### Copy of Rules and Regulations

That as the Caretaker of the water works was originally engaged at a salary of sixty pounds per annum to give his whole time to the Commissioners to perform the different duties of his office

The Committee appointed to draw up Rules for Caretakers duties are of opinion that the following should be strictly carried out.

That the duties of Caretaker of Wicklow Water Works shall be in accordance with the following resolutions passed by this Board on the 6<sup>th</sup> September and 11<sup>th</sup> November 1892

Resolution 6<sup>th</sup> Sept Proposed by Walter Roche seconded by Charles Kerr and resolved That the following Committee draw up Bye Laws for the guidance of the Water works Caretaker Messrs Wynne, Armstrong, Desain, Nolan and the Chairman

Resolution 11<sup>th</sup> Nov Proposed by John Nolan, seconded by William Desain and resolved That the Water works overseer be allowed the five tons of coal as usual, but that in future all work done by him in making water connections and

the money received for same to be placed to the credit of the Town Commissioners - Furthermore that this Board insist upon him giving his time exclusively to the Water-works and the duties connected therewith

1<sup>st</sup> Rule That the Rate payers of Wicklow take notice. That in all cases where leakage or any defect takes place in the water connections they are required to report same as soon as possible to the Town Sergeant, who shall immediately inform Mr. O'Connor and see that same is attended to at once.

2. The Caretaker shall on report from the Town Sergeant make an examination of the different connections and taps, and if any leakage or waste is occurring that he at once take steps to remedy same and report to the Board.

3. The Caretaker shall <sup>occasionally</sup> at night visit all parts of the Town in which the pipes are laid and report to the Commissioners at their next meeting if any waste is occurring and in what particular houses such waste is taking place - He will further be required to attend at the practice and general working of the fire hose at such reasonable times as the Chairman shall direct.

4. That a report of the water-meter be laid before the Commissioners at all the monthly meetings of the Board

5. That all connections shall be made by the Caretaker, viz pipes leading from main to inside of all premises, but should any extra plumbing



115 Rule Continued. He required, consent must be by order of the Chairman who shall have full power to have same carried out for which Mr O'Connor may make a charge on his own account.

6 The Caretaker shall at least every three months have the filters thoroughly cleansed, and if required new sand procured - Furthermore that all reasonable work in connection with his duties shall be executed by him as the Chairman or the Board shall direct.

7 If the Caretaker should refuse to obey the foregoing Rules laid down by this Board he shall be dealt with in the same manner as the Town Clerk with reference to dismissal.

Gentlemen,

I have the honor to report that I have audited the Accounts of the Wicklow Town Commissioners for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 1892, a certified copy of Abstract of which is enclosed.

In my last report I referred to a balance found to be due by the former Town Clerk being Market Tolls not accounted for. Adding to this sum the amount of

similar Tolls received by him while in office during 1892 also cash received for water connections and an unaccounted balance of Petty Cash as shown at foot of Abstract and giving him credit for lodgements made during 1892 and for Salary due, but withheld, I find that his indebtedness to the Commissioners stands at £6. 14. 5. He does not appear to have given any security bond to the Commissioners and consequently I fear this amount must be considered a total loss.

I have found it necessary to surcharge a sum of £4. 13. 0 paid by the Commissioners as rates upon holdings, the tenants of which are in my opinion liable themselves to pay the rates in question.

The collection of Water Rate has been very well maintained as also the collection of rents from the Corporate Estate with assistance from the Commissioners in some cases pointed out by me on the Rental I am hopeful that much improvement will be visible this year.

The Accounts have been very well prepared and were submitted for Audit in a satisfactory manner

Adverting to the circular letter of the Local Government Board for Ireland of the 4<sup>th</sup> November last recommending the adoption of certain precautions in this Country against Cholera, in the fifth paragraph of which the Board drew the attention of Sanitary Authorities to the duty devolving upon them under Section 108 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878, in regard to the periodical inspection of their district, I am directed by the Board to request that they may be informed whether the Sanitary Authority have since taken steps to ensure a careful and systematic inspection of their district, with a view to the immediate enforcement of the provisions of the Public Health Act in all cases in which nuisances requiring abatement made be found to exist therein.

The duty of the Sanitary Authority under the section referred to is one to which, having regard to the probable approach of Cholera in the present year, they should give their earnest and continued attention.

in good Sanitary order and help as a great preventative against  
the disease. It is important, therefore, that his recommendations  
if they should meet the approval of your Board should not  
only be put in force, but that they should also be continuously  
and systematically acted upon. — He is desirous that a small  
Committee be appointed to assist the Sanitary Officers in their  
efforts to carry out the provisions of the Public Health Act and  
that they should with their officers visit the different houses  
and premises within their Township and make a report thereon, so  
that this Board may make an order to compel the owners to  
comply with the Sanitary Regulations. — It is most vital  
that the following should be most carefully looked after, viz.  
Common lodging houses, Milk shops, Dairies, Slaughter Yards, Back  
yards, Privies, Sewers, Water Supply &c. — As to  
Common lodging houses he recommends the adoption of the Bye  
Laws now in existence in Ringstown, that same should be  
printed and published in accordance with the 221<sup>st</sup> Sec Public  
Health Act, and further he advises the adoption of the Public Health  
Amendment Act of 1890, but especially the Infectious Diseases  
Prevention Act 1890, which would give you additional powers for  
dealing with patients suffering from Cholera. —

Houses without proper care and proper accommodation should be



immediately closed up, if the owners refuse to comply with the Sanitary Regulations — It is also desirable that this Board should communicate with the Governors of the Fever Hospital asking their co-operation in the event of Cholera breaking out, and to point out that one considers it desirable that they should have Nurses engaged and extra Medical aid if required, the cost of which will be borne by the Poor Law Union — He also recommends that one should be in a position to have an ambulance car and a small body of men to assist at the burial of the dead, take charge of coffins, disinfect houses, destroy clothing etc

D. Stafford congratulates this Board on having a splendid supply of pure water and recommends that every precaution should be taken to have the filtering beds and surroundings of the Reservoir properly looked after and above all under no circumstances to allow cattle or sheep round the embankment of the Reservoir as same would be most dangerous to the water supply and Public Health.
