Town Surveyor's Report
2nd January 1914.

The roads and paths are getting into a wretched state for want of materials and labour to repair and maintain them. In some cases the yellow clay bottom is laid bare and of course dangerous ruts will be the result of this. A number of the roads are also untrimmed. Macadam from Ballece is slowly arriving and is being applied to the worst portions of the town. Owing to the recent frost and rain several of the roads are in a dirty state and I must ask the Council to employ two additional men for a month to give them a thorough cleaning up. I also recommend that 60 tons of half inch screenings be ordered from Ballece for the footpaths. If this wearing down of the surface is allowed to continue much longer the restoration of the roads and paths to their normal condition will be a costly matter.

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

Visited 165 premises and served seven notices under the Public Health Act for various sanitary purposes, all of which have been complied with. The Medical Officer of Health's attention has been directed to some sanitary subjects. The usual flushing and disinfecting of the main drainage have been carried out satisfactory. The scavengers have not been as attentive to their work as they should have been, several of the back streets have not been scavenged and others seldom visited. During the month a drain broke down at the Cottage Road, same has been repaired and put in working order.
