


A Meeting of the Bray Commissioners
Commissioners was held at the Court House
Bray, on Monday, 6th December 1880 at 10 o'c.

Seconded.

That Mr. Dupreene do take the Chair
Mr. Jackson having signed the
Statutory declaration took his Seat at the
Board as Commissioner for the Little Bray
Ward.

The Minutes of former meeting were
read and confirmed.

Mr. Ryan called attention to the backward
State of the rate collection.

Letter from Mr. Keogh Collector stating
that Mr. Sullivan's one hundred pounds for
land on Bray Commons had been invested
in New 3 per cent in the joint names of the
Commissioners and Lord Meath.

Moved by Mr. Doyle and Seconded by
Mr. Byrne: — That Mr. Jackson's name

be added to the several Committees &
Passed unanimously.

Mr. Comber was authorised to procure
50 tons of broken stones 4/- per ton, and the Clerk
directed to advertise for tenders for 500 tons
more. Tenders to be before the Board at next
Meeting.

A report from Mr. Comber stating
that a portion of the retaining wall of the
Ravenswell road had fallen into the
river was read. Mr. Comber was directed
to prepare a plan and specification of what
requires to be done in the matter.

Mr. Jackson moved and Mr. John Ryan
Seconded:

That tenders for the Supplying of timber
to pile the breaches on the Esplanade be
advertised for and also for tenders for the
restoration of the Esplanade where damaged
by the storms

Passed unanimously.

A letter from Messrs. Scallans in reference
to Mr. Bridgeford's Account for plans &c. of the
Esplanade was read and the Secretary directed
to wait upon Mr. Bridgeford and show him
Messrs. Scallans letter.

A letter from Mr. D. C. Cullagh drawing
attention to the bad condition of the footpath
in the Main Street was read.

Or reputation of ratepayers was
received in reference to the proposed
Amendment Act.

Extract from M^o of 11 Dec 1880.

A Special Meeting of the Bray Township Commissioners was held at the Court House Bray on Saturday the 11th Decr. 1880 at 10 o'clock A.M. to take into consideration the correspondence in reference to the proposed Amendment Act and to consider what steps shall be taken in relation thereto

Mr. Byrne proposed and Mr. Smith
seconded, that Mr. Dupreane do take the
Chair - Passed unanimous.

The Requisition and Notice convening
the meeting were read.

The letter of Mr. Keogh Solicitor of the 8th
inst. requiring immediate action to be taken
respecting the proposed Amendment Act
having been read, the following resolution
was proposed by H. A. Jackson Esq. S. P. and
seconded by Alfred Gotheren Esq.

Resolved. That having very fully considered
the Parliamentary notice in reference to the
proposed Amendment Act, we approve
of the following items contained therein:-
The Extension of the Boundaries of the
Township as shown on the Map in the

County Dublin. That the extension on the South shall join the present boundary near the County Brook and extend no further South, also the questions in reference to the Town Hall - Markets - Battling places - Hactney Carriages - Promenade Pier - Harbour levying of tolls - making Bye-laws and imposing penalties for breaches thereof. The Outfall works - the Bea Wall - the Grand Jury question - borrowing powers to the extent of £5000 by Debenture or otherwise - as to Rating of premises - Extension of Little Bray Ward to the Northern boundary of the Town lands of Cork Little and the Aske - New ward to extend to Bhanaganagh River - That 3 new members be added for the New ward - That the Qualification of Electors and Commissioners remain as at present - the Rating to remain as at present within the present Township - and not to exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ in the Pound on House property and $\frac{1}{9}$ on land in the New District.

We recommend the following questions to be struck out - the Gas question - Fire Brigade - Slaughter houses - Extension of Metropolitan District - the Widening of Strand Road.

That Mr. Dufreane, Mr. Bolsteren and the Secretary with the Solicitor be authorised to proceed to London to confer with Parliamentary agents and Mr. Keogh and decide on the draft proposed Bill and that the deputation be invested with full powers to see the matter properly arranged for the lodgement of the Bill in the House of Lords on the 17th inst.

Passed unanimously

+ Dr. Keogh having stated that a Mr. Hamilton Collector of the County Cess in the district proposed to be taken in had applied to him to have a

clause inserted in the Bill securing him in his present Employment or otherwise to give him compensation, as had been done in the Drumcondra and Delaney Townships the Board declined accede to his request Proposed by Mr. Jackson seconded by Mr. James Doyle.

That a Cheque for the sum of Thirty Pounds on account of expenses be now signed

Passed unanimously

The road-overseer reported that he had been prevented by Lord Meath's man from taking gravel from Bray river. The Clerk was directed to communicate with the Solicitor and ascertain what the powers of the Commissioners

are under the Grand Jury Acts in respect to taking materials for the roads from the river or elsewhere within the Township.

Mr. Keogh having stated that a meeting of the gentlemen living in the proposed new district was to be held in Dublin to day, was requested to attend it and explain the proposed Bill.

A letter from Mr. Keogh Solicitor, directing the Board as to the course they should adopt in reference to the taking of land &c. from the river was referred to next meeting.

A further letter from Mr. Keogh stating that Mr. O'Brien had written to him on behalf of Lords Breath and Brabazon with reference to the powers proposed to be obtained in the new Bill relative to the markets was read, and also

a draft of the answer proposed to be sent, which was approved of.

The advertisement for tenders for timber and repairs of the Esplanade was read, and the Secretary directed to advertise for tenders for next meeting. The Esplanade Committee to inspect the Esplanade in the meantime.

Mr. Comber reported that a portion of the wall at rear of Ravenhill Row required to be re-built, and also recommended the wall to be continued opposite Mr. Botheren's house. It was ordered to advertise for tenders for this and the wall of Ravenhill Road.

Mr. Byrne handed in the following notice of motion:-

Edition of both of the above papers giving
in full the statements of the Gentlemen
supporting the opposition to the Bill and
expressing nearly altogether the sentiments

of those gentlemen who supported the measure. And as the trusted Custodians of the welfare and interests of the inhabitants of Bray, the Commissioners would feel much obliged if the proprietors of the "Daily Express" and "Irish Times" would direct their reporters to give more impartial accounts of such proceedings in future and if any accounts of such proceedings are given they should be accurate and impartial.

Passed unanimously.

Proposed by Mr Doyle and Seconded by Mr John Ryan:-

That in consequence of the filthy and dangerous state of the streets and paths of the Township we order that a sufficient number of men be at once employed to clean same.

Passed unanimously.

It was ordered that Bray men only should be employed and that each man should provide himself with a spade or shovel wages $\frac{1}{8}$ per day.

Mr Smith C.E. of the Railway Company gave his sanction to have the land slip at Bray Head Carted to the Esplanade for the purpose of repairing the breaches thereon.

It was ordered to employ horses and drivers at from 5/- to 6/- per day. and Mr. Cotteren was requested to buy some wheel-barrows & pick handles.

A Cheque for £20 to pay wages was then signed.

The meeting adjourned to 1-30 o'clock on Saturday next.

The consideration of tenders for walls at Bloody-bank and Ravenswell road was postponed for the present.

It was ordered to retain 50 of the best of the extra men for the removal of the filling & the Esplanade & discharge the remainder. and that Mr. Comber should employ a proper man as gauger.

A proof of the printed instructions for the Road-overseer and of his form of Report were received. and approved of and 50 copies of each ordered to be printed—one to be sent to each Commissioner.

A letter was received from the Irish Times stating that they would have the complaint made regarding the biased Report of the Ratepayers meeting investigated. The Clerk was directed to thank them for their courtesy.

A letter from the L.G. Board relative to the proposed extension of the Township &c. was read and referred to Mr. Keogh.

A Cheque for £50 to pay wages was issued.
