Inspected 200 premises and served 5 notices under P. H. Act for various sanitary purposes which were completed with. Had five premises limewashed and supplied lime for same. The Main Drainage and Urinals have been flushed weekly. Had roof of Boat House repaired and step ganstructed at entrance to Woodenbridge. The men were engaged at the following roads during the month Dunbur Road, Monkton Row, St Patrick's Road, Green Hill and Rathnew Road. I have had stones spread at Abbey St, Fitzwilliam Square, Main St, New St, Bath St & Leitrim Place. The Railing at Bachelors Walk is in a bad state of repair. The sewerage at the Council's cottages at Bond St is constantly chocked and recommend the water services be renewed in these cottages. The drainage in one of the Cottages on the Convent Road is chocked and is only a stone shore to take the surface water from flooding the kitchen. The Cottage requires a pipe drain to bottom of Garden to take water away from Cottage.
