The Letter from the Decartment of Local Government (G.16841/2/41) of3rd July 1941 in reply to Town Clerks letter of the 1st idem stating that the Minister does not agree that the attendance of the deputation to discuss the rate for the current financial year would serve any useful purpose and pointing out courses that might be adopted.

Letter from the Treasurer of the 7/7/41 asking to have the overdraft cleared by the 15/7/41. The Council proceeded to examine the estimates in the light of the correspondence. The Town Clerk explained the loss on the Water

undertaking and how a special rate might be levied on users and what is known as a Compulsory Rate on all and also a special charge for water for trade or non-domestic purposes . He advised a special rate in

addition to rate already made for Water Users.

The Council declined to increase the Rates as already adopted but agreed to set apart 1/- of the P. Health charges as a Water Rate and to raise additio nal receipts from Water for non-domestic purposes. It was agreed that by counting on £160 from Water for non-domestic

purposes, £40 increase in estimated receipts from Housing Subsidy £5 receipts from Scavenging, and by further reductions in P. Lighting (£6), Sewers (£40), Waterworks (£10) and ty£10 on School Meals and Printing and a receipt of £30 from the Harbour Commissioners the 1/reduction made in the Clerk's Estimate could be restored.

It was arranged that the Clerk reddjust those figures accordingly -I and that the Rate be made a Special Meeting after the lapse of 14 days.
