



A meeting of Bray Township Commissioners was held in the Town Hall Bray at 11 am on Monday 3rd August 1891

Mr George Keofhs solicitor to the Boards and Messrs P. H. Bomber and W. G. Syrpe Engineers were in attendance.

The minutes of meeting of 20th July were read and confirmed.

2 The minutes and reports of Finance and Public Health Committees were read & adopted.

3 Mr O'Byrne withdrew his motion re advertising.

4 Mr W. G. Syme wrote in reference to Harbour Stock, that the Commissioners' solicitors had not completed arrangements with law agents of Bank. Ordered - consideration postponed until adjourned meeting to be held on

5th Inst at 11.00. Mr Keofhs to complete arrangements by that date and Town Clerks to answer Mr Syme's letter.

6 It was ordered that the Harbour Rate as collected should be lodged to credit of Bray Township Consolidated Loan Funds (Harbour accounts).

7 Mr Keofhs wrote advising that £15 should be paid to Mr J. Martin for fare to London and expenses to give evidence in support of Bray Township Act 1890.

8 It was proposed by Mr McCormick seconded by Capt. Patterson and unanimously adopted "That bonds for the sum of £1500 (fifteen hundred pounds) be issued to Hibernian Bank Limited, Bray, for costs of Bray Township Act 1890, in fifteen bonds of £100 each numbered 41 to 55-inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of 3 3/4 per cent from 1st July 1891. The bonds to be sealed with the Township Seal and stamped and handed by Town Clerk to Hibernian Bank the proceeds to be placed to the credit of costs of act account."

9 The bonds were sealed accordingly and ordered to be completed and delivered as per resolution.

Pursuant to advertisement which was read fourteen applications were received from candidates for the position of Clerk of Works at New Harbour &c

all the applications testimonials &c were referred to Messrs Stryke and Comber for consideration and recommendation, and they reported in favour of Messrs Groves, Middleton & Henderick.

For Brady messrs Nolan, Burkett & Rynd (3) - Middleton, Sir Hy Cochrane & Capt Palmerstone
Mr Groves having an absolute majority was declared elected on the motions of Sir Hy Cochrane seconded by Mr Breslin.

The Chairman - Informed Mr Groves that he had been elected and would be expected to take up his duties at once.

Mr Groves thanked the commissioners and said he was prepared to start work on following morning.

Messrs Geo Keoph & Son wrote stating that they were at a loss to know what Mr Syme alluded to in writing that the necessary arrangements with the Banks Law agents had not been completed. The Commissioners should appoint a Registrar, & provide an allotment book, and description Ledger, and a Transfers Register.

Mr Keoph stated that he observed that the Town Clerk had already prepared an allotment book, and provided forms of certificate and deeds of transfer.

The minutes and report of Special Finance Committee of 6th Inst were read and adopted on the motion of Mr Jackson seconded by Capt Richardson.

The Town Clerk was directed to inform the Manager of Hibernian Bank Bray of the proceedings of that meeting, and also that all necessary resolutions re creation of Harbour stock had been passed and that an allotment would be made at next meeting of Commissioners with a view of getting about £2000 into Harbour Loan account at once.

The solicitor of the Commissioners was personally instructed to see that the law agents of the Bank were thoroughly satisfied on all points, by next meeting.

Mr McCormick gave notice that at next meeting he would move that bonds for £3000 be issued under general purposes loan.

Resolved - That while in common with all our fellow-countrymen, we deplore the long chain of circumstances which led to the committal of the overt acts for participation in which many of our countrymen were sentenced to long periods of imprisonment at a time when strong passions were aroused and panic reigned in the State, we believe that the punishment already endured by them is amply sufficient to vindicate the power of the Sovereign and the majesty of the law and that a prolongation of that punishment would in our opinion assume the appearance of vengeance and be calculated to discredit the character of the English Government in the eyes of all liberal and enlightened nations; and

be it further:-

Resolved - That as many of the prisoners were convicted under circumstances which gave rise to the gravest doubt as to their connection with the offences committed, while others were convicted by means calculated to reflect unfavourably upon the administration of justice in Ireland and to alienate the loyalty of thousands of her Majesty's subjects, inasmuch as many loyal adherents of her throne who profess the Catholic faith were ordered to "stand by" as jurors; therefore be it further:-

Resolved - That in our opinion the subsidence of the alarm created by the occurrences for which these men were convicted, and the feelings of respect and trust daily developing between the peoples of the Three Countries give grounds for hope that the Government will exercise their prerogative of pardon by granting the speedy release of all political prisoners now languishing in British jails. This hope is strengthened and intensified by the remembrance that Ministers while condemning every attempt at revolt as a crime have yet admitted by their policy of conciliation towards this country that the actions of these men were provoked by the existence of great wrongs - wrongs which her Majesty's Government are at present labouring to redress.
