The Sanitary Officer reports the Township in a healthy condition At the last Petty Sessions two parties were prosecuted for nuisances and fined ten shillings and costs each and an order made by the Magistrate for the abatement of the nuisance The penalty in those cases to be paid to your Treasurer, one of the parties against whom proceedings were taken is now carrying out the Magistrate's order and making drains to the houses complained of but there is no main sewer within 100 feet

of the houses for the drains to empty into, the sanitary authority are bound to make such drains 17 sec. or sewers and is badly wanted in Inishtown and the street reformed and a presentment should be applied for keeping it in repair. The escape of sewerage gas from the open grate of the sewer at the foot of quarantite Hill is very offensive and dangerous to the public health it would require to be trapped. The scavenger kept the streets and lanes in cleanly order during the last month. I served 6 notices and visited 60 houses and premises.






