


The following letters in reference to the drainage etc of Pembroke and Lansdowne Lodges were read viz:-

(B) Letter dated 8th June from Mr Maurice Knight enclosing copies of communications from Mr Dawson Carroll and Mr Scholes in reference to ancient easement for drainage of Pembroke Lodge thro' Lansdowne premises.

(C) Letter from Mr Knight dated 8th June 1894 stating that the landlord of Lansdowne had ordered new drainage which could not be laid until Pembroke Lodge had a sewer of its own.

(D) Letter dated 11th June 1894 from Messrs Dawson Carroll and Bitchellor stating that the drainage easement of Pembroke Lodge through Lansdowne premises could not be abolished without the consent of the owner etc.

(E) Letter dated 11th June from Mr Knight saying that Legal proceeding should be instituted in re drainage of premises.

(F) Letters from Mr A. Downes and Mr Comber in same matter.

After a protracted consideration it was ordered that legal proceedings should be instituted to compel owner of Pembroke Lodge to comply with recommendations of Medical Officer of Health and Engineer as per notice served in the matter and that legal assistance should be obtained if necessary.

Proceeds to be placed to credit of Bray Township Harbour Loan Account."

2522 The reports of Town Clerk and Engineers in "Loan Account" and works were further considered together with certificate for payment of £670 to contractor.

The Chairman informed Mr Doherty that payments now made were considering terms of contract and borrowing powers practically portion of his retention money; and that if he continued he would have to take the risk of the Commissioners obtaining powers to pay him for the completion of the works.

Mr Doherty - Said he was perfectly well aware of the fact all along but he was thankful for the matter having been so fully & clearly explained. He was prepared to go on with the work and stand out of his retention money until the Commissioners obtained the necessary power to raise further capital except only about £1000 say nine months hence on the understanding that the Commissioners would seek necessary powers.
