut off and the breaks applied.

Three of the five composite carriages have been improved by having the outside as well as the inside divided into 1st and 3rd classes.

The 1st class carriage which seats 20 passengers inside and 26 outside is fitted with two sets of wheels, one set to suit the Dublin United Company's rails and the other the rails of the Blessington line, the former set being fixed under the carriage and the latter removable and placed under it only when it enters on the rails of the Blessington line; but I understand the trials made with it have been only partially successful and that a better arrangement is under consideration.

The break vans are fitted with both automatic vacuum brakes and hand brakes.

I have inspected the Company's depot at Templeoge where there is a carriage shed capable of holding all the carriages and vans, an engine shed, fitting shop, forge, coke shed, lamp room, store and office.

The site of the depot at Blessington has been enclosed and small engine and carriage sheds have been erected, the former is 32 feet long and 17 feet wide and the latter is 82 feet long and 15 feet wide. A small loading bank has also been provided.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE GRAND JURY ON THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S AND TRAMWAY REPORTS—EXISTING CONTRACTS—AND DISCHARGED AND UNDISCHARGED QUERIES.

Committee—Robert Pratt Saunders, David Mahony, Colonel Kemmis, and Edward Breslin.

We, the Committee appointed to inquire into the best arrangement for having the presentments recommended to be discharged or otherwise laid before the Grand Jury, and also to consider the reports of the County Surveyor relative to the ordinary works of the county and to the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway, and also to examine into the amounts required for carrying out the existing contracts, beg to report as follows:—

The following arrangement has been arrived at by mutual consent and agreement of the three officers concerned, who were all present together before the committee. The County Surveyor is to furnish the Secretary of the Grand Jury, two clear working days before the meeting of the Grand Jury for fiscal business at each assizes, with an abstract marked with such presentments, or parts thereof, as have been disallowed at sessions, and with such presentments, or part presentments, as he recommends to be disallowed or re-presented by the Grand Jury—viz., "U" for disallowed, and "Rep" for re-presented; and the Secretary of the Grand Jury is to furnish the Clerk of the Clerk of the Crown and Peace, together with the presentments for flating, a list of Discharged and Undischarged Queries.

The ordinary works of the county appear to be progressing in a

satisfactory manner.

Relative to presentment No 41, North Ballinacor, we recommend that payments be made by the Secretary, to the contractor, out of any funds in his hands, to the extent of three-fourths of the amount of the contract sum, on the certificate of the County Surveyor, in accordance with 128 sec of the Grand Jury Act, without waiting for the levying of the instalments.

The Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Company appear to have fairly carried out the requirements of the Grand Jury, but some small deficiencies and defects of work still exist, and we recommend that the County Surveyor be directed to call the attention of the Company to them.

The amounts required for the existing contracts are correct, and are

Upper Talbotstown-The High-constable did not appear before us; we recommend that his fees be disallowed; that he and all other high-constables be warned that they must appear with their books, &c, before the committee as well as the grand jury; otherwise their fees will be disallowed.

We understand that the High-constable was before the Grand Jury on the subject of the uncollected cess in Lower Talbotstown, the amount returned as uncollectable was £3 15s 7d.

We have checked the books and found the amounts correct.

CORONERS .- We have checked the coroners' accounts and compared the distances charged by the map prepared by the County Surveyor. We recommend that Mr Newton be paid £3 8d, and Mr Jones £12 3s.

COURTHOUSE-KEEPERS—The Courthouse-keepers' accounts are correct, with the exception of one item of the Courthouse keeper at Baltinglass, who has charged £1 for attendance to obtain payment of his coal account, but failed to attend, which we recommend to be disallowed.

The County Courthouse-keeper failed to produce two vouchers for

washing and sweeping chimneys.

With respect to the resolution of the last grand jury, as to the dismissal of the County Courthouse-keeper, the Secretary having reported in his favour as to his conduct since last assizes, and taking into consideration his 31 years' service, we recommend that he be granted another trial.

HARBOUR BOARD-We report on the accounts of the Harbour Board, as laid before them by Mr Barton, and find that the total amount borrowed was £40,000. The total amount of repayments paid to the Commissioners of Public Works amounts to £9,894 is 5d. Of this amount £8,895 0s 11d have been paid by the guaranteeing baronies, and £999 6s 1d by the Harbour Board. The total amount levied off the county is £9,706 13s 3d, £811 13s 4d of which was levied at Spring Assizes, which will not be paid till October. The levy at this assizes is £971 13s 4d, which will not become due till 1st April, 1890. The Harbour Board have been unable to make any payment to the Commissioners of Public Works since the 11th of February, when the sum of £160 was paid. This has been caused by the expense of providing a dredge and appliances for deepening the harbour in the places where it has silted up.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON INFIRMARY, WEIGHTS AND MEASURES, AND SUB-SHERIFF'S ACCOUNTS.

Committee-Fletcher Moore, Frank Brooke, Dr. Truell, and Gordon E. Tombe.

COUNTY INFIRMARY.—Your Committee beg to report that they have examined the accounts of the Wicklow Infirmary, and find as follows:

That there is an increase asked in the usual grant of about £40, which is rendered necessary by arrears having been allowed to accumulate in previous years and bills not being paid; whilst there is on the other hand

an increase in the number of patients relieved.

Your Committee, therefore, recommend that the County Grant for this half year-being the long half year-should be increased to the sum of two hundred and ten pounds, so as to clear off these arrears and unpaid bills, and they further recommend that in future the presentment should be kept down to the usual presentment of £170.

SURGEON'S SALARY.—This Committee do not recommend the increase asked for, as they consider the salary heretofore granted-namely, £70 per annum sufficient for the present

SUB-SHERIFF'S ACCOUNT. - Only one account, being for £20 7s 6d for printing, has been laid before us. This account was not put in within the usual prescribed time; but as this has been explained to have occurred through inadvertence, we recommend that it be paid, trusting that such delay will not occur again.

We recommend that the County Inspector be authorised to procure ten boxes made of well-seasoned timber, or red pine or vellow deal, dovetailed, according to specification, at a cost not exceeding one pound each, including pad locks for same; each box to hold four 56lb weights.

We have examined the several accounts and certify that the amounts in this application book are correct.

We have experienced some difficulty in checking some of the accounts owing to the absence of information as to the dates and places of committal and term of detention of each inmate charged for, and we suggest that a circular should be sent to each of the schools and reformatories asking

that this information, and also the ages of the children chargeable to this

county, should be given.

No. 56, St Kevin's Industrial School at Glencree, Andrew Mulvey, who was committed from Bray in December, 1888, does not appear in the account now furnished, nor is it stated that he has been discharged. In like manner, the name of Joseph Carroll (committed at Arklow, on 13th December, 1888, for four years) is omitted from the Artane Industrial School return, without explanation.

The return from St. Nicholas' Industrial School, Cove Street, Cork, has not been sent in in time, but inasmuch as the term of the only boy chargeable there expired on 26th March last, we recommend that it should

be put on the application sheet.

Nos. 76 and 77 are for schools not on our list, the committals are from Arklow and Ovoca petty sessions, and we recommend that the Clerk of Petty Sessions be written to again on the subject, and informed that we shall bring the matter before the authorities if he do not observe the directions given under circular of the year 1888.
