SPECIFICATION OF

COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

WORK TO BE DONE IN THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE for years of perches of Road and Footpath,

between

and

IMMEDIATE REPAIRS, GENERAL DIRECTIONS AND CONDITIONS.

1-Immediately after the ensuing Assizes the surface is to be cleaned, holes and ruts filled with good material, stagnant water drained off, dangerous holes and grips fenced, the road made safe and convenient for traffic within one month, and afterwards repaired as specified from time to time, or continuously, as may be necessary, and maintained constantly in good order during the contract, clean, hard, and even, at all seasons. 2-No notice of inspection will be given but the County Surveyor expects the road

to be in good order and repair at *any time* he or his assistant may visit it. 3—The Grand Jury shall have the power of cancelling the contract at any Assizes

should the County Surveyor report that the road has not been kept in a satisfactory manner.

4-The Contractor is to procure a copy of this Specification, and produce it when required by the County Surveyor or his assistant.

5-All the work herein specified is to be executed in a judicious, effective, and workmanlike manner in every particular necessary for the repair, constant maintenance in good order, and improvement of the road, according to the true intent and meaning of this Specification, and to the entire satisfaction of the County Surveyor.

6-In addition to the provisions of this Specification the Contractor is at once to carry into effect any instructions of the County Surveyor or his assistant.

WIDTH OF WORKING WAY. 7.—The width of the working way of the road shall be equal to the present width; but in no case less than 13 feet, except where walls, fences or grips interfere. The width to be extended or reduced as the County Surveyor may direct. In towns or villages the metalled surface is to extend to the paved channels, footpaths, fences or buildings, as the case may be, and over all open spaces.

MARGINS AND SIDES.

8-The margins to be formed of sods and clay, at least two feet wide and four inches high over the watertables. These margins to be neatly kept and edged with spade and line (a plough on no account to be used) and the working way defined by parallel lines, straight or regularly curved, according to the course of the road. Contractor to remove any waste margins that may be pointed out.

Where the sides are ravelled or broken, they are to be made up with stones, sods, and clay.

The sides are also to be kept clear of all bushes, brambles, weeds, rubbish, loose stones, turf, manure, &c.

The Contractor is to cut down and remove before seed time all weeds growing on the roadsides and fences.

DRAINAGE.

9-All water-tables, side cuts, pipe holes, outlets, side, back, and catch drains, water courses, &c., to be kept, at all times, clear of mud, grass, weeds, or other obstructions to the free discharge of the water, and new ones made where necessary.

FRENCH DRAINS.

10_Where springs or soft places occur in the road, French Drains shall be made to drain off the water to the nearest outfall.

GULLETS, ETC.

11—Gullets to be opened up, cleaned out and repaired when required, and the chan-nels through all bridges and gullets, and for such distances as may be necessary above and below the same, are to be cleared and kept clear. 12—This drainage and the edging above described in No. 8 to be thoroughly done three times a year—before 1st February, 1st April, and 1st October, and at all other

times as may be required.

WASTE STUFF.

13-All scrapings and other road stuff to be used for levelling hollows in the sides, filling grips, repairing fences, &c. Any surplus stuff not so required shall become the 4

property of the contractor, and be removed by him forthwith, as well as any accumulation of mud, &c., that may be on the roadsides at the commencement of the contract. Road stuff on no account to be thrown on the margins.

MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF SURFACE.

14—The roadway and water-tables shall be scraped, swept and cleaned, so as to be at all times free from mud, dust, grass and dirt, especially before spreading stones.

15—The surface of the working way is to have a rounding of one inch per yard of width; but on hills this rounding must be greater. Where the road has not at present this form it must be brought to it by the application of materials, and by picking up and re-forming the surface.

16-The surface is to be made even by picking and levelling ribs, ruts, and inequalities.

All rocks appearing over the surface and stones of more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in any dimension to be picked up and the holes at once carefully filled with fine metalling. All surface damages that may occur to be at once repaired by the Contractor.

APPLICATION OF MATERIALS.

17—Every hollow, worn or weak place, to be covered with a sheet of metal. These sheets to be applied so as to preserve and improve the shape of the road, and to strengthen the crust.

They are to be spread at short intervals alternately on each side of the centre line of the road, so as to induce the traffic to beat over the entire surface.

The sheets or patches are not to be less than 3 square yards in area, to be spread evenly, closely and thick enough to prevent the old surface being seen through the stones, and of the shape of the worn or hollow parts of the road. In no case will drills or small patches be allowed.

The patches to be kept raked in and blinded when necessary.

Before spreading the materials the old surface to be picked and loosened to the depth of half an inch (rather deeper at the edges), so that the new metalling may unite with the old.

18-Particular care must be taken to have the covering-flags of gullets and the archstones of bridges well covered with metal.

LOOSE AND OVER-SIZED STONES.

19-The surface shall at all times be kept free from loose stones which must be kept picked off by the contractor; also any stones larger than the specified size.

TIME FOR SPREADING.

20-One-third of the yearly supply of stones for the road to be spread before the 1st December; two-thirds before 1st February, and all before Spring Assizes in each year. QUALITY OF MATERIALS.

21—The stones, which are to be quarry stones if obtainable, are to be the hardest and toughest procurable within three miles of any part of the road, to be broken as nearly as possible to a cubical form, to pass through a two-inch ring in every direction, and be free from clay, sand, or other extraneous matter.

QUANTITY TO BE SUPPLIED AND MODE OF DELIVERY.

22—The contractor is to supply annually at least cubic yards a sufficient quantity of broken stones for the proper maintenance of the road. This quantity to be laid down in equal heaps, not less than 18 inches high, dressed for measurement, along the sides of the road, on carefully prepared level floors, before let October in each year of the contract. The heaps to be outside the working way.

No road metal to be deposited or broken on roadside until the whole of the metal previously measured has been spread, and until notice in writing has been served by the contractor on the assistant that such is the case.

EXTRA MATERIALS.

23—In addition to the annual quantity as above, such extra materials must be provided and spread as may be required to fulfil the conditions of the contract for constantly keeping the surface in good repair during the whole term of the contract.

FOOTPATHS, PAVED CHANNELS, GRATINGS, ETC.

24-The footpaths (if any) whether gravelled, paved, or flagged to be repaired and maintained as follows :--

If curbed with stone, all missing and defective curb-stones to be replaced with good stones, properly dressed and set. If edged with sods, any parts ravelled or broken to be resodded. Grass on both sides of path to be neatly edged three times a year, and to be cleared away wherever it may grow on path along walls. Clean out and repair all existing outlets and make any new ones required. Fill up any hollows with hard material and pick up all stones that project over the surface. Path to have two coats of gravel each year—in February and October—and at such other times as may be required. Gravel to be screened free from clay, dirt, and stones over ³/₄-inch diameter. Surface of path to be flush with top of curb and to have a fall of l_2 inch per yard towards the road.

25-All flagged or paved paths and channels to be repaired and kept in repair. All gratings where broken, disturbed, or removed, to be repaired, re-set or renewed COUNTY WORKS.

26-Bridge parapets, walls, fences, etc., made by presentment, to be repaired during the first helf-year, and afterwards kept in repair.

INJURIES, OBSTRUCTIONS, ENCROACHMENTS, TREES, HEDGES, ETC.

27—All works connected with the road to be preserved in good order, free from damage, encroachment or trespass. The contractor shall not allow the sides to be dug up or interfered with in any way. The contractor shall require the owners, by proper legal means, to prune and lop all injurious or obstructive hedges and trees, and shall proceed summarily sgainst all offenders in accordance with the provisions of the Acts relative to such offences, especially 14 & 15 Vic., cap 92, secs 9 & 10, and 19 & 20 Vic., cap 63, sec 18.

SURPLUS MATERIALS.

28—Any broken stones or gravel found at the termination of the contract along the road shall become the property of the county.

29—The Contractor will be liable to a deduction of 6s for each cubic yard of road metal found deficient from above quantity at the October measurement in each year. The Contractor will also be liable to a deduction from, or a total forfeiture of, as the case may require, the sum payable at any Assizes under the contract, should he fail to comply with the several provisions of this specification; such deductions will be represented to the credit of the Barony.

COUNTY ANALYST.

Conditions under which the County Analyst performs Analyses.

1.—All articles sent to him by the Grand Jury, Boards of Guardians, Towns Commissioners, County Infirmary, County Coroner, and Magistrates sitting at Petty Sessions, to be analysed without any fee.

2.—Persons residing within the county to pay 10s. 6d. for the analysis of any article which it is suspected to be adulterated, the fee to be paid to the County Treasurer.

3.—Persons residing within the county to be entitled to have analysis made at the following reduced scale—about one-fourth of the usual fees—payable to County Analyst:—Analysis of water, oil cakes, and artificial manures, 10s.; analysis of the viscera of sheep, cows, and horses, for the detection of poison, 30s.; dogs' do., £1; analysis of soils, limestones, and ores, from 10s. to £3, according to nature of investigation.

Quantities required for analysis: -8 oz. of bread, flour, butter, whiskey, wine, beer, porter; 4 oz. of buttermilk, confections, cocoa, pepper; 2 oz. of new milk, tea, coffee, pepper, mustard; $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon of water, in clean and, if possible, stopper bottles; $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of oil cakes and manures. In case of soil and ores analysis, quantities to be sent depend on nature of the investigation and may be ascertained on reference to the Analyst. The bodies of animals suspected to have been poisoned should not be sent; only their viscera.

AUDITOR'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY WICKLOW.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to forward herewith certified and declared Abstracts of the Accounts of the Secretary to the Grand Jury, County Wicklow, following Summer Assizes, 1891, and Spring Assizes, 1892, the audit of which I have this day completed.

The only matter in the account requiring special attention seems to be that of the arrears of county cess. The table at foot of the abstract shows over £900 returned due as arrears by different baronies. I am assured that this large sum is almost, if not entirely, irrecoverable. If so, the amount should not be counted, as at present, among the available assets of the county. The Acts require, and the bond conditions that each High Constable shall duly pay to the Treasurer all such public money as he shall be required to collect, on or before the first day of the following assizes; and the Grand Jury, upon being satisfied that certain sums, though lodged by the collector, have not and cannot be legally recovered by him, should represent them and so reimburse him.

I inspected the surety bonds of the high constables, which appeared to be duly executed, and have only to add that the accounts attest to the care and attention bestowed upon them by the Secretary.

PUBLIC ANALYST'S REPORT.

TO THE GRAND JURY OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

MR. FOREMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg leave to report for your information that I have made the following analyses during the half-year ended on the 30th June, 1892:-

January 2nd—On this date a specimen of whiskey was received from Sergeant H. Joyce, R.I.C., Dunlavin. It contained no adulterant, and was above the minimal strength permitted by law.

March 18th-A specimen of water was analysed for Rev. Mr Boyce, Carnew. It was found to be of tolerably good quality.

25th March—Two specimens of whiskey were analysed for Sergeant S. Moore, R.I.C., Baltinglass. Both proved to be pure.

April 8th—Two specimens of tea were analysed for the guardians of Baltinglass Union, and their composition determined; one was better than the other.

April 28th—A specimen of water was analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union. It proved to be of fairly good composition.

May 6th—Three specimens of water were analysed for the Guardians of Shillelagh Union; one was not quite up to the standard of the best waters; the others were good waters, and fit for all domestic purposes.

May 7th—A specimen of water was analysed for the Guardians of Rathdrum Union, and was very unfavourably reported upon.

A specimen of water from the Rectory, Ashford, was found to be polluted and unfit for use.

For Naas Union, which is partly situated in the County of Wicklow, a specimen of soap liniment was analysed. It was found to have been correctly prepared according to the formula given in the Pharmacopœia.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

The applications approved of at last May Baronial Sessions consist

4 permissive presentments.

1 repairs to Court-houses.

Total 66

The road renewals represent in the aggregate a length of $63\frac{1}{3}$ miles. In Arklow barony the average price of 7 miles of roads is reduced from 2s $3\frac{1}{2}$ d to 1s $6\frac{1}{4}$ d per perch per annum, representing a decrease of £87 8s 11d per annum on four contracts.

In North Ballinacor the price of $6\frac{3}{4}$ miles of road is reduced from 11d to $7\frac{1}{2}d$, representing a decrease of £31 15s 10d per annum on two contracts.

In South Ballinacor, the price of $5\frac{1}{5}$ miles of road is reduced from $9\frac{3}{4}$ d to $9\frac{1}{2}$ d, representing a decrease of £2 4s 2d per annum on two contracts.

In Newcastle the price of $3\frac{5}{8}$ miles of road is increased from 1s 6d to 1s $8\frac{3}{4}$ d, representing an increase of £13 7s 3d per annum on three contracts.

In Rathdown the price of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of road is increased from 6d to $7\frac{1}{2}$ d, representing an increase of £2 18s 2d per annum on one contract.

In Upper Talbotstown the price of 3 miles of road is increased from $3\frac{3}{4}d$ to $5\frac{1}{4}d$, representing an increase of £6 12s 2d per annum on two contracts.

In Lower Talbotstown the price of $36\frac{1}{8}$ miles of road is increased from $11\frac{3}{4}$ d to 1s 1d, representing an increase of £57 19s 3d per annum on fourteen contracts.

All the special works applied for on this occasion are either necessary or useful, and any required information can be given as they come in order before you.

Since last assizes it became necessary to take proceedings for breach of contract against Henry Jones, contractor for No. 41, Barony of Upper Talbotstown. A decree was granted.

The Guardians of Baltinglass Union have sunk a well in Weaver's Square, Baltinglass, and propose to erect a pump with posts round it without having first obtained the county authority for so doing as provided by

the authority for intering the sintrol of the Grand Auty over the cosine y

statute. They rely on the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, section 61, as their authority for ignoring the control of the Grand Jury over the county roads. I have not the slightest wish or inclination to obstruct such useful works in any way; but am strongly of opinion that your complete control over the county roads should be upheld and that before they are interfered with by the Sanitary Authority or any one else the necessary preliminaries, as laid down by statute, should be enforced.

Some other serious interferences with the roads have lately been made by private persons, the particulars of which I will lay before your Committee. I hope to settle them without legal assistance; but I think it essential that your Solicitor should aid your County Surveyor in such matters when all efforts to settle them amicably have failed.

Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury,

In compliance with the 35th clause of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Order, 1887, I inspected the line, sidings and other works of this undertaking situated in the county Wicklow on 13th inst. and the engines, rolling stock and plant on 14th inst. and found as follows—

In July last I reported "Proper attention is not paid to the cleaning, drainage and renewal of the ballast or the proper lifting and packing of the sleepers, all of which are essential to obtaining a good road and a fair average life from the permanent way materials." These remarks hold good still, as with the exception of some fresh ballast being spread there is but little improvement in the condition of the line. The line should be kept entirely free from weeds and grass, the sleepers should be kept covered with gravel for their whole lengths and a drain between ends of sleepers and adjoining fence should be sunk wherever possible and kept open.

The worst parts of the line are through the street of Blessington, where the rails are considerably over the adjoining road surface, the part between Tinode Post-office and the county bounds at Brittas which is covered with grass and weeds and badly needs fresh ballast, and several parts which have been raised but not fresh ballasted.

Some of the curbing is loose and misplaced and some of the drain pipes under the line are choked.

As the sleepers were not of the best quality signs of failure may soon be expected and should be carefully watched.

The thorough maintenance of the line is most essential, as renewals

when once commenced, unless done very gradually, will entail a serious outlay by the ratepayers. It would be far better to properly maintain the line than to show a small balance of revenue over expenditure.

The rolling stock is well looked after and several improvements are being effected in the engines which will reduce the cost of their maintenance.

The only change in the rolling stock is that the 1st class carriage which was intended to run on the Dublin United Tramways' system has been altered to suit the Blessington line alone and has been changed from 1st class to composite (1st and 3rd class).

The roof of the engine shed at Templeogue having been formed of corrugated iron, an unsuitable material for the purpose, is now destroyed by the action of smoke and steam from the engines. It should be re-roofed at once with suitable materials so as to afford proper shelter for the engines and men working at them.

The Coroners' Accounts are correct.

The Court-keepers' Accounts appear to be correct. No voucher has been produced for sweeping the chimneys in the Court-house, Wicklow.

We consider that in future each voucher should be produced.

The charge for stationery at the same court-house, though reduced from the previous assizes, we consider to be still excessive.

County Infirmary—We have examined the accounts as submitted to us by the Treasurer, Mr. E. N. Wynne, and find that they have been audited and certified as correct by Dr. Truell, and show a balance in hand of £16 11s 1d, on the 21st of April, 1892.

We find that the maintenance of the patients, including medicines, averages 1s 7²/₃d per diem, and the total cost brings up the expenses to 2s 11¹/₄d per diem, not including the doctor's salary; and including the doctor's salary, to 3s 3d per diem. No. of patients, 138; average number of days in hospital, 15¹/₂.
