 Mr Rooney as Poor Rate Collector, for the Wicklow Urban District is
 insufficient to disqualify him, inasmuch as his father who carried on
 the retail trade and with whom he has been residing has died since
 Mr Rooney's appointment and as a settlement in the Family affairs
 is pending which will cause him to take up some other place of abode
 we pledge ourselves to hold good his appointment pending the confirmation
 of the Local Government Board":

 "That we hereby direct and authorise two members of the Wicklow
 Urban District-Council to sign and seal on our behalf Lease
 to War Office of 100 feet of Upper Murrugh for a term of 19
 years from 25th March 1898 at the rent of £5 per annum
 as per resolution dated 3rd October 1898" =

A Special meeting of the Wicklow Urban District Council and Town Commissioners was held this evening in pursuance to a requisition signed by James Gannon, Charles Davis, Christopher Murray, David H. Haskins, Joseph McCarroll, Peter Doolittle, Thomas Gregory.
To consider the Order of the Local Government Board dividing the Town into Wards:

Members present - Mr. James Gannon Vice Chairman in the Chair Messrs Joseph McCarroll, Matthew McDonald, Charles Davis, Frank McPhail, Nicholas H. Haskins, David H. Haskins, Christopher Murray and Thomas Gregory: -

The Town Clerk stated that inasmuch as the Members of the Council did not receive two clear days notice the Meeting summoned for this evening was clearly illegal: - The requisition to convene the Meeting was handed in at his house at the hour of 9.45 pm on Saturday night 23rd Inst and owing to the late hour at which he received the requisition and to the fact that the next two days were Sunday and Christmas Day the Members of the Council did not receive their notice until Tuesday morning 26th Inst at nine o'clock am: -

* Proposed by Joseph McCarroll, seconded by Thomas Gregory and resolved
"That inasmuch as two distinct resolutions remain on the
"Books of the Council, one passed by the Town Commissioners in 1898,
"and one passed by the Urban Council in 1899, both resolutions declar-
"ing against the division of Wicklow into Wards and inasmuch
"as the whole public sentiment of Wicklow and the whole
"evidence of the Enquiry are dead against dividing the Town
"into Wards, we hereby call on the Local Government Board
"to reconsider the division into Wards and not act despotically
"against the resolutions of the Board of 1898 and 1899 the wish of
"the people and the requirements of the Town"

Mr. Nicholas Haskins declined to vote and Mr. Frank McPhail
dissented to the resolution: -

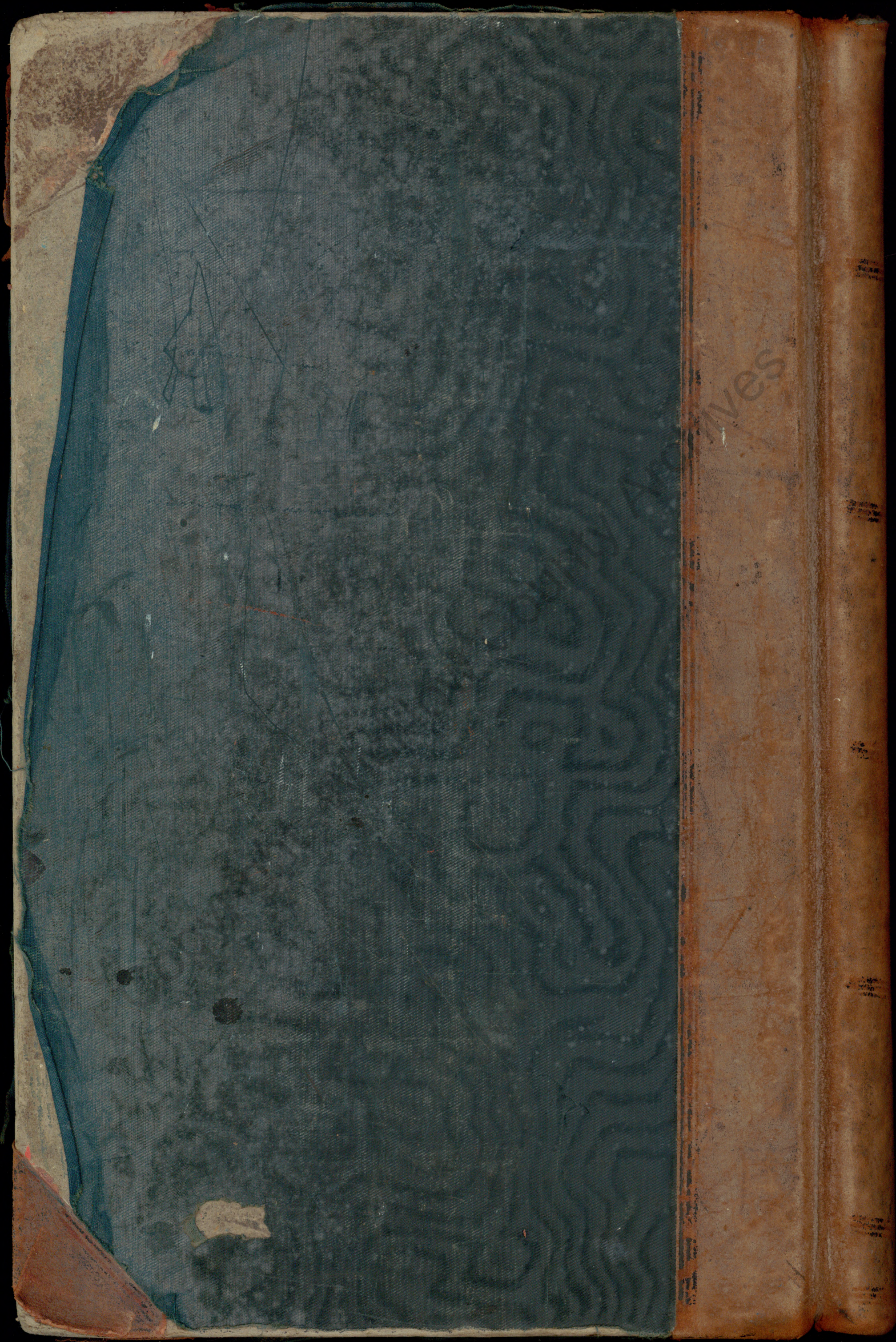
