

A special meeting of Bray Township Commissioners was held in Town Hall Bray at 4/30 OC PM on 27th November 1891 re Electric Light Bray and Enniskerry Railway and other matters

On the motion of Capt Patrickson seconded by Mr Langton the chair was taken by Mr Breslin.

271 The Town Clerk read the requisition and notice a meeting.

272 A draft of £400 as first instalment of Stables and Hay-market Loan was received from Board of Works and it was ordered that amount should be lodged to credit of account in Hibernian Bank

273 A long discussion took place in reference to Electric Light agreement. Mr Boucher explained that Messrs Gordon & Co desired to vary their tender in reference to lighting the Township by the direct current system but they could not agree to light all the lamps of the Township simultaneously. Ultimately the following resolution was unanimously agreed to by all parties.

Proposed by Mr McFarland and seconded by Mr Plunkett:-

"That in the event of Messrs Gordon & Co simultaneously lighting the Dunsboro' Road and Strand from Martello Terrace to Bray Head we agree to forego our right to

insist on the direct current system as tendered for"
Passed Unanimously

Correspondence between Messrs Gordon & Co the Town Clerk and Solicitor having been read it was decided that the penalties mentioned in agreement with Messrs Gordon should not accrue in the event of any injury to the Contractors plant occasioned by Commissioners workmen being the cause of non-lighting of any lamp or lamps

Letters were read from the Board of Trade stating that they had no power to nominate an Engineer to report to Commissioners in re Bray Harbour works as requested in Town Clerks letter of 12th November, but it was open to the Commissioners to communicate with the president of Institution of Civil Engineers in the matter.

It was proposed by Mr Plunkett and seconded by Mr Coffey:-

"That the President of the Institution of Civil Engineers of Ireland be requested to recommend an eminent Engineer to advise this Board on the departure that has been made from Specification in carrying out of Harbour works"

Passed Unanimously

277

Mr Slattery Solicitor wrote asking that he might be authorized to consult Senior Counsel in re Bray and Enniskerry Railway and Bray bridge. It was proposed by Mr Langton seconded by Capt Patrickson and adopted:-

"That Mr Slattery's request to employ Senior Counsel in conjunction with Mr Martin Burke Esq in reference to our position re Bray and Enniskerry Railway Compny and Bray bridge &c be complied with and that the Town Clerk send copy of Parliamentary notice (now published) to Mr Slattery."

"That report of Harbour Committee be adopted"
Mr Langton proposed and Capt Patrickson seconded as
an amendment:-

"That a cheque for £350 be drawn for Mr Doherty
on account of works done at Harbour as recom-
mended by Engineers"

There voted for the amendment:- Messrs Breslin
Langton Byrne Tierney Mr Farland Coffey Condren
Mr McCormick Dunne Hennessy and Patrickson (11)
against Messrs Plunkett and Cuthbert (2)
The Chairman - Declared Mr Langton's motion carried
and report "not adopted."

The Engineers reported that a serious difference had
arisen between the Contractor and the Clerk of Works
at Harbour in consequence of which they had suspended
the latter. Mr Comber and Mr Groves having been
heard in the matter the Commissioners informed the
former that it would in their opinion be best to have
an amicable arrangement arrived at as between parties
In reply to Mr Breslin, Mr Comber said that the
Engineers would not have the slightest objection to the
Clerk of Works making his reports in duplicate one copy
to be sent to Engineers and one to Commissioners
Unanimously approved

Mr Keogh drew attention to the position of Commissioners
in re Grand Jury applotment and asked whether
the Commissioners would take Counsel's opinion in re
legality of same:-

It was proposed by Mr Coffey seconded by
Mr Plunkett and passed:-

"That a cheque for amount due to Grand
Jury be drawn"

Pursuant to notice Mr Breslin moved and Capt
Patrickson seconded:-

That the following Committee be appointed

for the purpose of reporting as to the best means

Passed Unanimously

Mr Plunkett submitted plans of two new houses
which he proposed building on Florence Road. Referred
to Engineer.

Mr Keogh submitted conveyance prepared by the
Solicitor of the Board of Trade in re the grant
from Crown of site of Bray Harbour below low
water mark:-

It was proposed by Mr McCormick and seconded
by Mr Byrne:-

That the seal of the Township be affixed
deed of conveyance to be executed between
the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, The Board
of Trade and the Bray Township Com-
missioners in re acquirement by latter
of the rights of the Crown in sea-bed
forming site of Bray Harbour below
low water mark

Three copies of conveyance were sealed accordingly
and handed to Mr Keogh

The Solicitor of the Commissioners submitted two
copies of agreement between the Commissioners and
Messrs J E H Gordon & Co as finally settled for
Electric Lighting of Township:-

It was proposed by Mr McCormick seconded
by Mr Farland and passed:-

That the township seal be hereby affixed
to agreement as submitted by Mr Keogh
between the Commissioners and Messrs J E H
Gordon & Co for Electric Lighting of Township

One copy of the agreement was sealed and both

returned to Mr Keogh to arrange for completion by Messrs Gordon & Co.

It was ordered that the attention of Overseer should be drawn to state of roads and footpaths in little Bray and particularly road from Old Connaught Ave to Bray bridge

Mr Keogh informed Commissioners that statement of Claims &c had been lodged in the case of McAlpine & Commissioners and he was authorized to take all necessary steps to properly defend the action

The minutes of meetings of 7th & 10th December were read and confirmed.

The minutes and reports of Finance and Public Health Committees were read and adopted and it was ordered that tenders should be invited for extension of sewer in Sidmanton Avenue as recommended by latter.

Correspondence between Messrs Casey and Clay and Messrs Rowlands and Co in re proposed Marine Promenade Pier was read and considered. On the motion of Mr Plunkett the following Committee was appointed to arrange with Messrs Casey & Clay for granting of a conditional agreement to the promoters in the matter viz:- The Chairman Sir Hy Cochrane Mr Breslin and Mr Langton.

A letter was read from the solicitors of the Board stating that certain claims appeared against the

premises to be taken from Mrs Kelly for Bray Harbour works and it was necessary that these parties should join in assignment to Commissioners. The matter was left in the hands of Mr Keogh.

The President of the Institution of Civil Engineers (Mr Geo Berkeley 57 Charing Cross SW) wrote under date 15th December 1891 in reply to Town Clerk's letter of 11th December nominating Mr Harrison Hayter Vice President of the Institution of Civil Engineers of No 33 Great George Street Westminster S.W. to report to the Commissioners in reference to certain deviations from Specification in re Bray Harbour Works. The Town Clerk was authorized to communicate with Mr Hayter in the matter.

It was ordered that a cheque for £350 in favour of Messrs Barton and Copland should be issued against Sea Wall Sinking Fund account for investment in India 3 per cent Stock to form Sinking Fund.

The Board having considered Mr Keogh's statement in re illegality of recent applotment made by Secretary Co Wicklow Grand Jury and the probable cost of resisting it, it was decided that under all circumstances it would be more advisable to pay the balance claimed. Cheque for which had been held over pending decision.

A letter was read from the Right Hon Viscount Powerscourt regretting that his absence in London would prevent him from meeting deputation of Commissioners appointed to wait on him in re closing of Dargle and Waterfall. He would be glad however if the Commissioners would wait upon Mr Johnston at the Agency Office Enniskerry. Ordered Committee already appointed in the matter to wait upon Mr Johnston.

Mr Keogh reported that Counsel advised that a sum of £25 should be lodged in Court in the Case of McEgane & Commissioners. Ordered cheque to be drawn for amount and matter left in hands of Mr Keogh.

Mr Cutbert's motion re Working Expenses was postponed and Mr Breslin's motion re Committee withdrawn.

A communication received from Messrs Casey & Clay in re Blackrock and Kingstown Main Drainage Bill was read and referred to Public Health Committee.

Mr Alex^l Mc^l Donnell forwarded account for WC erected at Main car Stand as per agreement for £8. Ordered to be paid.

A report having been read from Daniel Pluck in the matter it was ordered that Pat^l Bergin should be dismissed from the Commissioners employment.

It was ordered that two suits of oil clothes should be

provided in addition to those ordered at last meeting.

A telegram was received from Mr Comber asking that his account for Engineering should be paid. Ordered £50 to be paid on account.

The Engineers wrote enclosing copy of instructions issued to Clerk of Works. Ordered referred to Harbour Committee. On the motion of Mr Plunkett Mr Coffey's name was added to the Committee.

Mr Richard Farrell and Capt J H Patrickson Hon Secs Bray Public Shelter Committee wrote in reply to complaint of Mr Somers which had been referred to them stating that the shelter only occupied the same space as the horses did when standing on Seymour Road prior to erection of shed complained of. Ordered copy of letter to be sent to Mr Somers.

The use of Market House was granted to St Kevin's Lontine Society for payment of annual dividends during Christmas week.

The Rev Mr Loney wrote asking if the Commissioners would be satisfied with the erection of an earth closet for stable in rear of Goldsmith Terrace where he had been noticed to erect a WC. Ordered Town Clerk to reply that the Commissioners would prefer a WC.

The Park Caretaker wrote complaining of damage which his cottage had sustained and asking that it should be repaired. Referred to Superintendent.

Mr Slattery wrote enclosing reports and letters from Engineers of Commissioners and from Mr Lewis C.E. to

Board of Trade in re Bray and Enniskerry Ry and asking for further instructions. Ordered Mr Slattery to take whatever steps he considers necessary to protect the interests of the Commissioners in the matter.

The minutes of meetings of 15th February were read and confirmed.

The Committee appointed to consider tenders for supplying of Fire Escape reported favourably of that submitted by Mr J Browne of 107 Great Brunswick Street Dublin on 18th June last offering to supply a 50 ft escape with all modern improvements for £70. Mr Browne stating that the tender was still good.

On the motion of Mr Langton seconded by Mr O'Byrne: Mr Browne's tender was accepted and the Town Clerk was directed to order escape.

The Town Clerk wrote stating that the hose couplings in use were of an old pattern and that helmets, hatches, hand lamps, and ladders, also some additional lengths of hose were required for use

at five. Mr Plunkett and the Town Clerk were authorized to select and order whatever was required in the matter.

Mr Hayter's report to be referred back to Committee for recommendation as to whether any equitable arrangement could be made with Contractor for carrying out of suggestions &c contained in report. Committee to meet at 3 o'clock on Thursday 10th Inst.

The Town Clerk wrote drawing the attention of the Commissioners to the provisions of the Local Government Board Ireland Bill in so far as it proposed to give Baronial Councils the power of designating certain of their local thoroughfares main roads and charging for their maintenance over the entire County, also to the fact that similar power was not given to townships nor provision made to control County Charges or give townships a representation on County Councils commensurate with their contributions. The communication also referred to the desirability of considering the question of extending boundaries.

A letter was read from the Secretary of Rathmines Township inviting a Committee of the Commissioners to a conference with members of other Boards in reference to how the Local Government Bill affected Townships; meeting to be held that evening.

The Chairman and Town Clerk were authorized to attend conference and the further consideration of Town Clerks letter was postponed.
