We have considered your Solicitor's Report and recommend that a clause be inserted in the Gas Company's Bill giving the Council the option of purchase.

We recommend that the standard price of gas be 3/- per the rating being, 8 Councillors for 3/-; It for 4/- Messrs M. Phail, Murphy & Newbold declined to vote - The Chairman declared 3/- carried.

We recommend that the capital be reduced in proportion to the amount of money put into the undertaking.

We recommend that clause 33 dealing with electric lighting power be deleted, and a new clause to be substituted protecting the Urban Council against monopoly.

We recommend that the mains be laid with the top of the socket of each pipe at a depth not less than 2 ft 6 inches under the surface of the road or ground and that no mains be laid without the express sanction of the Council between the 1st of April and 1st of Oct, this not to apply to service pipes.

(5) That the additional capital does not exceed £4,000.

1. The roads and streets are not in a satisfactory state owing to the difficulty in getting road material in proper time from the Firm now supplying it, I recommend the Council to get it elsewhere in future -
2. The wooden footbridge wants repairs -
3. The house drainage of Castle Street is dangerous to the Public Health, I recommend that your solicitor be instructed to advise take proceedings against the owners who have not complied with the notices served on them. Proceedings should also be taken against the owner of three houses on the south side of Main Street, between New Street and the Market Square, upon whom notice has ^{been} also been served for defective sanitary arrangements.
4. The Council should provide a new dumping ground. The Harbour Master objects, and I think very properly, to any more stuff being deposited on the margin of the Harbour.
5. The owner of the high hedge on the south west side of the main road, between Fern Hill entrance gate and the watering place, refuses to cut it although notice was served on him over a month ago, I recommend that proceedings be taken, as

the season is nearly over for compulsory hedge cutting. Four Solicitors should also be engaged in this case.

6. Four of the Councils Cottages on the Murrumbidgee want repairs.
7. The garden gate at John Byrne's house (Cross Road Cottages) wants repairs.
8. The road surface between, and alongside the tramway rails through Strand Street, wants levelling up, it is in a bad state.
9. The paling at Cobby's Bank is down and should be re-erected.
10. The house occupied by Mrs Quinsey, in Castle Street is in a dangerous state and unfit for human habitation.
11. Part of the wall on Fitzwilliam Road, over Miss O'Keilly's yard has fallen and should be repaired at once.
12. The drainage of the Lane at the south side of the Cross Road Cottages is defective.
13. Miss Owen's garden wall should be pinned and pointed.
14. I recommend the Council not to sanction Mr Williams Adams application as it would interfere with the boundary fence of two properties.
