After the storm in January last the road leading to the Chemical works, which was reduced in width to 15 feet by the erosion of the sea, was widened to 20 feet in the narrowest part, since this widening was done the road has been again narrowed to 16 feet in parts, by the further encroachment of the sea: =

None of the road contracts expire until next Summer Assizes, and I do not consider it advisable at present to suggest any works of improvement, although there are several of such a nature required in the Urban District, but they are not of an urgent character.

Amongst them I may mention the closing up of the arch at the north west end of Church Street at present the adjoining road and path at this watering place is continually in slop and dirt, and cannot be kept in a decent state owing to cars and other vehicles being constantly washed there, and it is also a corner for nuisance, I think the projection should be removed altogether and the path continued round from Church Street to Wentworth Place: =

Gentlemen

During the quarter just ended, your Contractors have not complied with some of the terms of their Specifications, inasmuch as none of them have their metal ready for measurement, and the Streets, at times, were very slovenly kept.

I cannot account for this, except that the men were busy with the preparation of the materials. However, as the full supply was not ready in the specified time, I am compelled to withhold certificates on all continuing contracts for this reason, as well as for the manner in which the Streets were kept.

In the annexed Schedule, I am only certifying for the "Transferred Contracts" which expired on the 21<sup>st</sup> July last. The amounts consequently are small as the Urban Contractors were all paid up to 30<sup>th</sup> June last



and any other moneys due to them on their expiring Summer Contracts will, I think it, have to be made up by the Rural District Council, as ~~well~~ all the works were transferred to the Urban District Council on 1<sup>st</sup> April 1899. = This arrangement appears at first sight, a little confusing; but you will find it is correct. But it only affects the transferred contracts when they expire at Summer Assizes. =

In my last quarterly report, I recommended that the post and wire fence in the Brickfield Lane, be repaired, but no order was made; = This was provided for in the year's Estimate, and should now be put up for Contract, as it is at present in a bad state: = As no <sup>other</sup> work of improvement was included in the Estimate, I shall not now recommend any, although there is room for a great many. =

I inspected all the Contract Roads recently, and I must impress on the Contractors the necessity of keeping them in better order, especially having them free from rolling stones, cleaning channels and edging and trimming up generally. I have noticed each of them, and hope by next meeting that a better state of things will prevail: =

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

7th December, 1920

During the month I inspected upwards 300 premises and served three notices under the Public Health Act for sanitary purposes which were complied with. The flushing of the main drainage and Urinals on the South Quay has been carried out satisfactory. I have five cases of Scarlet Fever removed to the fever hospital and one case of Biphtheria removed to Rathdrum Fever Hospital, and disinfected the premises in each case by the Medical Officer of Health's instructions. The Paling at the Mill has been repaired in the dangerous places of same. I would recommend the council to put a concrete wall at same. On Tuesday morning 30th inst I found the Board Room door open, and the door leading to the back in same. On examining the room three of the press doors had been forced opened, I reported same to the Town Clerk, as the doors of the Board Room were fastened the Monday night at 9-40 p.m. One of the lengths of Paling on Bachelor's Walk has been carried away I had the space fastened with wire till it is replaced. The public lighting during the month has been satisfactory and only in one case the lamps have been broken which happened to the lamp at the Station Gates. The Scavengers work on the Streets has been well attended to during the month. I beg to let the council know that my Uniform is to be renewed this month.
