The Men were engaged during the month on the following roads and streets:- Green Hill, Dunbur, Rathnew, Church Hill, Upper & Lower Strand Street, South Quay, Bachelors Walk, Leitrim Place. Paving on Sea Murrrough repaired. The Public Seats painted. The Stone Shore in Morton's Lane has been broken by Motor traffic and I had same repaired and reported to Town Clerk. Water Cart requires repairs.
