During the past month the Town roads have been
fairly maintained, large supplies of metal spread and
all the unflagged paths travelled.

The necessity for a mud cart increases with the approach of winter,
as the liquid scrapings must remain on the streets for a day or two,
before they can be removed in ordinary carts. The new crossing is
completed, and several of the paved channels have been repaired. The
work at the New Technical School foundations is progressing satisfactorily,
and also the water main on Dunbar Road. More than half the
work is executed on both contracts. With reference to Kesperary
Lane, it will be necessary to construct a new concrete channel,
and reform and remetal the road, at a cost of about £17. 0. 0

I beg to submit report for month of November.
The Public Lighting of the Town was fairly well attended, but for
two exceptions, the 8th and 9th November included I found ten
lamps not-lighting. - I made usual sanitary visitations
inspecting over two hundred and fifty premises and served
24 notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary
purposes - I had drains and waterways repaired, cleaned and
flushed on 14 occasions, I also had the main drains disinfected

The street-cleaner was attentive to his business. - On Saturday
the 26th November the main street was scraped by grom road
workers and the scrapings were left in heaps by the side

of the footpaths to the inconvenience of pedestrians. - at the Petty Sessions held on the 7th November I had five cases before the Justice, one for disobedience of Sanitary notice and four for trespass; orders were given in each case - I would draw your Council's attention to the use of the ambulance van for the conveyance of patients to Fever Hospital outside your Township and would suggest that a small charge be made to defray the expense of cleaning and wear. The Medical Officers attention has been directed to some Sanitary Subjects - As requested I furnish some Sanitary reports - I have received one shilling for trespass. =

We have directed that Robert Richardson be employed to cart remainder of slag from Dunbar Quarry at six pence per ton, spreading to be done by our men, and also that the channel be properly levelled and trimmed up so as to drain the water off the road, same to be carried to upper side of gullet at Summer Hill, the rock at entrance to be levelled off. — We recommend that provision be made in next year's estimate for the erection of a gas lamp and fountain at Upper Monkton Row. We recommend that the resolution limiting the work at Colly Street to £ 10 be rescinded on the grounds of the advantages to be obtained by having the work thoroughly and economically done by labour than by direct taxation. We visited the Ball Alley, and found the road flooded, owing to the old gullet being choked and connections on private premises not being connected with new Main Sewer, we understand that notice has been served on the owners to connect with main sewer. — We have directed Mr. Pansing to make a thorough examination and have the matter put in order at once, Mr. Doyle to assist. Waterworks Committee Report

Your Committee have considered the analysis of the two samples of water analysed by Sir Charles A. Cameron. Sample No 50 was taken from the extreme end of West Pier and at the dead end of pipe which is only seldom used, vessels taking occasional supplies from it. Sample No 20. was taken from an ordinary pipe and as Sir Charles A. Cameron remarks is a fairly good water, and even better than the analysis shows. The albuminoid ammonia is only slightly over the standard given by the analyst and this is principally derived from peaty matter which is comparatively harmless. The Chlorine is low showing absence of contamination. Nitrous and Nitric Acid are practically absent. Turbidity and sediment only slight with some minute suspended particles. The solid matter retained on the filter consists principally of peaty matter and oxide of iron which would account for a slight turbidity and colour due to oxidation after leaving the filter beds.

With respect to the Catchment area, all known sources of

pollution were directed from the supply and every precaution are taken to ensure a pure inlet supply to Reservoir. The filter beds are worked with a sufficient thickness of well graded material, and are regularly and constantly cleaned, the gravel and sand is washed by a proper machine purchased for the purpose, and the filters are doing their work effectually. The Committee knowing the importance of a pure domestic water supply exercise a constant care that every precaution is taken to attain this end.

The roads in your District are in fairly good order. The full staff of workmen had to be constantly on them during the past month, cleaning and stoning. Consequently, none of the special works recommended by the Road Committee have yet been commenced.
