1st July, 1930.

During the month inspected 24 premises and served two notices for sanitary purposes which were complied with.

The usual flushing of the main drainage and disinfecting of gully-traps and Urinals on the North and South Quays has been carried out weekly during the month.

The sewer in Hall's Lane got chocked, I had it opened up and cleared.

By the Council's instructions I had three sets of concrete steps erected at Golf Links for stiles and 70 yards of concrete pailing laid at same, also had pailing at Bachelor's Walk, that was broken, repaired with two lengths of concrete rails and posts.

Owing to the bad state of the water-table at Convent Road I would recommend a new water-table to be laid before the bad weather as it is dangerous at present.

I wish the Council's instruction regarding the cleaning of the Main Street on Sundays during the months of July and August.

During the month the Council's men also had a foot-way made to beach at Foreshore and are at present cleaning up water-tables at Convent Road and Bayview, one of the men is at the Waterworks with Overseer.

During the month one of the Council's men was employed taking up dirty sand from surface of filtering beds.


