To the Member of Wicklow Urban District Council.

Section - Mr. C. M. Byrne, T.D., Town Clerk and I accompanied with Mr. Kenny, waited on the Ministry on Thursday last in connection with Electric Lighting Scheme.

Mr. Fred Allen, gave great praise as to the manner in which the Scheme had been prepared and promised to do everything in his power to assist the council in the project.

We pointed out that a great deal of proceedure had to be gone through before the Ministry could give their sanction to the Order.

Messrs Tierney & So, are preparing plans and specifications which will be ready in a fortnight. Your Solicitor is preparing the Order; and the Town Slerk is carrying out the necessary statutory rules and orders in connection with Electricity (Supply) Act 1919, so that in about a month's time we will be in a position to consider the tenders for the work.

We have learned that the price of Gas in Wicklow is higher than any other Town in Ireland and that there are only two other Towns which come near Wicklow that is to say 9/- 2 10/- per 1.000, but there are reasons why these prices are charged.

We also understand that Messrs Anderson, has another works and the price they charge is 8/- per 1,000 and are able to pay a very good Dividend at this figure.

I wish to thank the Town Clerk, for his very able and clear statement to the Minister and for all the extra trouble which he has

taken in connection with the scheme, the success so far is attributed to his untiring energy which I trust he will have the reward by the installation of Electric Light in Wicklow by the end of the year.
