Inspected 25 premises and served two notices for sanitary

purposes which has been complied with. Had four samples of

water sent for analysis. The usual flushing of the main

drainage and the disinfecting of the Cully-traps and the Urinals

on the North Quay, and South Quay has been carried out weekly
during the month. I wish the Committee to inspect Urinals
on the North Quay, as it requires some other means of flushing,
than the present way with a bucket. I inspected the stream
of water at Monkto Row, Upper, with Committee, and we recommend to
the Council, to have four yards of nine inch earthenware pipes laid
from the commer of the Convent field to the water-table, and a
concrete well about four feet long, two foot by two foot erected
at same, to keep all rubbish from water.

Sub Sanitary Officer's Report

1st September, 1925.

Inspected 40 premises and served two notices for sanitary purposes which have been complied with. The usual flushing of the main drainage and the disfecting of the Gully Traps and the Urinals on the North and South Quays has been carried out weekly during the month

I had notices posted up at Upper Monkton Row warning persons
against using water from well thereon. Owing to Gully Trap at
New Street constantly stopping I had same opened and found that same
was not connected with main drainage, but with a stone shore which
is the cause of the stoppage. I would recommend that this
Cully be connected to main drainage which is five yards away from it.

With the Council's instructions I had 8 lengths of 6" pipes laid and a cement catch-pit erected at Upper Monkton Row, by the Council's men.

I also had the Council's men engaged on the Ballynerrin Road,

Convent Road, Upper Monkton Row, Dunbur Road, and Ball Alley, cleaning

up water-tables and side dressing same. Owing to heavy traffic

on the Dunbur Road it requires 20 tons of stones.

I wish the Council's instructions regarding water coming from Mr Darcy's premises on South Quay, and crossing the public read, as I cannot trace where the water is coming from.

ER: - Gully to be opened up at New Street, and examined with a view to ascertianing the cause of the stoppage, also an examination to be made at Mr Darcy's premises to trace were the water is coming from which is the cause of compliant.
