Gentlemen,

I have the honour to report that I have audited the Accounts of Wicklow Urban District for the financial year ended 31st March 1906, and transmit herewith two copies of the Abstracts in the prescribed form duly certified.

A Town Rate of 4/4 in the £ was levied for the period and a Poor Rate of 2/7¹/₂, the Collectors were in both instances able to close their warrants satisfactorily.

The collection of rents from the Corporate Estate and the manner in which the rental was submitted reflects much credit on the officer responsible for these duties.

The large arrears appearing on the Abstract is due to inclusion of the half-year's rents accruing at end of March which were not collectable until after the close of the year.

The other items of receipts as classified on the abstract were duly brought to account and the expenditure under the several heads adequately vouched and accurately recorded.

In former reports I have referred to the fact that no charges are made for water supplied for trade and other non-domestic purposes, though meters were attached some years ago to record the quantities used. It is usual and indeed equitable to the general body of ratepayers that water used for such purposes should be

paid for at special rates and if the meters are now out of repair, the Council might consider if it would not be desirable to enter into agreements with the consumers for a reasonable fixed sum per annum according to the estimated requirements.

I have examined the Officers Bonds and find that owing to the Town Clerk's sureties having become Urban Councillors a new bond would be necessary.

Having regard to the fact that the books and forms prescribed by the Public Bodies Order were not adopted by the Council during the period, I am unable to certify the correctness of abstract form 41 (Table a.) as there are no records from which these figures could be ascertained.

I have no reason however to doubt the accuracy of the statement as submitted by the Town Clerk from his knowledge of the Council's transactions.
