I submit report for the month of September and beg to state  
 that the public lighting of the Town during the month but for  
 a few exceptions was well maintained. I made my usual  
 Sanitary inspections visiting over 100 premises and served 11 Notices  
 under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes.

According to your Councils instructions I had the main  
 drainage of the Town disinfected and flushed with water  
 twice weekly. In a few days I hope to be in a position to  
 furnish a report in connection with all sanitary orders up to  
 last Board day which I will place in your Secretarys hands  
 for your information. The main drainage of Summer Hill  
 got out of order during the month I had it remedied with as  
 little delay as possible, and is now in good working order. The  
 Scavenging of the Town was fairly well attended. I would suggest  
 to your Council that the watering Cart be scraped and painted  
 the springs of the Cart should also receive attention. I had  
 the public seats and Bathing Boxes covered to storage for  
 the winter season. The Medical Officer of Healths attention  
 has been directed to some sanitary subjects.

(2) The concrete on the roof should be finished with a thin layer comprising one part of cement to two parts of clean sharp sand applied before the remainder of the concrete has fully set.

Your Committee have directed your Town Clerk Surveyor to add to specification six columns as suggested by Local Government Board: - The plans and specification of Abbey St Sewer the Local Government Board state are now suitable -

We have directed your Town Clerk to instruct the Councils Solicitor Mr Joseph McCarroll to prepare a petition to the Local Government Board for sanction to a loan of £500 to enable the Council to repair Bond St houses, the money to be raised by way of loan from the Hibernian Bond repayable in 10 years.

In accordance with directions Mr. Pansing Surveyed the acreage of Mr Collins fields at Dumbur, we find that Mr Collins has been paying £17. 10. 0 for seven acres, consequently he is entitled to a reduction in his rent of 20% per annum for 1 rood and 18 perches taken from him by quarry encroachment, we recommend that his rent be reduced accordingly from 29<sup>th</sup> September 1905.

According to your Councils instructions I had the main drainage of the Town flushed with water twice weekly and disinfected ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> house ~~it~~ once a fortnight: - The main drainage at the rear of the premises in High St and New St got out of order, I had it remedied as quickly as possible, some time ago it was contemplated to construct a flushing chamber on this drainage, I would now suggest to your Council that it be carried into effect. On several occasions I have had to call your scavengers attention to the cleaning of the streets of the Town especially the back ones but apparently without effect, at present some of them are in a most neglected condition. Your direct scavenger is rarely ever at it his work which is done by his father and in the manner I have stated =

There is just one other matter I would draw attention to in connection with the street cleaning and that is when the streets have been scraped and when the scrapings are in such a condition as to be taken off the streets at the time, I would

Suggest that an extra horse and car be employed for a day or two, and remove the heaps from the sides of the streets.

In accordance with the resolution passed by the Council, I attended a Conference in the Town Hall on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October last, to discuss the Chief Secretary's letter re free grant: =

The various interests were represented by the following Mr Frank Brooke for Carl Fitzmillian, Mr Reid for the Dublin Wicklow Railway Co, Mr John Northing for the Dublin Wicklow Manure Co, Mr Samuel E. Finn (Chairman) for the Wicklow Harbour Commissioners, and myself for Wicklow Urban Council.

Mr Robertson of the firm of Sir A. Rendel & Robertson attended by direction of the Harbour Commissioners. It was resolved that the Town and Harbour of Wicklow should undertake to contribute a sum of £2,500 towards the Scheme for Harbour and foreshore protection in accordance with the Chief Secretary's letter, and that Carl Fitzmillian, the Dublin Wicklow Railway Company, and Dublin Wicklow Manure Co should make up a

further sum of £2500. The Chief Secretary, to be asked on behalf of the Government to increase the amount of the free grant from £22,000 to £25,000, making a total from all sources of £30,000 =

You will observe from the Chief Secretary's letter, that the free grant of £22,000 is conditional on the Town, and Harbour, and Railway Co making up a sum of £5,000, so that if you agree to the proposal of the Conference, you will gain it is hoped an additional £3,000 of a free grant without increasing your liability.

With regard to the contribution from the Town and Harbour, it is proposed to ask the Chief Secretary to embody in the Board of Works annual bill to be laid before Parliament, a short section authorising the Urban Council to raise £2500, repayable in 50 years at the rate of 5.4 per cent to cover principal and interest, equivalent to an annual charge of £106.13.4.

It is further recommended that the charge of £2500 shall be a first-charge on the revenue of the Harbour in addition to the £2500 advanced by the Board of Works under the Wicklow Harbour Advances Act, and that on and after the passing of the proposed new clause in Board of Works annual bill, there is any excess of income over expenditure in respect of Wicklow Harbour, that excess shall be paid to the Board of Works and applied by them.

(a) In reduction of the payments for that year made by or due from the Town of Wicklow in respect of the proportion of the Consolidated debt, and the additional debt of £2500 charged upon the Rates of the Town in pursuance to the arrangements to be made with Mr Long -

The Conference has been adjourned for the following reasons (1) To enable representatives of the contributing parties to consult the various interests (2) To give Sir A. Reudel and Robertson time to modify the plans so as to meet an outlay of £30,000, you will therefore observe that it is most important for the Council to confirm by resolution the contribution of £2500 towards the Scheme.

Managing Committee's Report  
29<sup>th</sup> November 1905.

1. Town Managing Committee met this evening and having considered  
 your Sub Sanitary Officers Report with regard to flushing arrange-  
 ments for Limer in Davis Lane, have directed your Town  
 Surveyor to inspect and report on same.
2. Your Committee having considered Mr. Rose's letter of the 17<sup>th</sup>  
 ultimo, returning Paying Order for balance due in connection  
 with Technical School Contract, cannot see their way  
 to alter the decision arrived at by the Council and  
 supported by your Engineer's certificate, we recommend  
 that Mr. Rose be informed accordingly.
3. We have had laid before us scheme for building  
 Villas at Dumber and having considered same,  
 recommend that the Golf Club be let the vacant  
 piece of ground at the end of Coopers Lane at the rate  
 of one shilling per annum, conditionally, that should the  
 ground be required as an accommodation for building  
 sites in the vicinity, the Golf Club to surrender same

on receiving three months notice.

4. With regard to Charles Torle's holding your Surveyor reports as follows: - I inspected the above this morning, and found that one of the walls had fallen into the adjoining lane. The dwelling house is in such a state as well as the other old walls on this holding, that immediate steps must be taken for the safety of the occupiers and the public, and I would recommend that the premises be closed as unfit for human habitation.

Your Committee recommend that immediate steps be taken to carry out your Town Surveyor Report.

5. We have directed your Town Surveyor to prepare an estimate for piping Wentworth Place Sewer to low water and that the consideration to provide a tidal flap be deferred pending same.

6. The following Sanitary notices have expired Messrs. Dorah Macshail, Dr. Grey, Francis Murphy, Daniel Byrne, John Hanlon, James Murphy, Denis Byrne, Thomas Cuddy, William White and Mr. Barlow. In the first case a promise has been made to have sanitary requirements carried out within two weeks and we recommend that no steps be taken until the expiration of the time aforesaid. We have directed that your Solicitor proceed against John Hanlon for non compliance with sanitary notices. With regard to the remaining cases your Surveyor recommends that the construction of the drains in Strand Street be deferred for two months in consequence of the construction of Tramway.

7. Your Solicitor reports that the Council are not liable for the cost of the construction of Frederick Staughton's Sewer in Market Square and we therefore cannot legally recommend payment.

8. With regard to Mrs. Caldwell's application enclosing an account from Mr. William Rose for making house connections to her premises Main Street, the Council affirm their previous decision that they are not liable in the matter.

9. We recommend that the surroundings of the well in the "Well Field" be put in order, and an overflow pipe laid to connect with main sewer in Castle Street.

10. Your Town Surveyor has laid before us detailed estimate for a 6 inch pipe sewer on Dumbur

Road from the South end of Cooper's Lane to the man hole on Summer Hill at Captain Walls gate, 250 feet in length. We recommend that the work be carried out by direct labour.
