SANITARY SUB-OFFICER'S REPORT.  
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1st. April 1930.

Inspected 15 Premises and served one notice for defective drainage which has been complied with. The flushing of the main drainage and the Urinals on the North and South Quays has been carried out weekly. I had 40 yards of Stones broken in the Mill Yard and had same spread on the Roads that required it. I wish to have the Council's permission to have the Public Seats painted, this work can be done by the Council's men on wet days. Farther damage has been done to the Foreshore. The wall at the north end of the Wooden Bridge was taken down owing to the flood, requires to be rebuilt as it is dangerous to children. I had water tables, etc. cleaned on the Green Hill Road, Station Road, and Coopers Lane. One of the Councils men is out sick since the 19th. instant.

By the Council's instructions I am sending two men to Sawmill Yard to repair the drain on Wednesday next the 2nd. April.

Order:- That Mr. McCarroll be written to asking <sup>if he is</sup> ~~is~~ prepared to go half in the cost of repairing the Wall which was knocked down by the floods and if so the Council were prepared to pay the other half of the cost. ## WATERWORKS OVERSEER'S REPORT.

During the month two of the Council's men were employed at the Waterworks opening holes to enable men to repair leak in clean water tank. The leak is now complete and staunch. The reservoir is overflowing, and there is a good supply coming in from the streams.

On this date last year the water was decreasing in the reservoir. I flushed all mains, and done all necessary repairs to fountain during the month. There is a Fine Screen required at Waterworks to clean out filtering sand.

WATERWORKS OVERSEER'S REPORT.

6th May, 1930.

During the month I carried out necessary repairs to fountains and flushed mains.

The connection to Mr Crofton's premises on Marlton Road, was broken by a steam roller and I had a new connection fitted in to replace broken one.

One of the Council's men was employed at the Waterworks during

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the month for two weeks filling in holes and fencing.

The water is up to overflow yet, but streams are falling off, however, we have 3ft. 3ins. of water more than on same date last year and more coming into the Reservoir.

I wish the Council's instructions in the following case:-

There are two leaks in services to private houses in Main Street.

To open the road in one case I asked for the necessary leave from the Engineer of the County Council, and was demanded to deposit £2 before allowing road to be opened. This to my mind is a hardship, as the people concerned will not deposit £2 although willing to have the leak repaired under usual or old conditions.

In time of scarcity of water I would be in a very awkward position should a leak occur, in a part of a house service where it could not be repaired except by turning off water main.
