Read Memorial from tenants of Town Parks which ran as follows.

The Memorial of the undersigned sheweth. That memorialists are tenant of your Town Parks paying at the rate of £4 per Irish acre for same. That memorialists respectfully submit that this high rent which was originally fixed many years ago when the circumstances of the County were quite different from what they are at present shewed now having regard to the revolution which has taken place be reduced by at least 25 per cent or to three pounds per acre. That taking into consideration also the fact that Lord Fitzwilliam the proprietor of the Soil adjoining and surrounding the Corporate Estate has made the very substantial abatement of 50% on the September half year and that as appears by the Public Press many other land lords throughout the Kingdom have also given reductions. Your memorialists respectfully submit that they are fairly entitled to an abatement of at least 25% on the ensuing half year's rent ending 25 March 1886

Your memorialists therefore earnestly hope that you will be pleased to accord a favourable consideration to this their Memorial and recommends to the Treasury the granting of its prayer & your memorialists will ever pray &c.

On the motion of Mr. McCabe seconded by Mr. Mc. Carroll. That the following resolution recently arrived at by the Corporation of the City of Dublin be likewise adopted by this Board and forwarded to the Rt Hon. W. E. Gladstone with a view of endorsing and giving effect to the resolution which ran as follows. That having regard to the recent declarations of Mr. Gladstone in reference to the national claims of Ireland we feel justified in hoping that the new term of power to which he has been called will not pass away until he shall have restored to the Irish people their ancient natural and indefeasible right of legislating for the local affairs of their own Country. That we believe the re-establishment of our Native Parliament would conduce to the peace contentment and prosperity of our Country that it would involve no danger to the integrity of the British Empire and that by removing a fertile cause of ill will and contention

it would remove no danger to the integrity of the British Empire for the first time in their history give a fair chance for the growth of friendly relations between the peoples of England and Ireland. That we deny and repudiate in the strongest possible manner the allegation that an Irish Parliament would be likely to deal unfairly or oppressively with those who as regards religious creed or political opinion form a minority of the Irish people. That we hope the ruling classes and the people of England will not suffer themselves to be misled by the highly coloured and enormously exaggerated accounts of Irish disorder which are being spread amongst them but will have the wisdom to turn to good account the present most favourable juncture for effecting a happy settlement of the long standing strife between the two nations

The usual monthly meeting of the Town Commissioners was held here to day. Present Messrs. Jos. Smith in the chair Tension Edwards, J.P. Kynaston Edwards, Thos. Delahunt, Mr. Doolittle, Garrett Byrne, P. Carr, Jas. Hamilton P. Badin, J. Mc. Carroll, W. Roche, C. Murray and Mr. J. Chapman Agent.

Mr. Chapman sought the Boards direction to take steps to recover arrears of rent on the County Hotel and suggested that a decree for possession should be levied at once against Mr. Sothern.

Mr. Delahunt proposed that a decree for immediate possession be carried into effect. Mr. Roche seconded the motion. but subsequently after prolonged discussion Mr. Delahunt withdrew his resolution and it was resolved nem. con. to endeavour to recover the arrears of rent before taking possession of the premises. The Medical Officer of Health reported the unsanitary state of a sewer at Bayview Terrace, and of being completely choked up, and recommended it to be continued to the road leading from Cross Roads to Mortons Lane so as to join the Main Sewer at Mr. Chapman's back gate. A discussion ensued and it was eventually decided to refer the matter to the managing committee on the motion of Mr. J. Edwards sec'd by Mr. Hamilton. The Medical Officer also drew attention to the unsanitary state of a yard and premises occupied by Edward Drury Strand St. and recommended a connection to be made with the main sewer in front of the house.

Resolved that usual notice be served on owner to abate nuisance complained of.

Read Sub. Sanitary Officer's monthly report which showed that there had been during the month some cases of scarletina in the Township but it had entirely disappeared, and those that had been visited by it had their places cleansed and disinfected. He had inspected 70 houses and served 10 notices. The scavenger had done his work fairly and placed a considerable amount of manure on the Marrough. The Public Lamps were well attended to during the month. The report suggested repairs to the pump opposite jail the roof of the Market Hall. The report was adopted as satisfactory but the matter of repairs was referred on the motion of Mr. Hamilton sec'd by Mr. Delahunt but the Board resolved on the motion of Mr. Murray sec'd by Mr. Hamilton to allow the Sub. Sanitary Officer to have repairs made to counteract influx of water at Mr. Corrigan's holding Grishtown to the amount of 18/-

Read report of the Waterworks Caretaker which showed that the reservoir got full on the 7th ult. he had the filtering beds cleaned out, but required 16 tons of sand for them. On the motion of Mr. Carr sec'd by Mr. Doolittle the report was adopted and necessary order made for same.

Read letter from Local Govt. Board extending their general order regarding Cholera to the 1st May 1886.

Read letter from Local Govt. Board which had been previously submitted to the Finance Committee requesting remittance for £9. 10. 0 being remuneration for auditing the accounts of the Township for year 1885.

Resolved that cheqne. be perfected and passed for payment

Read letters from Messrs. Coker & Byrne. M.P. acknowledging copies of resolutions passed by the Town Commissioners on the subject of Town Tenancies and expressing their willingness to lend their best support to the Bill introduced by the Irish party for the purpose of securing to tenants of houses benefits similar to those enjoyed by agriculturists under the Land Act. Letters marked read.

Read letter from Mr. Mulhall Sol. stating that he had been instructed by Chas Kavanagh to proceed against the Commissioners for £1. 18. 6 for work done at Bayview Road. Letter marked read.

Read letter from the Lord Lieutenant's Dublin Castle containing instructions to Local Authorities in Ireland relative to the existence of rabies in dogs. And impressing upon Local Authorities the imperative necessity of exercising the powers given by the Act promptly so as to stamp out the disease. Letter marked read

Read letter from the Lords of the Treasury returning the Memorial forwarded to them on behalf of the Town Park tenants and requesting further information thereon. Letter marked read

Read letter from the Local Govt. Board requesting to be informed whether anything had been done under the Artisans dwelling Improvement Act in the Wicklow Urban Sanitary district in the course of last year or whether anything has been done or was in contemplation under the housing of the Working Classes Act 1885. Int. Mr. Carroll gave notice of motion to have the matter considered at next monthly meeting with a view of taking steps under the Acts mentioned

Read letter from Mr. Mulhall Sol. recommending the Commissioners to take Councils opinion relative to the Eaton bequest as shined the bequest to the gardeners fails from uncertainty then it ought to be claimed by the people of Wicklow as part of the residuary estate. After some consideration the Board resolved to defer the consideration of any definite line of action until the case further developed itself. And on the motion of Mr. McCarroll the Clerk was directed to convey to Mr. Coker M.P. the thanks of the Board for his exertions in the matter

Read tender from Patk. Brown proposing to clean the streets for ensuing month according to directions for £4. On the motion of Mr. Carr. Secd by Mr. Delahant his services were accepted.

Mr. Hamilton in accordance with a previous notice of motion brought up for discussion the advisability of constructing a Sewer between the road of the Market H.Q. and the Sewer at Mrs Edwards gate half the cost having been allowed by the presentment Sessions. After some opposition it was resolved on the motion of Mr Murray, Secd by Mr McCarroll to lodge half the sum required (viz £14.12.6) with the County Treasurer within the period specified by the Secretary of the Grand Jury towards carrying out the project the Contractor agreeing to build a gullet 54 yds long & 2 ft square also to reset two grates on Quarantine Hill

The ordinary monthly meeting of members of the Board was held here this day. Present Messrs J. Smith chm. Tension Edwards R. Edwards Arthur Doolittle Dr. Hamilton Dr. M. Carroll Walter Roche Garrett Byrne P. Carr. J. Wynn and Dr Chapman Agent.

Read report of the Sub. Sanitary Officer who stated that he had inspected 60 houses and premises and served five notices for the removal of nuisance. He had noted six cases of Scarletina from which two had died making the number of deaths from all causes during the month twelve. He also reported the street lamps as being well attended to during the month. He also sought the Boards direction towards prosecuting persons who allowed cattle to trespass on the Marrough as on his appearing on behalf of the Commts at the last Court day Mr Burkitt objected to any person representing the Commts but a Solicitor. After consideration on the motion of Mr J. Edwards Secd by Mr Wynn the Town Clerk was authorised to appear on the Boards behalf. 45x46 Victoria Avenue and 46 Petty Lane

Read the report of the Waterworks Superintendent who reported an overflow during the previous month and the works as being in good order. He was getting the necessary supply of sand (90 tons) to the top of the Embankment at 2/- per ton.

Resolved that report be adopted as satisfactory

Submitted lease of plot of ground in New St. demising to Wm Robert for the term of 75 years at £1. 10. 0 per annum with the rights membersc. for completion and signature by the Board. Resolved that lease be signed sealed and delivered. Int. Chapman sought the Boards consideration with regard to the recovery of the arrears of rent due in respect of the County Hotel. As Int. Burkitt had informed him that the tenant did not live in the county and therefore could not be brought under the jurisdiction of the Quarter Sessions Court here and he Int. Burkitt if authorised would serve a writ out of the Superior Courts and would also be inclined to take Councils opinion. After some discussion the Board resolved on the motion of Int. J. Edwards Secd by Int. R. Edwards to instruct their solicitor to process the tenant to a Quarter Session held in the division of the County Dublin in which she resides. The Chairman drew the Boards attention to the fact that he had been waited on by some of the leading inhabitants of the Township regarding the discontinuance of train service to the old station and appealed to the Board to take steps to use their influence towards securing the re-establishment of train accommodation at the old terminus. After full consideration it was resolved nem. con. on the motion of Int. Mc. Carroll Secd by Int. J. Edwards that the railway Co. be called upon to give a train to the people of Wicklow to run to the old station and that the resolution be carefully worded by a Special Committee composed of the Chairman Int. Mc. Carroll Mr. H. Edwards and Mr. Carr. The chairman also requested permission for the members of the Wicklow Band to be allowed

to Loresopore the use of the upper room of the Town Hall for their practice. After consultation it was resolved to grant the use of the room up to 10 o'clock.

Read letter from the premier acknowledging receipt of the resolution in favour of Home legislation for Ireland which had been forwarded for his consideration.

Read letter from Int. Corbet acknowledging with thanks the receipt of the resolution appreciating his effort in connection with the Eaton bequest. On the motion of Mr. H. Edwards Secd by Int. Byrne it was resolved to refer the matter to the Special Committee in order that they might draft a resolution to be forwarded to the Chief Secretary with a view of putting pressure on the Lord Chancellor through his influence as Chief Secretary. Int. Cline made application to Surrender his yard on the murrongh as she had paid up the arrears of rent due thereon and had no further use for the premises. After consideration the Board decided on the motion of Int. Mc. Carroll Secd by Int. G. Byrne to take a Surrender provided there be no legal impediment. Int. Doolittle drew the Board's attention to the state of High St. which was a County road and required the attention of the County Surveyor. Resolved that the Secretary convey an intimation to the County Surveyor on the subject.

Read letter from Dr. Lombard recommending the Board to have a new map ~~made~~ of the Corporate property made (on roller) as the one in existence

was old and antiquated. no order. The Town Sergeant reported persons for removing stones from the Marquis without the sanction of the Board. After long discussion it was resolved to allow Mr. Hender to remove a few ton of stones which he had already collected.

Read letter from the Town Clerk of Drogheda enclosing printed petition in favor of a Home Port for Ireland which had been adopted by the Drogheda Corporation on the 26 Feb 1886. no order.

Pursuant to notice of motion Mr. McC. Carroll brought forward the question of housing the working classes in towns and the unequal state of the laws affecting house property. After speaking at length he moved that it is the opinion of the Board that the time has arrived for Parliament to confer upon legislative bodies and others holding property in fee the power to enable artizans to build at a moderate figure such houses as would meet the approval of men of advanced progressive opinion. He voted also move that in the future legislation in connection with house property in Towns it would be desirable to confer upon public bodies sufficient power to sell the fee simple of any plot upon which persons might be desirous of building and thus encourage the investment of capital. After further discussion it was resolved to refer the matter to the Special Committee of the Board.

Read letter from Sub. Sanitary Officer requesting a new suit of uniform. On the motion of Mr. McC. Carroll seconded by Mr. Wynn it was resolved to invite tender

by next meeting.

Read tender from P. Bruen proposing to clean the street during ensuing month for £4. On the motion of Mr. Carr seconded by Mr. H. Edwards his services were accepted.

Read resignation from Messrs Edwards as members of the Board accepted for the time being. Resolved that following cheques be perfected and passed for payment of wages and current account.

Read report of the Sub San. Officer who stated that during the previous month there had been seven cases of Scarletina within the Township. He drew attention to the imperfect condition of the road leading to the Castle gate Bush town which was nearly impassable through large stones being scattered over it. On the motion of Mr Wynne seconded by Mr P. J. Byrne it was resolved to expend £3/- for the purpose of having stones broken and necessary repairs executed. Re. the Sub San. Officer further remanded the Board that a quantity of manure collected by the scavenger was lying on the Burrough and would require to be disposed of. On the motion of Mr Doolittle seconded by Mr W. Lane it was resolved to dispose of it by public auction. He had inspected 50 houses and served ten notices for abatement of nuisance.

Read report of Water Works Superintendent who stated that during the foregoing month the reservoir was down 6 m from overflow. He had received 20 bags cart of sand and required 2 sacks to carry it to filtering beds. He had in stock some rd. lead piping which requiring disposing of. Resolved that the necessary sacks be obtained and that lead piping be sold at Manure Auction.

Read letter from Treasurer and Secy of the Wicklow Fever Hospital enclosing Medical Report and Statement of accs.

of the institution for the year ending 5th April 1886 and soliciting subscription for the year ending 5th April 1887.

Resolved on the motion of Mr Carr. Seconded by Mr. Collins that a Cheque be drawn for the amount £5.

Read Report of Waterworks Caretaker who reported the reservoir full and of having the sand placed on the beds and washed and the works as being in a satisfactory condition marked. Read and ordered for Palings to protect cattle from falling down embankment made.

Read copy of Auditor's report to the Local Government Board which ran as follows.

Gentlemen. I have the honor to report to your Board that I have audited the account of the Town Commissioners of Wicklow for the year ended 31st Decr. 1885. I transmit an abstract of the account which shows that the Town Clerk had in hands for petty cash purposes at the beginning of the year £5. 17. 2 and the Comms received during the year £2 591. 8. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ making together £2599. 6. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ and that the payments made under the various heads of account including £780. 1. 5 balances due to the Treasurer and the Agent at the end of the preceding year amounted to £2410. 6. 8 leaving at the end of the year a balance of £9. 12s 8d petty cash in the Town Clerk's hands and balances due to the Treasurer and the Agent amounting to £120. 13. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$. Collected at the end of the preceding year amounted to £53. 7. 10. I have re-investigated the claim of the Bank to be allowed the sum of £44. 11. 0 referred to in my last year's report as interest on overdraft. I found that the facts were not properly put before me at previous audit and that the advances were obtained by the Comms for the purpose of executing certain works in anticipation of a loan from the Board of Works under the provisions of the Public Health Act. The loan was subsequently sanctioned and £90 was lodged with the Treasurer by the Board of Works in July last under these circumstances the interest charged in respect of the overdraft was fairly and legally payable by the Comms to their Treasurer. The Comms have not obtained security from their rate collector for the due and faithful performance of his duties notwithstanding that the Act 9th Geo the 4th Cap 82 Sec 30 requires them to obtain a bond with two sufficient Sureties for that officer in such sum as they shall think fit and proper according to the amount of moneys to be received by him. The Comms special attention should be called to the proviso to this section as it personally affect them. It is desirable that the Town Clerk should also give security for the petty cash with which he is entrusted and which amounted last year to £73. 14. 6. The account of the expenditure of which sum extends to the unusually large number of 324 separate items in the ledger. It would be a great advantage if a Time Table and a system of weekly payment to be established in future. The accounts of the Town Clerk and Agent were

Sir I am directed by the Lords Commrs. of H. M. Treasury to acknowledge the receipt of the Town Clerk's letter of the 18th inst. stating that the application of Mrs. Gregory one of the agricultural tenants of the Town Commrs. of Wicklow for a reduction of rent on her farm came before the Board on the 3rd inst when the subject of her application was considered and after deliberation it was decided in consequence of the great agricultural depression now existing to concede Mrs. Gregory's application commensurate with the prices now ruling for agricultural produce and the reduced value of land. The Board first seeking my Lordships ratification. My lords presume that Mrs. Gregory is the person referred to in the memorial of the Town Commrs. of the 1st of Decr 1879. A. Somers' application to that now before my Lord was made then by the Town Commrs. and my lords then replied that as Mrs. Gregory's land was only held by her on a yearly tenancy and not on lease. My lords must decline to interfere in the matter. See Treasury letter of the 9th March & 14th April 1880. I am further to refer you to the letter of this department of the 13th Feb. 1886. and to repeat that if the tenants of the Town Commrs. either hold their leases for 31 years or less pursuant to section 140 of the Act 3 & 4 Vic Cap 108 or are merely tenants

from year to year the reduction or abatement of their rents is not a matter with which my lords have any concern. My lords consider that the Town Commrs. should consult their legal adviser as to their powers under section 140 of the act referred to.
